A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's lead the season series, 2-1, after winning two of three in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year, 5-4...lost two of three in Oakland but won four of six in Chicago in 2009...have won the season series seven times over the previous nine years and are 53-28 (.654) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season...that is the best record by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 280-258 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 148-126 in Oakland and 132-132 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 957-1013 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jack Cust is batting .323 (14 for 43) with six home runs and 15 RBI in his last 13 games... also has hit six homers in his last 11 games.

Rajai Davis stole his 30th base Wednesday night in Texas, thus becoming only the fifth player in Oakland history with at least two 30-steal seasons (Henderson 13 times, Campaneris 8, North 4 and C. Washington 2)...he now has 32 steals, which ranks third in the American League.

Adam Rosales is hitting .327 (18 for 55) with 11 runs scored and nine RBI in his last 17 games.

Kurt Suzuki is batting .370 (17 for 46) with 10 RBI and nine runs scored in his last 12 games...also ranks second among AL catchers in home runs (12) and is third in RBI (44) despite missing 19 games on the DL and bereavement lists.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1901, Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier ...in 2000, Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last eight games, 10 of the last 14 and 17 of the last 27...Oakland's 17-10 (.630) record since June 25 is fourth best in the American League behind the Yankees, Rays and White Sox...are 51-50 overall, 8-4 since the All-Star Break and have been over the .500 mark for five straight games, their longest stretch above .500 since May 26 to June 11 (17 straight games) ...dropping two of three in the just-completed Texas series snapped a string of winning a season high four consecutive series...are perched in second place in the AL West, trailing Texas by 8½....it marks the fourth straight day the A's have held at least a share of second place after being lodged in third from June 4 to July 25...have spent 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 28 days in second, three days tied for second, 47 days in third and one day in fourth...are 13-20 in the first game of a series, 15-18 in the second game and 20-10 in the third game...had their season high five-game winning streak snapped July 19...went into the All-Star Break with a 43-46 record, the second consecutive season the A's had a losing record at the break (were 37-49 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are playing the fourth game of a six-game road trip in Texas (1-2) and Chicago (3 games) tonight...have won nine of their last 13 road games....the A's were 4-2 on their last homestand against Boston (2-1) and Chicago (2-1) July 19-25...are 30-22 (.577) at home this season compared to 21-28 (.429) on the road...have a 2.97 ERA (157 er in 475.0 ip) at home compared to a 4.63 ERA (218 er in 424 ip) on the road...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 34 home runs at home compared to 66 on the road...have yielded the fewest home runs at home in the AL and the second most on the road...starting pitchers are 22-16 with a 3.06 ERA (109 er in 321 ip) at home compared to 15-17 with a 4.43 ERA (139 er in 282.2 ip) on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's extended their winning streak in day games to seven Sunday and have not lost a day game since June 23...are 24-10 (.706) during the day, which is the best record in the majors, compared to 27-40 (.403) at night, which is seventh worst in the majors (fourth worst in the AL)...have a 2.87 ERA (97 er in 303.2 ip) during the day and a 4.20 ERA (278 er in 595.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

IN JULY: The A's are 13-9 (.591) in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the AL ...have clinched their best July record since 2005, when they went 20-6, and their first winning July since 2006 (14-13)...combined for a 29-49 (.372) record in July over the previous three seasons...the pitching staff has a 2.97 ERA (66 er in 200 ip) this month, second lowest in the majors (CWS, 2.90)...have a .231 opponents batting average, also second lowest in the majors (Cincinnati, .213), and have yielded 17 home runs, which is tied for third fewest...the A's offense has 30 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (TB, 33).

