WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost a season-high six straight games and 10 of their last 12 as they begin a six-game, seven-day trip tonight in Oakland ... right-hander Gavin Floyd, who owns a 2.85 ERA in his last 18 starts, takes the mound for the Sox.
- The Sox were a season-high 17 games over .500 (77-60) and 3.5 games behind Minnesota in the American League Central on 9/6 but have gone 2-10 since and are a season-high 10.0 games off the pace.
- Chicago's 25-5 mark to end the first half matched the best record in major-league history in the final 30 games before the break (also 1975 Reds and 1990 Mets).
- The White Sox have used 102 different lineups.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has lost a season-high six straight games (all at home), its longest losing streak since 4/28-5/5/08 (seven).
- The White Sox are 7-3 in their last 10 road games.
- Sox starters are 0-8 with a 7.09 ERA (62 ER/78.2 IP) and a .345 (117-339) average against in their last 14 games.
- Manny Ramirez is 13-50 (.260) with one home run and one RBI and a .422 on-base percentage in 17 games with the White Sox (12 singles).
- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to tie Patsy Donovan (518) for 30th place on the all-time list.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox erased a four-run deficit in the ninth inning only to fall to the Tigers, 9-7, in 11 innings to extend their season-high losing streak to six games ... Detroit's sweep was the first over Chicago since 8/11-13/06 and the second straight by an opponent at U.S. Cellular Field.
- The Sox led 3-1 in the seventh inning before the Tigers tallied six runs on five hits to take the lead ... Chicago evened the score at 7-7 before Gerald Laird's two-out single brought home the deciding run in the 11th.
- Alex Rios established a career high with his 86th RBI ... the Sox stranded 21 runners, their most since 5/8/84 vs. Milwaukee (24 in 25 innings).

AT THE GATE

- The Sox surpassed the 2-million mark in attendance last night vs. Detroit, marking the 12th time in franchise history (sixth straight year) the club has reached that milestone.

ON THE HOMESTAND

- Chicago went 2-7 on its nine-game, 10-day homestand vs. Kansas City (2-1), Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (0-3) ... the Sox hit .248 (80-322) with a 7.27 ERA (67 ER/83.0 IP) on the homestand and were outscored, 67-41.
- The White Sox were swept in back-to-back home series for the first time since 5/19-31/89 (three consecutive series sweeps by Toronto, Baltimore and Detroit).
- Manny Ramirez hit his first home run as a member of the White Sox on Friday vs. Detroit, ending an 84 at-bat homerless drought ... the homerless streak was the second-longest of his career behind an 89 at-bat stretch from 7/6-8/1/97.

ON THE MOUND

- White Sox pitchers have posted a 6.29 ERA (88 ER/126.0 IP) and a .317 (164-517) average against in their last 14 games ... Sox starters have gone 0-8 with a 7.09 ERA (62 ER/78.2 IP) and a .345 (117-339) average during that span.

KONERKO IN THE TRIPLE CROWN RACE

- Paul Konerko ranks among the American League leaders in home runs (2nd, 37), RBI (5th, 105) and average (6th, .318).
- The last White Sox player to rank in the Top 5 in the AL in home runs, RBI and average in a single season was Albert Belle in 1998 ... Belle finished second in both homers (49) and RBI (152) and was third in average (.328).
- Chicago's last player to finish among the five best in each of the AL's Triple Crown categories: home runs (2nd, 36 by Carlos Quentin in 2008), RBI (5th, 120 by Jermaine Dye in 2005) and average (5th, .317 by Magglio Ordonez in 2003).

SOX SS MAKES CASE FOR THE SILVER

- Alexei Ramirez leads all American League shortstops in average (.279), is tied for first in home runs (17) and tied for second in RBI (63) ... he is tied with former Toronto shortstop Alex Gonzalez (now with Atlanta) for the AL lead in home runs as a shortstop ... statistics as shortstop only.
- Ramirez also leads all AL shortstops with 721 total chances.
- No Sox shortstop has ever won a Silver Slugger Award.

SOX OPPONENTS WAITING TO SCORE

- Twenty of Chicago's 24 runs allowed in its last three games have come in the seventh inning or later ... Detroit scored all nine of its runs Friday after the sixth, three of six on Saturday and eight of nine last night.

LOOK AT ME, I CAN BE CENTER FIELD

- Alex Rios ranks second in club history with 21 home runs as a center fielder, third with 84 RBI and fourth with 88 runs scored ... he needs two home runs to tie Aaron Rowand (23 in 2004) for the franchise record for center fielders ... statistics as center fielder only.

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox are hitting .179 (12-67) in their last six games with runners in scoring position, including a 4-24 effort last night vs. Detroit.

WHAT A STEAL

- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to tie Scott Podsednik (59 in 2005) for second place on the club's all-time single-season list ... Pierre is also one stolen base behind Patsy Donovan (30th, 518) on the all-time list.
- Pierre is attempting to become the first White Sox player since Luis Aparicio (1961) to lead the major leagues in stolen bases ... he leads the majors with 58 steals in 2010, six more than Houston's Michael Bourn (52).

KER-PLUNKED

- White Sox batters have been hit by a pitch 76 times this season, most in the American League ... conversely, Sox pitchers have hit just 32 batters, fewest in the AL.
- Since 2004, Sox pitchers rank 13th in the AL with 338 hit batsmen, while their hitters rank third with 453 ... only Cleveland (509) and New York (505) have been hit by a pitch more.

CENTRAL STRUGGLES

- Chicago is 2-10 in its last 12 games vs. American League Central opponents and 8-16 in its last 24 ... the Sox, who are 30-39 against the AL Central this season, have gone 7-8 vs. Cleveland, 8-10 vs. Detroit, 10-8 vs. Kansas City and 5-13 vs. Minnesota.

CHISOX INSTRUCTIONAL LEAGUE

- The White Sox Instructional League will commence with their first workout tomorrow at Camelback Ranch in Glendale, Az ... among those participating in the fall camp are right-handed pitchers Addison Reed and Thomas Royle, catchers Miguel Gonzalez, Sean O'Connell and Josh Phegley, infielders Jon Gilmore and Tyler Saladino and outfielders Jared Mitchell, Brandon Short and Trayce Thompson.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Chicago is 3-3 vs. Oakland this season, going 1-2 at the Coliseum and 2-1 at U.S. Cellular Field.
- The Sox are 5-3 at Oakland in their last eight games after going 6-28 (.176) in 34 games from 5/18/01-8/15/08.
- The White Sox are hitting .234 (46-197) with a 4.15 ERA (24 ER/52.0 IP) and have been outscored, 25-23.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 260-281 ... they are 134-133 in Chicago (46-51 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 126-148 at the Coliseum.
