WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the Mariners 6-0 last night to take that series, as club is 3-3 on this 9-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Seattle (2-1), and Oakland (3 games)...Texas has won 2 straight, 6 of 10, 8 of 13 and 11 of 17, and is 13-7 (.650) since All-Star break, T2nd-best record in A.L. and T3rd-best in majors since break...loss on Sunday snapped stretch of 4 straight series wins, although Texas has still won 6 of last 8, series and are 14-4-0 in last 18 series overall...club has won 30 of 47 beginning June 12 and 49 of 80 since May 6...**club's 58-36 (.617) record beginning April 22 is best in majors...**at 63-45 (.583), the Rangers have the 3rd-best overall record in the A.L. and 4th-best in the majors...**current record is 2nd-best in team history after 108 games.**

ON TOP: Texas enters tonight with an 8.5-game lead over second-place Oakland in the A.L. West, matching largest lead all season...Rangers have the largest division lead in baseball, 6.5 games better than any other division leader, as no other team has a lead larger than 2.0 games...this is the 4th day to have an 8.5-game lead in 2010, all in the last 10 days, largest since Oct. 2, 1999...this is just the 3rd season in Rangers history for the club to have lead as large as 8.5 games, also 1996 (+9.0 GA) and 1999 (+10.0 GA)...have led by at least 7.5 games for 11 straight days...Rangers have had sole possession of first for 59 straight days and have spent 95 total days in first this season (5th-most in a season in club history).

HIGH WATER: Rangers enter tonight at season-high 18 games above .500 for the 4th time in 2010...high water mark in 2009 was 19 games twice: after wins both Sept. 9 at CLE (79-60) and Sept. 13 vs. SEA-G1 (80-61)...this is just the 6th season in club history to reach as many as 18 games over .500 at some point in a campaign...this is just the 13th time since 1999 for the club to be at least 18 games over, other instances coming in 2004 (3) and 2009 (6).

TAKE THE UNDER: The Rangers and A's enter tonight ranking 1-2 in the majors in ERA since the All-Star break...since the break, Texas has lowered its season ERA from 3.97 to 3.79, which is the club's 3rd-lowest figure at any point since May 13 (3.57)...only 2 instances since May 13 in which it was lower came after games July 28 and 29 (3.78).

AGENT ZERO: The Rangers posted club's 5th shutout of the season last night, 2nd against the Mariners (also April 30 at Seattle)...4 of the 5 shutouts have come on the road...the Rangers had 2 shutouts before the break (both in April), among the lowest totals in the majors...since the break, Rangers' 3 blankings are among most in the majors, 2nd-most in the A.L. behind only Minnesota (4).

ANOTHER WIN: Tommy Hunter recorded his 9th win of the season last night, this despite not making his first start until June 5...his 9 wins since the beginning of June are tied with C.C. Sabathia for most in the majors in that span, and his 9-1 (.900) record in that stretch is the best of any big league starter with at least 5 decisions.

LEE AGAIN: Cliff Lee lost his last start on Sunday at LA of Anaheim despite his career-high 7th complete game...Lee has thrown at least 8.0 innings in each of his first 5 starts with Texas, taking a pair of complete-game losses...he is averaging 1.66 runs of support per 9 innings with Texas, as the Rangers offense has scored 8 total runs in those 5 games, 3-or-less in all 5...Lee averaged 5.30 runs of support per 9 in his 13 starts with Seattle...Lee's 7 complete games rank 2nd in the majors behind only Philadelphia's Roy Halladay (8)...he has also taken no decisions in 2 games with Texas in which he threw 9.0 innings...Lee has 9 consecutive outings of at least 8.0 innings, the longest run by any pitcher since Toronto's Pat Hentgen had a 12-game 8.0-inning streak in 1996 on his way to a Cy Young Award.

WORKING THE COUNT: Elvis Andrus had 2 hits last night...as a leadoff batter this season, Andrus has averaged more pitches per plate appearance than any other A.L. player, 2nd behind only Arizona's Kelly Johnson among major league leadoff men.

LARGE IN THE MARGIN: With last night's 6-0 win, the Rangers out-scored Seattle by a 19-9 margin in the 3-game series...Texas has now out-scored opponents by a season-high 100-run margin, 3rd-best figure in the majors...that current 100-run margin would be the 3rd-highest mark in franchise history...only years with a run margin better than 1999's +86 figure were 1996 (+129) and 1977 (+110).

