BOSTON RED SOX (78-64) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (71-70)

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Red Sox continue a 6-day, 6-game road trip with the last of 3 games in Oakland...Boston will also visit Seattle (9/13-15) on their penultimate road trip...The club has an off-day Thursday (9/16) before beginning a 6-day, 6-game homestand against the Blue Jays (9/17-19) and Orioles (9/20-22)...Of Boston's remaining 20 regular season games, 11 are on the road and 9 will be at Fenway Park.

The club has dropped 8 of their last 12 road games overall but has won 11 of their last 21 and 13 of their last 25 tilts away from home...They are 28-24 (.538) on the road since 5/22, the 3rd-best road mark in the American League in that time after the White Sox (32-24, .571) and Yankees (25-20, .556).

Overall, the club's 36-34 (.514) road mark is 7th in the Majors and 4th in the AL

after the Rays (43-29, .597), Yankees (38-30, .559) and White Sox (39-36, .520).

RECORD KEEPER: At 78-64 (.549), the Sox are tied for 10^{th} in the Majors, and tied with Chicago (also 78-64) for 5th in the AL after New York (87-55, .613), Tampa Bay (86-55, .610), Minnesota (84-58, .592) and Texas (79-63, .556)...The club has lost 9 of its last 13 tilts but is 23-20 since 7/26.

Boston is 3rd in the AL East, 9.0 games behind the 1st-place Yankees...The Sox are tied with the White Sox for 2nd in the AL Wild Card race, 8.5 games behind the Rays.

TOUGH LUCK LOSSES: John Lackey suffered the loss in last night's 4-3 defeat in Oakland, yielding 3 runs over 7.0 innings...It marked his 2nd straight losing effort in which he recorded a quality start (also, 9/4 vs. CWS, 7.0 IP/3 R/1 ER), receiving just 3 total runs in support while on the mound in those outings.

TO THE VICTOR: Victor Martinez, who went 2-for-4 with a run, double and walk in a start at 1st base last night, is batting .393 (22-for-56) with 5 homers and 12 RBI over his last 14 games dating back to 8/27...In that time ranks among AL leaders in homers (T-1st), RBI (T-2nd) and batting average (4th)...He has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games overall at .375 (24-for-64).

LEFT IS RIGHT: Victor Martinez leads the Majors with a .411 mark (51-for-124) against left-handed pitching and has tallied a .750 slugging percentage vs. southpaws, 2nd in the Majors behind Kevin Youkilis who slugged .798 against lefties prior to his season-ending injury.

Darnell McDonald is hitting .429 (15-for-35) when facing left-handed

pitching over his last 14 games and .299 (38-for-127) on the season.

MARCO THE LEADER: Marco Scutaro was back in the lineup last night after a night off Friday and knocked his 3rd homer in as many games, a solo shot in the 3rd inning...It was his 11th long ball of the year, 1 shy of his career high from 2009.

He went 4-for-5 with a double, 2 home runs, 3 RBI and 3 runs as Boston's lead-off hitter in Wednesday's win over TB and is hitting .313 (10-for-32) with 4 homers and 8 RBI over his last 8 contests.

Scutaro leads the AL with 12 games of at least 3 hits as a shortstop and is tied for 1st in the AL with 43 multi-hit games at the position (also NYY's Derek Jeter).

1,000 NOW 100: Adrian Beltre, who went 2-for-3 with a double, RBI and 2 walks last night, is 4 RBI shy of reaching the 100 mark for the 2nd time in his career, after driving in 121 runs in 2004...His 96 RBI lead the Sox and are 10th in the AL...His 41 RBI since the All-Star Break are 2nd in the AL behind Toronto's Jose Bautista (54).

Beltre collected his 1,000th and 1,001st career RBI on Wednesday vs. the Rays...He

became the 27th Major League third baseman to reach the milestone since the stat was tracked in 1920 and is 1 of 4 active 3rd basemen, joining Chipper Jones, Scott Rolen and Aramis Ramirez.

30 ROCKS: David Ortiz knocked his 29^{th} homer in Wednesday night's win, topping his mark from 2009 (28)...He ranks 6^{th} in the American League and is **1 shy of his 6^{th}** career 30-HR campaign, 1st since 2007...The 6, 30-HR seasons will tie Manny Ramirez for 2nd most in Red Sox history behind Ted Williams (8).

10 SPOTS: The Red Sox have 8 players with double-digits in homers this season (Beltre, Drew, Hall, Martinez, Ortiz, Pedroia, Scutaro and Youkilis), tied with the Yankees and Blue Jays for the most in the Majors...It is the most by a Red Sox club since the 2003 squad boasted 9 players with 10 or more homers.

