

# BOSTON RED SOX GAME NOTES

**BOSTON RED SOX (53-41) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-47)**

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Red Sox today continue a 10-day, 10-game West Coast trip with the last of 3 games in Oakland...Following today's tilt, the club will head to Seattle (7/22-25) followed by a stop in Los Angeles (7/26-28)...This marks the club's 2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 trips out west in 2010 as they played in Colorado (1-2) and San Francisco (2-1) in June and will return to Oakland (9/10-12) and Seattle (9/13-15) in September.

The Sox went 1-3 on their homestand vs. Texas after the break...Boston has dropped 9 of its last 13 games but have won 16 of their last 29 contests overall.

The Red Sox have lost 10 of their last 16 games away from Fenway Park but are 15-11 (.577) in their last 26 road tilts beginning 5/22...With a win today giving the team the series victory, the Sox will have won or a split 8 of their last 10 series away from Fenway Park, losing only 6/22-24 at COL (1-2) and 7/5-7 at TB (0-3).

Overall, the club's 23-21 (.523) road mark is 5<sup>th</sup> in the AL behind the Rays (30-17, .638), Yankees (28-19, .596), Rangers (24-20, .545) and White Sox (25-22, .532).

Of Boston's 27 games from 7/19-8/15, 20 are on the road, going 1-1 thus far...The Sox have just 2 off days in the next 36 days (7/29 and 8/16) through 8/25.

**WILD WEST:** Boston plays each of its 1<sup>st</sup> 14 games after the break against American League West opponents from 7/15-28, going 2-4 thus far...The Sox are 10-6 (.625) this season vs. AL West opponents.

**RECORD LABEL:** At 53-41 (.564), the Red Sox are tied for the 6<sup>th</sup> best record in the Majors, 4<sup>th</sup> in the American League behind the Yankees (58-34, .630), Rays (56-37, .602) and Rangers (55-39, .585)...Boston is 3<sup>rd</sup> in the AL East, 6.0 games behind New York for the top spot and trailing the Rays by 3.5 games.

Since the club was a season-high 17 games over .500 after a win on 7/3 and 0.5 game out of 1<sup>st</sup> place, Boston has gone 4-9 (.308), tied with the Mets and D-Backs (both also 4-9) for the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst record in the Majors in that time behind only the Mariners (3-11, .214).

With a win today, the club will have won or split 16 of their last 19 series since 5/17 and 21 of 27 sets since 4/20, during which they have the 3<sup>rd</sup> best record in the Majors at 49-32 (.605) behind the Yankees (49-31, .613) and Rangers (50-32, .610).

**DAYTIME DRAMA:** The Red Sox are 9-15 (.375) in day games, the 4<sup>th</sup> worst record in the AL this season compared to their 44-26 mark (.629) at night which is tops in the Majors...The club is hitting .254 (208-for-819) with 98 runs scored in 24 daytime tilts compared to .278 (682-for-2,451) with 400 runs scored in 70 night games while the pitching staff has a 4.79 day ERA (114 ER/214.1 IP) compared to a 4.12 mark (290 ER/633.2 IP) at night.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** Last night's 5-4 loss in 10 innings marked the Red Sox 11<sup>th</sup> extra-inning contest this season, tied with Texas for the most in the AL...Only Cincinnati has played more with 13...The Sox dropped to 3-8 in extra innings, including 1-5 on the road...Boston played just 10 extra inning contests in 2009.

**GOING DEEP:** The Red Sox have hit 30 home runs in their last 22 games beginning 6/23 and 44 over their last 33 tilts beginning 6/10, 3<sup>rd</sup>-most in the Majors in that time behind Milwaukee (49) and Toronto (46)...The Sox 123 homers overall on the season are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Majors, trailing only the Blue Jays 143...David Ortiz and Kevin Youkilis are tied for the team lead with 18 homers each, tied for 9<sup>th</sup> in the AL.

