WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost four of their last six games but have won 11 of their last 15 and 28 of 37 as they continue a 10-game road trip tonight in Oakland ... left-hander Mark Buehrle. who is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (13 ER/48.1 IP) in his last seven starts, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- During their current 28-9 run, the White Sox have gone from a season-high tying nine games under .500 (24-33) and 9.5 games out of first place to leading the American League Central by 2.0 games over Minnesota and Detroit.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, only one team in baseball history has come back from a bigger first-half deficit to enter the break with a division lead (1973 Cardinals, -11.5).
- Chicago's 25-5 mark to end the first half matched the best record in major-league history in the final 30 games before the break (also 1975 Reds and 1990 Mets).
- The White Sox have used 67 different lineups.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are a major-league best 28-9 since 6/9.
- Sox starters have thrown 20.1 consecutive scoreless IP.
- Chicago is 4-1 in its last five games in Oakland after going 6-28 (.176) in 34 games from 5/18/01-8/15/08.
- Mark Buehrle is 3-12 with a 3.93 ERA (60 ER/137.1 IP) lifetime vs. the A's and 0-6 with a 4.66 ERA (35 ER/67.2 IP) in 12 games (10 starts) at the Coliseum.
- Omar Vizquel needs one hit to pass Luke Appling (2,749) for sole possession of 50th place on the all-time list ... Carlos Quentin is expected to return to the lineup after missing the last three games with a bruised right hand.

WEDNESDAY'S RECAP

- The White Sox failed to hold a one-run, extra-inning lead as the Mariners earned a 2-1 come-from-behind win to avoid the three-game sweep \dots Franklin Gutierrez's two-run single off Bobby Jenks in the 11th inning sent the Sox to their fourth loss
- Sox starter Gavin Floyd tossed 7.0 scoreless IP, and both Sergio Santos (1.1 IP) and Erick Threets (1.2) made a scoreless relief appearance ... Mariners starter Felix Hernadez allowed two hits in 8.0 scoreless IP.
- Omar Vizquel drove in Chicago's lone run with an 11th-inning single off Brandon League.

ON THE TRIP

- The White Sox are 3-4 on this 10-game, 11-day trip to Minnesota (1-3), Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (7/23-25).
- The Sox are hitting .287 (71-247) with a 3.08 ERA (21 ER/61.0 IP) and have outscored their opponents, 31-27.
- Chicago's nine-game winning streak ended with a 7-4 loss on 7/16, the first loss by more than two runs since a 7-2 setback vs. Detroit on 6/8.

VHITE SOX SINCE JUNE 9

- Chicago is 28-9 since 6/9, the best record in baseball.
- During the 28-9 run, the Sox are hitting .288 (358-1,243) with a 2.54 ERA (93 ER/329.0 IP) and a 187-103 edge in runs scored ... they have compiled 11-game (6/15-26) and nine-game (7/4-15) winning streaks and are a combined 12-4 vs. the Angels (4-0). Atlanta (3-0), Detroit (2-0), Texas (2-1) and Minnesota (1-3).

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY MARK!

- Today marks the one-year anniversary of Mark Buehrle throwing the 18th perfect game in major-league history on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay ... Buehrle, who also no-hit Texas on 4/18/07 at U.S. Cellular Field, will be the first pitcher in history to start a game
- exactly one year after tossing a perfect game.

 He has gone 10-15 with a 4.42 ERA (97 ER/197.1 IP) in 32 starts since the perfect game.

STARTING POINT

- Sox starters are 22-7 with a 2.46 ERA (69 ER/252.1 IP) and 32 quality starts in the last 38 games, lowering their season ERA from 5.28 to 4.12 \dots during that span, the rotation has worked at least 7.0 IP 21 times and allowed two runs or less 21 times.

■ White Sox starting pitchers have not allowed a run over their last 20.1 IP, limiting the opposition to a .169 (11-65) average during that span ... the last run a Chicago starter has given up was by Daniel Hudson in the first inning on 7/19 at Seattle.

SOUTHSIDE HITMEN

- The Sox are hitting .305 (197-645) with 36 doubles, 22 home runs and 99 runs scored (5.2/G) in their last 19 games, raising their average from .249 to .260.
- Chicago's .305 average since 6/29 is the best in the majors, ahead of Minnesota (.292) and San Diego (.281)
- Gordon Beckham has gone 18-36 (.500) with five doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and eight runs scored in his last 10 games, raising his average from .205 to .241.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

■ Since the start of the 2003 season, White Sox pitchers lead the major leagues with 668 quality starts ... Mark Buehrle is tied for the most in the majors with 200 quality outings since 2001 (also Houston's Roy Oswalt).

