CHICAGO WHITE SOX (79-72) at OAKLAND A'S (76-74) RHP Edwin Jackson (3-2, 3.25) vs. LHP Brett Anderson (6-6, 2.83) Game #152/Road #78 • Wednesday, September 22, 2010

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost a season-high eight straight games and 12 of their last 14 as they continue a six-game, seven-day trip today in Oakland ... right-hander Edwin Jackson, who has struck out a career-high 163 batters this season, takes the mound for the Sox.
- The Sox were a season-high 17 games over .500 (77-60) and 3.5 games behind Minnesota in the American League Central on 9/6 but have gone 2-12 since and are a season-high 12.0 games off the pace.
- Chicago's 25-5 mark to end the first half matched the best record in major-league history in the final 30 games before the break (also 1975 Reds and 1990 Mets).
- The White Sox have used 104 different lineups.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- Chicago has lost a season-high eight straight games, its longest losing streak since 8/11-19/07 (also eight) ... the last time the Sox lost nine in a row was 8/19-28/91.
- The White Sox are looking to avoid their first three-game sweep in Oakland since 8/14-16/07 and third consecutive sweep overall ... the last time Chicago was swept in three consecutive series was 8/19-28/91 (vs. Detroit and at Cleveland and Kansas City).
- The White Sox are 7-5 in their last 12 road games.
- White Sox starting pitchers are 0-9 with a 7.12 ERA (67 ER/84.2 IP), two quality starts and a .347 (128-369) average against in their last 16 games ... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 16 games without a victory by a Sox starter is a club record, breaking the previous mark set in 1985.
- Manny Ramirez is 14-55 (.255) with one home run, one RBI and a .431 on-base percentage in 19 games with the White Sox (13 singles).
- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to move past Patsy Donovan (518) for sole possession of 30th place on the all-time list.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox lost their season-high eighth straight game and were eliminated from playoff contention with a 7-2 loss at Oakland ... Mark Buehrle, who is 1-7 lifetime at the Coliseum, suffered his 12th loss, allowing five runs on 11 hits in 6.0 IP.
- Mark Kotsay, Alexei Ramirez and Omar Vizquel each collected two hits in the loss ... Juan Pierre stole his 518th base, tying Patsy Donovan for 30th place on the all-time list.
- Chicago committed three errors and went 1-7 with runners in scoring position.

ON THE TRIP

- Chicago is 0-2 on its six-game, seven-day road trip at Oakland (0-2) and Los Angeles-AL (9/24-26) ... the Sox are hitting .185 (12-65) with a 3.94 ERA (6 ER/16.0 IP).

SEPTEMBER LOSING STREAK

- The Sox eight-game losing streak is their longest in September since dropping nine in a row from 9/14-23/76.

SOX STARTERS SET RECORD

- White Sox starting pitchers are 0-9 with a 7.12 ERA (67 ER/84.2 IP), two quality starts and a .347 (128-369) average against in their last 16 games.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 16 games without a victory by a Sox starter is a club record, breaking the previous mark set in 1985.
- The 16-game streak is also the second-longest in the majors this season, behind only Seattle (19 games from 7/11-8/1).

KONERKO IN THE TRIPLE CROWN RACE

- Paul Konerko ranks among the American League leaders in home runs (2nd, 37), RBI (T5th, 105) and average (.315).
- The last White Sox player to rank in the Top 5 in the AL in home runs, RBI and average in a single season was Albert Belle in 1998 ... Belle finished second in both homers (49) and RBI (152) and was third in average (.328).
- Chicago's last player to finish among the five best in each of the AL's Triple Crown categories: home runs (2nd, 36 by Carlos Quentin in 2008), RBI (5th, 120 by Jermaine Dye in 2005) and average (5th, .317 by Magglio Ordonez in 2003).

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox are hitting .163 (13-80) in their last eight games with runners in scoring position.
- Chicago has also left 38 runners on base in the last three games, including a season-high 21 on 9/19 vs. Detroit.

SOX SS MAKES CASE FOR THE SILVER

- Alexei Ramirez ranks among American League shortstops in average (1st, .277), home runs (T1st, 17) and RBI (3rd, 63) ... he is tied with former Toronto shortstop Alex Gonzalez (now with Atlanta) for the AL lead in home runs as a shortstop ... *statistics as shortstop only.*
- Ramirez also leads all AL shortstops with 731 total chances.
- No Sox shortstop has ever won a Silver Slugger Award.