AGAINST THE BEST: Beginning with last weekend's three-game series against Chicago, the A's encounter a 15-game stretch where they will play 12 games against first place teams...have a three-game set in Chicago this weekend and have a pair of three-game series against Texas during this span...the A's are 27-34 against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 24-16 against teams that were below .500.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two earned runs or fewer in seven of the last 14 games (39 er in 126.1 ip, 2.78 ERA), which has lowered the season ERA to 3.75—second lowest in the American League behind Tampa Bay (3.63)...tied with the White Sox for the AL lead in shutouts (9), while rank first in fewest hit batters (19) and rank third in opponents batting average (.247).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 10 of the last 14 games and are 8-3 with a 2.89 ERA (29 er in 90.1 ip) over that span...have a 3.69 ERA (248 er in 604.2 ip) this season, tops in the American League...their.246 opponents batting average ranks second in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs three times in the last 14 games, the last time occurring Saturday vs. the White Sox...did it just once over the first 87 games (4 at Boston, June 3)...have 14 home runs total over that span but just 67 for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 107 home runs...have hit 108 or fewer home runs three times in Oakland history in a non-strike season (94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979).

OFFENSE: Oakland has managed only 266 extra base hits this year, third fewest in the American League...also rank fourth lowest in slugging percentage (.385) and runs (426) in the AL...however, are tied for third in the American League with 22 triples, which is one more than the season total from last year...rank second with 34 sacrifice hits, which is three more than last year's season total ...have not had more since 1999 when they had 39...have 305 walks and are on pace for 489...have walked fewer than 500 times in a non-strike season just three times in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (12) and are fourth in batting (.250).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 22 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, most in the majors...have been successful in 87 of 109 (79.8%) stolen base attempts for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (TB, 80.1%) and third best in the majors (Philadelphia, 83.8%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...have a record of 36-17 when stealing a base and are 15-33 with no stolen bases...the A's pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 17 pickoffs (CWS, 20).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-10 (.600) in one-run games, which is third best in the American League behind New York (10-6) and Chicago (19-12)...have lost eight of their last 13 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...with Tuesday night's 3-1, 10-inning loss at Texas, they are 4-6 (.444) in extra inning games.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Andrew Bailey on the disabled list today, marking the 20th time they have used the DL this year...have now used the DL 84 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (87)...the 20 players have combined to miss 828 games (41.4 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at season-high tying 10 (Bailey, Buck, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since April 21 and at least five on the DL all year...have not had fewer than five players on the DL since April 28 of last year when they had four...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of 2006 (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, his first since being reinstated from the disabled list today...the A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 17-19 (.472) in his career starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in three of his six starts this year, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer in all six starts.

ANDERSON'S 2010 STARTS WITH OAKLAND

THE DISABLED LIST: Has two stints on the disabled list this year, both due to his left elbow...was placed on the 15-day DL the first time April 27 retroactive to April 25 with a left elbow inflammation and proximal medial forearm strain...it was his first

career stint on the disabled list...made one rehab start with Triple-A Sacramento May 24 against Nashville and tossed 3.0 innings in the River Cats 8-3 win...was reinstated May 29 and went 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL June 4 with a left elbow inflammation...posted a 3.00 ERA in two rehab starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and went 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA (4 er, 10.1 ip) in two starts with Triple-A Sacramento for a 1-0 record and a 3.31 ERA (6 er, 16.1 ip) in four starts overall during his second rehab

assignment...struck out nine, walked one and allowed four hits in 5.1 scoreless innings at Tacoma Sunday in his last rehab start with Sacramento, a no-decision in a 3-2 Rivercats' loss.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in 30.2 innings pitched this year at the major league level nor 19.1 innings pitched in the minors.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .212 (21 for 99) batting average while lefties are hitting .350 (7 for 20)...opponents are batting .194 (6 for 31) when leading off an inning.

LAST 23, FIRST 13: Is 10-5 with a 2.82 ERA (43 er in 137.0 ip), .237 (122 for 515) opponents batting average and seven home runs in his 23 starts since June 29, 2009...went 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs allowed over the first 13 starts of his career through June 20 of last year...had a 2.96 ERA from June 29 through the end of the 2009 season, which was fourth best in the AL behind Lester (2.35), Greinke (2.37) and Hernandez (2.44).

SEASON-OPENING SCORELESS STREAK: Allowed three runs in the third inning April 18, snapping his season-opening scoreless streak at 14.0 innings...that was the third longest season-opening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...did not allow a run in his first two starts to become the first starting pitcher in Oakland history, among pitchers who began the season with the A's, to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...Vin Mazzaro (2009) and Ron Darling (1991) did not allow a run in their first two starts in their respective seasons, but they did not start the year with the A's...the last A's pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts and a 21.0 inning scoreless streak.

