A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail 4-3 in the season series...including last night's setback, have lost three of four meetings in Texas after taking two of three in Oakland May 3-5...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Texas...it was the A's first season series win since 2005...are 61-61 against the Rangers since 2004...the A's are 280-288 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 149-134 in Oakland and 131-154 in Texas, including 64-66 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 377-370 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jack Cust has hit six home runs over his last 10 games and has driven in at least one run in nine of his last 12 games (15 RBI total).

Rajai Davis has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games against the Rangers (20 for 66, .303)...has 13 career RBI vs. Texas, tied for his most against any team (LAA)....he stole his 29th base of the season July 20 and needs one more to become the fifth player in Oakland history with at least two 30-steal seasons

Kevin Kouzmanoff has hit safely in each of his nine games since the All-Star Break (.324, 12 for 37, 5 runs, 6 doubles, HR, 10 RBI).

Kurt Suzuki is batting .395 (15 for 38) with nine runs scored in his last 10 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1989, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle ...in 2002, Miguel Tejada has six RBI and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2 ...in 2009, Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston... it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games, nine of the last 12 and 16 of the last 25...Oakland's 16-9 (.640) record since June 25 is fourth best in the American League...are 50-49 overall and have been over the .500 mark for three straight games, their longest stretch above .500 since May 26 to June 11 (17 straight games) ...have won a season high four consecutive series and have not won more than four in a row since May 27-June 14, 2007 when they won five straight...are tied with Los Angeles for second place in the AL West, trailing Texas by 8½....it marks the second straight day the A's have held at least a share of second place after being lodged in third from June 4 to July 25...have spent 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 26 days in second, three days tied for second, 47 days in third and one day in fourth...are 13-20 in the first game of a series, 14-18 in the second game and 20-9 in the third game...had their season high five-game winning streak snapped July 19...went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record, the second consecutive season the A's had a losing record at the break (were 37-49 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are playing the second game of a six-game road trip in Texas (0-1, 3 games) and Chicago (3 games) tonight...went 3-0 on their last road trip to Kansas City (July 16-18), their first road series sweep of the season....have now won eight of their last 11 road games....the A's were 4-2 on their just completed six-game homestand against Boston (2-1) and Chicago (2-1)...are 30-22 (.577) at home for the season compared to 20-27 (.426) on the road...have a 2.97 ERA (157 er in 475.0 ip) at home compared to a 4.67 ERA (211 er in 407 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs at home compared to 64 on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and the second most on the road...starting pitchers are 22-16 with a 3.06 ERA (109 er in 321 ip) at home compared to 14-16 with a 4.41 ERA (132 er in 269.1 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's extended their winning streak in day games to seven Sunday and have not lost a day game since June 23...are 24-10 (.706) during the day, which is the best record in the majors, compared to 26-39 (.400) at night, which is tied for fourth worst in the majors...have a 2.87 ERA (97 er in 303.2 ip) during the day and a 4.22 ERA (271 er in 578.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

IN JULY: The A's are 12-8 (.600) in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the AL ...combined for a 29-49 (.372) record in July over the previous three seasons...the pitching staff has a 2.90 ERA (59 er in 183 ip) this month, which is second lowest in the majors behind the White Sox (2.70)...have a .227 (155 for 683) opponents batting average, which is also second lowest (Cincinnati, .212), and have yielded 15 home runs, which is third fewest...the A's offense has 25 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (TB, 31).

AGAINST THE BEST: Beginning with last weekend's three-game series against Chicago, the A's encounter a 15-game stretch where they will play 12 games against first place teams...also have a three-game set in Chicago next weekend and have a pair of three-game series against Texas...the A's are 26-33 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 24-16 against teams that were below .500.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two earned runs or fewer in six of the last 12 games (32 er in 109.1 ip, 2.63 ERA), which has lowered the season ERA to 3.76...that is the lowest it has been since it was 3.65 on April 29 and it is second lowest in the American League behind Tampa Bay (3.65)...tied for the AL lead in shutouts (9), while rank first in fewest hit batters (18) and rank third in opponents batting average (.247).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in nine of the last 12 games and are 7-2 with a 2.57 ERA (22 er in 77.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.67 ERA (241 er in 591.1 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the AL ...have the second lowest opponents batting average (.245).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs three times in the last 12 games, the last time occurring Saturday vs. the White Sox...did it just once over the first 87 games (4 at Boston, June 3)...have 13 home runs total over that span but just 66 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 108 home runs...have hit 108 or fewer home runs three times in Oakland history in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979).

