WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's 5-1 in last night's series opener...club has won 3 straight, matching longest win streak of 2nd "half" (also July 18-20...last longer win streak was season-high 11 straight, June 12-24, 2nd-longest win streak in team history...club is 4-3 on this 9-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Seattle (2-1), and Oakland (1-0)...Texas has won 7 of 11, 9 of 14 and 12 of 18, and is **14-7 (.667) since All-Star break, 2nd-best record in majors since break** behind only Minnesota (15-7, .682)...Texas has won 6 of last 8, series and are 14-4-0 in last 18 series overall...club has won 31 of 48 beginning June 12 and 50 of 81 since May 6...**club's 59-36 (.621) record beginning April 22 is best in majors...**at 64-45 (.587), the Rangers have the **3rd-best overall record in both the A.L. and majors...**current record is **2nd-best in team history after 109 games.**

RARE LEAD: Texas enters tonight with a **season-high 9.5-game lead** over second-place Oakland in the A.L. West...**this marks just the 2nd day in club history to have a lead as large as 9.5 games, as the only other time the Rangers held a lead of this size was a franchise-best 10.0-game advantage through Sept. 30, 1999...**Texas could at least match, and possibly surpass that mark with a win today...Rangers have the largest division lead in baseball, a full 8.0 games better than any other division leader, as no other team has a lead larger than 1.5 games...have led by at least 7.5 games for 12 straight days...Rangers have had sole possession of first for 60 straight days and have spent 96 total days in first this season (5th-most in a season in club history).

HIGH WATER: Rangers enter today at **season-high 19 games above .500** for the first time in 2010...high water mark in 2009 was 19 games twice: after wins both Sept. 9 at Cleveland (79-60) and Sept. 13 vs. Seattle-G1 (80-61)...this is just the 5th season in club history to reach as many as 19 games over .500 at some point in a campaign...the others: 1999 (31 over), 1977 (26), 1996 (22), and 2009 (19)...this is just the 3rd time since 1999 for the club to be at least 19 games over, the other 2 instances coming last year.

LAST, NOT LEAST: Taylor Teagarden contributed to 3 of the Rangers' 5 runs, doubling and scoring with 2 outs in the 3rd to tie the game, then hitting a 2-run homer in the 5th to extend a 2-1 lead at that point...it was the 2nd home run in a span of 3 starts for Teagarden, who has more home runs over the past 9 days than Josh Hamilton, Vladimir Guerrero, or Nelson Cruz (one HR each).

Teagarden's performance extended a season-long trend for Rangers no. 9 batters...Texas 9-hole batters lead the majors with a .282 average and .328 on-base pct. this season, ranking 3rd in slugging (.392) behind only the White Sox (.416) and Blue Jays (.398)...oddly enough, the .282 average ranks as the 4th-highest for any slot in the Texas lineup, trailing only 2-hole (.299), cleanup (.304) and 5th slot (.344).

O.K. AT PLATE: Texas batters have 5-or-more runs in 3 straight (3-0), batting .297 (33-111) in those 3 contests to rise from .275 to .276...it marks the first time for Texas to score 5+ runs in 3 consecutive games since doing so in 4 straight, June 26-30.

THE ROOKIE: Neftali Feliz has 29 saves this season, tied for 6th-most among rookies in baseball history (since saves became official in 1969)...Feliz has converted 20 consecutive save chances, the 2nd-longest saves streak in club history (Cordero - 21 straight in 2004) and tied for the 2nd-longest such streak ever by a MLB rookie behind Andrew Bailey's 21 straight in 2009 (single-season streaks only).

