TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners open the penultimate road trip of the 2010 season with a 2-team, 6-game trip today with the first of three games against the Oakland A's...following an off day on Thursday in Southern California, will play three games vs. the Angels...went 4-6 on just concluded 10-game homestand against the Twins (1-2), Angels (1-2) and Indians (2-2)...today's game will be broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network and televised by FSN Northwest in HD.

ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday to improve to 2-3 in September...won 4 of last 8 games and are 10-12 in last 22 games...lost 38 of last 60 games; 19-30 post ASG...were 13-14 in August, 6-22 in July; 14-13 in June...held a lead in 92 of 137 games (40 blown leads in losses)...trailed at some point in 28 of 54 wins...33-38 at home: 21-45 on the road.

THIS WOULD BE GREAT IF WE WERE GOLFING ... the Mariners have scored 3 or less runs in 10 consecutive games (4-6)...scored 4 runs in game #2 Aug. 25 at Boston, the only time in their past 13 games to reach 4 runs...have not scored 5 or more runs in a game since Aug. 21 at NYY...current 10-game streak of scoring 3 or fewer runs is the 2nd-longest in club history...trails only a 12-gamer in 1988 (June 10-22)...has scored 3 or fewer runs in 15 consecutive home games, the longest streak of its kind by a Major League team since the 1954 Orioles.

<u>DOMINATION...</u> following his 8.0 shutout innings yesterday, **Felix Hernandez** has allowed just 1 ER in his last 6 starts for a 0.20 ERA (1 ER, 45.0 IP)...has a current string of 16.1 consecutive scoreless innings, the longest streak by a Mariners hurler this season...posted a 0.82 ERA in August, the 2nd-lowest by a Mariners pitcher in ANY month (M. Langston, 0.50, September 1988)...among AL starters, ranks 2nd in ERA (2.30), 1st in starts (30), 1st in quality starts (27), 1st in innings (219.1) and 1st in strikeouts (209).

YOU KNOW HE WILL GET YOU TO THE 7TH ... Felix Hernandez has pitched into the 7th inning in 21 consecutive starts...it is the longest single-season streak in club history and tied for the overall club record set by Randy Johnson in 1992 (last 11 GS) and 1993 (first 10 GS)...Felix is 9-7, 1.72 (31 ER, 162.1 IP) during the 21-start stretch (since May 23).

IT DOES SEEM LIKE THE HITS COME IN BUNCHES...Ichiro recorded career hit #2,200 Wednesday vs. the Angels (current hit total is 2,208), reaching the 2,200-hit mark faster than any player over the last 65 years...lchiro recorded hit #2,220 in career game 1,559...the previous quickest players to reach 2,200 hits (since 1945): Stan Musial (1,669 G), Tony Gwynn (1,693), Kirby Puckett (1,705 G), Wade Boggs (1,710).

YOU ALREADY KNOW THAT...Russell Branyan has hit 13 home runs in his 43 games with the Mariners this season...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that he ranks 2nd in club history hitting a home run once every 13.66 at-bats (min. 700 PA)?...Branyan has hit 44 home runs in 164 games with the Mariners over the last two seasons, and trails only Ken Phelps (13.32) for highest AB/HR ratio in club history...Ken Griffey Jr. is 3rd on the list with a homer every 15.15 at-bats (as a Mariner only).
