Escobar's 2009 Season Recap

- Set career highs in games (141), at-bats (528), runs (89), hits (158), doubles (26), home runs (14) and RBI (76) as the Braves' everyday shortstop.
- His .373 avg. (50-for-134) with RISP tied for second in the NL and third in the Majors (min. 100 ABs).
- With the bases loaded, hit .444 (4-for-9) with 11 RBI.
- His .327 batting average vs. RHP ranked fourth in the NL. He hit .232 (36-for-155) with four home runs and 19 RBI off LHP.
- Led the Braves with 46 multi-hit games and ranked second in multi-RBI games (20), two-out RBI (38) and GW-RBI (9).
- His .356 (26-for-73) July batting average ranked fifth in the NL (min. 50 ABs).
- Became the first right-handed batter in 2009 to hit a home run off NL Cy Young winner Tim Lincecum with his two-out, three-run shot in the third inning on 7/22.
- Named NL Player of the Week for 7/16-19. He went 7-for-14 (.500) with three doubles and two home runs in the four-game series vs. NYM. It was his first career weekly award.
- Returned to the starting lineup on 7/16. His 2nd-inning HR teamed with G. Anderson's HR to mark the first time in '09 ATL hit consecutive HR in a game.
- Grounded into a team-high 21 double plays.
- Had a career-best 46-game errorless streak from 6/30-9/28. He made just two errors in his final 75 games in the field (since June 30).
- Had three final at-bat victories: a game-winning sac. fly in the bottom of the ninth of 5/15 win over ARI, an RBI single in the bottom of the 8th vs. MIL and an RBI single in the top of the 12th inning on 8/7 at LAD.
- Hit .344 (16-for-44) with one home run and two RBI during a season-high 11-game hitting streak 8/16-27.

Escobar's Career Highlights

2008: Played first full season at the Major-League level, setting career highs in games (136), at-bats (514), hits (148), home runs (10), RBI (60), walks (59) and strikeouts (62)...Ranked fourth on the team with 42 multi-hit games...Tied the Atlanta record for most GDP in a season with 24 (Murphy '88, A. Jones '04)...On 8/29

at WSH, he grounded into three double plays, matching the single-game franchise mark set by Walt Cruise, 9/18/21 vs. CIN and Joe Adcock, 7/20/55 vs. PIT...Had 11-game hitting streak (17-for-44) snapped 9/14 with a PH at-bat...Suffered a strained right hamstring in Gm 1 on 9/13 at NYM and did not start another game or play in the field again, he made three plate appearances as a pinch hitter the remainder of the season...Hit his third career leadoff HR (2nd this season) on the first pitch on 8/21 off NYM's P. Martinez...Snapped an 0-for-13 hitless streak (2-for-4, 1 HR, 1 2B) and matched his career high with 3 RBI (last 7/23/08 at FLA) on 8/31 at WSH...Hit his first career game-ending home run in the 10th inning on 6/2 vs. FLA off Logan Kensing...Hit his second career leadoff HR (last: 8/29/07) on 5/14 off PHI's Brett Myers...Had career-high 12-game hitting streak from 4/6-19 (16-for-49, .327)...Went 3-for-4 on 3/31 vs. PIT with his first career triple.

2007: Had an outstanding rookie year, hitting .326 in 94 games with Atlanta after his 6/2 promotion from Richmond (AAA)...Was named by *Baseball America* as the eighth-best prospect in the International League...His 104 hits after his debut on 6/2 ranked as the ninth most among MLB rookies...His .336 batting average after the All-Star break was fourth among all Major League rookies (2nd in NL) and 17th overall in the NL...He hit .304 before the break...Led all Major League rookies with a .352 avg. in August (37-for-105)...Played 53 games at shortstop, 22 games at third base and 21 games at second base...Was a .333 hitter with runners in scoring position (20-for-60)...Hit .355 vs. NL East clubs, including .475 in 11 games vs. FLA (19-for-40)...Hit .448 (13-for-29) during his season-best seven-game hitting streak (8/23-29)...Hit his first career leadoff homer off Dontrelle Willis on 8/29 at FLA...Collected the game-winning walk-off hit in the 10th inning on 8/5 vs. COL...Matched career high with four hits and set a career high with four runs 6/27 vs. WSH...Had a two-run, game-winning double in the ninth inning on 6/15 at CLE, also his first multi-RBI game...Went 4-for-4 with his first career HR in the fourth inning on 6/4 vs. FLA...Made his Major League debut on 6/2 at CHI with a 2-for-4 game and had the game-winning RBI with a double in the 8th inning...His .333 avg. ranked seventh in the IL and he was 7-for-9 in SB attempts...Named as the Best Infield Arm and Best Defensive SS in the International League by *Baseball America*...Was Richmond's April Player of the Month, hitting .313 with a homer and 12 RBI with 3 2B and 4 SB.