FIRST WILD PITCH: Was charged with the first wild pitch of his career in the sixth inning April 13 at Seattle, snapping a career-opening streak of 31 starts and 186.1 innings without a wild pitch...the streak of 31 consecutive starts without a wild pitch was sixth longest in Oakland history by a starter...it was the longest since Barry Zito had a streak of 38 starts from July 2, 2002 to July 13, 2003.

LONG-TERM CONTRACT: Agreed to terms on a four-year contract through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015 on April 16...the 2015 season would be Anderson's first possible season in which he would be eligible for free agency.

2010 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, the A's 6-2 win over Seattle *April 8* in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings, scattering three hits and a walk...retired 10 consecutive batters before allowing a Figgins single and a Gutierrez walk to start the seventh inning...was relieved by Chad Gaudin who retired the next three betters...the bullpen allowed two runs in the ninth...did not allow a run for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss at Seattle *April 13*...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed six hits and two walks...the Mariners were 0 for 6 with four strikeouts with runners in scoring position off him as he stranded nine base runners in his six innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Baltimore *April 18*...retired each of the first eight batters he faced before the Orioles scored three times with two outs in the third inning on a two-run double by Wigginton and a RBI single by Markakis...also allowed a RBI single to Montanez in the fourth and a two-run double to Reimold in the fifth and left after six innings, trailing 6-2...had a no decision in the A's 6-1 loss to Cleveland on *April 24* in Oakland...shutout the Indians on one hit and one walk over the first five innings before allowing his only run in the sixth inning on a Choo RBI single...Carmona limited the A's to a run in 7.1 innings and Anderson left after six innings with the score tied at 1-1...the bullpen then allowed two runs in the eighth and three in the ninth for the loss...combined with Ziegler and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Detroit *May* 29...tossed 5.2 innings and left after 70 pitches in his first start after his rehab assignment...yielded three of the hits and did not walk a batter.

LAST START: He tossed just 2.0 innings in the A's 9-8 win at Boston on June 3...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the first and a Hall scored on a Scutaro ground out in the second...left the game early with left elbow soreness and returned to the DL the next day.

ANDERSON vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-0 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the win came at Chicago on June 4 when he combined with Wuertz and Casilla on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings, yielded three of the hits and allowed only one base runner as far as third base...then had a no decision in in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss in Oakland August 14...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Dye RBI single and a Rios sacrifice fly, and four more in the second inning on a two-run home run by Castro and a two-run single by Dye...that gave the White Sox a 6-0 lead but the A's scored five times in the fourth and twice in the fifth to take a 7-6 lead...he put runners on first and second to start the sixth inning and the A's bullpen allowed one of the runs to score to tie the game.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dallas Braden (5-7, 3.77 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, his third since coming off the disabled list July 20... has tossed six or more innings in 13 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked one batter or fewer 14 times... halted a personal five-game losing streak in his last start Sunday, earning his fifth win of the season in a 6-4 verdict over the White Sox at Oakland (6.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)... prior to that win, he had posted a 0-5 mark with a 4.10 ERA (52.2 ip, 69 h, 30 r, 24 er, 10 bb, 36 so, 6 hr) and .319 (69 for 216) opponents batting average over his previous nine starts since tossing his perfect game May 9... however, had received just 12 runs of support over that nine-game span (2.05 RSA)... has run support this season of 3.17 (37 rs in 105.0 ip), which is the second lowest figure in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors... is 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA in two career starts vs. the White Sox.

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 24 of the past 29 games and has a 2.71 ERA (23 er in 76.1 ip) over that span...has posted a 2.29 ERA in 21 games in July (59.0 ip, 46 h, 18 r, 15 er, 22 bb, 54 so)...ranks second in the American League in losses (17), is tied for second in home runs allowed (38), is fourth in strikeouts (260), tied for fifth in wins (14) and is sixth in innings pitched (294.1)...has 33 save opportunities this season, which is the third fewest in the AL...has a 2.82 ERA (48 er in 153.1 ip) at home compared to a 5.03 ERA (79 er in 141.1 ip) on the road.
