BOSTON RED SOX (52-40) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-46)

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Red Sox tonight begin a 10-day, 10-game West Coast trip with the 1st of 3 games in Oakland...The club also has stops in Seattle (7/22-25) and Los Angeles (7/26-28)...This marks the club's 2nd of 3 trips out west in 2010 as they played in Colorado (1-2) and San Francisco (2-1) in June and will return to Oakland (9/10-12) and Seattle (9/13-15) in September.

The Sox went 1-3 on their homestand vs. Texas after the break...Boston has dropped 8 of its last 11 games but have won 15 of their last 27 contests overall.

The Red Sox have lost 9 of their last 14 games away from Fenway Park but are 14-10 (.583) in their last 24 road tilts beginning 5/22, the 4th-best road record in the Majors in that time behind the Yankees (15-9, .625), Rangers (15-9, .625) and White Sox (16-10, .615)...The Sox have won or a split 7 of their last 9 series away from Fenway Park, losing only 6/22-24 at COL (1-2) and 7/5-7 at TB (0-3).

Overall, the club's 22-20 (.524) road mark is tied for 4th in the Majors with the Rangers (also, 22-20, .524), behind the Rays (29-16, .644), Yankees (28-19, .596) and Padres (24-18, .571).

Of Boston's 27 games beginning tonight through 8/15, 20 will be played on the road...The Sox have just 2 off days in the next 38 days (7/29 and 8/16) through 8/25.

WILD WEST: The Red Sox play each of their 1st 14 games after the break against American League West opponents from 7/15-28, going 1-3 thus far...The Sox are 9-5 (.643) this season vs. AL West opponents.

RECORD LABEL: At 52-40 (.565), the Red Sox have the 6th best record in the Majors, 4th in the American League behind the Yankees (58-33, .637), Rays (55-36, .604) and Rangers (53-39, .576)...Boston is 3rd in the AL East, 6.5 games behind New York for the top spot and trailing the Rays by 3.5 games.

Since the club was a season-high 17 games over .500 after a win on 7/3 and 0.5 game out of 1st place, Boston has gone 3-8 (.273), the 3rd worst record in that time behind only the D-Backs (2-9, .182) and Mariners (3-9, .250).

The club has won or split 15 of their last 18 series since 5/17 and 20 of 26 sets since 4/20, during which they have the 2nd best record in the Majors at 48-31 (.608) behind the Yankees (49-30, .620).

600 CLUB: Yesterday's sellout crowd of 37,431 marked the 600th consecutive sold out Red Sox game at Fenway Park dating back to 5/15/03, extending the club's all-time Major League record.

YOK AGAIN: Kevin Youkilis has recorded multi-hits in each of his last 3 games, going 7-for-11 (.636) with 3 doubles, 2 RBI, 2 runs and a walk...He's raised his average from .289 up to .301 in that span.

In Saturday night's 3-2 win over the Rangers in 11 innings, Youkilis drove in the game-tying run with an RBI double in the 9th and the game-winner with a sac fly in the 11th...According to Elias, the last player to tie the game with an RBI in the 9th and win it in extra innings was Texas' Josh Hamilton on 6/20/2010 at Houston (RBI single in 9th, RBI single in 10th)...The last Sox player to do it was David Ortiz on 8/16/2005 at Detroit (solo HR in 9th, 3-run HR in 10th).

AFTER EIGHT AND EXTRAS: Saturday night's win also marked Boston's 1st when trailing after 8.0 innings, improving to 1-31 in those contests...The Red Sox played their 10th extra-inning contest of the season, improving to 3-7...The club's 10 extra-inning contests are tied for the most in the AL (also Seattle and Texas).

GOING DEEP: The Red Sox have hit 29 home runs in their last 20 games beginning 6/23 and 43 over their last 31 tilts beginning 6/10, tied for the 2nd-most in the Majors in that time with Philadelphia and Toronto, behind Milwaukee (45)...The Sox 122 homers overall on the season are 2nd in the Majors, trailing only the Blue Jays 140...David Ortiz and Kevin Youkilis are tied for the team lead with 18 homers each, tied for 9th in the American League.

Red Sox relievers have allowed 41 homers, the most of any bullpen in the Majors.

10 SPOTS: The Sox have notched 10-or-more hits in 3 of their last 8, 7 of 16, 9 of 20, 14 of 26, and 17 of their last 31 games dating back to 6/10...The club has 44 games with at least 10 hits overall this season, tied with the Twins for 2nd most in the Majors behind the Rays (45).

HALL MONITOR: With his 1st start of the season at third base Thursday night, Bill Hall has now started at 6 different positions in 2010, including left field (19), center (6), right (4), second base (17) and shortstop (3)...The last Red Sox player to make at least 1 start at each of those 6 positions in 1 season was Damian Jackson in 2003...Hall has also pitched in a game, joining Steve Lyons (1991) and Jack Rothrock (1928) as the only Sox players to appear at each of those 7 positions in a season.

