CHICAGO WHITE SOX (79-71) at OAKLAND A'S (75-74) LHP Mark Buehrle (12-11, 4.16) vs. RHP Trevor Cahill (16-7, 2.84) Game #151/Road #77 • Tuesday, September 21, 2010

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost a season-high seven straight games and 11 of their last 13 as they continue a six-game, seven-day trip tonight in Oakland ... left-hander Mark Buehrle, who is 7.2 IP shy of his 10th straight season with at least 200.0 IP, takes the mound for the Sox.
- The Sox were a season-high 17 games over .500 (77-60) and 3.5 games behind Minnesota in the American League Central on 9/6 but have gone 2-11 since and are a season-high 11.0 games off the pace.
- Chicago's 25-5 mark to end the first half matched the best record in major-league history in the final 30 games before the break (also 1975 Reds and 1990 Mets).
- The White Sox have used 103 different lineups.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has lost a season-high seven straight games, its longest losing streak since 4/28-5/5/08 (seven) ... the last time the Sox lost eight in a row was 8/11-19/07.
- The White Sox are 7-4 in their last 11 road games.
- Sox starters are 0-8 with a 7.09 ERA (62 ER/78.2 IP) and a .345 (117-339) average against in their last 15 games ... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 15 games without a victory by a Sox starter ties a club record (also 6/15-7/1/85).
- Mark Buehrle is 1-6 with a 4.46 ERA (36 ER/72.2 IP) in 11 career starts in Oakland ... he earned the win in his last start on 7/23 at the Coliseum (1 ER/9.0 IP).
- Manny Ramirez is 14-52 (.269) with one home run, one RBI and a .441 on-base percentage in 18 games with the White Sox (13 singles).
- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to tie Patsy Donovan (518) for 30th place on the all-time list.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox lost their seventh straight game as four Oakland pitchers combined on a four-hit shutout, 3-0 ... the A's scored all three runs (one earned) in the seventh inning off reliever Scott Linebrink.
- Chicago starter Gavin Floyd left the game after throwing just seven pitches due to tightness in the back of his right shoulder ... Tony Pena tossed 6.0 scoreless IP in relief of Floyd.
- The Sox No. 1-4 hitters combined to go 0-16.

ON THE TRIP

- Chicago is 0-1 on its six-game, seven-day road trip at Oakland (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (9/24-26) ... the Sox are hitting .129 (4-31) with a 1.00 ERA (1 ER/9.0 IP).

10-30-200

- Mark Buehrle needs 7.2 IP to record at least 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the 10th straight season, already the longest active streak in the major leagues.
- Buehrle and CC Sabathia are the only active pitchers with at least 10 wins in each season since 2001.

ON THE MOUND

- White Sox pitchers have posted a 5.98 ERA (89 ER/134.0 IP) and a .315 (173-549) average against in their last 15 games ... Sox starters have gone 0-8 with a 7.09 ERA (62 ER/78.2 IP) and a .345 (117-339) average during that span.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 15 games without a victory by a Sox starter ties a club record (also 6/15-7/1/85).

KONERKO IN THE TRIPLE CROWN RACE

- Paul Konerko ranks among the American League leaders in home runs (2nd, 37), RBI (5th, 105) and average (7th, .316).
- The last White Sox player to rank in the Top 5 in the AL in home runs, RBI and average in a single season was Albert Belle in 1998 ... Belle finished second in both homers (49) and RBI (152) and was third in average (.328).
- Chicago's last player to finish among the five best in each of the AL's Triple Crown categories: home runs (2nd, 36 by Carlos Quentin in 2008), RBI (5th, 120 by Jermaine Dye in 2005) and average (5th, .317 by Magglio Ordonez in 2003).

SOX SS MAKES CASE FOR THE SILVER

- Alexei Ramirez ranks among American League shortstops in home runs (T1st, 17), average (.277) and RBI (3rd, 63) ... he is tied with former Toronto shortstop Alex Gonzalez (now with Atlanta) for the AL lead in home runs as a shortstop ... *statistics as shortstop only.*
- Ramirez also leads all AL shortstops with 723 total chances.
- No Sox shortstop has ever won a Silver Slugger Award.

SOX OPPONENTS WAITING TO SCORE

- Twenty-three of Chicago's 27 runs allowed in its last four games have come in the seventh inning or later.

LOOK AT ME, I CAN BE CENTER FIELD

- Alex Rios ranks second in club history with 21 home runs as a center fielder, third with 84 RBI and fourth with 88 runs scored ... he needs two home runs to tie Aaron Rowand (23 in 2004) for the franchise record for center fielders ... *statistics as center fielder only.*

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox are hitting .164 (12-73) in their last seven games with runners in scoring position, including a 4-24 effort on 9/19 vs. Detroit.
- Chicago has also left 31 runners on base in the last two games (season-high 21 on 9/19 vs. Detroit).

