WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's 6-2 yesterday to even this series entering today's rubber games series and road trip finale...the loss snapped Rangers' 3-game win streak...club is 4-4 on this 9-game, 10-day road trip to Anaheim (1-2), Seattle (2-1), and Oakland (1-1)...Texas has won 7 of 12, 9 of 15, and 12 of 19, and is 14-8 (.636) since All-Star break, 3rd-best record in A.L. and T5th-best in majors since break...Texas has won 6 of last 8, series and are 14-4-0 in last 18 series overall...club has won 31 of 49 beginning June 12 and 50 of 82 since May 6...club's **59-37 (.615) record beginning April 22 is best in majors...**at 64-46 (.582), the Rangers have the **3rd-best overall record in both the A.L. and majors...**current record is **2nd-best in team history after 110 games...**team was season-high 19 games above .500 after win on Friday, just 3rd time since 1999 for club to be at least 19 over (also twice in 2009).

WITH A WIN TODAY, the Rangers could:

- Secure a winning road trip at 5-4...it would make 3 straight winning road trips (multiple cities only).
- Match season high at 19 games above .500 (also after Friday's win).
- Improve to 15-4-0 in last 19 series, 8-2-0 in last 10 road series.

STILL ON TOP: Texas enters today with an 8.5-game lead in the A.L. West over second-place Oakland...club had a season-high 9.5-game lead after Friday's win, which was the 2nd-largest division lead in Rangers history (+10.0 GA through Sept. 30, 1999...Rangers have the largest division lead in baseball, 6.5 games better than any other division leader, as no other team has a lead larger than 2.0 games...have led by at least 7.5 games for 13 straight days...Rangers have had sole possession of first for 61 straight days and have spent 97 total days in first this season (5th-most in a season in club history).

LONG RELIEF: Bay Area native Scott Feldman tossed 4.2 innings in relief yesterday, the longest relief outing by a Texas pitcher in over a year since Dustin Nippert's 4.2 innings on July 26, 2009 at Kansas City...prior to Nippert, last time a Texas pitcher had at least 4.2 relief innings was Kameron Loe, 5.0 IP on Aug. 17, 2008 vs. Tampa Bay...Feldman's effort is tied for the 8th-longest relief outing in the majors this season.

THE LONG BALL: The Rangers have homered in 4 straight for the first time since July 6-9...the 4-game homer streak on the road matches longest away from home all year, also done June 16-19 at Florida and Houston.

STILL GOING: The Rangers scored single runs in the 8th and 9th innings yesterday to avoid a shutout...although the current streak has been threatened of late, Rangers have still not been shut out in 73 consecutive games, the longest such streak in the majors this season...it is also the 4th-longest streak in team history...Rangers have been shut out a major league-low one time in 2010, every other team has been blanked at least 3 times.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: While the Rangers scored at least 5 runs in each contest during the 3-game win streak from Wednesday through Thursday, there is still a large separation between the club's output at home and on the road...club is batting .292 (570-1950) in home games, .257 (480-1866) on the road...team has higher OBP (.359 vs. .320) and slugging (.458 vs. .383) at home than on road, and has averaged far more runs per game (5.46 vs. 4.51) and home runs per game (1.21 vs. 0.81) in Arlington.

BEAR DOWN: The Rangers lost yesterday despite holding Oakland to 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position...Texas is among the best in the majors at holding teams down with runners in scoring position, ranking 2nd in the A.L. and 3rd in the majors...today's starter, Colby Lewis, holds batters to a .169 average with RISP, 4th-best in the league...Cliff Lee (10th, .221) and C.J. Wilson (11th, .222) also rank among the league's best in opponents average with RISP.

TOP DOWN: The top 3 hitters in the Texas order yesterday, Elvis Andrus, Michael Young, and Josh Hamilton, went a combined 0-for-11 with a walk...it was just the 3rd time all season for the Rangers to go hitless in the top 3 spots in the batting order...to find the other 2, you have to go all the way back to the 2nd and 3rd games of the season, against Toronto on April 7-8 in Arlington...Julio Borbon and Young resided in the top 2 spots for both of those games...Hamilton hit 3rd in the first game, but Ryan Garko (0-3) hit 3rd in the second contest, and Chris Davis went 0-for-1 after entering the game in that slot...Rangers are 0-3 in the 3 contests this season in which the top 3 spots go hitless.

