BOSTON RED SOX (78-62) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (69-70)

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Red Sox begin a 6-day, 6-game road trip with the 1st of 3 games in Oakland...Boston will also visit Seattle (9/13-15) on their penultimate road trip...The club has an off-day next Thursday (9/16) before beginning a 6-day, 6-game homestand against the Blue Jays (9/17-19) and Orioles (9/20-22)...Of Boston's remaining 22 regular season games, 13 are on the road and 9 will be at Fenway Park.

The club has dropped 6 of their last 10 road games overall but has won 11 of their last 19 and 13 of their last 23 tilts away from home...They are 28-22 (.560) on the road since 5/22, the 3rd best road mark in the Majors in that time after the Yankees (25-18, .581) and White Sox (32-24, .571).

Overall, the club's 36-32 (.529) road mark is 4th in the Majors after the Rays (41-29, .586), Yankees (38-28, .576) and Padres (38-30, .559)

RECORD KEEPER: At 78-62 (.557), the Sox are 9th in the Majors, 4th in the AL after NYY (87-53, .621), TB (84-55, .604) and MIN (83-57, .593)...The club has lost 7 of their last 11 tilts but are 23-18 since 7/26.

Boston is 3^{rd} in the AL East, 9.0 games behind the 1^{st} -place Yankees...The Sox are 2nd in the AL Wild Card race, 6.5 games behind the Rays for the top spot.

KING OF THE HILL: Entering tonight's start, Clay Buchholz leads the American League with a 2.25 ERA (38 ER/151.2 IP), behind only San Diego's Mat Latos (2.21) for tops in the Majors...Buchholz also ranks among AL leaders in wins (T-6th, 15), winning pct. (T-5th, .714) and opponent avg. (8th, .225), while pacing the ML in road (2.13) and night ERA (1.76).

2010 AL FRA LEADERS

OLD TRICKS: With a win over the Rays at 44 years and 37 days old on Wednesday night, Tim Wakefield became the oldest Red Sox pitcher to earn a victory...He passed Dennis Eckersley, who earned his last Sox win on 9/17/98 at Baltimore at 43 years, 349 days old.

MARCO THE LEADER: Marco Scutaro went 4-for-5 with a double, 2 home runs, 3 RBI and 3 runs as Boston's lead-off hitter in Wednesday's win over TB, matching career highs in homers (2nd time, also 7/22/09 vs. CLE with TOR) and hits (7th time, last 8/9/09 vs. BAL with TOR)...According to Elias, he became **the 4th player in Red Sox** history to record at least 4 hits and 2 home runs in the same game from the 1st slot in the batting order, joining Wade Boggs (8/6/84 vs. DET-GM 2), Darren Bragg (8/8/98 at TEX) and Johnny Damon (7/9/04 vs. TEX).

Scutaro leads the AL with 12 games of at least 3 hits as a shortstop and is tied for

1st in the AL with 43 multi-hit games at the position (also NYY's Derek Jeter).

CROSSING 1,000: With his 2-run homer in the 2nd inning on Wednesday, A Beltre collected his 1,000th and 1,001st career RBI...He became the 27th League third baseman to reach the milestone since the stat was tracked in 1920 and is 1 of 4 active third basemen, joining Chipper Jones, Scott Rolen and Aramis Ramirez. Beltre leads the Sox with 95 RBI in 2010, tied for 10th in the AL...His 40 runs batted in since the All-Star Break are 2nd-most in the American League.

30 ROCKS: David Ortiz knocked his 29th homer in Wednesday night's win, topping his mark from 2009 (28)...He ranks 6th in the American League and is **1 shy of his 6th** career 30-HR campaign, 1st since 2007...The 6, 30-HR seasons will tie Manny Ramirez for 2nd most in Red Sox history behind Ted Williams (8).

TO THE VICTOR: Victor Martinez is batting .396 (19-for-48) with 5 homers and 12 RBI over his last 12 games dating back to 8/27, the top average in the AL during that span (min. 39 PA) and tied for the most home runs and RBI...He has hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games overall at .375 (21-for-56).

MAJOR FIRSTS: Lars Anderson, who made his Big League debut on Monday, singled off Matt Garza in the 4^{th} inning on Wednesday night for his 1^{st} Major League hit and later notched his 1^{st} ML RBI with a run-scoring single in the 7^{th} .