WHAT A STEAL

- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to tie Scott Podsednik (59 in 2005) for second place on the club's all-time single-season list ... Pierre is also one stolen base behind Patsy Donovan (30th, 518) on the all-time list.
- Pierre is attempting to become the first White Sox player since Luis Aparicio (1961) to lead the major leagues in stolen bases ... he leads the majors with 58 steals in 2010, six more than Houston's Michael Bourn (52).

KER-PLUNKED

- White Sox batters have been hit by a pitch 76 times this season, most in the American League ... conversely, Sox pitchers have hit just 32 batters, fewest in the AL.
- Since 2004, Sox pitchers rank 13th in the AL with 338 hit batsmen, while their hitters rank third with 453 ... only Cleveland (509) and New York (505) have been hit by a pitch more.

CENTRAL STRUGGLES

- Chicago is 2-10 in its last 12 games vs. American League Central opponents and 8-16 in its last 24 ... the Sox, who are 30-39 against the AL Central this season, have gone 7-8 vs. Cleveland, 8-10 vs. Detroit, 10-8 vs. Kansas City and 5-13 vs. Minnesota.

CHISOX INSTRUCTIONAL LEAGUE

- The White Sox Instructional League will commence with their first workout today at Camelback Ranch in Glendale, Az ... among those participating in the fall camp are right-handed pitchers Addison Reed and Thomas Roysse, catchers Miguel Gonzalez, Sean O'Connell and Josh Phegley, infielders Jon Gilmore and Tyler Saladino and outfielders Jared Mitchell, Brandon Short and Trayce Thompson.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Chicago is 3-4 vs. Oakland this season, going 1-3 at the Coliseum and 2-1 at U.S. Cellular Field.
- The Sox are 5-4 at Oakland in their last nine games after going 6-28 (.176) in 34 games from 5/18/01-8/15/08.
- The White Sox are hitting .219 (50-228) with a 3.75 ERA (25 ER/60.0 IP) and have been outscored, 28-23.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 260-282 ... they are 134-133 in Chicago (46-51 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 126-149 at the Coliseum.

BUEHRLE AT A GLANCE

- 31-year-old left-hander makes his 31st start, 17th on the road and second vs. Oakland ... needs 7.2 IP to record 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the 10th consecutive season (2001-current), becoming the only pitcher in baseball to accomplish that feat ... has recorded 10 victories and 30 starts in 10 straight campaigns, both extending his own franchise records ... is 0-2 with a 5.63 ERA (20 ER/32.0 IP) in five starts since his last victory on 8/19 at Minnesota ... had gone 9-3 with a 2.69 ERA (27 ER/90.1 IP) in his previous 13 outings.
Sox are 18-12 in his starts, winning 16 of the last 22 ... has made 18 quality starts, including 14 of his last 18 ... has induced 17 GDP ... is receiving 5.01 runs of support per 9.0 IP (107 R/192.1 IP).
Is 6-7 with a 3.51 ERA (41 ER/105.0 IP) in 16 road starts this season and 65-58 with a 3.88 ERA (457 ER/1,060.1 IP) lifetime ... is 6-3 with a 2.85 ERA (28 ER/88.1 IP), two complete games and 10 quality starts in his last 13 road starts.
Went 4-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 ER/28.0 IP) during interleague play ... led the major leagues in wins and ranked second in ERA behind teammate Gavin Floyd (0.92).
His 207 quality starts since 2001 rank second in the major leagues behind Roy Oswalt (208) ... owns a .576 career winning percentage (147-108).

LAST START

Suffered his 11th loss on 9/16 vs. Minnesota, allowing six runs on eight hits over 5.0 IP ... walked two and struck out one ... gave up three runs each in the second and fifth innings ... left with a 6-2 deficit after throwing 99 pitches (66 strikes) ... start was the 30th of his career, the 10th straight season he has reached that milestone ... game lasted 3:25

SEEING DOUBLE

Has recorded 10 victories for the 10th consecutive season, setting the franchise record he previously shared with Doc White (1903-11) ... joins CC Sabathia (2001-10) as the only active pitchers with 10-plus wins in each of the last 10 campaigns.

RECENT STARTS OF NOTE

- Threw a season-high 125 pitches on 9/5 at Boston, the second-highest total of his career (128 on 6/26/03 at Minnesota) ... last win came on 8/19 at Minnesota when he threw with 7.0 scoreless IP ... threw back-to-back complete games on 7/17-23 for the third time in his career and first since 9/25-30/04 ... went the distance on 7/23 at Oakland on the one-year anniversary of his perfect game vs. Tampa Bay.
Recorded his 25th career complete game in a loss at Minnesota on 7/17 ... game lasted 1:52, his eighth career start played in under 2:00 ... made his 200th career quality start on 7/9 vs. Kansas City with 7.0 scoreless IP ... threw 2.1 scoreless IP on 5/26 at Cleveland before being ejected by first-base umpire Joe West for disputing two called balks ... ejection was second career (8/1/05 at Baltimore) ... made eighth career OD start on 4/5 vs. Cleveland, allowing three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.