RUBBER SOUL: Texas will play a rubber game for a 4th consecutive series here today...team has gone 2-1 in the first 3 of those rubber games and is 6-6 in such contests this season, 2-3 on the road in '10...Rangers are also 18-17 in series finales this season, 7-10 on the road.

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have won 7 of last 9 road series since the beginning of June, with only series losses in that span coming in Anaheim...would need a win today to keep that streak alive...club's 28-25 (.528) road record is 4th-best in A.L. and 6th-best in majors in '10...club matched season high at 4 games above .500 in road games with Friday's win, 2nd time all year...seeking to climb to 4-over on the road again with a win today...Rangers have won 3 of 4 and 18 of last 26 away from home, going 20-10 beginning June 1, this after starting 2010 8-15 on the road.

BAY AREA: The Rangers are 6-5 vs. Oakland this season, 2-3 at the Coliseum...Texas has won 5 of last 7 overall, including taking 2 of 3 last week July 27-29 in Arlington...Texas has gone 8-15 vs. Athletics beginning May 31, 2009...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 289-283 overall, but A's lead 150-135 in Oakland...the club is 6-9 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of 2009 after going 21-20 from 2005-08.

GO WEST: Rangers end a stretch of 16 straight vs. West (9-6) here today, having gone 23-13 (.639) against the West in 2010, including 9-8 on the road.

YANKEES NEXT: The Rangers are scheduled to fly back to Texas following today's game and have an off day tomorrow...team begins a brief 2-game set against the Yankees on Tuesday in Arlington, first of 5 home games vs. New York the rest of the way (also 3 games, Sept. 10-12)...Rangers dropped all 3 games against the Yankees this season, all in New York April 16-18...club has gone 4-15 vs. Yankees in Arlington beginning 2005, including 1-2 last year at home...the Rangers have 24 home games remaining and 5 are against the Yankees (20.8%), the only opponent to still have 2 visits remaining before the end of the home slate.

THE ROOKIE: Neftali Feliz has 29 saves this season, tied for 6th-most among rookies in baseball history (since saves became official in 1969)...Feliz has converted 20 consecutive save chances, the 2nd-longest saves streak in club history (Cordero - 21 straight in 2004) and tied for the 2nd-longest such streak ever by a MLB rookie behind Andrew Bailey's 21 straight in 2009 (single-season streaks only)...the All-Star has a 1.37 road ERA (3 ER/19.2 IP) this season, having gone 15-for-15 in road save chances, while holding opponents to a .077 (5-65) road average with just one extra-base hit (HR).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#48 Colby Lewis, RHP
(9-8, 3.45)

TONIGHT: The 31-year-old right-hander, who celebrated his birthday on Monday, is scheduled to make his 22nd start and appearance in today's series and road trip finale...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest after taking loss in series opener on Tuesday at Seattle...at 9-8, he will be seeking his 10th win for a 4th straight start, as he has dropped 3 consecutive starts since earning win no. 9, with Rangers scoring one or 2 runs in each of those 3 starts...the 10 wins would tie C.J. Wilson for the staff lead...had career-high 10 wins in 2003...is 0-3 last 3 starts despite a 3.60 ERA (8 ER/20.0 IP)...still 5-4, 3.27 (24 ER/66.0 IP) last 10 starts beginning June 8 to drop season figure from 3.62 to 3.45.