10 SPOTS: With Marco Scutaro hitting his 10th homer on Wednesday night, the Sox now have 8 players in double-digits in 2010 (also Beltre, Drew, Hall, Martinez, Ortiz, Pedroia and Youkilis), tied for the most in the Majors with the Yankees and Blue Jays.

TO THE NINES: Darnell McDonald is the only Major Leaguer with at least 9 homers and 9 sac hits in 2010...He is the 1st Sox player to do it since 1993, when John Valentin (11 HR, 16 SH) and Billy Hatcher (9 HR, 11 SH) accomplished the feat.

STRIKING RESULTS: Red Sox hurlers have recorded 8 double-digit strikeout games in their last 17 contests and 4 in 8 September tilts...Their 36 games with at least 10 K's in 2010 lead the AL.

Boston leads the AL with 300 K's since the beginning of August, tied with the Dodgers and trailing only the Phillies (317) and Padres (316) for the ML lead.

DRIVE IN PLAYOFFS: Boston's Single-A Greenville club won Game 1 of the South Atlantic League's best-of-3 Southern Divisional Championship Wednesday night, beating the Savannah Sand Gnats (NYM) 8-3 at home...The Drive will be in Savannah tonight for Game 2 at 7:05 p.m. ET...Chris Balcom-Miller, who the Sox recently acquired from the Rockies in a trade for Manny Delcarmen, is slated to start.

BIRTHDAY ON TAP: Jacoby Ellsbury will celebrate his 27th birthday tomorrow...He shares his birthday with former Red Sox outfielder Ellis Burks amongst others.

The Sox begin a 3-game set in Oakland today, their final series against the A's this season...The 2 teams play a total of 9 times in 2010 with the clubs split 3-3 thus far.

2 victories in this series will give Boston a win in the season set with Oakland, its 4th straight year with a win or split...The Sox have won or split 5 of the last 6 season series with the A's beginning in 2004, losing only in 2006 (3-7)...Boston is 35-28 overall vs. Oakland since the start of 2004.

The Red Sox have won 2 of their last 4 but just 6 of their last 21 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06...Boston has not won a set in Oakland since 4/1-2/08 (2-0), after the 2 clubs opened that season with a split (1-1) in Japan.

The Sox have won 7 of their last 12 tilts vs. the A's and 17 of 29 beginning 6/7/07.

ROSTER RECAP: Boston yesterday claimed right-hander Matt Fox off waivers from the Twins and now has 34 players on the active roster (16 pitchers, 4 catchers, 6 infielders, 7 outfielders, 1 DH)...The club also has 5 players currently on the DL.

The Sox have had 50 different players appear in a game this year, most in the AL and 3rd in the Majors behind the Marlins (52) and Pirates (51)...The club had 52 players appear in a game last year.

Boston has used 23 pitchers in 2010, 2nd

most in the AL behind the Royals (25).

YOUTH IS SERVED: On 9/6 vs. TB, Red Sox started 3, 22 year-old players: Lars Anderson (22 years, 346 days), Ryan Kalish 162) and Yamaico Navarro 310)...It was the 1st time Boston featured a starting lineup of at least 3 players under the age of 23 since 10/4/80 vs. Toronto (G2): Glenn Hoffman (22, 89), Reid Nichols (22, 60) and Chico Walker (21, 314).

The loss snapped his 7-game unbeaten streak, 7/26-8/28...In that time, posted a ML-best 1.07 ERA (6 ER/50.2 IP) while going 5-0...Was the 2nd-longest undefeated stretch of his career after an 8-gamer, 8/19-9/24/09...Notched career-high streaks of quality starts and 6.0+ IP in the 7-start span.

Loss was 1^{st} at home since NYY on 5/8, snapping a career-high, 7-game home unbeaten stretch.

AL LEADER: Leads the American League with a 2.25 ERA (38 ER/151.2 IP), 2nd in the Majors behind SD's Mat Latos (2.21)...It is the 1st time a Red Sox hurler has paced the AL in ERA at this date since 2003, when Pedro Martinez posted an AL-best 2.48 ERA through games of 9/9/03.

Also ranks among AL leaders in wins (T-6th, 15 wins), win. pct. (T-5th, .714), opponent avg. (8th, .225) and HR/9.0 IP (3rd, 0.47)...Holding opponents to a ML-best .160 clip with RISP (19-for-119).

