A's vs. MARINERS

The A's lead the season series, 6-4...are 5-1 in Oakland and 1-3 in Seattle...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland but have lost 15 of the last 17 games at Safeco Field...have lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 26-41 (.388) against the Mariners since 2007, which is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 276-205 (.574) against Seattle, which is the best mark by an AL team against the Mariners...are 156-87 in Oakland and 120-118 in Seattle, including 44-54 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dating back to Friday, the A's have gone 0 for their last 35 with runners in scoring position.... that's the second longest such streak in Oakland's 43-year history...the longest is an 0 for 41 streak from June 23-30 in 1980...

Coco Crisp has 10 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which is second most in the majors..

Rajai Davis ranks third in the American League with 34 stolen

Kevin Kouzmanoff doubled for the 11th time since the All-Star Break Sunday, which ranks second in the American League.

Cliff Pennington hit his seventh triple Saturday vs. Texas, which ties him for the AL lead.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972, in a game completed the next day, the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in 19 innings...the game was suspended after 17 innings and ended the next day when Joe Rudi hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the 19th ...in 1985, Dave Kingman hits his 400th career home run in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of three games and three of the last five ... will try to inch two games over the .500 mark tonight for the fourth time since the All-Star Break....are 22-15 (.595) since June 25, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span...are 14-23 in the first game of a series, 17-19 in the second game and 22-11 in the third game...are in second place in the AL West and have spent 13 of the last 15 days with at least a share of second after 51 consecutive days all alone in third...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 35 days in second, five days tied for second, 51 days in third and one day in fourth...have been exactly .500 seven times since the All-Star Break and 18 times this year...the only times in Oakland history the A's have been exactly .500 more times are in 1968 (20 times) and 2007 (19 times)...the A's have a 30-37 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 26-18 against teams that were below .500.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 13-9 (.591) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best record in the American League behind Minnesota (17-7), Toronto (15-7) and Texas (14-9)...have won five of seven series since the break, including all four home series...the pitching staff has a 2.90 ERA (63 er in 195.1 ip), which is the lowest mark in the majors...lead the AL in opponents batting average (.229)...the offense leads the majors with 30 stolen bases...however, is tied for second fewest extra base hits and home runs (13) in the AL (54), and ranks fourth fewest in doubles (38).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 1.80 ERA (10 er in 50.0 ip) and .185 (31 for 168) opponents batting average in their last seven games...they are now 19-10 with a 2.97 ERA (81 er in 245.2 ip) over the last 37 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 games...have a 3.58 ERA (269 er in 677.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL and second lowest in the majors (.243)...all five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation have an ERA under 4.00, with Mazzaro being the highest at 3.86.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.03 ERA (14 er in 62.0 ip) and .185 (39 for 211) opponents batting average in its last seven games...now has a 2.74 ERA (65 er in 213.1 ip) over the last 24 games (since July 10) and has a 3.66 ERA for the season, second best in the American League...also leads the AL in shutouts (10), ranks second in pickoffs (19), has allowed the second fewest extra base hits (291) and ranks third in opponents batting average (.245).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen eight bases in their last seven games and now have 95 for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...this marks just the second time in the last 12 seasons the A's have stolen 90 or more bases (had 133 last year)...have been successful in 95 of 118 (79.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (PHI, 81.3%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...the A's have a record of 40-17 when stealing a base and are 16-38 with no stolen bases...have three players with at least 15 stolen bases (Davis 34, Pennington 17, Crisp 15) for the first time since 1992 (Henderson 48, Wilson 28, Blankenship 21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered four times over the last 14 games after going deep 14 times over the previous 11 contests...have hit just 70 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors ahead of Seattle (67)...are on pace to hit 102 home runs...the three lowest single season home run totals in Oakland history in a non-strike season are 94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979...Kurt Suzuki leads the A's with 12 home runs and there have been just two seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not have a 20-home run hitter: 1978 (Page, 17) and 1983 (Murphy and Lopes, 17).

