A's vs. MARINERS

The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 5-1 in Oakland and 1-4 in Seattle...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 18 games at Safeco Field...have lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 26-42 (.382) vs. Seattle since 2007, which is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 276-206 (.573) vs. Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners...are 156-87 in Oakland and 120-119 in Seattle, including 44-55 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Last night in the first inning, the A's snapped a **0-for-35 streak** with runners in scoring position when Kurt Suzuki singled with runners on first and second base. ... it was the second longest such streak in Oakland's 43-year history (0 for 41, June 23-30 in 1980).

Coco Crisp has 10 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which is second most in the majors.

Rajai Davis ranks third in the American League with 34 stolen

Kevin Kouzmanoff doubled for the 11th time since the All-Star Break Sunday, which ranks second in the American League.

Cliff Pennington hit his seventh triple Saturday vs. Texas, which ties him for the AL lead...also ties for the ninth best single season total in Oakland history...he's only the second Athletic in the last 23 years with at least seven triples (Eric Byrnes, 9 in 2003).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1978, Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in the A's 2-0 victory ...in 2003, Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight to the Mariners after winning three of their last four contests... slide back to the .500 mark for the eighth time since the All-Star Break and 19th time this season....the only time the A's have been exactly .500 more times in Oakland history was their first year in the Bay Area in 1968 (20 times)...are 22-16 (.579) since June 25, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span...are 14-23 in the first game of a series, 17-20 in the second game and 22-11 in the third game...have fallen back into third place for the first time since Aug. 1...had spent 13 of the previous 15 days with at least a share of second after 51 consecutive days all alone in third...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 35 days in second, five days tied for second, 52 days in third and one day in fourth...the A's have a 30-37 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 26-19 against teams that were below .500.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have won 10 of their last 11 day games and are 27-11 (.711) during the day for the season, which is the best record in the majors...are 29-45 (.392) at night, which is second worst in the American League...have a 2.82 ERA (106 er in 338.2 ip) during the day and a 4.08 ERA (297 er in 655.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 13-10 (.565) since the All-Star Break, which is the fifth best record in the American League...prior to losing this Seattle series, had won five of seven series since the break, including all four home series...the pitching staff has a 2.88 ERA (65 er in 203.1 ip), which is the lowest mark in the majors...lead the AL in opponents batting average (.231)...the offense leads the majors with 30 stolen bases...however, is tied for second fewest home runs (13) in the majors and tied for third fewest extra base hits (54) since the Break.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 1.74 ERA (11 er in 57.0 ip) and .187 (36 for 193) opponents batting average in their last eight games...they are now 19-11 with a 2.92 ERA (82 er in 252.2 ip) over the last 38 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 games...have a 3.55 ERA (270 er in 684.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL and second lowest in the majors (.242)...all five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation have an ERA under 4.00, with Mazzaro being the highest at 3.86.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.06 ERA (16 er in 70.0 ip) and .195 (47 for 241) opponents batting average in its last eight games...now has a 2.72 ERA (67 er in 221.1 ip) over the last 25 games (since July 10) and has a 3.65 ERA for the season, second best in the American League...also leads the AL in shutouts (10) and fewest extra base hits (292), ranks second in pickoffs (19) and ranks third in opponents batting average (.245).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen eight bases in their last eight games and now have 95 for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...this marks just the second time in the last 12 seasons the A's have stolen 90 or more bases (had 133 last year)...have been successful in 95 of 120 (79.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League (TB, 79.3%) and third best in the majors (PHI, 81.3%)...the Oakland record is 80.7% set in 2008...the A's have a record of 40-17 when stealing a base and are 16-39 with no stolen bases...have three players with at least 15 stolen bases (Davis 34, Pennington 17, Crisp 15) for the first time since 1992 (Henderson 48, Wilson 28, Blankenship 21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered four times over the last 15 games after going deep 14 times over the previous 11 contests...have hit just 70 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors ahead of Seattle (67)...are on pace to hit 101 home runs...the three lowest single season home run totals in Oakland history in a non-strike season are 94 in 1968, 100 in 1978 and 108 in 1979...Kurt Suzuki leads the A's with 12 home runs and there have been just two seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not have a 20-home run hitter: 1978 (Page, 17) and 1983 (Murphy and Lopes, 17).

OFFENSE: The A's lead the American League in sacrifice hits (38), are tied for first in sacrifice flies (39), and are tied for second in triples (24)...over the last 21 years, the only time the A's had more triples in a season was in 2002 when they had 28...have the second fewest extra base hits in the AL (285) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.378) ahead of Seattle (243 xbh, .339 slugging)...rank last in the majors with 12 intentional walks...last year, the A's were walked just 16 times intentionally, which was the fewest by a ML team since the 1961 Kansas City A's had 10.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are in the midst of a six-game road trip to Seattle (0-2, three games) and Minnesota (three games) ...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2) and Chicago (1-2) and are 22-31 (.415) on the road for the season...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (2-1) and have won 10 of the last 14 home games...are 34-24 (.569) at home for the season...have a 4.55 ERA (235 er in 465.0 ip) on the road compared to 2.86 (168 er in 529.0 ip) at home...have the lowest home ERA in the American League...have allowed 67 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in the AL, and 39 at home, which is second fewest...starting pitchers are 16-21 with a 4.36 ERA (155 er in 320.0 ip) on the road compared to 26-17 with a 2.86 ERA (116 er in 365.0 ip) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-11 (.607) in one-run games, which is the best record in the American League, but are 9-14 (.391) in two-run games, which is third worst in the AL...have dropped nine of their last 16 one-run decisions after winning 10 of the first 12...have lost five of their last six extra inning games are 4-6 (.400) for the season, which is fourth worst in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times this year and 85 times since the start of the 2007 season (17 in 2009, an Oakland record 25 in 2008 and 22 in 2007)...the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (90)...the 21 players have combined to miss 921 games (43.9 games per stint)...began the year with six players on the DL and it now stands at 10 (Bailey, Chavez, Devine, Duchscherer, Jackson, Meloan, Outman, Sheets, Sweeney, Watson)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season, his fifth since coming off the disabled list July 20...the A's are 8-11 (.421) in his starting assignments and are 28-37 (.431) in his 65 career starts...has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 19 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batter or fewer 18 times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 2-1 with a 3.46 ERA (10 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 20...was placed on the 15-day DL July 3 retroactive to June 23 with left elbow tightness...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab start for Single-A Stockton on July 15 and had a no decision in the Ports 10-9 win over Visalia (4.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in 15 of his 19 starts and has issued just 22 walks in 120.0 innings, an average