2006: Named Mississippi (AA) Player of the Month for June by the Atlanta Braves organization (.298, 10 doubles, one home run and 11 RBI)...Led MS with 121 games, 428 at-bats, 55 runs scored, 113 hits, 21 doubles, 25 infield hits and tied for first with four triples...Ranked second on the team with 45 RBI and 59 walks...Was named the Mississippi Player of the Year by the Braves organization...Named by *Baseball America* as the Braves' 10th-best prospect following the season and one of the top five prospects by *Sports Weekly*...Named as one of the 50 players for the 2006 Futures game and played for the World Team against the United States on 7/9 at PNC Park in Pittsburgh...Played third base and went 0-for-1 with a walk...Went 2-for-3 with a double, two RBI, and a stolen base in his AA debut on 4/6 vs. HVL...Hit his first homer of the year to lead off the 11th inning on 5/19 at JAX...Had his second three-double game on 6/2 at CAR with an RBI, and two runs scored...Recorded the 150th hit of his career on 6/28 vs. BIR...Placed on the disabled list on 7/18 with a left elbow contusion and a fractured right heel...Activated from the disabled list on 7/26...Won the 2006 Arizona Fall League batting title, hitting .407 in 86 at-bats.

2005: Rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 overall prospect in the Braves organization...Had a 12-game hitting streak 6/21-7/3 (.378, 17-for-45), combined between Danville and Rome...Reached base via hit or walk in 26 consecutive games 7/7-8/5...Hit .325 (38-for-117) with eight doubles, two triples, two homers, and 10 RBI in July...Led Rome in July with 38 hits...Recorded a combined (Danville and Rome) 19 multi-hit games...Made just six errors in 48 games with Rome...Ranked fourth in the Braves organization with an OPS of .912...Had a 10-game hit streak from 7/7-7/17...Went hitless in back-to-back games only once in 2005.

PERSONAL: Frederick Deshaun Lewis... Single... Has two children... Graduated from Stone (Wiggins, MS) High School where he played baseball, football and basketball... Helped Stone basketball team to Mississippi state championship... Graduated from Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, where he played baseball and football... Attended Southern (Baton Rouge, LA) University where he played baseball... Is cousin of big league outfielder Matt Lawton.

LAST SEASON: Played in 122 games, batting .258 (76- for-295) with 21-2B, 3-3B, 4-HR and 20 RBI... Posted back-to-back seasons with at least 20-2B (25 in 2008)... **WHY WAIT?:** Batted .542 (13-for-24) on 1st pitch, highest figure among NL players and 3rd-best in Majors behind Oakland's Jack Cust (.577) and Toronto's Randy Ruiz (.545)... **HOME COOKING:** Hit better at AT&T Park posting .288 clip (42-for-146) compared to .228 figure (34-for-149) on road... PROFESSIONAL CAREER:

2002: Earned Northwest League All-Star honors for short-season Salem-Keizer... Won NWL batting title with .322 avg., while finishing 5th for both hits (77) and OBP (.396)... Earned share of S-K Player of Month honors for July with Daniel Ortmeier and Greg Brusco.

2003: Finished 2nd among Giants farmhands with 30 stolen bases, while playing for single-A Hagerstown.

2004: Had breakout season, while splitting campaign between San Jose (A) and Fresno (A)... Established career standards in avg. (.301), runs (91), RBI (59) and SB (34)... Led all Giants farmhands in thefts, while ranking 8th in avg... Spent majority of season with San Jose, where he hit .301 and ranked among California League leaders in runs (9th - 88), 3B (T2nd - 11), SB (7th - 33) and OBP (2nd - .424)... Earned late season promotion to Fresno, hitting .304 with HR and 2 RBI in 6 games for Grizzlies... Following conclusion of regular season, re-joined San Jose for Cal League playoffs... In 7 post season contests, hit .222 (6-for-27) with 3 runs, 2 2B and 4 RBI... Following season, played for Grand Canyon Rafter in Arizona Fall League.

