ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last seven games, 10 of the last 13 and 17 of the last 26...Oakland's 17-9 (.654) record since June 25 is fourth best in the American League behind the Yankees, Rays and White Sox...are 51-49 overall and have been over the .500 mark for four straight games, their longest stretch above .500 since May 26 to June 11 (17 straight games) ...have won a season high four consecutive series and have not won more than four in a row since May 27-June 14, 2007 when they won five straight...perched in second place in the AL West, trailing Texas by 7½....it marks the third straight day the A's have held at least a share of second place after being lodged in third from June 4 to July 25...have spent 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 27 days in second, three days tied for second, 47 days in third and one day in fourth...are 13-20 in the first game of a series, 15-18 in the second game and 20-9 in the third game...had their season high five-game winning streak snapped July 19...went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record, the second consecutive season the A's had a losing record at the break (were 37-49 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are playing the third game of a six-game road trip in Texas (1-1, 3 games) and Chicago (3 games) tonight...have now won nine of their last 12 road games...the A's were 4-2 on their last homestand against Boston (2-1) and Chicago (2-1) July 19-25...are 30-22 (.577) at home for the season compared to 21-27 (.437) on the road...have a 2.97 ERA (157 er in 475.0 ip) at home compared to a 4.56 ERA (211 er in 416 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs at home compared to 64 on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and the second most on the road...starting pitchers are 22-16 with a 3.06 ERA (109 er in 321 ip) at home compared to 15-16 with a 4.28 ERA (132 er in 277.1 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's extended their winning streak in day games to seven Sunday and have not lost a day game since June 23...are 24-10 (.706) during the day, which is the best record in the majors, compared to 27-39 (.409) at night, which is seventh worst in the majors (fourth worst in the AL)...have a 2.87 ERA (97 er in 303.2 ip) during the day and a 4.15 ERA (271 er in 587.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

IN JULY: The A's are 13-8 (.619) in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the AL ...have clinched their best July record since 2005, when they went 20-6, and their first winning July since 2006 (14-13)...combined for a 29-49 (.372) record in July over the previous three seasons...the pitching staff has a 2.77 ERA (59 er in 192 ip) this month, which is the lowest in the majors...have a .223 (159 for 713) opponents batting average, which is also second lowest in the majors (Cincinnati, .213), and have yielded 15 home runs, which is third fewest...the A's offense has 28 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (TB, 33).

AGAINST THE BEST: Beginning with last weekend's three-game series against Chicago, the A's encounter a 15-game stretch where they will play 12 games against first place teams...also have a three-game set in Chicago this weekend and have a pair of three-game series against Texas...the A's are 27-33 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 24-16 against teams that were below .500.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two earned runs or fewer in seven of the last 13 games (32 er in 118.1 ip, 2.43 ERA), which has lowered the season ERA to 3.72...that is the lowest it has been since it was 3.65 on April 29 and it is second lowest in the American League behind Tampa Bay (3.65)...tied for the AL lead in shutouts (9), while rank first in fewest hit batters (18) and rank third in opponents batting average (.246).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 10 of the last 13 games and are 8-2 with a 2.33 ERA (22 er in 85.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.62 ERA (241 er in 599.1 ip) and .243 opponents batting average for the season, both the lowest figures in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs three times in the last 13 games, the last time occurring Saturday vs. the White Sox...did it just once over the first 87 games (4 at Boston, June 3)...have 14 home runs total over that span but just 67 for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 108 home runs...have hit 108 or fewer home runs three times in Oakland history in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979).

OFFENSE: Oakland has managed only 262 extra base hits this year, tied for second fewest in the American League...also rank second lowest in slugging percentage (.384) and fourth lowest in runs (422) in the AL...however, are tied for second in the American League with 22 triples, which is one more than the season total from last year...rank second with 34 sacrifice hits, which is three more than last year's season total ...have not had more since 1999 when they had 39...have 302 walks and are on pace for 489...have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (12) and are fourth in batting (.254).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 20 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, most in the majors...have been successful in 85 of 106 (80.2%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the best percentage in the American League and second best in the majors (Philadelphia, 83.3%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 36-16 when stealing a base and are 15-33 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 17 pickoffs (CWS, 20).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in one-run games, which is third best in the American League behind New York (10-6) and Chicago (19-12)...have lost eight of their last 13 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...with Tuesday night's 10-inning loss, they are 4-6 (.444) in extra inning games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ben Sheets on the disabled list Saturday, marking the 19th time they have used the DL this year...have now used the DL 83 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (86)...the 19 players have combined to miss 811 games (42.7 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at a season high tying 10 (Anderson, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year.