FIELD YOUR POSITION

- Won his first Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2009, joining Jim Kaat (1974-75) as the only pitchers in White Sox history to win the honor ... became the first Sox winner since third baseman Robin Ventura was honored five times from 1991-98 ... is one of six pitchers in major-league history to throw a no-hitter and win a Gold Glove, joining Bob Gibson, Phil Niekro, Jim Palmer, Kenny Rogers and Bret Saberhagen.
Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads all major-league pitchers with 74 pickoffs (29 more than Andy Pettitte) and ranks third with 546 total chances and 415 assists.

PERFECTION

Threw the 18th perfect game in major-league history and second in White Sox history (first since 1922) on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay ... marked his second career no-hitter (also 4/18/07 vs. Texas) ... perfect game was the first in the majors since Arizona's Randy Johnson on 5/18/04 at Atlanta and the first in the American League since New York's David Cone on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal.

2009 SEASON

Set a major-league record by retiring 45 consecutive batters over three starts from 7/18-28 ... recorded 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the ninth consecutive season, the longest active streak in the major leagues ... became the second pitcher in Sox history to record 10 or more wins in at least nine straight seasons, joining Doc White (1903-13) ... made 30-plus starts for the ninth straight season, extending his club record.

WORKHORSE

Has thrown 2,202.0 IP since the start of the 2001 season, most in the major leagues ... is the only pitcher in baseball to throw at least 200.0 IP each season from 2001-09 ... led the AL in IP in back-to-back seasons in 2004-05, the first Sox pitcher to accomplish the feat since Wilbur Wood in 1972-73.

AMONG THE BEST

Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads the major leagues in IP (2,202.0), pickoffs (74) and opponents GDP (253) and ranks among the leaders in quality starts (2nd, 207), starts (3rd, 328), wins (4th, 143), complete games (4th, 26), shutouts (T10th, 8) and walks per 9.0 IP (13th, 2.04).

NO WALKING OR RUNNING

Has averaged 2.06 walks per 9.0 IP over his career and 2.20 in 2010, ninth-best in the AL ... has issued no walks in 69 of 331 career starts (6-30 in 2010) ... opponents have been successful on just 46 of 107 (43.0 percent) steal attempts and are 6-12 in 2010 ... has picked off 78 runners (MLB-high 11 in 2010).

DON'T GO TO THE FRIDGE

His 2010 starts have lasted an average of 2:41 ... eight of his career starts have been played in less than 2:00 ... his 1:39 game on 4/16/05 vs. Seattle was the fastest in the majors since 9/30/84 when Atlanta beat San Diego in 1:39 and fastest Sox game since 7/7/75 (1:38).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is a four-time All-Star (2002, 2005-06, '09) ... 208 of his 331 (62.8 percent) career starts have been quality ... ranks among the Sox all-time leaders in strikeouts (5th, 1,276), starts (4th, 331), wins (8th, 147) and IP (2,253.1) ... is one of five pitchers in history to record each of his first 100 wins in a Sox uniform and one of six to record his first 1,000 strikeouts with the Sox.
Lasted at least 6.0 IP in 49 straight starts from 5/11/04-7/26/05, the longest streak in the majors since Steve Carlton went 69 straight with Philadelphia from 1979-82 ... has retired 10 or more straight batters in a game 51 times (last, 11 on 7/23/10 at Oakland).

VS. OAKLAND A'S

- Makes his 26th career appearance (22nd start) ... is 4-12 with a 3.75 ERA (61 ER/146.1 IP) and three complete games lifetime and 1-6 with a 4.23 ERA (36 ER/76.2 IP) in 13 games (11 starts) at the Coliseum ... 12 career losses are his third-most vs. any opponent.
Went the distance in his last start on 7/23 for his first career victory in Oakland, allowing one run on four hits over 9.0 IP ... back-to-back starts opposing Mark Mulder on 5/6/03 in Oakland (1:49) and 8/8/03 in Chicago (1:53) were played in less than 2:00.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

- RHP Edwin Jackson (3-2, 3.25) makes his ninth start with the White Sox ... is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (14 ER/18.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts in his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 1.47 ERA (6 ER/36.2 IP) and 45 strikeouts in his first five with the Sox.
Lost his last start on 9/17 vs. Detroit, allowing four runs on four hits over 6.1 IP ... carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning and a one-hit shutout into the seventh before allowing four runs on three hits.
Struck out 10-plus batters in three straight starts from 8/14-31, the third pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that feat (Floyd Bannister in 1985 and Ed Walsh in 1910).
Is 2-1 with a 3.26 ERA (7 ER/19.1 IP) in three career starts vs. Oakland.
Was acquired from Arizona on 7/30.