**SWEET RELIEF:** The A's winning run with 2 outs in the 10<sup>th</sup> last night snapped the Sox bullpen's scoreless stretch at 11.1...Red Sox relievers have not given up a run in 5 of 7 games since 7/11, posting a 1.78 ERA (5 ER/25.1 IP) with a .174 opponent average (15-for-86) in that time.

Daniel Bard has not allowed a run in a career-high 13 straight outings beginning 6/15, tossing 12.2 scoreless frames in that time...It is the 5<sup>th</sup> longest active scoreless stretch in the AL and longest by a Sox reliever this season...The last Boston reliever with a longer stretch was Hideki Okajima's 16.1-inning streak, 4/28-6/4/09.

**10 SPOTS:** The Sox notched 12 hits last night, snapping a stretch of a season-high 6 straight tilts without collecting at least 10 hits...The club has 45 games with at least 10 hits overall this season, tied for most in the Majors with the Twins and Rays.

**COMMUNITY CORNER:** David Ortiz is auctioning off the bat, cleats and batting gloves he used in his Home Run Derby win last Monday in Anaheim...All proceeds raised in the auction will benefit the David Ortiz Children's Fund, a non-profit organization committed to providing critical pediatric services to children in New England and the Dominican Republic...The online auction can be found at [www.davidortizchildrensfund.org](http://www.davidortizchildrensfund.org)...Bids will be accepted through midnight ET on 7/27.

Daisuke Matsuzaka and his wife, Tomoyo, yesterday announced major new charitable initiatives that will benefit the Red Sox Foundation, including "Dice-K's Strikeouts for Kids," donations from memorabilia sale proceeds and upcoming programs spearheaded by Tomoyo...Under "Dice-K's Strikeouts for Kids," for every strikeout earned by Matsuzaka during the 2010 regular season (retro to the beginning of the season), he will donate \$500 to the Red Sox Foundation...Additionally, the right-hander will donate proceeds from his memorabilia sales to charities in his native Japan and in the United States.

**THIRD ROCKS:** Adrian Beltre knocked his 15<sup>th</sup> home run of the season Monday night and has now reached that mark in 10 of the last 12 seasons since 1999, the most among all Major League third basemen in that time...Beltre's 15 home runs are the most among all American League third basemen this season.

**BOLD** - Fenway Park

The Red Sox conclude a 3-game series in Oakland today...The 2 teams play a total of 9 times in 2010 with the Sox up 3-2 thus far...Boston took the series at Fenway in June, 2-1...The 2 clubs meet again with a 3-game series in Oakland, 9/10-12.

Prior to this series, each of the previous 10 games between the Sox and A's beginning 7/6/09 were played in Boston...It tied for the longest such streak ever between the 2 franchises, also at Fenway from 7/4-8/29/19...The Red Sox have not played 10 consecutive road games against the Athletics since 8/20/71-7/12/72.

The Red Sox have won 2 of their last 3 but just 6 of their last 20 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06...A win today would give the club their 1<sup>st</sup> series victory in Oakland since taking each of 2 games, 4/1-2/08, after the 2 clubs opened that season with a split (1-1) in Japan.

The Sox have won 7 of their last 11 tilts against the Athletics and 17 of 28 beginning 6/7/07...Boston is 35-27 vs. Oakland since the start of the 2004 campaign and has won or split 5 of 6 season sets in that time.

**REHAB UPDATES:** Jeremy Hermida, on the 15-day DL since 6/11 (retro to 6/10) with fractured ribs, continued his rehab with Triple-A Pawtucket last night and went 1-for-4 and played left field in the PawSox 7-1 loss to Toledo (DET) at home...He is slated to join the Red Sox in Seattle tomorrow...In 5 rehab games overall between Pawtucket and Double-A Portland, he has hit .211 (4-for-19) with 2 doubles, 3 RBI, a run and a walk, playing left field and DH.

Mike Lowell, on the 15-day disabled list since 6/24 (retro to 6/23) with a strained right hip, is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with Pawtucket tomorrow night as they complete their series with Toledo.

