A's vs. RANGERS

The A's have split the first six games of the 2010 season series...lost two of three meetings in Texas May 11-13 after taking two of three in Oakland May 3-5...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Texas...it was the A's first season series win since 2005...are 61-60 against the Rangers since 2004...the A's are 280-287 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 149-134 in Oakland and 131-153 in Texas, including 64-65 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 377-369 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jack Cust had his seventh career multi-homer game Saturday and now has six home runs over his last 10 games...added three walks Saturday to become the fourth player in Oakland history to walk three times in a multi-homer game (Giambi, McGwire, Jackson) ...has driven in at least one run in nine of his last 11 games (15 RBI

Rajai Davis has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games against the Rangers (19 for 62, .306)...has 13 career RBI vs. Texas, tied for his most against any team (LAA)...he stole his 29th base of the season July 20 and needs one more to become the fifth player in Oakland history with at least two 30-steal seasons.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1956, Hector Lopez and Vic Power have five hits each but the A's lose 10-9 to New York in 14 innings ...in 2008, Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings to extend his career opening scoreless streak to a major league record 27.0 innings, breaking the previous mark of 25 set by George McQuillian of the 1907 Philadelphia Phillies...the streak would reach 39.0 innings before he allowed his first run

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games, nine of the last 11 and 16 of the last 24...Oakland's 16-8 (.667) record since June 25 is second best in the American League behind New York (18-8)...are 50-48 overall and have not been three games over .500 since June 3 (29-26)...have won a season high four consecutive series and have not won more than four in a row since May 27-June 14, 2007 when they won five straight...are tied with Los Angeles for second place in the AL West, trailing Texas by 7½....today marks the first time the A's have held at least a share of second place Sune 4...have spent 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, two days ited for second, 47 days in third and one day in fourth...are 13-19 in the first game of a series, 14-18 in the second game and 20-9 in the third game...had their season high five-game winning streak snapped July 19...went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record, the second consecutive season the A's had a losing record at the break (were 37-49 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Texas (3 games) and Chicago (3 games) tonight...went 3-0 on their last road trip to Kansas City (July 16-18), their first road series sweep of the season....have now won eight of their last 10 road games....the A's were 4-2 on their just completed six-game homestand against Boston (2-1) and Chicago (2-1)...are 30-22 (.577) at home for the season compared to 20-26 (.435) on the road...have a 2.97 ERA (157 er in 475.0 ip) at home compared to a 4.71 ERA (208 er in 397.2 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs at home compared to 63 on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and the second most on the road...starting pitchers are 22-16 with a 3.06 ERA (109 er in 321 ip) at home compared to 14-16 with a 4.48 ERA (131 er in 263.1 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's extended their winning streak in day games to seven Sunday and have not lost a day game since June 23...are 24-10 (.706) during the day, which is the best record in the majors, compared to 26-38 (.406) at night, which is third worst in the majors...have a 2.87 ERA (97 er in 303.2 ip) during the day and a 4.24 ERA (268 er in 569.0 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

IN JULY: The A's are 12-7 (.632) in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the American League behind New York (16-5), Tampa Bay (15-6) and Chicago (14-7)...combined for a 29-49 (.372) record in July over the previous three seasons...the pitching staff has a 2.90 ERA (56 er in 173.2 ip) this month, which is second lowest in the majors behind the White Sox (2.83)...have a .227 (147 for 648) opponents batting average, which is also second lowest (Cincinnati, .210), and have yielded 14 home runs, which is third fewest...the A's offense has 24 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 27).

AGAINST THE BEST: Beginning with the just completed three-game series against Chicago, the A's encounter a 15-game stretch where they will play 12 games against first place teams...also have a three-game set in Chicago next weekend and have a pair of three-game series against Texas...the A's are 26-32 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 24-16 against teams that were below .500.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two earned runs or fewer in six of the last 11 games (29 er in 100 ip, 2.61 ERA), which has lowered the season ERA to 3.76...that is the lowest it has been since it was 3.65 on April 29 and it is second lowest in the American League behind Tampa Bay (3.66)...lead the AL in shutouts (9) and fewest hit batters (18) and rank third in opponents batting average (.247).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in eight of the last 11 games and are 7-2 with a 2.66 ERA (21 er in 7ip) over that span...have a 3.69 ERA (240 er in 585.1 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the AL (Seattle, 3.63)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.245).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs three times in the last 11 games, the last time occurring Saturday vs. the White Sox...did it just once over the first 87 games (4 at Boston, June 3)...have 13 home runs total over that span but just 66 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 109 home runs...have hit fewer than 109 home runs three times in Oakland history in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979).

OFFENSE: The A's are tied for second in the American League with 22 triples, which is one more than the season total from last year...rank second with 32 sacrifice hits, also one more than the season total from last year...have not had more since 1999 when they had 39...rank third lowest in extra base hits (260) and slugging percentage (.287) in the AL, and have scored the fourth fewest runs (418)...have 300 walks and are on pace for 496...have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (12) and are third in batting (.263).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 16 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which leads the majors...have been successful in 81 of 101 (80.2%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the best percentage in the American League and second best in the majors (Philadelphia, 84.4%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 35-15 when stealing a base and are 15-33 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 17 pickoffs (CWS, 20).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in one-run games, which is tied with Chicago (18-12) for second best in the American League behind New York (10-6)...have lost eight of their last 13 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...are 4-5 (.444) in extra inning games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ben Sheets on the disabled list Saturday, marking the 19th time they have used the DL this year...have now used the DL 83 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (86)...the 19 players have combined to miss 791 games (41.6 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at a season high tying 10 (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...the A's are 11-9 (.550) in his starting assignments this year and are 22-22 (.500) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

LAST SIX STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA (11 er in 36.2 ip) over that span...went 1-2 with a 5.65 ERA over his previous five starts.

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Leads the A's with 95 strikeouts but has also issued 56 walks, which is second most in the has League...now American strikeouts and 137 walks in 252.2 career innings for an average of 8.48 strike and 4.88 walks per nine innings.

IN JULY: Is 3-1 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in July...the three wins are tied for fourth in the American League this month and match the best one-month total of his career (May, 2010).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.25 ERA (15 er in 60.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game and a 5.25 ERA (35 er in 60.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has allowed 25 of his 51 runs in the fourth and fifth innings (37.0 ip, 6.08 ERA).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-0 with a 1.99 ERA (9 er in 40.2 ip) and .186 (27 for 145) opponents batting average in six starts during the day and 4-6 with a 4.65 ERA (41 er in 79.1 ip) and .268 (82 for 306) opponents average in 14 starts at night...has the sixth lowest day ERA in the American League.

GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS: Is 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, two starts...is 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA (4 er in 5.0 ip) in two games in Texas and 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 8.2 ip) in two games in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) in his two starts...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 10-1 A's loss at Texas May 12...blanked the Rangers on four hits over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth on a Kinsler RBI double and a balk...vielded a two-run home run to Hamilton with no outs in the fifth and was relieved by Gaudin with the A's trailing 4-0...his one win came in his only outing and start last year on August 4 when he combined with Ziegler, Wuertz and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits while walking three.

RHP Trevor Cahill (9-4, 3.15 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season ... has a streak of 16 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history ... has the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.204), the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.272) and the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.327)... had 10 wins in his rookie season of 2009... the only pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career is Tim Hudson (1999-2000)... was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Chicago last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 0 so)... is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (36.1 ip, 29 h, 10 r, 9 er, 11 bb, 23 so, 4 hr) in six career starts vs. Texas... in his last Texas start, had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 13-inning road win May 11 (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so).
