ROSTER MOVE---Rays have optioned RHP **Jeremy Hellickson** to Class A Charlotte where he is expected to work out of the bullpen ... Rays have recalled RHP **Dale Thayer** from AAA Durham...Thayer, 29, went 3-1 with 3 saves and a 3.40 ERA in 41 apps at AAA. TB Rays have employed 35 players this season, including 16 pitchers – both fewest in the majors.

THE EAST---Rays, Yankees and Red Sox all lost yesterday, so Rays sit in 2nd place for the 2nd straight day and maintain a 5.5-game lead over the Red Sox in the wild card chase...Rays have been in first place for 73 of the 138 days this season, but only 6 of the last 58 days...Rays had a 52-day stretch of sole possession of first place end on June 13...Yankees have been in first place for 70 days this season...Rays have held the majors' best record for a total of 69 days this season, 29 more than their first 12 years *combined...*TB is 7 games ahead of last season and even with 2008 for their best record after 122 games...*on May 23 the Rays were 32-12 (.727) and had a 6.0 game lead over the Yankees in the AL East and an 8.5 game lead over the Red Sox...Rays are 42-36 since.*

<u>RAY MATTER</u>---Rays have dropped the first two games of this 7-game Left Coast road trip on the heels of a 5-game win streak that closed out the last homestand...Rays led in both games and last night suffered

just their 3rd loss of the season in 63 games when leading after the 7th inning...Rays have 11 hits in the two

games, batting .175 (11-63)...Rays are now 3-16 on Fridays...Rays are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the AL West (3-2)...Rays are 17-10 since July 24 and 30-16 since June 30.

THE ROAD---Rays still own the best road record in the majors at 35-24 (.593), but have lost 6 of their last 8...the Rays 35 wins are already the 3rd highest road win total in club history...the Rays won 40 in 2008 and the Devil Rays won 36 in 1999...their 12 road series wins are one shy of the club high of 13 in 2008...Rays went 6-3 on their only other West Coast road trip of the season, May 4-12 (3-0 at SEA, 1-2 at OAK, 1-2 at LAA) – the only time in club history stopped at all 3 left coast cities on same trip...all-time the Rays are 64-119 (.350) on the West Coast and have enjoyed just seven winning trips (out of 40)

RAYS DID YOU KNOW?---Only 4 teams since 1969 had as good or better than the Rays after 122 games and not been in first:

<u>REMAINING SCHEDULE</u>---Of the 40 games left on the schedule, 21 are against teams currently better than .500...their remaining games: New York (7), Toronto (6), Boston (6), Baltimore (6), Los Angeles (6), Kansas City (4), Seattle (3), Oakland (2).

- TB Rays have 25 games remaining against the AL East...their 29-18 record within the East is best amongst their division mates,
- including 6-5 against the Yankees...further Rays are 15-10 against the Yankees, Twins and Rangers.

VS. OAKLAND---Matchup of the top two pitching staffs in the AL (Oakland-3.53 ERA, TB-3.62)...Oakland leads the season set 4-3...all but one game has been decided by 3 runs or fewer...Rays won the first three, A's the last 4...Rays are 44-76 (.367) all-time vs. the A's, their 3rd worst pct. against an AL opponent (NY, CLE) ...however, the Rays are 19-17 (.528) starting in 2007 and 22-23 (.489) under Joe Maddon...Rays have had only 3 winning seasons against the A's, but two of those have come in the last 3 years (2007 and 2008)...the Rays are 16-43 (.271) all-time in Oakland, but are 8-9 here starting in 2007 and 11-12 under Joe...the Rays lost 30 of their first 36 games there from 1998 thru 2005.

TB Rays are 14-8 (.636) against the AL West this season (7-1 at home, 7-7 on the road...Rays have pitched to nearly 2 full runs better this season (3.21, 193.2-IP, 69-ER) than a year ago (5.05).

TOMORROW'S MATCHUP---According to the *Elias Sports Bureau* when Matt Garza (July 26 vs. DET) faces Dallas Braden (May 9 vs. TB) tomorrow, it will mark just the second time in the last 20 years two pitchers will face each other after throwing no hitters earlier in the season...the last one came on July 28 of this year ARZ Edwin Jackson (June 25 at TB) lost to PHI Roy Halladay (May 29 a FLA)... the previous occasion came Sep 6, 1991 when CWS Wilson Alvarez faced TEX Nolan Ryan.