OFFENSE: For the second straight game and 10th game this season, the A's had no extra base hits last night...their 260 extra base hits this year rank second lowest in the American League...also rank second lowest in slugging percentage (.384) and fourth in fewest runs (419) in the AL...are tied for second in the American League with 22 triples, which is one more than the season total from last year...rank second with 33 sacrifice hits, which is two more than last year's season total ...have not had more since 1999 when they had 39...have 300 walks and are on pace for 491...have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (12) and are fourth in batting (.254).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 17 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, tied with Tampa Bay for most in the majors...have been successful in 82 of 102 (80.4%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the best percentage in the American League and second best in the majors (Philadelphia, 83.3%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 35-16 when stealing a base and are 15-33 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 17 pickoffs (CWS, 20).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in one-run games, which is tied with Chicago (18-12) for second best in the American League behind New York (10-6)...have lost eight of their last 13 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...with last night's 10-inning loss, they are 4-6 (.444) in extra inning games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ben Sheets on the disabled list Saturday, marking the 19th time they have used the DL this year...have now used the DL 83 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (86)...the 19 players have combined to miss 801 games (42.2 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at a season high tying 10 (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season...the A's are 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments this year and are 28-21 (.571) in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times

SIX HITS OR FEWER: Allowed seven hits in his first start this year but has allowed six hits or fewer in each start since then...has a streak of 16 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...the previous best was 14 by Barry Zito (May 17-July 25, 2005)...according to baseball-reference.com it is the third longest such streak by a major league pitcher since 1920...the longest is a 20-game streak by Nolan Ryan (California) from July 27,

1972-April 18, 1973 and the second longest is a 17-game streak by Mike Scott (Houston) from May 21-August 8, 1986.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.204), the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.272) and the sixth lowest slugging percentage (.335)...is tied for seventh in winning percentage (.692) and ranks 10th in ERA (3.15).

BRIEFLY: Is 1-2 with a 4.39 ERA (13 er in 26.2 ip) and .188 (18 for 96) opponents batting average over his last four starts...that comes on the heels of a career high seven-game winning streak that spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 1...posted a 2.12 ERA and allowed a .194 opponents batting average during the winning streak...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA and .244 opponents average over his first four starts

WINS: Is tied for the team lead with nine wins, all of which have come since the start of May...had 10 wins in his rookie season of 2009...the only pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career is Tim Hudson (1999-2000)...only seven players have done it in franchise history (Hudson, Jim Nash, Bob Hooper, Lefty Grove, Weldon Henley, Chief Bender and Eddie Plank)...his 19 career wins are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher before his 23^{rd} birthday.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .194 (37 for 191) batting average, which is the second lowest mark in the American League...opponents are

batting .176 (19 for 108) with five walks (.212 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are third lowest in the AL...has yielded a .156 (21 for 135) batting average the first time through the lineup, .210 (29 for 138) the second time through and .252 (29 for 115) after that...his mark the first time through the lineup is fourth lowest in the AL...the opponents three through five hitters are batting a combined .164 (22 for 134).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-1 with a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts against American League West teams and 6-3 with a 3.79 ERA in 12 starts against everyone else...is now 7-5 with 2.55 ERA (28 er in 98.2 ip) in 16 career starts against divisional foes and 12-12 with a 4.87 ERA against the rest of baseball.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed two grand slams over his last four starts (Rodriguez, July 6 and Betancourt, July 17) after allowing no grand slams over the first 45 starts of his career...has now allowed 11 home runs in 108.2 innings this year (0.91 per nine innings) after allowing 27 in 178.2 innings last year (1.36 per nine innings)...set an Oakland rookie record for home runs last year...has allowed nine of his 11 home runs this year on the road...last year, he surrendered 20 home runs at home to set a Coliseum record...nine of his 11 home runs have been hit by right-handers after yielding 21 of his 27 home runs in 2009 to lefties.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed a first inning run July 1 at Baltimore, snapping a 15-start stretch dating back to last year where he did not allow a run in the first inning...has a 0.53 ERA (1 er in 17.0 ip) and .096 (5 for 52) opp. batting avg. in the first frame in 2010 and has a 1.84 (10 er in 49.0 ip) career ERA in the first.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 4-1 with a 1.60 ERA (7 er in 39.1 ip) in six starts during the day and 5-3 with a 4.02 ERA (31 er in 69.1 ip) in 11 starts at night...has the lowest day ERA of any starter in the American League.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento April 30 and allowed eight runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings in a start that day at Toronto...then went 4-1 with a 1.96 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in six starts in May and 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in five starts in June...ranked fourth in the American League in ERA in May, tied for fifth in wins and tied for seventh in opponents batting...was eighth in opponents batting in June...is 3-1 with a 3.74 ERA (14 er in 33.2 ip) and .183 (22 for 117) opponents batting average over his first five starts in July.

THIS AND THAT: Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula and made one rehab start before he was optioned to the minors...was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (8.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 8 so) and .226 (7 for 31) opponents batting average in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 30...was named to his first American League All-Star team but was ineligible to pitch as he started on the Sunday before the game...was the youngest Athletic to be named to an All-Star team since Ben Grieve in 1998 and is the second youngest Oakland pitcher to Vida Blue in 1971.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Chicago last Friday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 innings and did not strike out a batter, his first career start of five or more innings without a strikeout...allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the first and two more runs in the sixth on a fielders choice and a ground out...Buehrle tossed a complete game four-hitter and did not walk a batter.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (36.1 ip, 29 h, 10 r, 9 er, 11 bb, 23 so, 4 hr) in six career starts...is 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in Texas and 3-1 with a 2.66 ERA (7 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year...the win came in a 4-1 victory on May 5 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on four hits and three walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead entering the sixth, when they bullpen allowed an inherited runner to score...then had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 13-inning win in Texas on May 11...allowed a RBI single to Young in the third and a solo home run to Murphy in the fourth...the A's scored twice in the fifth to tie the game and he was relieved by Blevins after 5.2 innings with the score tied at 2-2.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