A's vs. RANGERS

With last night's 3-1 win, the A's have pulled even at 4-4 in the season series... have lost three of five meetings in Texas after taking two of three in Oakland May 3-5...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Texas...it was the A's first season series win since 2005...are 62-61 against the Rangers since 2004...the A's are 281-288 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 149-134 in Oakland and 132-154 in Texas, including 65-66 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 378-370 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jack Cust is batting .326 (14 for 43) with six home runs and 15 RBI in his last 13 games... also has hit six homers in his last 11 games.

Rajai Davis stole his 30th base last night, thus becoming only the fifth player in Oakland history with at least two 30-steal seasons (Henderson 13 times, Campaneris 8, North 4 and C. Washington 2)...has also hit safely in 16 of his last 17 games against the Rangers (23 for 70, .329) and has 13 career RBI vs. Texas, tied for his most against any team (LAA).

Kurt Suzuki is batting .405 (17 for 42) with 11 RBI and 11 runs scored in his last 11 games...also ranks second among AL catchers in home runs (12) and is third in RBI (44) despite missing 19 games on the DL and bereavement lists.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1969, Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees. He would go on to hit 47 home runs, a record that stood for 18 years ...in 1992, Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd consecutive game to set a major league record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th appearance and 11th start of the season...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and 12-15 (.444) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.12 ERA (8 er in 34.0 ip) and .202 (24 for 119) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the winning streak is a career high and he has allowed three runs or fewer in each start...now has six wins for the season, which surpasses his total of four from his rookie season last year.

BRIEFLY: Replaced the injured Brett Anderson in the starting rotation June 8 and is 5-2 with a 2.84 ERA (18 er in 57.0 ip) and .226 (47 for 208) opponents batting average in eight starts since then...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 1-1 with a 2.59 ERA in five games, four starts, when the A's called for the first time on May 4...started that night against Texas, had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...went 2-0 with a 4.15 ERA in two more starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland May 20...went 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) in three relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 5-2 with a 3.30 ERA (22 er in 60.0 ip) and .224 (49 for 219) opponents batting average in 10 starts and 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) and .409 (18 for 44) opponents average in three relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two home runs over his last six starts (41.0 ip) after yielding seven over his first seven games (29.1 ip)...eight of his nine home runs have come with runners on base...four have been hit by the opponents cleanup hitter...has allowed a .288 (30 for 104) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .250 (24 for 96) the second time through and .206 (13 for 63) after that...has yielded a .362 (34 for 94) batting average and seven of his nine home runs against the opponents two through four hitters and has a .195 (33 for 169) mark against everyone else.

SIX INNINGS OR LESS: Tossed 7.0 innings June 23 against Cincinnati, snapping an Oakland record streak of 19 consecutive starts with 6.0 innings pitched or fewer...broke the previous mark of 14 held by five pitchers, most recently by Kirk Saarloos from July 19, 2004 to June 11, 2005...has now tossed seven or more innings in four of his last six starts.

IN RELIEF: Tossed 5.0 innings of relief against Detroit May 20 in the first relief appearance of his career after 19 starts...it is the longest outing by an A's reliever this year...his second outing also came against Detroit on May 30 and he pitched the final two innings of the A's 10-2 loss...allowed five unearned runs in the eighth inning...tossed 3.1 innings of relief June 3 at Boston after Brett Anderson left the game following the second inning with an injury and was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-8 win...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...struck out two of his first batters faced and walked the other.