Hall has hit safely in 5 of his last 7 road contests, going 9-for-26 (.346) with 3 doubles, a homer, 6 RBI and 3 runs over the 7-game stretch.

CAMERON COMING ON: Since hitting his 1st homer of the season on 6/26, Mike Cameron is batting .325 (13-for-40) with 4 homers, 10 RBI and 9 runs scored over 12 contests, including a season-high 3 hits on 2 occasions...Cameron has hit safely in 9 of the 12 contests.

WELCOME BACK BOWDEN: Michael Bowden made his 2010 debut yesterday, tossing a perfect 9th with 2 strikeouts...He was recalled from Triple-A Pawtucket earlier in the day...Including Bowden, 5 of the 8 hurlers in Boston's bullpen were drafted by the club (also Bard, Delcarmen, Papelbon and Richardson) and 6 have never played for another franchise (also Okajima).

BOLD – Fenway Park

The Red Sox begin a 3-game series in Oakland tonight...The 2 teams play a total of 9 times in 2010...Boston took the series at Fenway in June, 2-1...After the current set, the 2 clubs don't meet again until a 3-game series in Oakland, 9/10-12.

Each of the last 10 games between the Sox and A's have been played in Boston, a streak that began on 7/6/09...It is tied for the longest such streak ever between the 2 franchises, also a 10-gamer at Fenway Park from 7/4-8/29/19...The Red Sox have not played 10 consecutive road games against the Athletics since 8/20/71-7/12/72.

In their loss to Oakland on 6/3, the Sox had 18 hits, 10 of which went for extra bases...It was only the 2nd time ever that the Sox lost a 9-inning game in which they had at least 18 hits and 10 XBH (also 12-10 loss vs. Indians at Fenway Park on 5/21/95).

The Red Sox last played in Oakland, 4/13-15/09 (1-2)...The club has won just 5 of their last 18 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06.

The Sox have won 6 of their last 9 games against the Athletics and 16 of 26 beginning 6/7/07...Boston is 34-26 vs. Oakland since the start of the 2004 campaign and has won or split 5 of 6 season sets in that time.

Former A's Marco Scutaro and Eric Patterson return to Oakland for the 1st time with the Red Sox...Scutaro spent the 2004-07 seasons with the A's while Patterson was with Oakland for parts of the 2008-10 seasons until he was acquired by Boston on 6/26...Additionally, Terry Francona was the bench coach in Oakland in 2003.

REHAB UPDATES: Jeremy Hermida, on the 15-day DL since 6/11 (retro to 6/10) with fractured ribs, is slated to have his rehab transferred to Triple-A Pawtucket tonight as the PawSox face Toledo (DET) at home...In 3 rehab games with Double-A Portland, he hit .273 (3-for-11) with 2 doubles, 3 RBI, a run and a walk, playing left field and DH.

Jed Lowrie, on the 60-day DL since 3/31 (retro to 3/26) with mononucleosis, continued his rehab yesterday, going 0-for-4 while playing second base in Pawtucket's 3-0 loss at Syracuse (WSH)...In 9 rehab games overall with Pawtucket and Short-A Lowell, he's hit .370 (10-for-27) with 8 RBI, also playing shortstop, third base and DH.

UPDATED GAME TIMES: The Red Sox game on 8/1 vs. the Tigers at Fenway Park has been confirmed for a 1:35 p.m. start time...Boston's 8/8 contest at Yankee Stadium has been picked up by ESPN and is slated to begin at 8:00 p.m. while the 8/9 game in New York will be a 2:05 p.m. start.

CAREER: 43-24, 4.08 ERA (228 ER/502.2 IP) in 85 GS
2010 SPRING TRAINING: 0-0, 3.00 ERA (2 ER/6.0 IP) in 2 G

LAST START: Earned the 3-2 win at TOR on 7/11, allowing 6 hits and 2 runs over 6.0 IP...Struck out 5 without walking a batter, the 3rd time this season he has not issued a free pass...Blacked the Jays on 4 hits through the 1st 6.0 frames...Gave up 2 runs on a 2-run shot by Adam Lind without recording an out in the 7th, ending his night...Boston snapped a 0-0 tie with back-to-back homers by Darnell McDonald (2-run) and David Ortiz (solo) in the 6th.

Earned his 1st win since 6/7 at CLE, snapping a season-long 3-game winless streak...Is 5-1 with quality starts in all 6 of his starts of at least 6.0 innings this season...Of his 12 starts this year, 5 have lasted 5.0 innings or less.

Is 5-2 with a 3.67 ERA (17 ER/41.2 IP) in his last 7 home starts since 9/15/09...Has earned a decision in 12 straight home starts since 9/28/08, going 5-7.

ELITE EIGHT: Ranks 15th in the AL (min. 45.0 IP) with a 3.10 ERA (17 ER/49.1 IP) over his last 8 starts beginning 5/22, improving his overall ERA in that time from 7.89 to his current 4.56 mark...During that stretch, owns a 4-2 record with 40 strikeouts...Has limited opponents to 3 runs or less in 7 of his 8 starts during that stretch.