LEWIS ON THE LEADERBOARD: Ranks among A.L. leaders in strikeouts-per-9 (5th, 8.89), strikeouts (7th, 134), and ERA (18th, 3.45)...has the 9th-highest percentage of swings that miss in the A.L. at 23.0%...also ranks 7th in A.L. with 108.0 pitches-per-game...leads all Rangers in strikeouts, while ranking T2nd in wins and 2nd in innings...owns a .222 (113-510) opponents avg., 6th-lowest in the A.L., while Cahill leads league at .192...opposing batters have hit .289 (50-173) in last 7 outings since complete game 2-hitter at HOU on June 19, raising average from .187 to .222...has limited opponents to 5 hits-or-less in 14 of 21 outings, giving up more hits than innings pitched just 6 times in 2010, including 4 of last 7 starts.

LAST START: Took a tough-luck 3-2 Texas loss in series opener on Tues. at Seattle (6.0 IP, 9 H, 3 R-ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR, 105 pitches/72 strikes)...endured several soft hits, and the HR allowed to Gutierrez bounced off the top of the wall...first run scored on a safety squeeze bunt by Gutierrez with bases loaded in 3rd inning...run scored on wild pitch in the 4th and final run was Gutierrez solo HR in 5th...Jason Vargas gave up 2 runs in 6.0 innings for the win...Rangers had 4 hits in the game.

VS. OAKLAND: Was member of Oakland organization in 2007 season, appearing in 26 games (one start) with A's that season...was his final campaign in the States before 2 years in Japan...is 0-2, 3.15 (7 ER/20.0 IP) in 3 starts vs. A's this season, opposing Trevor Cahill in all 3 starts, with Rangers going 0-3 in those games despite 3 quality starts from Lewis...A's batting just .213 (16-75) off Lewis in those starts...took loss in only start at Coliseum in '10, May 5 in a 3-1 defeat (6.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER)...career vs. A's: 2-2, 3.27 (16 ER/44.0 IP) in 9 games/7 starts, including 2-1, 3.18 (8 ER/22.2 IP) in 4 starts vs. Oakland at the Coliseum (all with Texas).

STRANDED: Lewis has held opponents to the lowest average (.196) with runners on base by any A.L. starter, 2nd-lowest by any qualifying A.L. pitcher behind Cleveland reliever Chris Perez (.151)...opponents are also batting just .169 (20-118) with runners in scoring position, 4th-lowest in the A.L.

COMPLETE: Tossed first career complete game on June 19 at Houston, earning win in Rangers' 5-1 victory (9.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 9 SO, 0 HR, 101 pitches/72 strikes)...retired first 13 batters faced in order before a Hunter Pence infield single in the 5th...gave up a Michael Bourn leadoff double in 7th, he advanced on a wild pitch, and scored on a groundout for only run allowed...retired final 9 faced in order after the Bourn double...some other notes on the outing:

- Marked fewest hits allowed by a Texas pitcher in a CG since Doug Davis' 2-hit shutout April 11, 2002 vs. Oakland...last such road performance was Roger Pavlik's one-hitter May 4, 1996 at Detroit.
- Had no walks and 9 K's in his CG, 1st Texas pitcher 9-or-more K's and no walks in a CG since Aaron Sele (0 BB/10 K) Aug. 7, 1999 vs. Toronto...was just the 12th time that had been done in club history, later joined by Cliff Lee, July 27 vs. OAK (13 K's/0 BB's).
- Became just 2nd pitcher in Rangers history with: 2-hits-or-less, no walks, and 9-or-more K's in a CG...the other was Ferguson Jenkins on Aug. 31, 1974 vs. Cleveland (9.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 9 SO).

WEEKLY HONORS: Named A.L. Co-Player of the Week with Josh Hamilton (June 7-13) after going 2-0, 1.80 (3 ER/15.0 IP) in a pair of starts, beating Felix Hernandez and Yovani Gallardo, as duo became first-ever pair of Texas teammates to share the honor.