2010 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Texas on **May 4** in Oakland...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on just one hit, a Guerrero grand slam...left with a 5-4 lead but tossed just 4.0 innings...the 3.0 innings pitched matched his fewest as a starter...picked up the win in the A's 10-1 victory over Los Angeles on **June 8** in Oakland...had his two-game winning streak snapped in the A's 6-2 loss at San Francisco **June 13**...allowed a career high tying two home runs and they came back-to-back in the sixth inning by Huff and Uribe...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at St. Louis **June 18**...allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the first and RBI singles to Holliday and Pujols in the fifth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Cincinnati **June 23**...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Bruce two-run single but then shutout the Reds on four hits and a hit batter over his final six innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win at Baltimore **June 29**...issued a career high six walks in 6.0 innings but allowed just three hits and one run...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-1 win at Cleveland **July 4**...tossed a career high 111 pitches in 7.1 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third inning on three consecutive singles by Santana, Hafner and Kearns...retired 13 of the next 14 hitters...had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss to Los Angeles on **July 9** in Oakland...left after seven innings with the score tied 3-3...extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 9-6 victory at Kansas City **July 18**...tossed a career high 7.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Butler in the first inning, but that was the only run he allowed...blanked the Royals on five hits and a walk over his final 6.2 innings and left with a 6-1 lead...the bullpen allowed five runs in the ninth.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to four games in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first inning, but he allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second inning...he then retired 14 of the last 16 hitters he faced, yielding lead off walks to Castro in the fifth and Rios in the sixth.

MAZZARO vs. TEXAS: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 7-6 A's win on May 4 of this year in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first and three times in the second to take a 5-0 lead but he allowed four runs in the third inning on just one hit, a Guerrero grand slam...issued three walks in the inning and was relieved by Breslow after walking the leadoff batter in the fourth inning...left with a 5-4 lead.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA in seven games, six starts, with the River Cats...allowed two home runs in 37.1 innings...opponents hit .245, including .204 (11 for 54) by left-handed hitters and .270 (24 for 89) by right-handers...yielded a .200 (8 for 40) mark with runners in scoring position...allowed six of his 16 runs in the first inning for a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) and .360 (9 for 25) opponents batting average...had a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) and .220 (26 for 118) opponents average from the second inning on.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (2-1, 2.35 ERA): Is expected to be reinstated from the disabled list tomorrow to make his seventh start of the season ... has two stints on the disabled list this year, both due to a sore left elbow.... was first placed on the disabled list prior to Opening Day, then reinstated May 29...went 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL June 4 with left elbow inflammation... is 10-5 with a 2.82 ERA (43 er in 137.0 ip), .237 (122 for 515) opponents batting average and seven home runs in his 23 starts since June 29, 2009.... had a 2.96 ERA from June 29 through the end of the 2009 season, which was fourth best in the AL behind Lester (2.35), Greinke (2.37) and Hernandez (2.44)... tossed just 2.0 innings in the A's 9-8 win at Boston in his last start June 3, leaving the game with left elbow soreness and returning to the DL the next day... is 1-0 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts vs. the White Sox, both last year

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 23 of the past 28 games and has a 2.81 ERA (23 er in 73.2 ip) over that span...has posted a 2.25 ERA in 20 games in July (56.1 ip, 44 h, 18 r, 15 er, 22 bb, 53 so)...ranks second in the American League in losses (17), is tied for second in home runs allowed (38), tied for third in strikeouts (256), tied for fourth in wins (14) and is sixth in innings pitched (291.2)...has 33 save opportunities this season, which is the third fewest in the AL...has a 2.82 ERA (48 er in 153.1 ip) at home compared to a 5.13 ERA (79 er in 138.2 ip) on the road...allowed a season-high four home runs May 12 at Texas, their most in a game since May 25, 2006 when they also allowed four at Texas.

- Earned his 45th career save July 17, which moved him past Billy Koch and Keith Foulke for seventh place on the Oakland career list...now has 46 saves.
- Has not allowed a run in 13 of his past 15 appearances (1.10 ERA, 2 er in 16.1 ip)...has a 1.56 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest among American League relievers.
- Has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) in Oakland and a 2.08 ERA (4 er in 17.1 ip) on the road.
- Has yielded a .154 (6 for 39) batting average with runners in scoring position.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA and three saves (three blown saves) in 14 career appearances against the Rangers (15.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 11 so).
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time...entered the game in the seventh inning with a runner on second and two outs...walked Furcal but then struck out Phillips to end the inning.
