ANGELS BRIEFING: Halos seeking consecutive wins for first time since a three-game sweep of KC (Aug. 9-11) and consecutive road wins for first time since Aug. 6-7 at Detroit... Angels have won two of last three games but are 3-7 over their last 10 contests and 5-11 over last 16 affairs... Club is 18-25 since the All-Star Break and 21-33 since July 1st... Angels remain a season-high -10.5 games behind the division lead, the club's largest deficit since the end of 2003 season (-19.0)... Tonight, the Angels play the fourth game of a six-game road trip to Seattle (8/30-9/1; 2-1) and Oakland (9/3-5)... Halos are 20-20-3 in 43 series played... Angels have 27 remaining games (15 at home, 12 on road)... Halos posted consecutive losing months (July-Aug.) for the first time since opening the 2007 season with three sub .500 months (April-June).

DID YOU KNOW? Halos are 24-17 vs. A.L. West foes (41-52 vs. rest of opponents).

FROM THE START: Angels' starting pitchers have held the opposition to two earned runs or less in six of last seven games.

@ OAKLAND: Halos visit Oakland for third time this season...<u>Club has an 11-5 record at the Coliseum since the start of 2009</u>...Angels are 11-6 in last 17 games vs. A's and 7-6 this season...**Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)**...<u>In the Angels' seven victories this season, they have outscored the A's 41-14</u>...In their six losses, they have been outscored 13-55.

FAST AUGUST FACTS: Halos finished 11-16 in August despite a season-best 3.90 team ERA in the month...In 27 games, Angel starters held opponents to two earned runs or less in 13 contests... The club batted .262 scoring 3.8 runs per game and hit just .206 (45/218) with RISP.

EXTRA! EXTRA! All five of the Angels' hits on Wednesday went for extra bases (3 2B & 2 HR)...Halos have at least one extra-base hit in each of last 35 games, the longest current streak in the A.L.

<u>HOT HALOS:</u> Alberto Callaspo has hit safely in 29 of 35 contests since being acquired from KC batting .321 (42/131)...10 of **Michael Kohn's** last 12 outings are scoreless...He has posted a 1.64 ERA (11 IP – 2 ER) in the span...**Hideki Matsui** has 14 RBI his last 13 games to take over the club lead with 73 RBI on season...**Since Aug. 14, Matsui is batting .404 (19/47), 2nd in the A.L. in the span.**

A LITTLE HELP OVER HERE? Jered Weaver logged 11 strikeouts in his last start, the 5th time this season he has reached at least 11 K's...However, for his third consecutive start, the Angels were shutout.

KING K: Weaver is tied for the MLB lead (F. Hernandez) with 200 strikeouts and could be the first Angel to lead Majors in strikeouts since Nolan Ryan in 1977 (341)...Weaver and Ervin Santana (214 K's in 2008) are the only Angel hurlers with 200+ K's since 2000.

WHO'S ON FIRST? 10 different Angels have played first base this season, second most in club history (11 in '69)...Nine of those players coming since the season-injury of **Kendry Morales** in May.

THANK YOU FANS: The Angels will surpass 3 million fans for the 8th consecutive season to extend the club record...The Yankees are the only other A Liteam that can make the same claim.

THE RUN AROUND: Halos have outscored opponents 71-55 in the first inning (+16)...However, the club has been outscored 610-584 (-26) overall in 2010...Angels been held to two-or-fewer runs 43 times in 2010...Team is averaging 4.4 runs per game after posting 5.5 runs per contest in 2009.

ONE EXTREME TO ANOTHER: In the Angels' 65 wins, starting pitchers have logged a 2.26 ERA (439 IP – 110 ER) and a .216 avg. against (349/1617)... In the Halos' 69 losses, starters have a 6.44 ERA (392.2 IP – 281 ER) and a .316 average against (506/1603)...ERA differential (4.2 runs) is largest in MLB.

HURTIN' HALOS: The Angels have placed 15 different players on the disabled list this season...The 15 players have missed 821 combined games.

- In a 2-for-27 (.074) skid his last eight games
- Batting .354 (17/48) with four doubles and five home runs this season against Oakland.
- With HR 8/21 at Twins, joined ARod and Vladimir Guerrero as the only actives with at least 15 HRs in each of the last 13 seasons (1998-2010)...His 13 consecutive seasons with at least 15 HR and 15 stolen bases rank second all-time to Barry Bonds (14 straight seasons).
- Has batted leadoff in 20 of his last 23 games (batted 3rd last three games, Angels are 100-69 over last two seasons when he hits third).
- Named A.L. Player of the Week (8/9-16) after posting an A.L.-best .524 (11-for-21) average with two home runs and five RBI...Also led league with a .615 OBP and ranked second with a .952 SLG.
- 17 stolen bases three shy of reaching 20 stolen bases for 12th consecutive season (longest active streak in Majors). Since 2001, he has reached safely 2,697 times 2nd most in span to Albert Pujols (credit STATS LLC).
- Leads club with 70 walks (T7th in A.L.) and 73 runs scored.
- One of 16 active players with min. of nine grand slams (hit ninth career slam April 13 @ NYY)...Logged 8th career walk-off hit and 4th career walk-off HR in 10th inning on 8/11 in 2-1 win over KC...<u>1,952 career games in right field are most among actives.</u>
- Hit 500th double June 2 at KC to become one of just one four players all-time with: 500 2Bs, 250 HRs & 350 SBs...The other three all-timers are Barry Bonds, Rickey Henderson and Craig Biggio.