- TB Rays are 27-13 (.675) when the opposition starts a lefthander, best in bigs..
 TB David Price turns 25 on Thursday...he and Phil Hughes own the most wins in the majors by pitchers under 25.
- TB Carl Crawford is sitting on 99 career HR, tied with Crime Dog for 3rd on club's all-time list...with 402 steals and 100 triples already in the books, he is looking to become the 8th player since 1900 to reach 100 home runs, 100 triples and 400 stolen bases (Ty Cobb, Tris Speaker, Lou Brock, Frankie Frisch, Kenny Lofton, Paul Molitor and Tim Raines)...last night marked his 7th season of 40 or more steals.
- TB Evan Longoria is one double from becoming the only Ray with a pair of 40-double seasons (44 in 2009).
- TB Rays batters lead the majors in walks (510) and the AL in strikeouts (953).
- TB Rays also lead majors with 145 SB, 33 more than any other club (White Sox, 112).

- His .177 (22-124) opp avg. with RISP is the 4th lowest in the AL.
- At the Break: Was leading the league in wins and ERA at the break, the youngest to lead either league in wins and ERA at the break since MIN Scott Erickson, 23, in 1991 (12 wins, 1.83 ERA).
- His 100 strikeouts entering the break also made him 1 of 6 pitchers all-time under age 25 to reach a dozen wins, an ERA below 2.50 and 100 SO before the break break, and the first in 25 years - since Roger Clemens in 1986 (15-2, 2.48 ERA, 146 SO).
- Also became the youngest pitcher to win 12 games before the All-Star break since FLA Dontrelle Willis (13 wins at age 23) in 2005...youngest in AL since CWS Mark Buehrle (12 wins at age 23) in 2002.
- Hurled a complete-game, 4-hit shutout on April 25 vs. TOR, a 6-0 win over Brandon Morrow...was his first career shutout or complete game.

2009 & CAREER NOTES

In 2009 led the Rays with 7 wins after the All-Star break...over his final 12 starts (from July 31) went 7-3 with a 3.58 ERA (75.1-IP, 61-H, 30-ER) and held opponents to a .217 batting avg., 5th best in the AL over that span.

Made 23 starts for the Rays after his promotion from AAA Durham on May 25...Rays were 14-9 in his starts.

Led all AL rookies (min. 20 starts) with a .241 opp avg... his 7.15 SO/9 IP ranked 4th among ML rookies.

2008 Postseason: Made 5 relief outings for the Rays and was on the mound when the Rays captured the AL pennant...combined to go 1-0 with a save, 1.59 ERA (5.2-IP, 2-H, 2-R, 1-ER, 4-BB, 8-SO) and a .100 opp avg. (2-20)...finished each of the 5 games in which he appeared... became the quickest No. 1 overall pick to play in World Series, passing Chipper Jones ('90 draft, '95 WS) and Tim Belcher ('83 draft, '88 WS). Was selected No. 1 overall by the Rays in the 2007 June Draft out of Vanderbilt.

- Won his 400th career game on Tues vs. TEX...is 401-398 (.502) in his career, including an interim stint with the Angels in 1999 (19-10).
- Skippered the American League to a 4-3 win over the NL in the 80th All-Star Game at St. Louis July 14, 2009.
- Was named AL Manager of the Year in 2008, guiding the Rays from the majors' worst record to the World Series.
- His 14 career ejections as a Ray are one shy of franchise leader Larry Rothschild (15).
- Is in the first year of a three-year contract through 2012.

Won his career-high 12 game last time out, 10-1, Tuesday at home over Tommy Hunter and the Rangers (7.0-IP, 5-H, 0-R, 2-BB, 10-SO)...was Joe Maddon's 400th career win as a Manager and gave the Rays the series win over first-place Texas.

• Was his first victory since he no-hit the Tigers on July 26.

• The 10 K's were one shy of his career high and his 6th career double-digit strikeout game.

• Has allowed no earned runs in 3 of his last 5 and 4 of his last 7 starts dating back to his last start before the break (July 10), but is just 3-2 (2.57 ERA, 29.0-IP, 32-H, 16-R, 14-ER, 8-BB, 40-SO, .181 opp avg.)...also has a pair of complete games.

• In his last 5 starts, beginning with the no-hitter, has 1.72 ERA (36.2-IP, 7-ER).

• On Aug 6 at TOR, became the first Ray to throw a complete game, not allow an earned run and get charged with a loss...lost 2-1 to Brett Cecil...his line: 8 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 4 SO...throwing errors by 2B Sean Rodriguez (3rd inning) and Garza himself (7th) led to the 2 runs.

His 3 complete games are T-5th in the AL...his 6 career complete games are tied with Joe Kennedy for most in club history.

Became only the third pitcher in the last 45 years to face the minimum 27 batters in a no-hitter that was not a perfect game (prev.