PUTZ-ING ON A SHOW

- J.J. Putz has made 25 consecutive scoreless appearances (24.2 IP), the longest streak in White Sox history ... his careerbest 25.0 consecutive scoreless IP also is the longest active scoreless streak in baseball.
- Putz has limited opponents to a .140 (12-86) average during the streak with just three walks and 26 strikeouts.

HOW THE WEST WAS WON

- The White Sox are 13-8 against the American League West this season, going 5-1 vs. Seattle, 4-2 vs. Los Angeles, and 4-5 vs. Texas.
- Chicago went 15-18 vs. the AL West in 2009.

BAINES ON LEAVE

■ White Sox first base coach Harold Baines will miss 6-8 weeks after undergoing knee replacement surgery on 6/18 ... pre-game instructor Omer Munoz (No. 98) will coach first in his absence.

WHITE SOX VS. A'S

- The White Sox and A's meet for the first time this season Oakland went 5-4 vs. Chicago in 2009, going 4-2 at U.S. Cellular Field and 1-2 at the Coliseum.
- Chicago is 4-1 in its last five games in Oakland after going 6-28 (.176) in 34 games from 5/18/01-8/15/08.
- The Sox hit .248 (77-311) with a 4.20 ERA (40 ER/85.2 IP) last season and were outscored by the A's, 44-34.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 257-278 ... they are 132-132 in Chicago (44-50 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 125-146 at the Coliseum.

BUEHRLE AT A GLANCE

- 31-year-old left-hander makes his 20th start of the season, 11th on the road and first vs. Oakland ... tonight marks the one-year anniversary of his perfect game vs. Tampa Bay ... is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (13 ER/48.1 IP) in his last seven starts, lowering his ERA from 5.40 to 4.18.
- Sox are 10-9 in his starts, winning eight of the last 11 after losing six in a row from 4/16-5/14 ... opponents are hitting .297 (138-464), fifth-highest among American League starters ... has made 11 quality starts, including 11 in a row ... has induced 12 double play grounders ... is averging 6.2 IP and 96.8 pitches per start ... is receiving 4.11 runs of support per 9.0 IP (54 R/118.1 IP), the lowest of his career (4.15 in 2005).
- Is 3-6 with a 4.11 ERA (28 ER/61.1 IP) in nine road starts this season and 62-57 with a 3.93 ERA (444 ER/1.016.2 IP) lifetime ... was 5-4 with a 3.66 ERA (37 ER/91.0 IP) in 14 road starts in 2009.
- Went 4-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 ER/28.0 IP) during interleague play ... led the major leagues in wins and ranked second in ERA behind teammate Gavin Floyd (0.92).
- His 200 quality starts since 2001 rank second in the major leagues, tied with Houston's Roy Oswalt for most in the major leagues ... owns a .577 career winning percentage (143-105).

LAST START

■ Suffered the loss on 7/17 at Minnesota despite registering his 25th career complete game ... allowed three runs on nine hits over 8.0 IP for his 11th quality start and seventh in a row ... gave up all three runs on four hits in the second inning ... did not issue a walk and struck out three ... picked off two runners, the 75th and 76th of his career ... threw 95 pitches (63 strikes) ... Carl Pavano also went the distance for Minnesota in a game lasted 1:52, his eighth career start played in under 2:00.

2010 STARTS OF NOTE

- Made his 200th career quality start on 7/9 vs. Kansas City with 7.0 scoreless IP ... won for the fourth time in five starts on 7/4 at Texas (3 ER/7.0 IP) ... became the first major-league pitcher this season to throw 7.0 IP or more without recording a walk or strikeout
- Won three straight starts from 6/12-23 ... earned first road victory on 6/12 at the Cubs, throwing 6.2 scoreless IP with a season-high seven strikeouts ... made 313th career start on 6/6 vs. Cleveland to move past Ed Walsh into fourth place in franchise history ... allowed a season-high 12 hits on 6/1 vs. Texas.
- Threw 2.1 scoreless IP on 5/26 at Cleveland before being ejected by first-base umpire Joe West for disputing two called balks ... ejection was second career (8/1/05 at Baltimore) ... became first Sox pitcher called for two balks since Scott Radinsky on 6/8/93 vs. Detroit ... ended five-game losing streak on 5/21 vs. Florida with 8.0 scoreless IP ... retired first 13 batters on 5/14 at Kansas City, the 50th time in his career he has set down 10 or more consecutive batters in a start.
- Suffered 100th career loss on 4/27 at Texas ... made eighth career OD start on 4/5 vs. Cleveland, allowing three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.