of 1.65 per nine innings...that is the fourth lowest mark in the American League...ranks 10th in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41)...had a streak of 21.0 consecutive innings (79 batters) without a walk from May 3 to 14.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support in his last start, a loss...has seven runs of support in his eight losses (48.2 ip, 1.29 RSA) and 26 runs of support in his 29 career losses (157.1 ip, 1.49 RSA)...has run support of two runs or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and his season run support of 3.30 (44 rs in 120.0 ip) is the lowest in the American League...is 2-27 in 41 career starts with support of two runs or fewer and zero or one run of support and 17-2 in 24 starts with run support of three or more...has career run support of 3.53 (148 rs in 377.1 ip) as a starter.

ON THE BASES: Is tied for second in the American League with six pickoffs (Buehrle, CWS 10)...now has 15 career pickoffs, including a career high seven in 2008...the Twins Danny Valencia stole second base in the second inning on June 4 and that was the first stolen base he allowed since Aug. 20, 2008, also against Minnesota (Punto)...had gone 230.1 innings without allowing a stolen base...opponents are 1 for 2 in stolen base attempts off him this year and 4 for 10 (40.0%) in his career.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his third complete game of the season July 31, which is tied for fourth in the American League...the three complete games are the most by an Athletic over the last three years...had back-to-back complete games May 9 against Tampa Bay and May 14 at Los Angeles...of the 16 perfect games since 1922, only Len Barker followed with another complete game...Braden is the first A's pitcher to toss back-to-back complete games since Mark Mulder had three straight from May 9-21, 2004...began his career with 52 consecutive starts without a complete game to set an Oakland record to start a career, topping the previous mark of 51 by Todd Van Poppel from September 11, 1991-September 12, 1995...it was the fourth longest streak at any point in Oakland history.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 3-6 with a 4.62 ERA (33 er in 64.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest and 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA (17 er in 55.2 ip) in his other nine starts.

INNING BY INNING: Has yielded 25 of his 56 runs this year in the fifth and sixth inning (12 in the fifth, 13 in the sixth)...has a 2.37 ERA (20 er in 76.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 6.14 ERA (30 er in 44.0 ip) average after that.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed a career high 13 home runs...yielded nine in both 2007 and 2009...eight of the 13 home runs have been solo shots.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .338 (24 for 71) opponents average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .233 (67 for 288) from pitches 16 through 75 and .317 (33 for 104) with five of his 13 home runs after that.

PERFECT: Pitched the 19th of the 20 perfect games in Major League history on Mother's Day, May 9, against Tampa Bay (includes Don Larsen's in the 1956 World Series)...it was the second by an Athletic and it came 42 years and one day after Catfish Hunter did it against Minnesota on May 8, 1968...he was named American League Player of the Week for his effort...retired the first two batters he faced in his next start May 14 at Los Angeles to extend his consecutive batters retired streak to an Oakland record tying 29 (also Hunter, May 3-8, 1968)...the streak ended on a two-out double by Abreu in the first but he retired 11 straight after that for a stretch where he retired 40 of 41 hitters...please see the expanded game notes at pressbox.oaklandathletics.com or mlbpressbox.com for more information about his perfect game.

AFTER THE PERFECT GAME: Went 0-5 with a 4.10 ERA and .319 opponents batting average in his first nine starts after his perfect game before snapping his losing streak on July 25...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the nine consecutive starts without a win following a no-hitter or perfect game is the longest streak in major league history...the previous was eight by Mark Buehrle following his perfect game in 2009...received just 12 runs of support over the nine start stretch (2.05 RSA)...the five-game losing streak is the longest by an A's pitcher this year and is the second longest losing streak of his career to an eight-game streak from April 29 to September 23, 200.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first inning but he allowed a RBI double to Andrus in the third to tie the game...Hamilton then homered to lead off the fourth and Teagarden hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning.

BRADEN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-1 with a 5.18 ERA (24.1 ip, 31 h, 17 r, 14 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, four starts...is 0-1 with an 8.71 ERA (10 er in 10.1 ip) in three games in Seattle and 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 1-1 with a 4.84 ERA (12 er in 22.1 ip) in his four starts...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win in 10 innings on April 6 in Oakland...struck out a career high 10 in 7.0 innings...allowed his only run in the fourth inning when Gutierrez doubled with one out, advance to third on a balk and scored on a wild pitch...scattered four hits in his seven innings but Mariners starter lan Snell held the A's to a run on four hits in 6.0 innings