SOX OPPONENTS WAITING TO SCORE

- Twenty-five of Chicago's 34 runs allowed (73.5 percent) in its last four games have come in the seventh inning or later.

LOOK AT ME, I CAN BE CENTER FIELD

- Alex Rios ranks second in club history with 21 home runs as a center fielder, third with 84 RBI and fourth with 88 runs scored ... he needs two home runs to tie Aaron Rowand (23 in 2004) for the franchise record for center fielders ... *statistics as center fielder only.*

WHAT A STEAL

- Juan Pierre needs one stolen base to move past Scott Podsednik (59 in 2005) for sole possession of second place on the club's all-time single-season list ... Pierre is also one stolen base away from sole possession of 30th place on the all-time list, breaking a tie with Patsy Donovan (518).
- Pierre is attempting to become the first White Sox player since Luis Aparicio (1961) to lead the major leagues in stolen bases ... he leads the majors with 59 steals in 2010, seven more than Houston's Michael Bourn (52).

CENTRAL STRUGGLES

- Chicago is 2-10 in its last 12 games vs. American League Central opponents and 8-16 in its last 24 ... the Sox, who are 30-39 against the AL Central this season, have gone 7-8 vs. Cleveland, 8-10 vs. Detroit, 10-8 vs. Kansas City and 5-13 vs. Minnesota.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Chicago is 3-5 vs. Oakland this season, going 1-4 at the Coliseum and 2-1 at U.S. Cellular Field.
- By virtue of last night's loss, the White Sox fell to 2-10-1 in the last 13 season series vs. the A's.
- The Sox are 5-5 at Oakland in their last nine games after going 6-28 (.176) in 34 games from 5/18/01-8/15/08.
- The White Sox are hitting .222 (58-261) with a 4.10 ERA (31 ER/68.0 IP) and have been outscored, 35-25.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 260-283 ... they are 134-133 in Chicago (46-51 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 126-150 at the Coliseum.

ON DECK: LOS ANGELES ANGELS

- Following an off day tomorrow, the White Sox conclude their road portion of the 2010 schedule with three games at Angel Stadium ... the Sox have won four straight vs. Los Angeles-AL and lead the season series, 4-2.
- Chicago is 14-8 in its last 22 games at Angel Stadium.
- The White Sox are hitting .266 (50-188) with a 1.83 ERA (11 ER/54.0 IP) and have outscored the Angels, 26-14.
- Juan Pierre is hitting .391 (9-23) against Los Angeles-AL this season, while both Carlos Quentin and Dayan Viciedo have gone 4-10 (.400) in three games apiece.

JACKSON AT A GLANCE

- Is making his ninth start with the White Sox (30th overall) ... was acquired from Arizona on 7/30 in exchange for pitchers Daniel Hudson and David Holmberg.
Has struck out a career high 163 batters, eclipsing his previous mark set in 2009 (161).
Has gone 3-2 with a 3.25 ERA (20 ER/55.1 IP), 14 walks and 59 strikeouts in eight starts with the Sox ... posted a 0.96 ERA (3 ER/28.0 IP) in his first four starts with Chicago, compared to 5.60 (17 ER/27.1 IP) over his last four.
Is 4-6 with a 4.57 ERA (42 ER/82.2 IP) since throwing a no-hitter on 6/25 at Tampa Bay (13 starts).
Recorded three consecutive games with at least 10 strikeouts from 8/14-31, tying a franchise record (also Ed Walsh in 1910 and Floyd Bannister in 1985).
Threw the second no-hitter in Arizona history (278th all-time) on 6/25 at Tampa Bay, allowing eight walks with six strikeouts on 149 pitches (SEE NOTE BELOW).
Established career best with a 3.62 ERA, 33 starts, 161 strikeouts and 214.0 IP with Detroit in 2009 ... also was selected to the 2009 American League All-Star Team.
Was a member of the United States Team in the 2003 Futures Game at U.S. Cellular Field ... named the Dodgers 2002 Minor-League Pitcher of the Year.
Was born on the Neu-Ulm U.S. Army Base in Germany (closed in 1991) ... father is retired U.S. Army Sergeant First Class Edwin Jackson.

