Among AL catcher's with at least 40 starts, **Adam Moore** ranks 2nd with a 3.21 catcher's ERA...Kurt Suzuki (OAK) leads the AL with a 3.18 CERA.

**THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS**

**Ichiro** currently has 179 hits, and is 21 short of his 10th consecutive 200-hit season...would break the AL record for 200-hit seasons in a career (currently tied with Ty Cobb) and tie the ML record held by Pete Rose.

**YOUNGEST TO 1,000 STRIKEOUTS**

**Felix Hernandez** turned 24 years, 139 days old Aug. 25, and struck out 9 Red Sox to give him 1,002 strikeouts in 166 games (now 1,019)...he became the 4th youngest player in MLB history to reach 1,000 strikeouts.

**40 / 40 TEAMMATES**

**Chone Figgins** (35) & **Ichiro** (36) have a shot to be the 2nd pair of Mariners to each have 40 steals in a season...they would join **Harold Reynolds** (60) and **Phil Bradley** (40) who did so in 1987...since 1994, the 2009 Tampa Bay Rays (Crawford & Upton) are the only team to boast 2 players with 40+ steals.

**DAREN BROWN**

**Daren Brown** took over as interim manager on Aug. 9...Seattle is 12-14 overall with Brown at the helm.

**LEAGUE LOCKDOWN**

**Brandon League** is 4-0 with 2 saves and a 0.70 ERA (2 ER, 25.2 IP) since July 11...has allowed only 1 ER over his last 20.0 innings (0.45 ERA)...T8th in the AL with 61 appearances and T1st in the Majors with 9 relief wins.

**TONIGHT'S TILT...**the Mariners continue the penultimate road trip of the 2010 season with a 2-team, 6-game trip tonight with the 2nd of three games against the Oakland A's (0-1)...following an off day on Thursday in Southern California, will play three games vs. the Angels...went 4-6 on recently concluded 10-game homestand against the Twins (1-2), Angels (1-2) and Indians (2-2)...tonight's game will be broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network and televised by FSN Northwest in HD.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**lost yesterday to fall to 2-4 in September...won 4 of last 9 games and are 10-13 in last 23 games...6-7 in last 13 road games...lost 39 of last 61 games; 19-31 post ASG...held a lead in 92 of 138 games (40 blown leads in losses)...trailed at some point in 28 of 54 wins...33-38 at home; 21-46 on the road.

- Have lost 21 games in the opponents final at-bat (last: 8/16 at BAL), including 10 walk-off losses.
- Seattle leads the Majors with an average time of game of 2:39:13 in regulation 9-inning games.
- **Ichiro** leads MLB w/ 48 infield hits...505 career inf. hits, 2nd among active players, trails L. Castillo (530).
- **Ichiro** is 1st in MLB w/57 multi-hit games (Prado, 53) & 2nd in MLB in hits (179; Josh Hamilton, 183).
- Mariners batted around 5 times (last: 7/22 vs. BOS)...sent 9 men to plate 7 times (last: 8/17 at BAL).
- 70 of 137 G decided by 1 or 2 runs...19-23 in 1-run, 13-15 in 2-run.
- Seattle is 35-17 when scoring 4 or more runs, compared to 19-67 when scoring 3 runs or less.
- **Felix Hernandez** has a current streak of 16.1 consecutive scoreless innings.
- Have scored 2 runs or less in 62 (10-52) of 138 games; 1 or less in 35 games (3-32) incl. 12 shutouts.
- The Mariners have used 112 different batting lineups and 89 different defensive alignments this year.
- Seattle is 14-28 in day games (lost 6 of last 9) and 40-56 in night games.
- **Russell Brayan** has hit 17 of his 23 home runs this season on the road...5 of 23 HR vs. LHP.
- **Current Hitting Streaks -- Ichiro** 8 G (.400/14x35).

**SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...**tonight is the 14th (5-8) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2010...Seattle is 1-6 in Oakland, and 4-2 at Safeco Field...finish out the 2010 season with a 4-game series in Seattle, Sept. 30-Oct. 3...Seattle is 42-28 vs. the A's since 2007, including winning 2 of last 3 season series...Mariners trail the all-time series 206-278, including going 87-157 in Oakland.

**STOP THE STREAK...**the Mariners have dropped 6 of 7 games in Oakland this season...after winning here 5-3 on Opening Day, have dropped 6 straight games...6-game losing streak at Oakland Coliseum is the longest since a 10-gamer Sept. 7, 2005-Aug. 16, 2006.

