ANGELS BRIEFING: Halos are a season high six games under .500 for second time this season, first time since May 12th (15-21)...**Angels limited to one run over last two-plus games and 19 innings played**...Angels are 3-9 over their last 12 contests and 5-13 over last 18 affairs...Club is 18-27 since the All-Star Break and 21-35 since July 1st...Angels have remained a season-high -10.5 games behind the division lead since Aug. 27th, the club's largest deficit since end of 2003 season (-19.0)... Today, the Angels play the final game of a six-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (0-2)...Halos are 20-21-3 in 44 series played ... Angels have 25 remaining games (15 at home, 10 on road)....Club posted consecutive losing months (July-Aug.) for the first time since opening the 2007 season with three sub .500 months (April-June)

PASSES FROM PETE: Yesterday Peter Bourjos logged his eighth outfield assist in his 26th start, most by a rookie to start a career in that span in at least the last 40 years (ELIAS).

SCORING STRUGGLES: Angels have been shutout in four of last 12 games...Since August 1st, the Club is batting .199 (46/231) with RISP...**Halos have totaled 12 runs in last eight contests (1.5 per).** Angels been held to two-or-fewer runs 45 times in 2010.

A LITTLE HELP OVER HERE? With vesterday's 3-1 loss, the Angels have scored a total of one run of support over Jered Weaver's last four combined starts...Over his last 14 starts, Angels have plated 26 total runs (1.8 per start).

DID YOU KNOW? Halos are 24-19 vs. A.L. West foes (41-52 vs. rest of opponents).

FROM THE START: Angels' starting pitchers have held the opposition to two earned runs or less n seven of last nine games...However, Angels' starters have just three wins in the nine-game stretch.

@ OAKLAND: Angels are 7-8 vs. Oakland this season... Angels have not lost a season series to the A's since 2003 (8-12)...In the Angels' seven victories this season, they have outscored the A's 41-14... In their seven losses, they have been outscored 14-66.

HOT HALOS: Alberto Callaspo has hit safely in 30 of 37 contests since being acquired from KC batting .317 (44/139)...11 of **Michael Kohn's** last 13 outings are scoreless...He has posted a 1.59 ERA (11.1 IP – 2 ER) in the span...**Hideki Matsui** has 14 RBI his last 14 games to take over the club lead with 73 RBI...Since Aug. 14, Matsui is batting .380 (19/50).

KING K: Weaver leads the Majors with 205 strikeouts and could be the first Angel to lead Majors in strikeouts since Nolan Ryan in 1977 (341) ... Weaver and Ervin Santana (214 K's in 2008) are the only Angel hurlers with 200+ K's since 2000.

WHO'S ON FIRST? 10 different Angels have played first base this season, second most in club history (11 in '69)...Nine of those players coming since the season-injury of Kendry Morales in May.

THE RUN AROUND: Halos have outscored opponents 71-57 in the first inning (+14)...However, the club has been outscored 621-585 (-36) overall in 2010...Team is averaging 4.3 runs per game after posting 5.5 runs per contest in 2009.

ONE EXTREME TO ANOTHER: In the Angels' 65 wins, starting pitchers have logged a 2.26 ERA (439 IP – 110 ER) and a .216 avg. against (349/1617)... In the Halos' 71 losses, starters have a 6.35 ERA (405.1 IP – 286 ER) and a .312 average against (514/1646)...ERA differential (4.1 runs) is largest in MLB.

HURTIN' HALOS: The Angels have placed 15 different players on the disabled list this season...The 15 players have missed 829 combined games

THIS N' THAT: Angels are 35-30 on weekend games (Fri.-Sun.)...However, Halos are 30-41 Monday-Thursday...Angels have spent a total of four days in first place...In 2009, the Halos spent 100 days atop the division...Angels are 18-17 in one-run games and 33-30 in games decided by two runs or less...In the Halos' 65 victories, the club has hit .312 (182/584) with RISP...In the 71 losses, Angels are 87 for 495 (.176)...Halos' average home attendance of 40,000 is second in A.L. to NYY (46,400)...Angels have held a lead at some point in 25 of 71 losses...<u>Angels have used 112 different lineups in 136</u> games...Angels will fly the most miles in 2010 (50,509), while the White Sox will fly the fewest (22,832).