2005: Logged 1st year at double-A level, appearing in team-high 137 games for Norwich... Batted .273 with 79 runs scored, 28 2B, 7 3B, 7 HR, 47 RBI and 30 SB (in 43 attempts)... Placed 2nd on club in both runs and steals... Was named Giants' Organizational Player of Month for Norwich in July.

2006: Batted .276 with 20 2B, 11 3B, career-high 12 HR, 57 RBI and 18 SB in 120 games... Triples total led club and ranked 3rd in PCL, while he also led Grizzlies in runs scored (85), hits (121) and SB... Was recalled Sept. 1 and collected RBI-double that day at Wrigley Field (off Cubs' Rich Hill) in 1st ML at-bat... In fact, registered hits in each of his 1st 3 big league ABs... Was perfect 3-for-3 (all singles) as pinch-hitter... Played for Scottsdale Scorpions in Arizona Fall League, hitting .273 (15-for-55) with 2 2B, 3 3B, 2 HR, 7 RBI and 2 SB in 17 contests.

2007: Hit for cycle in just his 3rd Major League game of year May 13 at Colorado (Mother's Day), while also connecting for pair of grand slams June 1 at Philadelphia (off Adam Eaton) and July 4 at Cincinnati (off Matt Belisle)... Appeared in 58 games for Giants, batting .287 with 6 2B, 2 3B, 3 HR, 19 RBI and 5 SB... Reached base safely in 33 of 38 starts with club, hitting .304 (42-for-138) in starting role (31 runs scored, 6 2B, 2 3B, 3 HR and 18 RBI)... Began year in minors, being recalled to Giants May 10... Hit at .348 clip (23-for-66) with 3 2B, HR and 7 RBI over last 33 ML games... However, missed time June 9-29 while on big league Disabled List, suffering from right oblique strain... Also missed action in late Aug. and early Sept. in minors because of big toe sprain... Was transferred to single-A San Jose while rehabbing toe injury in Sept., going 5-for-23 (.217) with 2 HRs in 7 playoff games for California League champions... Was recalled to San Francisco Sept. 22 and went 6-for-15 with 5 runs scored, 2B, 4 walks, 2 RBI and steal in 7 games after returning to Giants... In May 13 cycle performance, finished 5-for-6 with 3 runs scored and 4 RBI to become just 22nd player in Giants franchise history to accomplish feat (24th time) and 9th in SF annals... Was also just 4th player in ML history (since 1900) to hit 1st big league HR as part of cycle (courtesy: Elias Sports Bureau)... He joined: STL's Cliff Heathcote (June 13, 1918 at Philadelphia), MIN's Gary Ward (1st game of Sept. 18, 1980 DH at Milwaukee) and HOU's Luke Scott (July 28, 2006 vs. Arizona)... Rookie accomplished feat in just his 16th ML contest overall, and only his 4th career start... Was 2nd earliest in career player had hit for cycle since 1957, surpassed only by MIN's Gary Ward (14th game - Sept. 18, 1980) (courtesy: Bill Arnold/Sports Features Group)... Last Giants rookie to hit for cycle was Dave Kingman on April 16, 1972 at Houston... Became 1st strictly left-handed batter to hit for cycle since Giants moved to SF in 1958... Last strictly lefty Giant to hit for cycle was NY's Don Mueller on July 11, 1954 vs. Pittsburgh... Also became just 6th SF Giants rookie to record 5 hits in game (courtesy: Bill Arnold/Sports Features Group).

2008: Spent entire campaign with Giants, his 1st full season with big league club, before having year cut short due to season-ending surgery on big right toe... Appeared in 133 games with SF, batting .282 (132-for-468) with 81 runs, 25 2B, 11 3B, 9 HR and 40 RBI, while going 21-for-28 in SB... Ranked 8th among NL leadoff hitters in runs scored (62) and hits (93)... Averaged 4.23 pitches per plate appearance, 4th-most in NL behind CIN-AZ's Adam Dunn (4.32), CHI's Kosuke Fukudome (4.29) and AZ's Mark Reynolds (4.24)... Recorded 1st career splash hit, and 1st splash hit at AT&T Park in 2008, April 26 when he belted HR off CIN's Matt Belisle in 5th inning...