FIELD YOUR POSITION

- Won his first Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2009, joining Jim Kaat (1974-75) as the only pitchers in White Sox history to win the honor ... became the first Sox winner since third baseman Robin Ventura was honored five times from 1991-98 ... is one of six pitchers in history to throw a no-hitter and win a Gold Glove, joining Bob Gibson, Phil Niekro, Jim Palmer, Kenny Rogers and Bret Saberhagen.
- Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads all major-league pitchers with 72 pickoffs (27 more than Andy Pettitte) and ranks third with 533 total chances and 404 assists.

PERFECTION

■ Threw the 18th perfect game in major-league history and second in White Sox history (first since 1922) on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay ... marked his second career no-hitter (also 4/18/07 vs. Texas) ... perfect game was the first in the majors since Arizona's Randy Johnson on 5/18/04 at Atlanta and the first in the American League since New York's David Cone on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal.

2009 SEASON

■ Set a major-league record by retiring 45 consecutive batters over three starts from 7/18-28 ... recorded 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the ninth consecutive season, the longest active streak in the major leagues ... became the second pitcher in Sox history to record 10 or more wins in at least nine straight seasons, joining Doc White (1903-13) ... made 30-plus starts for the ninth straight season, extending his club record.

SEEING DOUBLE

■ Is one of two pitchers in White Sox history to record 10 or more victories in at least nine consecutive seasons (2001-09), joining Doc White (1903-13) ... he and CC Sabathia are the only active pitchers with at least 10 wins each season from 2001-09.

WORKHORSE

■ Has thrown 2,128.0 IP since the start of the 2001 season, most in the major leagues ... Livan Hernandez (2,094.0) is second, followed by Javier Vazquez (2,045.1), Barry Zito (2,036.2) and CC Sabathia (2,033.2) ... is the only pitcher in baseball to throw at least 200.0 IP in each of the last nine seasons (2001-09) ... also is the only pitcher in Sox history to make 30 or more starts in nine straight seasons ... led the AL in IP in back-to-back seasons in 2004-05, the first Sox pitcher to accomplish the feat since Wilbur Wood in 1972-73.

AMONG THE BEST

■ Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads the major leagues in IP (2,128.0), pickoffs (72) and opponents GIDP (248) and ranks among the leaders in quality starts (2nd, 199), starts (3rd, 317), wins (5th, 139), complete games (T4th, 25), shutouts (T9th, 8) and walks per 9.0 IP (13th, 2.03).

NO WALKING OR RUNNING

■ Has averaged 2.06 walks per 9.0 IP (499 BB/2,179.1 IP) over his career and 2.21 in 2010 ... has issued no walks in 85 of 320 career starts (5-19 in 2010) ... opponents have been successful on just 43 of 103 (41.7 percent) steal attempts and are 3-8 in 2010 ... has picked off 76 runners (MLB-high nine in 2010).

DON'T GO TO THE FRIDGE

■ His 2010 starts have lasted an average of 2:39 ... seven of his career starts have been played in less than 2:00 ... his 1:39 game on 4/16/05 vs. Seattle was the fastest in the majors since 9/30/84 when Atlanta beat San Diego in 1:39 and fastest Sox game since 7/7/75 (1:38).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is a four-time All-Star (2002, 2005-06, '09) ... 200 of his 319 (62.7 percent) career starts have been quality ... ranks among the Sox all-time leaders in strikeouts (5th, 1,239), starts (4th, 319), wins (8th, 143) and IP (2,171.1) ... is one of five pitchers in history to record each of his first 100 wins in a Sox uniform and one of six to record his first 1,000 strikeouts with the Sox.
- Lasted at least 6.0 IP in 49 straight starts from 5/11/04-7/26/05, the longest streak in the majors since Steve Carlton went 69 straight with Philadelphia from 1979-82 ... has retired 10 or more straight batters in a game 50 times (last, 13 on 5/14/10 at Kansas City).