OFFENSE: The A's lead the American League in sacrifice flies (39) and sacrifice hits (38) and are tied for second in triples (24)...over the last 21 years, the only time the A's had more triples in a season was in 2002 when they had 28...have the second fewest extra base hits in the AL (285) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.380) ahead of Seattle (242 xbh, .339 slugging)...rank last in the majors with 12 intentional walks...last year, the A's were walked just 16 times intentionally, which was the fewest by a ML team since the 1961 Kansas City A's had 10.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won 10 of their last 11 day games and are 27-11 (.711) during the day for the season, which is the best record in the majors...are 29-44 (.397) at night, which is third worst in the American League...have a 2.82 ERA (106 er in 338.2 ip) during the day and a 4.10 ERA (295 er in 647.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the midst of a six-game road trip to Seattle (0-1, three games) and Minnesota (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2) and Chicago (1-2) and are 22-31 (.415) on the road for the season...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (2-1) and have won 10 of the last 14 home games...are 34-24 (.569) at home for the season...have a 4.59 ERA (233 er in 457.0 ip) on the road compared to 2.86 (168 er in 529.0 ip) at home...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 67 home runs on the road, which is second most in the AL, and 39 at home, which is second fewest...starting pitchers are 16-20 with a 4.41 ERA (153 er in 312.0 ip) on the road compared to 26-17 with a 2.86 ERA (116 er in 365.0 ip) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-11 (.607) in one-run games, which is the best record in the American League, but are 9-13 (.409) in two-run games, which is third worst in the AL...have dropped nine of their last 16 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...have lost five of their last six extra inning games are 4-6 (.400) for the season, which is fourth worst in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times this year and 85 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (90)...the 21 players have combined to miss 911 games (43.4 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at 10 (Bailey, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney, Watson).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, his third since being reinstated from the disabled list July 30...the A's are 4-4 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 18-20 (.474) in his career starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer in all eight starts

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in 43.0 innings pitched this year at the major league level nor 19.1 innings pitched in the minors...his eight consecutive starts without a home run is the longest such streak by an

DON'T WALK: Has four starts without a walk this year and has walked one batter or fewer in seven of his eight starts...has issued just five walks in 43.0 innings for the season, an average of 1.05 per nine innings.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 1-1 with a 5.11 ERA (7 er in 12.1 ip) and .283 (13 for 46) opponents batting average in two starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 30...has two stints on the disabled list this year, both due to his left elbow...was 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL the first time April 27 retroactive to April 25 with a left elbow inflammation and proximal medial forearm strain...it was his first career stint on the disabled list...made one rehab start with Triple-A

Sacramento May 24 against Nashville and tossed 3.0 innings in the River Cats 8-3 win...was reinstated May 29 and went 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL June 4 with a left elbow inflammation...posted a 3.00 ERA in two rehab starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and went 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Sacramento for a 1-0 record and a 3.31 ERA in four starts overall during his second rehab assignment.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .225 (29 for 129) batting average while lefties are hitting .333 (12 for 36)...has yielded a .202 (21 for 104) batting average with the bases empty and .328 (20 for 61) with runners on base...opponents are batting .209 (9 for 43) with two walks (.244 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

LAST 25, FIRST 13: Is 11-6 with a 3.01 ERA (50 er in 149.1 ip), .241 (135 for 561) opponents batting average and seven home runs in his 25 starts since June 29, 2009...went 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs allowed over the first 13 starts of his career through June 20

FIRST WILD PITCH: Was charged with the first (and only) wild pitch of his career in the sixth inning April 13 at Seattle, snapping a career-opening streak of 31 starts and 186.1 innings without a wild pitch...the streak of 31 consecutive starts without a wild pitch was sixth longest in Oakland history by a starter...it was the longest since Barry Zito had a streak of 38 starts from July 2, 2002 to July 13, 2003.