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have won 7 of last 9 road series since the beginning of June, with only series losses in that span coming in Anaheim...club's 27-24 (.529) road record is 4th-best in A.L. and 5th-best in majors in '10...Rangers have won 17 of last 24 away from home, going 19-9 beginning June 1, this after starting 2010 8-15 on the road.

BAY AREA: The Rangers begin a 3-game trip-ending series with the A's tonight...Rangers are 5-4 vs. Oakland this season, 1-2 at the Coliseum...Texas has won 4 of last 5 overall, including taking 2 of 3 last week July 27-29 in Arlington...Texas has gone 7-14 vs. Athletics beginning May 31, 2009...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 288-282 overall, but A's lead 149-134 in Oakland...the club is 5-8 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08.

MISCELLANEOUS: Rangers are in a stretch of 16 straight vs. West (8-5), having gone 22-12 (.647) against the West in 2010, including 8-7 on the road...Texas staff enters tonight having tossed 12.0 consecutive scoreless innings, 3.0 IP shy of the season best done 3 times (15.0)...Neftali Feliz retired all 3 batters faced last night to lower road opponents average to .077, lowest among any ML pitcher with at least 10.0 road innings...David Murphy has 2 go-ahead homers in the 5th inning or later in the past 2 games...the Texas bullpen has just one loss since the All-Star break, having won each of last 3 decisions.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Cliff Lee, LHP (9-5, 2.51)

TONIGHT: The 31-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 19th start and appearance of the season in tonight's series opener here in the Bay Area...will be making his 6th start in a Texas uniform on regular 4 days' rest, as he took a CG 4-1 loss on Sunday at Angel Stadium...has received an avg. of just 1.66 runs of support as a Ranger...Texas offense has plated 2 runs-or-less in 4 of his 5 starts, including exactly one run 3 times...has still won 5 of 7 and 8 of his last 11 decisions, going 5-2, 2.18 (19 ER/78.1 IP) over his last 9 starts to drop season figure from 2.88 to 2.51, best in A.L....needs one win to reach 100 for his career...career .635 winning pct. (99-57) ranks 5th among active pitchers behind only Santana (.663), Hudson (.658), Halladay (.657), and Pettitte (.637).

THE TRADE: Was acquired in July 9 trade from Seattle along with RHP Mark Lowe in exchange for 1B Justin Smoak and minor league players RHP Blake Beavan, RHP Josh Lueke, and INF Matt Lawson...was scheduled to pitch for M's that night vs. NYY in Seattle, but made Texas debut the next night (Sat., 7/10) vs. Baltimore in Arlington...was traded for the 4th time in his career, 3rd time since July 29, 2009.

LEAGUE LEADER: Leads A.L. in ERA (2.51) and CG (7), while his .222 opp. avg. ranks 9th in league...leads majors in opponents OBP (.239), runners per 9 innings (8.33), walks per 9 (0.55), and pitches per inning (13.3)...batters swing at first pitch 37.9% of the time, highest figure in majors...opponents' .572 OPS is 2nd-lowest in A.L. behind A's Cahill (.569) and 3rd-lowest in majors, behind Padres' Latos (.562)...opponents' .333 slugging pct. ranks 7th in A.L....batters put 22.7% of his pitches into play, 7th-highest in A.L.

RARE RATIO: Has 118 strikeouts against just 9 walks (2 IBB), for a ML-best 13.11 SO/BB ratio...that ratio is almost double the next-closest in 2010 (Halladay-7.52), and would easily be a major league record for a season among qualifying pitchers in the modern era (since 1900)...no other pitcher has ever averaged better than 11.00 strikeouts per walk for a full campaign...has not issued a walk to a left-handed batter in regular season since free pass to Adam Dunn (on 3-2 pitch) Sept. 15, 2009 vs. Washington in Philly, span of 138 plate appearances by LH batters without a walk against Lee.

LAST START: Took a 4-1 CG loss on Sunday at Angel Stadium (8.0 IP, 9 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB-1 IBB, 4 SO, 110 pitches-73 strikes), as both losses with Texas have come in CG efforts...allowed 4 of 9 hits during Angels' 2-run 1st inning...issued 2 walks (one intentional) for just 2nd time all season, both in 8th inning, incl. his first unintentional free pass as a Ranger...had faced 159 batters in a Texas uniform w/o an unintentional walk before Callaspo drew one-out walk in 8th...Jered Weaver gave up one unearned run in 7.0 IP (7 K's).