**600 CLUB:** Sunday's sellout crowd of 37,431 for Boston's home game against the Rangers marked the 600<sup>th</sup> consecutive sold out Red Sox game at Fenway Park dating back to 5/15/03, extending the club's all-time Major League record.

**GET YOUR KICKS:** While the Sox are on the West Coast today, Fenway Park is hosting the 1<sup>st</sup> ever *Fenway Football Challenge*...Perennial Scottish Premier League contender Celtic Football Club is taking on the storied Portuguese futebol club Sporting Clube de Portugal tonight at 8:00 p.m....Tickets are still available at [www.tickets.com/footballatfenway](http://www.tickets.com/footballatfenway).

**CAREER:** 22-18, 4.11 ERA (129 ER/282.2 IP) in 51 G, 49 GS  
**2010 SPRING TRAINING:** 2-1, 6.75 ERA (13 ER/17.1 IP) in 5 GS

**RETURN FROM DL:** Makes his 1<sup>st</sup> start since 6/26 at SF, a 4-2 Red Sox win...Allowed 1 hit and 1 walk while fanning 2 over 1.0 scoreless inning before leaving with a left hamstring strain, sustained while running the bases in the top of the 2<sup>nd</sup>...The Sox scored 4 times over the 1<sup>st</sup> 2 innings and 7 Boston relievers combined to allow 2 runs over the final 8.0 frames.

► Placed on the DL on 7/5, retroactive to 6/27, and missed 18 games (Sox went 8-10)...Made rehab start for Triple-A Pawtucket at Syracuse (WAS) on 7/16...Allowed 2 runs on 4 hits with 1 walk, 1 strikeout and 1 homer allowed in 3.2 IP...Threw 60 pitches (33 strikes).

► Did not receive a decision for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in 15 starts this season...According to Elias, over the last 35 seasons only 2 other Sox pitchers have earned a decision in each of their 1<sup>st</sup> 14 starts of a season: Tim Wakefield in 2007 (1<sup>st</sup> 26) and Pedro Martinez in 1999 (1<sup>st</sup> 18).

**FIRST TIME ALL-STAR:** Named an All-Star for 1<sup>st</sup> time in his career but did not pitch due to injury and was replaced on the AL roster by Yankees left-hander Andy Pettitte.

► His 2.45 ERA was the best by a Red Sox at the break since Pedro Martinez in 2003 (2.36).

**NIFTY NINE:** Leads the AL and ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Majors (min. 50.0 IP) with a 1.59 ERA (10 ER/56.2 IP) while posting a 7-1 record over his last 9 starts since 5/14...Matched a career high with quality starts in each of his 1<sup>st</sup> 6 outings of that stretch (also 8/29-9/24/09)...His loss on 6/9 at CLE snapped a career-high stretch of wins in 5 consecutive starts, the longest by a Red Sox hurler since Josh Beckett won 7 straight from 4/4-5/8/07.

**LEAGUE LEADERS:** Has won 9 of his last 12 games since 4/27, tied for the 4<sup>th</sup>-most wins in the AL in that time...Is 2<sup>nd</sup> on the club and tied for 8<sup>th</sup> in the AL with 10 wins in 2010...Sports the best ERA in the AL (min. 60.0 IP), with a 2.45 ERA (25 ER/92.0 IP).

► Gave up a run in the 1<sup>st</sup> inning on 6/9 at CLE, snapping a career-high streak of 18.0 consecutive scoreless innings, which began on 5/24 at TB in the 5<sup>th</sup> inning...It is the 3<sup>rd</sup>-longest scoreless streak by an AL starter this season (MIN's Francisco Liriano, 23.0 IP, 4/15-27 and CWS' Jake Peavy, 21.0 IP, 6/11-25) and is the longest scoreless streak by a Sox hurler since Josh Beckett's 18.0-inning run from 8/1-12/09.