THE TEN SPOT: Has 4 games with exactly career-high 10 K's this season, the first Texas pitcher with at least 4 10-K games in a single season since Nolan Ryan in 1991 (4)...is one of 6 pitchers with at least 4 10-strikeout games in 2010, joining Twins' Liriano (5), Rays' Shields (4) and teammate Cliff Lee (4) as one of just 4 A.L. hurlers...his first 3 efforts came in April, as Lewis became the first Texas pitcher with 10+ strikeouts 3 times in one month since Nolan Ryan had 3 such starts in Sept. 1990...Lewis' 10-strikeout effort on April 14 at Cleveland came more than 6 years after his first (Aug. 15, 2003)...according to Elias, no other active pitcher had gone 5-or-more years between his first and second game with double-digit strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Has won 3 of his last 5 road starts, going 4-5, 3.68 (32 ER/78.1 IP) in 12 starts away from Arlington this season...opponents batting .201 in those starts, 3rd-lowest road avg. by any A.L. pitcher, behind only Lester (.197) and Cahill (.196)...despite lower winning pct. and higher ERA on road (4-5, 3.68) than at home (5-2, 3.14), Lewis' splits away from Arlington (.201/.270/.349) are markedly better than at Rangers Ballpark (.249/.311/.371).

2010 NOTES: Team is 10-11 in his starts...went 3-0, 2.76 (10 ER/32.2 IP) in 5 April starts to win **Rangers April Player of the Month**...led A.L. with 38 K's, T2nd-most in majors and the 2nd-most ever for a Ranger in April behind Nolan Ryan's 49 K's in

1989...finished May 1-3, 4.11 (14 ER/30.2 IP) in 5 starts...has gone 6.0-or-more innings in 16 of 21 starts, 13 quality starts...this is his 2nd big league season with multiple wins (also 10-9 for Texas in 2003)...led the club with 8 victories in the first "half"...posted the 2nd-lowest ERA (3.33) in the first "half" by a qualifying Texas Ranger since 1996, behind only Kenny Rogers' 2.54 ERA in 2005 and the lowest ERA by a right-hander since Bob Tewksbury in 1995 (3.25)...started the Rangers' 4th game of the season on April 9 vs. Seattle (6-2 victory) and earned his first big league win since a start with Texas on April 7, 2004 at Oakland...was first start/appearance with Texas since April 17, 2004 at Seattle...earned win in start on April 14 at Cleveland, as outing was moved up a day due to case of food poisoning for original starter C.J. Wilson...earned 3rd win in 8-4 victory on April 25 vs. Detroit (4 ER/6.1 IP), setting down 15 of the last 16 batters he faced...tossed a career-high 9.0 scoreless innings in the Rangers' 11-inning, 2-0 victory on April 30 at Seattle...became the first Rangers pitcher to work at least 9.0 scoreless frames without a decision since Nolan Ryan (10.0 IP) on Aug. 17, 1990 vs. Chicago-AL (G1)...retired final 21 batters he faced, beginning with the first out of the 3rd inning...faced Cliff Lee, making his M's debut...that April 30 outing was 1st of 3 straight winless quality starts...retired first 12 batters faced in no-decision on May 11 vs. Oakland (3 ER/7.0 IP)...took first loss May 5 at Oakland, allowing a pair of first inning runs after first 4 batters, which would be enough to win game as Texas scored just once...retired first 12 batters faced in ND May 11 vs. Oakland...took 2nd loss May 16 at Toronto despite retiring 11 of first 13 batters faced...started Rangers first-ever game at Target Field on May 28, taking 2-1 loss despite QS (2 ER/6.0 IP)...established new Texas record after winning his 8th straight decision at RBIA on June 8 vs. Seattle (1 ER/7.0 IP) in matchup with Felix Hernandez...won June 13 at Milwaukee (8.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R-ER, 10 SO), matchup with Yovani Gallardo...only runs allowed came on 2 solo HR by Prince Fielder, as Lewis added a key 2-run, 2-out single in the 6th after a lengthy at-bat vs. Gallardo...went 2-for-4 w/ 2 RBI, first A.L. pitcher with 2-or-more hits and 2-or-more RBI in a 10-strikeout game since Detroit's Mickey Lohich on Sept. 18, 1971 vs. Baltimore at Tiger Stadium...tossed first career CG on June 19 at Houston (see separate note)...earned 8-4 win on July 16 at Boston, returning to the mound following a 1-hour rain delay in the bottom of the 4th.