MID-RANGER: Has allowed 16 runs (15 ER) in the 1st innings of his 12 starts this season, but just 4 runs in 36.0 IP in innings 2-4...From the 5th on, he has allowed 18 runs (17 ER) in 23.0 innings pitched.

FROM JAPAN: Ranks 3rd all-time among Japanese-born Major League hurlers with 468 career strikeouts...Passed Shigetoshi Hasegawa and Masato Yoshii (both 447) for 3rd on 6/24 at COL...Only Hideo Nomo (1,918) and Tomo Ohka (590) have more.

Ranks 4th all-time among Japanese-born pitchers with 43 career ML wins...Hasegawa is 3rd with 45...Is 5th in that group with 85 career ML starts and 7th with 502.2 career innings.

LIMITING HITS: Has held opponents to a .240 (64-for-267) average this season and owns a .244 (464-for-1,900) career opponent average ranks 3rd among AL hurlers with at least 500.0 innings pitched since 2007...In that time, owns the highest rate of walks per 9.0 innings at 4.28 (239 BB/502.2 IP) in the AL (min. 400.0 IP) and ranks 7th in that group with a rate of 8.38 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (468 K's).

Has held opponents to just 3 hits over 37 bases-loaded at-bats since allowing a grand slam to Scott Moore at BAL on 9/8/07 (3rd inning)...The last time he surrendered a bases-loaded hit at Fenway Park was a 2-run double by TB's Carlos Pena on 8/15/07 (3rd inning).

EIGHT BLANKS: Owns 2 scoreless outings of 8.0+ innings in 2010 (5/22 at PHI and 6/7 at CLE), tied with TOR's Ricky Romero, MIN's Francisco Liriano, and SEA's Doug Fister for the most in the AL this season...Matsuzaka has not allowed a run in each of his last 3 outings of at least 8.0 innings dating back to an 8.0-inning start at Fenway Park against the White Sox on 8/29/08.

WELL SUPPORTED: Ranks 4th among AL hurlers (min. 70.0 IP) with an average of 6.46 runs of support per 9.0 innings (51 RS/71.0 IP)...Has received 335 runs of support over 502.2 career innings pitched for an average of 6.00 runs of support per 9.0 innings, 2nd-highest among AL hurlers with at least 500.0 innings pitched since 2007, trailing only Josh Beckett (6.11).

VS. OAKLAND: Makes 2nd start vs. OAK this season after tossing 6.2 IP of 3-run ball on a season-high 10 hits, 6/2 at Fenway...Quality starts in 5 of his 6 career outings against the A's...Lasted 1.0 IP in his last start at OAK on 4/14/09 (5 H, 5 R, 2 BB, 0 K), matching the shortest outing of his career (also 6/21/08 vs. STL) and his only career start without at least 1 strikeout...In his 2 prior career starts at OAK, went 1-1, 1.98 ERA (3 ER/13.2 IP) with 17 K.

DISABLED LIST: Landed on the DL with a right forearm strain on 6/12 (retroactive to 6/8) and missed 14 games before his 6/24 activation...Was his 2nd DL stint this season...Also missed the 1st 23 games of the year on the DL with a neck strain.

PREVIOUS STARTS: Gave up 5 runs (4 ER) over 5.0 innings and got no decision in a loss on 7/5 at TB...Surrendered 8 hits and 4 walks while striking out 4...Allowed a run in the 1st but settled down to blank the Rays over innings 2-4...Squandered a 5-1 lead, allowing 2 runs in the 5th and another 2 without recording an out in the 6th...Eric Patterson hit a pair of solo shots and doubled, his 1st career multi-homer game...Took the 9-4 loss to the Rays at Fenway Park on 6/30...Struck out 7 in 6.0 innings but gave up 3 runs on 4 hits, 4 walks and 1 hit batter...Did not allow a run in 5 of his 6 IP...Faced 6 batters and loaded the bases in the 1st but got out unscathed...All 3 TB runs came in a 3-hit 3rd...Left trailing 3-1 after 6 frames but Boston's bullpen combined to allow 6 runs over the final 3.0 frames, including 5 off Manny Delcarmen.

MORE 2010 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings at CLE on 6/7 for his 5th win of the season, surpassing his 2009 total of 9, and his 150th career victory between Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball (108) and MLB (42)...Tossed 7.2 hitless innings before allowing a bloop single to Juan Castro with 2 outs in the 8th inning at PHI on 5/22...Left after 8.0 shutout frames having faced 3 batters over the minimum and earned the win...Allowed just that 1 hit while walking 4 and striking out 5...It marked the longest he's ever gone in a game without allowing a hit, topping his previous mark of 4.0 frames on 9/15/09 vs. LAA at Fenway Park...In Game 1 of the 2008 ALCS, did not allow a hit through 6.0 innings.