VS. OAKLAND: Has gone 4-2, 2.26 (17 ER/67.2 IP) in 11 career games versus Oakland, including 4-2, 2.33 (17 ER/65.2 IP) in 10 starts...8 of his 10 starts vs. Oakland have been quality starts, including each of his last 5 (2-1, 1.77 ERA, 7 ER/35.2 IP)...no HR allowed in his last 30.2 IP vs. A's (4+ starts)...is 1-1, 4.67 (9 ER/17.1 IP) in 3 career games/starts at the Oakland Coliseum, but has not pitched here since earning that lone win on April 6, 2008 with Cleveland...allowed just one unearned run to the A's over 9.0 innings on July 27 at RBIA in his lone start against the A's this season, taking no decision in a 10-inning, 3-1 Texas win (Nelson Cruz walk-off 2-run HR)...set career high with 13 K's to match Jamie Moyer's club record (4/8/89) for single-game K's by a left-hander, most by any Texas pitcher since Aaron Sele had 13 on Aug. 12, 1999 vs. Detroit, which was only other time in past 17 seasons (1994-2010) for a Ranger to have 13-or-more K's...was also just the 3rd outing ever by a Texas pitcher of 13-or-more K's and no walks, joining a pair of Nolan Ryan efforts.

ON ROAD: Slated for his 10th road start of the year, going 5-3, 2.45 (20 ER/73.1 IP) in 9 previous outings...his 2.45 road ERA is best in the A.L. and 3rd-lowest in the majors behind Gallardo (2.01) and Jimenez (2.23)...has issued 8 of his 9 walks this season on the road...has not lost consecutive road starts since dropping 2 straight July 6 & 21, 2007...in fact, there are just 3 stretches in Lee's career during which he has lost consecutive road outings, also: 3 straight in 2007 (5/23, 5/28 & 6/8) and 2 straight in 2004 (8/17 & 9/2).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Lee worked 9.0 innings in each of his first 2 starts for Texas, the first pitcher in club history to debut with 2 outings of 9.0-or-more frames...Lee became the first ML pitcher to work at least 9.0 innings in his first 2 outings with a team and not record a win in either game since Milwaukee's Bill Parsons had a pair of 9-inning CG losses, April 13 and 18, 1971...Lee has tossed 9.0 frames in 3 of his 5 Texas outings, first Ranger with 3 starts of 9.0+ IP in a season since Aaron Sele and Rick Helling (3 each) did it in 1998.

COMPLETE-LEE CLIFF: Has set a new career high with 7 complete games this season, most in the A.L. and 2nd in the majors behind only Roy Halladay, who has 8 CG for the Phillies...Lee became just the 3rd pitcher in the last 11 seasons with as many as 6 CG's at the All-Star break, joining Mark Mulder in 2003 (7) and Halladay in 2008 and 2010 (7 each)...6 of Lee's CG's have come in his last 11 starts, tossing 9.0 IP in 2 other starts in that span that were not CG...tossed 3 consecutive CG's June 18 vs. Cincinnati, June 23 vs. Chicago-NL, and June 29 at New York-AL to become the first pitcher in the majors with 3 straight CG's since C.C. Sabathia for Milwaukee in 2008.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Lee has thrown at least 8.0 innings in 9 consecutive starts, longest such streak since Toronto's Pat Hentgen had run of 12 straight from July 28-Sept. 24, 1996 on his way to a Cy Young Award...is longest such streak by a lefty since 15 straight by the Yankees' Ron Guidry in 1983...has 2-walks-or-less in each of those 9 straight 8.0+ inning starts, longest such streak in majors since Oakland's Rick Langford (10) in 1979...Lee went 8.1+ frames in each of his first 4 starts with Texas, longest such stretch by a Ranger since Charlie Hough did it in 6 straight starts, June 2-29, 1988.

ALL-STAR: Was selected to the 2010 A.L. All-Star roster via player voting (2nd career selection-started '08 Classic) and pitched a scoreless 4th inning in A.L.'s 3-1 loss July 13 in Anaheim...needed just 6 pitches (5 strikes) to retire Martin Prado (groundout), Albert Pujols (strikeout) and Ryan Howard (groundout)...now has 3.0 SHO IP in 2 All-Star appearances.

JUNE HONORS: Was named A.L. Pitcher of the Month for June after going 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA (10 ER/51.0 IP) in 6 starts...was his 3rd career monthly award, also earning the honor in both April and August of 2008 with Cleveland...became the first pitcher in the majors to record at least 4 complete game victories in a single month since Roy Halladay had 5 in September of 2003.