BROKEN RECORD: Cliff Lee tossed 8.0 innings for a 10th straight game last night and did not issue a walk...he has still allowed only one unintentional walk over 51.1 innings and 195 batters faced in a Texas uniform...Lee's 10 straight games of 8.0-or-more innings are the most by any pitcher since Toronto's Pat Hentgen had a 12-game run in 1996 on his way to the Cy Young Award...Lee's current streak is just the 5th double-digit games string of 8.0+ innings in the last 26 years (beginning 1985)...**the current streak is the longest by any left-hander in 27 years, since Yankees' Ron Guidry had 15 straight from July 18-Sept. 29, 1983...**Lee has gone at least 8.0 innings in each of his first 6 outings with Texas, the longest streak at any point by any Ranger since Bobby Witt had 12-in-a-row from July 10-Sept. 9, 1988.

QUICK 100: Lee improved his career record to 100-57 with his win last night...according to Elias Sports Bureau, only 5 active pitchers reached 100 wins in as few decisions as Lee: Tim Hudson (100-45), Roy Oswalt (100-47), Johan Santana (100-47), Roy Halladay (100-50) and Andy Pettitte (100-54).

PITCHING IN: Texas pitchers have allowed a total of one run over the past 2 games (18.0 innings)...the bullpen's current 3.14 ERA is lowest all season, and ranks 2nd in the A.L., right behind Tampa Bay (3.12)...overall staff's current 3.76 ERA ranks 3rd in the league, and is lowest in nearly 3 months since May 13 (3.57)...some Rangers perspective on current pitching figures:

- The current 3.76 team ERA would be the lowest by a Texas staff since leading the A.L. with a club-record 3.31 mark in 1983, the only year the Rangers have ever pulled that trick...would be first sub-4.00 figure since 1990 (3.83)...would be 7th-lowest ERA in team history.
- Team's current .244 opponents average, which ranks 2nd in A.L. behind Tampa Bay (.240), would be lowest since 1989 (club-record .239).
- Relievers' current 3.14 ERA would be Rangers' lowest since 1981 (2.91), and would be the 5th-lowest in team history...bullpen's .232 opponents average ranks 2nd in A.L. and would be 3rd-lowest in franchise history (including the Washington years) behind only 1979 (.225) and 1981 (.230).
- Rotation's 4.08 ERA would be lowest since 1992 (3.91), which would make it lowest since moving into Rangers Ballpark in 1994.

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have won 7 of last 9 road series since the beginning of June, with only series losses in that span coming in Anaheim...club's 28-24 (.538) road record is 4th-best in A.L. and 5th-best in majors in '10...this marks 2nd time this season for Rangers to be 4 games above .500 away from Arlington...last time to be 5 games over on the road in a season?: Sept. 5, 2006 (37-32)...Rangers have won 3 straight and 18 of last 25 away from home, going 20-9 beginning June 1, this after starting 2010 8-15 on the road.

BAY AREA: The Rangers are 6-4 vs. Oakland this season, 2-2 at the Coliseum...Texas has won 5 of last 6 overall, including taking 2 of 3 last week July 27-29 in Arlington...Texas has gone 8-14 vs. Athletics beginning May 31, 2009...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 289-282 overall, but A's lead 149-135 in Oakland...the club is 6-8 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08.

GO WEST: Rangers are in a stretch of 16 straight vs. West (9-5), having gone 23-12 (.657) against the West in 2010, including 9-7 on the road...Texas owns the best intradivision record in baseball.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER**#40 Rich Harden, RHP**
(4-3, 5.25)

TODAY: The 28-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 15th start and appearance of the season this afternoon in the middle game of a 3-game set against the A's here in the Bay Area...returned from the disabled list prior to his last start and earned the victory on July 31 in a 2-1 Texas win at LA of Anaheim...completed 7.0 innings for the 2nd time this season on his 3rd-lowest pitch count of the year...carried a no-hitter into the 6th inning in his May 3 start against the Athletics here in Oakland, earning the victory in a 4-2 Texas win...currently has the 4th-lowest ERA at this ballpark among pitchers with at least 45 starts, going 19-9, 2.94 (97 ER/297.0 IP) in 48 starts...made 4 rehab starts with Triple-A Oklahoma City before rejoining the club prior to his last start, going 0-2, 5.19 (10 ER/17.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts against just 5 walks.

AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY STADIUM: Has gone 19-9 with a 2.91 ERA (97 ER/300.0 IP) in 50 career games at this venue, including 19-9, 2.94 (97 ER/297.0 IP) in 48 starts...Harden's 2.91 career ERA at this ballpark is the 4th-lowest among pitchers with at least 45 starts in the facility, behind Catfish Hunter (2.39 in 140 starts)...is slated to make his 50th start at this facility, T20th-most...Harden's lifetime .213 (233-1093) opponents average ranks T6th with Catfish Hunter all-time among qualifiers...ironically, Nolan Ryan has the lowest all-time mark at .197...Harden has tossed 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings over his last 2 starts at this ballpark, dating back to his final start with Oakland on June 26, 2008 vs. Philadelphia...the right-hander has also won 3 straight decisions here over his last 8 starts, dating back to the start of the 2008 season.

VS. OAKLAND: Earned the victory on May 13 in his first career start against the Athletics (7.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R-ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 0 HR, 108 pitches/77 strikes)...carried a no-hit bid into the 6th inning before a one-out double by Rajai Davis...an Eric Chavez single in the 7th inning was the only other hit allowed by Harden...is the only start this season in which he has not walked a batter and is the 9th walk-free game in 141 career starts...is still one of 6 starts with 7-or-more innings pitched and 9-or-more strikeouts by a Texas pitcher this season, but just the 8th such instance since 2000.

WITH OAKLAND: Was selected by Oakland in the 17th round of the 2000 June draft...spent the better part of his first 8 professional seasons with the A's before a July trade sent him to the Chicago Cubs prior to that club's playoff run in 2008...in 6 major league seasons with Oakland (2003-08), Harden compiled a 36-19 record with a 3.42 ERA (206 ER/541.2 IP) over 97 games, going 36-19, 3.48 (205 ER/530.2 IP) in 89 starts.

ON THE ROAD: Scheduled to make his 3rd straight and 9th overall road start of 2010, as he has gone 3-2, 6.12 (29 ER/42.2 IP) through 8 outings thus far...bulk of the ERA comes from May 14 at Toronto and June 11 at Milwaukee, combining to allow 13 runs over 8.2 innings in those starts...tossed 7.0 shutout innings with 9 strikeouts in on May 3 at Oakland, his longest and lone scoreless outing in 2010...over the last 3 seasons (2008-10), Harden has gone 14-6 with a 3.22 ERA (60 ER/167.2 IP) over 29 road starts, which currently stands as the 9th-lowest road ERA in the majors during that span (min. 25 road starts)...has the 2nd-lowest opponents average on the road over last 3 seasons at .216 (133-615).

LAST START: Returned from the disabled list and earned the victory on July 31 in a 2-1 Texas win at LA of Anaheim (7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 88 pitches/62 strikes)...completed 7.0 innings for the 2nd time this season on his 3rd-lowest pitch count of the year...both of the Texas runs came on a Vladimir Guerrero 2-run home run off Harden's former Oakland teammate Dan Haren...surrendered a solo home run to Howie Kendrick for the Halos' lone run.

REHAB: Made 4 rehab starts with Triple-A Oklahoma City, recovering from a left gluteal muscle strain...was 0-2, 5.19 (10 ER/17.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts against just 5 walks in 4 starts with Oklahoma City...posted a quality start in final rehab start on July 26 at Memphis (6.0 IP, 2 H, 2R-0 ER, 1 BB, 10 SO, 0 HR, 96 pitches/67 strikes)...recorded 9 strikeouts in 3rd rehab start with the RedHawks, taking the loss on July 21 at Iowa (5.0 IP, 7 H, 6 R-ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 2 HR, 88 pitches/62 strikes)...suffered the loss in 2nd rehab start on July 16 against Iowa at Bricktown (3.2 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 67 pitches/41 strikes)...made first rehab start on July 11 at Round Rock (2.2 IP, 1 H, 0 R-ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 0 HR, 48 pitches/28 strikes).