KING OF THE HILL: Friday night's starter Clay Buchholz yielded 5 runs in 1.0+ inning of work, the shortest non-injury-related start of his career...Despite the setback, Buchholz ranks 2^{nd} in the American League with a 2.53 ERA (43 ER/152.2 IP), trailing only Seattle's Felix Hernandez (2.39) for tops in the circuit.

SWEET RELIEF: The Red Sox bullpen combined for 7.0 scoreless innings Friday night (4 relievers), matching the club's longest single-game scoreless relief effort since 2004, also accomplished 5/30/08 at Baltimore (6 relievers) and 7/15/10 vs. TEX (4 relievers)...Despite allowing 1 run last night, the pen is posting a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) over the last 3 games.

OLD TRICKS: With a win over the Rays at 44 years, 37 days old on Wednesday night, Tim Wakefield became the oldest Red Sox pitcher to earn a victory...He passed Dennis Eckersley, who was 43 years, 349 days old in his last Sox win, 9/17/98 at BAL.

DRIVE MOVING ON: Boston's Single-A Greenville affiliate swept the South Atlantic League's best-of-3 Southern Divisional Championship with a 5-4 Game 2 win Friday night in Savannah (NYM)...The Drive enter the SAL Championship Series for the 2^{nd} straight season and will host Lakewood (PHI) in GMs 1 and 2 on Monday and Tuesday.

The Sox conclude a 3-game series in Oakland today, their final set against the A's this year...The Sox trail 3-5 thus far.

Last night's 4-3 defeat secured Boston a loss in the season set with Oakland, only its series loss against the A's since 2004 (also 2006, 3-7)...Boston is 35-30 overall vs. Oakland since the start of 2004.

The Red Sox have won 1 of their 5 games in Oakland this year and just 6 of their last 23 contests at the Coliseum dating back to 7/26/06...Boston needs a win today to avoid losing as many as 5 games in Oakland for the 1^{st} time since 1987 (1-5).

With a victory today, the Red Sox will avoid being swept by the A's for the 1st time since 5/23-25/08 in Oakland (0-3)...The Sox have dropped 4 straight to the A's, their longest such stretch since a 5-game losing streak vs. OAK, 7/26/06-5/1/07...Despite the skid, the Sox have won 7 of their last 14 tilts vs. the A's and 17 of 31 since 6/7/07.

ROSTER RECAP: On Thursday, Boston claimed right-hander Matt Fox off waivers from the Twins and now has 34 players on the active roster (16 pitchers, 4 catchers, 6 infielders, 7 outfielders, 1 DH)...The club also has 5 players currently on the DL.

The Sox have had 50 different players appear in a game this year, most in the AL and 3rd in the Majors behind the Marlins (52) and Pirates (51)...The club had 52 players appear in a game last year.

Boston has used 23 pitchers in 2010, 2nd most in the AL behind the Royals (25).

LOVULLO JOINS RED SOX STAFF: Triple-A Pawtucket manager Torey Lovullo joined the Red Sox in Oakland Friday and will assist the staff for the rest of the season.

YOUTH IS SERVED: On Monday vs. TB, the Red Sox started 3, 22 year-old players: Lars Anderson (22 years, 346 days), Ryan Kalish (22, 162) and Yamaico Navarro (22, 310)...It was the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ time Boston featured a starting lineup with at least 3 players under the age of 23 since 10/4/80 vs. Toronto (G2): Glenn Hoffman (22, 89), Reid Nichols (22, 60) and Chico Walker (21, 314).

Struck out a season-high 9, his most K's in a game since fanning 9 on 9/2/09 at TB.

Notched his $3^{\rm rd}$ straight quality start since 8/25, his longest such streak of the season and longest overall since turning in 4 straight quality outings from 7/27-8/12/09.

Has walked 2 batters or fewer in 8 consecutive starts since 7/28, his longest such stretch of the season and longest overall since he put together 15 such starts from 6/3-8/23/09.

STRIKING RESULTS: Enters tonight's game needing 3 strikeouts to tie Frank Sullivan (821) for 9th place on the Red Sox all-time list...Fanned Jeff Mathis in the 5th inning on 8/19 vs. LAA for his 795th K with Boston, passing Ray Culp (794) to move into sole possession of 10th place on that list.