2010 NOTES: Has worked at least 7.0 innings in 17 of his 18 outings this season, going 8.0-or-more 14 times...has tossed at least 9.0 IP in 7 games in '10, 2nd-most in majors (Halladay-8)...teams have gone 11-7 in his starts...has received just 6 total runs of support in his 5 defeats in '10...With Texas: Team is 2-3 in his starts...Molina has caught 3 of his 5 starts, with both of Lee's losses coming in 2 non-Molina starts...made Rangers debut July 10 vs. Baltimore, one day after being acquired, and took a 6-1 CG loss (9.0 IP, 9 H, 6 R-ER)...was the first CG in a Texas debut since John Burkett (CG SHO) on Aug. 11, 1996 at Toronto...since STATS Inc. began tracking pitch counts in 1988, his 95 pitches marked fewest for a pitcher while allowing 5-or-more runs in a 9-inning CG...Lee allowed 4 of the 6 runs on a season-high 3 home runs (Markakis, Jones, Izturis)...took ND in 2nd start on July 17 at Boston despite being one out from CG win in Rangers' eventual 3-2, 11-inning defeat (9.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER)...was first opponent to throw at least 9.0 inn. at Fenway and not earn a win since Seattle's Tim Belcher June 4, 1995 (ND)...earned first Texas victory and won 5th consecutive start vs. Angels on July 22 at RBIA (2 ER/8.1 IP) opposite Jered Weaver...With Seattle: Acquired by Seattle from Philadelphia on Dec. 16, 2009 in exchange for RHP Philippe Aumont, OF Tyson Gillies, and RHP J.C. Ramirez...Mariners went 9-4 in his 13 starts...Seattle offense provided Lee with a 5.30 run support avg., but combined for just 4 total runs of support in his 3 losses...threw 7.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 8 SO) in no decision in season debut April 30 vs. Texas, a 2-0 Rangers win in 12 innings...only 4th pitcher in M's history to string together 3 consecutive starts without a walk (did it twice, first 3 starts and also 4 straight, June 7-23)...opened the season without allowing a walk in 22.1 consecutive innings...streak was snapped in first inning May 16 at TB...recorded 9 consecutive outs via strikeout between 3rd & 6th innings in start May 28 at LAA (non-consecutive batters)...matched career high with 11 K's in final start for M's on July 4 at Detroit...only run allowed came in first inning, as Tigers were 0-for-final-12 with RISP in that game...won final 4 starts for M's.

INJURIES IN 2010: Had surgery on his left foot on Feb. 5 to remove a loose body (a spur that broke loose from its attachment)...surgery was performed by Dr. Bryan Burke in Little Rock...he returned to baseball activities in early March...made his first spring appearance March 10...suffered a right lower abdominal strain in next appearance, March 15 vs. Arizona in Tucson, game in which he was ejected...did not pitch again during spring training...on the 15-day DL from March 26-April 29, one rehab start with Tacoma (AAA) on April 25 vs. Salt Lake (6.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R).

CY STUFF: Lee won the 2008 American League Cy Young Award with Cleveland after going 22-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 31 starts...with his July 10 start, he became just the 4th pitcher to appear for Texas after having won the award, joining Gaylord Perry, Ferguson Jenkins, and Sparky Lyle.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER - RHP Rich Harden (4-3, 5.25 in 14 games/starts)

The 28-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 15th start and appearance of the season tomorrow afternoon in the middle game of a 3-game set against the A's here in the Bay Area...returned from the disabled list prior to his last start on July 31 and earned the victory in a 2-1 Texas win at LA of Anaheim (7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 88 pitches/62 strikes)...completed 7.0 innings for the 2nd time this season on his 3rd-lowest pitch count of the year...both of the Texas runs came on a Vladimir Guerrero 2-run home run off Harden's former Oakland teammate Dan Haren...carried a no-hitter into the 6th inning in his May 3 start against the Athletics here in Oakland, earning the victory in a 4-2 Texas win...was first career start against Oakland, who Harden compiled a 36-19 record with a 3.42 ERA over 6 major league seasons (2003-08)...will be making 3rd straight and 9th overall road start of 2010, as he has gone 3-2, 6.12 (29 ER/42.2 IP) through 8 outings thus far...currently has the 4th-lowest ERA at Oakland-Alameda County Stadium among pitchers with at least 45 starts, going 19-9, 2.94 (97 ER/297.0 IP) in 48 starts...made 4 rehab starts with Triple-A Oklahoma City before rejoining the club prior to his last start, going 0-2, 5.19 (10 ER/17.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts against just 5 walks.