2010 NOTES: Team is 9-5 in his 14 starts...owns a 41-0 record when receiving at least 4 runs of support in a start, but has received 3 runs-or-less in 10 of his 14 starts this season...has thrown at least 5.0 innings in 10 of 14 outings, including 8 of last 9 before landing on DL...lead A.L. with 40 walks at time of injury and his 45 walks overall still rank 25th on the circuit...has allowed at least one home run in 10 of 14 outings, 15 total HR...his home ERA (3.99) is over 2 runs lower than his road figure (6.12)...has reached the 100-pitch plateau in 6 of 14 starts, throwing less than 90 pitches on 3 occasions, of which 2 have been victories, including his last start.

OTHER STARTS: Made Texas debut in club's 2nd game of the season, a 7-4 loss on April 7 vs. Toronto...permitted solo HR to Alex Gonzalez to lead off 3rd inning, only hit allowed...in total, he recorded 8 strikeouts with 5 walks over 3.2 innings, becoming just 2nd Texas pitcher in the last 14 seasons (1997-2010) to combine for at least 5 walks and at least 8 strikeouts in an outing (also John Thomson in CG win on May 18, 2003 at New York-AL...took no decision in club's 4-2, 10-inning win on April 12 at Cleveland, Tribe's home opener...gave up 2-out, first-inning solo HR to Shin-Soo Choo...beginning with final out of first inning, retired 14 of 17 faced until Choo's one-out single in the 6th...Nelson Cruz won game with 2-run HR in 10th...suffered first loss in a 5-2 defeat on April 18 at Yankee Stadium, logging just 3.2 innings for the 2nd time this season (4 ER)...gave up a solo HR to Mark Teixeira to lead off the 3rd...as a last minute replacement for Scott Feldman (stomach virus), Harden had his scheduled start moved up one day and took the mound on April 23 vs. Detroit (2 ER/4.1 IP)...did not factor into the decision, despite exiting with a 3-2 lead...both runs allowed came on Miguel Cabrera's 2-run single in the 5th...Elvis Andrus' bases-loaded walk-off single in 9th gave Texas a 5-4 win...earned first Texas win in club's 6-5 victory on April 28 vs. Chicago-AL, tossing season-low 87 pitches in quality start...bested Jake Peavy, allowing only a Carlos Quentin 3-run HR in the 6th...earned no decision in Rangers 3-2 win on May 9 vs. KC (2 ER/5.0 IP), despite CG loss by Gil Meche...allowed season-high 7 runs and 6 walks over season-low 2.2 IP on May 14 at Toronto, taking no decision in 16-10 defeat...became just 3rd Canadian Ranger to start for Texas in his native country (also Fergie Jenkins and Aaron Myette)...took no decision in walk-off win May 19 vs. Baltimore...all 8 hits allowed were singles...exited trailing 2-1, but game should have been tied following a Josh Hamilton "double" that cleared the wall but was not reviewed by umpires...in no decision May 25 at KC, was staked to a 6-3 lead entering the 6th inning, but recorded just one out in that frame in eventual 8-7 Texas win...earned 3rd win in matchup with Mark Buehrle on June 1 at CWS...allowed a career-high 4 home runs in 6-2 loss on June 11 in Milwaukee...placed on disabled list next day with left gluteal muscle strain...returned from DL on July 31 at LAA, earning the win in a 2-1 Texas victory, allowing one run over 7.0 innings of work.

AT THE TURN: The 9th place hitter in opponent's batting orders are hitting.407 (11-27) with one home run and 10 RBI against Harden, while the 1st and 2nd hitters in the order are batting a combined .118 (8-68)...the 10 RBI by the 9-hole hitter is more than any other spot in the line-up.