**(HIT) KING OF THE COLISEUM...****Ichiro** has recorded at least one hit in 76 of 89 career games at Oakland-Alameda County Stadium (85%)...has a hit in 17 of his last 18 games here (since 7/9/08), batting .397 (29x73) during the stretch...overall, is a career .363 (135x372) hitter at OACS, the highest batting average by any player at this venue (min. 200 PA)...Derek Jeter is next closest at .347 (90x63).

**BRANYAN'S BLASTS...****Russell Brayan** has homered in 3 of his last 5 games, including back-to-back games Sept. 4-5...has hit 7 of the Mariners last 11 home runs...for the season has hit 23 homers (15th in the AL), including 13 in 49 games with the Mariners (10 w/CLE)...Brayan ranks 2nd in club history (min. 700 PA) hitting a home run once every 13.73 at-bats (44 HR in 165 G)...trails only Ken Phelps (13.32) and is ahead of Ken Griffey Jr. (15.15).

**START IT UP...**Mariners starters rank 2nd in the AL with a 3.74 ERA (361 ER, 869.1 IP)...trail only Oakland (3.43) and are ahead of 3rd-place Tampa Bay (3.92)...also lead the league with 10 complete games and T4th with 2 CG shutouts...Mariners led the AL in 2009 with a 3.89 starters ERA (also led with overall 3.87 mark), and have a current 2-year run where the starters have posted the best AL mark at 3.82 (300 G, 777 ER, 1830.2 IP, 1259 K, 568 BB)...**Felix Hernandez** is 30-15, 2.40 (122 ER, 458.0 IP) over the last 2 seasons.

**THIS WOULD BE GREAT IF WE WERE GOLFING...**the Mariners have scored 3 or less runs in 11 consecutive games (4-7)...scored 4 runs in game #2 Aug. 25 at Boston, the only time in their past 14 games to reach 4 runs...have not scored 5 or more runs in a game since Aug. 21 at NYY...**current 11-game streak of scoring 3 or fewer runs is the 2nd-longest in club history**...trails only a 12-gamer in 1988 (June 10-22)...has scored 3 or fewer runs in 15 consecutive home games, the longest streak of its kind by a Major League team since the 1954 Orioles.

**DOMINATION...**following his 8.0 shutout innings Sunday, **Felix Hernandez** has allowed just 1 ER in his last 6 starts for a 0.20 ERA (1 ER, 45.0 IP)...has a current string of 16.1 consecutive scoreless innings, the longest streak by a Mariners hurler this season...posted a 0.82 ERA in August, the 2nd-lowest by a Mariners pitcher in **ANY** month (M. Langston, 0.50, September 1988)...**among AL starters, ranks 2nd in ERA (2.30), 1st in starts (30), 1st in quality starts (27), 1st in innings (219.1) and 1st in strikeouts (209).**

**IT DOES SEEM LIKE THE HITS COME IN BUNCHES...****Ichiro** recorded career hit #2,200 Wednesday vs. the Angels (current hit total is 2,209), reaching the 2,200-hit mark faster than any player over the last 65 years...**Ichiro** recorded hit #2,220 in career game 1,559...the previous quickest players to reach 2,200 hits (since 1945): Stan Musial (1,669 G), Tony Gwynn (1,693), Kirby Puckett (1,705 G), Wade Boggs (1,710).

**ON THE FARM...**West Tenn's **Leury Bonilla** played all 9 positions in the Diamond Jaxx regular-season finale yesterday vs. Chattanooga...Bonilla started in CF, played LF (2nd), RF (3rd), 2B (4th), SS (5th), 3B (6th), 1B (7th), C (8th) and pitched a scoreless 9th inning...he went 1-for-3 at the plate with his 7th HR...see full minor league report by visiting the Mariners virtual press box at <http://multimedia.mariners.com/>.

**DID YOU KNOW?...**that **Franklin Gutierrez** has set a career-high with at least one RBI in 4 consecutive games?...despite missing the last 2 games of the Indians series with a stomach illness, Guti picked right back up yesterday with his team-leading 54th RBI on his 11th home run...Mike Sweeney set a 2010 team-high with an RBI in 5 consecutive games, May 8-18...the all-time Mariners record is 9 consecutive games with an RBI by Edgar Martinez in 1995.