LONG-TERM CONTRACT: Agreed to terms on a four-year contract through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015 on April 16...the 2015 season would be Anderson's first possible season in which he would be eligible for free agency.

2010 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, the A's 6-2 win over Seattle April 8 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings, scattering three hits and a walk...did not allow a run for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss at Seattle *April 13*...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed six hits and two walks...became the first starting pitcher in Oakland history, among pitchers who began the season with the A's, to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...the last A's pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts and a 21.0 inning scoreless streak...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Baltimore *April 18*...retired each of the first eight batters he faced before the Orioles scored three times with two outs in the third inning, snapping his season-opening scoreless streak at 14.0 innings...that was the third longest season-opening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...had a no decision in the A's 6-1 loss to Cleveland on *April* 24 in Oakland...shutout the Indians on one hit and one walk over the first five innings before allowing his only run in the sixth inning on a Choo RBI single...Carmona limited the A's to a run in 7.1 innings and Anderson left after six innings with the score tied at 1-1...combined with Ziegler and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Detroit May 29...tossed 5.2 innings and left after 70 pitches in his first start after his rehab assignment...yielded three of the hits and did not walk a batter...tossed just 2.0 innings in the A's 9-8 win at Boston on June 3...left the game early with left elbow soreness and returned to the DL the next day...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss at Chicago July 30 in his first start after returning from the disabled list...yielded a career high tying 10 hits in 5.1 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win over Kansas City last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Butler sacrifice fly and a Guillen fielders choice...then shutout the Royals on two hits and a hit batter over his final six innings...the A's scored four times in the sixth and he left with a 4-2 lead

ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE: Is 3-2 with a 2.41 ERA (41.0 ip, 43 h, 14 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 35 so, 4 hr) in seven career starts...that includes 0-1 with a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts at Safeco Field and 3-1 with a 3.52 ERA (9 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland...has a win in two starts this year and has not allowed a run (12.0 ip, 9 h, 3 bb, 10 so)...the win came in a 6-2 decision on April 8 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings, scattering three hits and a walk...retired 10 consecutive batters before allowing a Figgins single and a Gutierrez walk to start the seventh inning...was relieved by Chad Gaudin who retired the next three betters...the bullpen allowed two runs in the ninth...then had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed six hits and two walks...the Mariners were 0 for 6 with four strikeouts with runners in scoring position off him as he stranded nine base runners in his six innings...made his Major League debut against Seattle on April 10 of last year and took the loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dallas Braden (6-8, 3.75 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season, his fifth since coming off the disabled list July 20 (elbow)... has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 19 starts ... has seven runs of support in his eight losses (48.2 ip, 1.29 RSA) and 26 runs of support in his 29 career losses (157.1 ip, 1.49 RSA)... has run support of two runs or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and his season run support of 3.30 (44 rs in 120.0 ip) is the lowest in the American League... is 2-27 in 41 career starts with support of two runs or fewer and zero or one run of support and 17-2 in 24 starts with run support of three or more... was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas last Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so) in his last start... is 1-1 with a 5.18 ERA (24.1 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, four starts, vs. Seattle.

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 30 of the past 36 games and has a 2.77 ERA (28 er in 91.0 ip) over that span...has a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in six games in August after posting a 2.34 ERA in 22 games in July (16 er in 61.2 ip)...is third in the American League in losses (18) and home runs allowed (40), fourth in strikeouts (275), tied for seventh in wins (14) and is eighth in innings pitched (309.0)...has 35 save opportunities this season, which is the second fewest in the AL (Detroit, 30)...has a 2.85 ERA (52 er in 164.1 ip) at home compared to a 4.97 ERA (80 er in 145.0 ip) on the road.

- Was placed on the 15-day DL July 30 with a right intercostal strain, retroactive to July 21.
- Had not allowed a run in 13 of his past 15 appearances (1.10 ERA, 2 er in 16.1 ip).
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).