► Leads the AL and ranks 4<sup>th</sup> among qualifying Major League hurlers with a 2.00 ERA (18 ER/81.0) during night games this season...Tied for 4<sup>th</sup> in the AL with 16 wins overall since 8/19/09 (16-5)...In that time, Boston has won 20 of his 25 starts.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Leads the AL and ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Majors with a 1.70 ERA (8 ER/42.1 IP) in away games (min. 35.0 IP), going 5-1 in 7 road starts...Ranks tied for 4<sup>th</sup> in the AL with 5 road wins, trailing only NYY's C.C. Sabathia and TB's David Price and James Shields, each with 6.

► Loss at CLE on 6/9 was his 1<sup>st</sup> on the road since 8/8/09 at NYY, snapping a streak of wins in 9 straight road starts from 8/19/09-6/4/10...Posted a ML-best 1.53 road ERA (10 ER/59.0 IP) in that span...Roger Clemens is the only other pitcher in Sox history to win at least 9 straight road starts, doing it 3 times, last from 7/18/92-4/20/93 (9)...Buchholz's is the longest such ML streak since CWS' Jon Garland won 10 straight on the road, 5/17-8/24/06.

**STAYING GROUNDED:** Has produced 139 ground balls compared to 81 fly balls this season for a 1.72 ground ball/fly ball ratio, the 12<sup>th</sup>-best mark in the AL (min. 75.0 IP)...Since his 2009 debut on 7/17, ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the AL with a 64.3 ground ball percentage.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Makes 1<sup>st</sup> start vs. OAK this season...Only other career start vs. OAK came at Fenway on 7/28/09 at Fenway (2 runs in 5.2 innings).

**PREVIOUS START:** Reached double-digit wins for the 1<sup>st</sup> time in his career with 6.2 scoreless frames in 2-0 win over LAD at home on 6/20...Gave up 3 hits and 3 walks with 4 K's...Retired 10 straight beginning with an inning-ending double play in the 3<sup>rd</sup>...Left with 1 on and 2 out in the 7<sup>th</sup>...Daniel Bard (1.1 IP) and Jonathan Papelbon (1.0) combined on the shutout.

► Was his 3<sup>rd</sup> scoreless outing of 6.0+ innings this season (also 7.0 vs. KC on 5/29 and 9.0 at BAL on 6/4), tied for 4<sup>th</sup> most in the AL in 2010...Was his 9<sup>th</sup> quality start this season, tying his career high (also 2009) and T-3<sup>rd</sup> on the team, trailing Jon Lester (13) and John Lackey (12).

► Earned his 40<sup>th</sup> decision at 22-18 in his 50<sup>th</sup> career appearance...Since 1952, Daisuke Matsuzaka is the only other Red Sox to earn at least 40 decisions in his 1<sup>st</sup> 50 Major League appearances, going 26-14 (40) from 2007-08.

**SHUTOUT:** Established a new career high with his 8<sup>th</sup> win of the year in an 11-0 complete game shutout at BAL on 6/4...1 of 14 AL hurlers with a shutout in 2010...Limited the O's to 5 hits and 1 walk with 2 K's on 101 pitches, his fewest in 3 career complete games...Was his 2<sup>nd</sup> career shutout, also a no-hitter vs. BAL at Fenway Park on 9/1/07...His 2 K's were the fewest by a Sox pitcher in a shutout since Danny Darwin on 8/18/93 vs. CWS (2).

**MORE 2010 HIGHLIGHTS:** Defeated ARI on 6/15 at Fenway...Struck out 8 in 5.2 IP and allowing 3 runs on 7 hits and 1 walk...Gave up a run in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2 more in the 4<sup>th</sup>...Left with a 6-3 lead with none on and 2 out in the 6<sup>th</sup> having thrown 113 pitches...4 Sox relievers combined to allow just 1 base runner over the final 3.1 innings...Took the loss on 6/9 at CLE, snapping a career-high streak of 5 straight winning starts...Gave up 3 runs over 7.0 IP.