Ranks 8th in the Majors with 1,288 strikeouts since the start of the 2003 campaign...Has recorded 818 strikeouts since joining the Red Sox in 2006, 5th in the AL in that time...Has recorded at least 5 K's in 104 of his 139 starts since 2006, 3rd-most in the AL in that span.

Recorded his 1,400th career strikeout in his 242nd ML outing, fanning Torii Hunter to end the top of the 1st on 8/19 vs. LAA...Became the 3rd-fastest pitcher since 2000 to reach 1,400 K's, after only A.J. Burnett (237th game on 8/7/09) and Jake Peavy (222nd game on 5/8/10).

CHASING DR. K: Has recorded at least 1 strikeout in each of his 245 career ML games since 9/4/01, the longest active streak in the Majors to begin a career...Since 1900, the only other pitcher with a strikeout in as many consecutive outings to begin a ML career was Dwight Gooden, who fanned at least 1 batter in each of his 1st 349 outings, 4/7/84-9/3/97.

(3-2 loss to Damian Moss)

His 245 straight games with at least 1 K is the 2nd-longest active streak overall after Javier Vazquez's current 349-game run (since 5/16/00) and tied with Bruce Hurst (4/15/85-7/31/92) for the 9th-longest stretch of any pitcher since 1920.

FAR AND NEAR: Leads the AL with 36 road wins since 2006, 4th-most in the Majors in that time

Has issued 3 walks or less in a career-high 20 straight road starts since 6/3/09, tied for the 4th-longest such streak in the AL since the beginning of 2009 and tied for the 2nd-longest active streak (also SEA's Jason Vargas) after TEX's Cliff Lee's 24-start run...Has allowed 3 ER or less 6 times in 9 road starts this season

Has lost only 3 times in his last 24 starts at home since the start of the 2009 season, 8/19/10 to the Angels and twice to the Yankees, 8/23/09 and 5/7/10...In that span, he is 12-3 with a 4.25 ERA (75 ER/158.2 IP) at home for a .800 winning percentage.

WINNING WAYS: Is tied for 6th in the Majors with 84 wins since 2005 and tied for 3rd in the AL with 69 wins since joining the Red Sox in 2006.

Since joining the Red Sox in 2006, ranks 2nd in ML (min. 575.0 IP) with 5.97 runs of support per 9.0 innings, behind only LAD's Vicente Padilla (6.25).

VS. OAKLAND: Makes 1st start vs. OAK this year after earning the win in his last outing against the A's, 7/27/09 at Fenway Park...Gave up 3 runs in 7.0 IP in that start...Allowed 3 ER or less in each of his last 6 outings against the A's since 7/24/06, including each of his 3 career starts at OAK.

ON THE DL: Missed 56 games on the DL with a lower back strain from 5/19-7/22 ...The Red Sox went 34-22 while he was sidelined...Is 3-3 with a 4.79 ERA (30 ER/56.1 IP) in 9 starts since coming off the DL on 7/23.

PREVIOUS STARTS: Suffered the defeat in a 5-2 loss at BAL on 8/31...Lasted 7.0 innings, allowing 3 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits with 1 walk and 5 K's...Lost for just the 2nd time in his last 10 road starts since 9/23/09 (also 8/8/10 at NYY)...Did not give up a home run, snapping a career-high-tying 5-start stretch of surrendering at least 1 long ball, from 8/3-25...Gave up just 4 hits and 1 ER over his final 6.0 innings...Allowed 3 runs in 6.1 innings in a 5-3 win over SEA at Fenway Park on 8/25 (G1)...Gave up just 1 hit through 6.0 shutout frames before allowing a solo HR to Russell Branyan and a 2-run shot to Casey Kotchman in the 7th...Retired 16 consecutive batters after an Ichiro Suzuki infield single to begin the game.

MORE 2010 HIGHLIGHTS: Earned his 1st home win of 2010 with a 3-1 victory vs. CLE on 8/3...Went a season-long 8.0 innings, allowing 1 run on a season-low 3 hits with no walks...Tied a season-high with 8 K's...Retired the final 14 batters he faced, beginning with the 2nd out of the 4th inning...Was his 1st win at home since defeating CLE at Fenway on 10/3/09...Allowed 3 runs in 7.0 innings to earn the 7-3 win at LAA on 7/28, snapping his 7-game winless streak, dating back to 4/10 at KC...Was the longest winless stretch of his career since an 8-start string with FLA from 5/25-8/15/04...Defeated LAA in the regular season for the 1st time since 4/16/07, ending his longest winless drought against any AL opponent (last win vs. TOR on 9/4/07).