Tied for AL lead with 8 starts allowing 0 ER and 14 starts allowing no more than 1 ER...The last Sox hurler to have more 0 ER starts in a season was Daisuke Matsuzka with 9 in 2008...The last Boston pitcher with more starts of 1 ER or fewer in a campaign was Pedro Martinez with 20 in 2003.

in the AL with 21 wins since 8/19/09, with the Sox going 26-8 in those 34 starts, including 17-7 in 2010...Started each of BOS's last 5 shutouts since 5/29.

ELITE 18: Leads ML hurlers with a 1.78 ERA (23 ER/116.1 IP) over 18 starts since 5/14, 14 of which were Sox wins...Has limited opponents to 3 runs or less in 17 of those 18 starts.

NASTY AT NIGHT: Leads ML with a 1.76 ERA (23 ER/117.2) during night games...His 13 night wins are tied with teammate Jon Lester and FLA's Ricky Nolasco for the ML lead.

ROAD WARRIOR: Leads the Majors with a 2.13 ERA (18 ER/76.0 IP) in road games, going 8-2 in 12 starts away from Fenway Park...Is tied for 3rd in the AL with 8 road wins, trailing Jon Lester and David Price (both 9)...Has gone 5-0 with a 1.18 ERA (6 ER/45.2 IP) in 6 road starts against AL East opponents this year...Is 9-1 with a 2.38 ERA (21 ER/79.1 IP) in his last 12 road starts overall vs. AL East foes since the start of 2008.

QUALITY GOODS: 3rd on the staff with 16 quality starts in 2010, trailing John Lackey and Jon Lester (both with 17)... Has a quality start in all 16 outings of at least 6.0 IP this year, going 12-2.

TOSSING ZEROES: Notched career-high streaks of 26.0 scoreless innings (2nd, 8/11-6th, 8/28) and 30.1 innings without allowing an ER (6th, 8/6-7th, 8/28)

Both streaks were the longest for a Sox hurler since Pedro Martinez's 35.0-inning scoreless run, 7/25-8/16/02...His 26.0-IP scoreless run is the longest by an AL starter this year, 3rd-longest in the AL overall (CWS J.J. Putz, 27.0; TEX Darren O'Day, 26.1).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Named AL Pitcher of the Month for August after going 4-0 with a 1.03 ERA (5 ER/43.2 IP) and 28 K's in 6 starts...Ranked 2nd in the Majors in ERA during the month and finished among AL leaders in wins (2^{nd}) and innings $(T-3^{rd})$...Allowed 1 ER or less in 5 of the 6 outings, going 7.0+ innings 5 times...Career-high 26.0 scoreless inning streak encompassed 3 straight starts without an ER, 8/11-22.

VS. OAKLAND: Makes 2nd start vs. the A's this year after taking the loss at OAK on 7/21, his 1st start after being activated off the DL (left hamstring strain)...Went 4.0 IP, allowing 5 runs (season-high tying 5 ER), including a season-high 2 HR in that outing...OAK is 1 of 4 AL teams he has never beaten, also CWS, CLE and SEA.

FIRST TIME ALL-STAR: Was a 1st-time All-Star in 2010...His 2.45 ERA was the best by a BOS pitcher at the break since Pedro Martinez in 2003 (2.36).

PREVIOUS STARTS: Did not receive a decision in a 3-2, 10-inning loss at TB on 8/28...Gave up 2 runs (1 ER) on 4 hits, with 2 walks and 5 K's...His own throwing error on a pickoff attempt set up a Matt Joyce sacrifice fly in the 7th and B.J. Upton hit a game-tying solo home run in the 8th...Dan Johnson hit a walk-off homer off Scott Atchison in the 10th to win it for the Rays...Overcame 2 rain delays, totaling 2:43, to toss 6.0 scoreless frames in a 5-0 win over TOR at Fenway on 8/22...Was his career-high 7th consecutive undefeated start at home, dating back to 5/19...Daniel Bard and Felix Doubront finished the shutout, Boston's 8th of 2010.

MORE 2010 HIGHLIGHTS: Went 8.0 IP, allowing 1 run (0 ER), in a 10-1 win at TOR on 8/11...Was his team-high 5th start this year giving up 2 runs or less while lasting at least 8.0 IP...The last Sox pitcher with more than 5 such starts was Pedro Martinez (10) in 2002...Took a 2-hit shutout into the 9th, but received a ND in a 4-3 win vs. DET on 8/1...Missed 18 games on the DL (Sox went 8-10) from 6/26-7/21 with a left hamstring strain, sustained while running the bases at SF on 6/26.