2010 SEASON

- Is averaging 6.5 IP and 105.2 pitches per start ... has made 14 quality starts (nine on the road) ... the White Sox are 4-4 in his starts (Diamondbacks were 7-14).
Led the National League with 13 wild pitches at the time of his trade and ranked fourth with 4.0 walks per 9.0 IP (60 BB/134.1 IP).
Struck out a career-best 12 batters on 5/17 at Florida (8.0 IP) ... recorded three straight games with at least 10 strikeouts from 8/14-31, tying a White Sox record (third time).
Singled and hit his first career home run in the fourth inning on 4/11 vs. Pittsburgh, becoming the first pitcher in Arizona history to collect two hits in one inning ... last pitcher to accomplish the feat was Pittsburgh's Paul Maholm on 9/12/08.

LAST START

- Suffered his second straight loss on 9/17 vs. Detroit (4 ER/6.1 IP) ... lost back-to-back starts for the first time since a four-game losing streak from 7/7-28.
Did not allow a hit in the first 5.2 IP ... Austin Jackson ended the no-hit bid with an infield single.
Departed trailing 3-2 after throwing 102 pitches.

NO-HITTER: JUNE 25 AT TAMPA BAY

- Threw the second no-hitter in Arizona history (278th all-time) on 6/25 at Tampa Bay, allowing eight walks with six strikeouts on 149 pitches ... the Diamondbacks won, 1-0, on Adam LaRoche's solo home run in the second inning.
The eight walks tied for the third-most allowed in a no-hitter (done five times, last California's Nolan Ryan on 9/28/74 vs. Twins) ... the 149 pitches were the most in a no-hitter since 1988.
Marked the fourth no-hitter in interleague play: Yankees' David Cone on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal, six Houston pitchers on 6/11 at New York-AL, and Detroit's Justin Verlander on 6/12/07 vs. Milwaukee ... also was the fourth vs. a former team: Philadelphia's Terry Mulholland on 8/15/90 vs. San Francisco, Houston's Ken T. Johnson on 4/23/64 vs. Cincinnati and the Yankees' Allie Reynolds on 7/12/51 vs. Cleveland.
Faced 36 batters, tied for the most in a nine-inning no-hitter since 1900, joining Florida's A.J. Burnett on 5/12/01 at San Diego and Pittsburgh's Dock Ellis on 6/12/70 at San Diego.

NO-HITTER DOES NOT EQUAL NO TRADE

- Became the first pitcher to throw a no-hitter and be traded within the same season since Cliff Chambers in 1951 ... Chambers tossed a no-hitter in the second game of a doubleheader for Pittsburgh on 5/6/51 at Boston before being traded to St. Louis on 6/15/51 in a seven-player deal that included Joe Garagiola.

MAGIC NUMBER IS 7.0

- Has gone 8-2 with a 2.58 ERA (31 ER/108.1 IP) in 2010 with a .209 (82-392) average, 34 walks and 102 strikeouts in 14 starts lasting at least 7.0 IP.
Is 1-10 with a 7.30 ERA (66 ER/81.1 IP) and a .337 (115-341) average, 40 walks and 61 strikeouts in 15 starts lasting less than 7.0 IP.

2009 SEASON

- Went 13-9 with a 3.62 ERA and 161 strikeouts in 33 starts in his only season with Detroit ... established career highs in ERA, starts, IP, strikeouts and quality starts (21).
Was named to his first American League All-Star Team ... pitched 1.0 perfect IP.
Limited opponents to three earned runs or less in 16 straight starts from 5/9-8/5/09.
Ranked fourth in the AL with a 3.05 ERA on the road.
Posted a 2.52 ERA prior to the All-Star Break, the lowest first-half ERA by a Tigers pitcher since Mark Fidrych in 1976 (1.78).
Acquired by Arizona from Detroit as part of a three-team trade on 12/9/09 ... the Diamondbacks also received RHP Ian Kennedy (from New York-AL) ... Detroit acquired RHP Max Scherzer and LHP Daniel Schlereth (from Arizona) and RHP Phil Coke and OF Austin Jackson (from New York-AL) ... the Yankees were sent OF Curtis Granderson (from Detroit).

VS. OAKLAND A'S

- Is making his fourth career start with Oakland ... is 2-1 with a 3.26 ERA (7 ER/19.1 IP) lifetime.
Has gone 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) over his last two starts.
Won his only start at Oakland on 8/21/09 (2 ER/6.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER

- RHP Freddy Garcia (11-6, 4.88) will be making his 27th start of the season and first since 9/7.
Left his last start on 9/7 at Detroit after only 2.0 IP due to a stiff lower back.
Is 0-2 with a 5.23 ERA (19 ER/32.2 IP) in seven road starts since his last win away from home on 6/20 at Washington (3 ER/7.0 IP).
Has gone 6-7 with a 5.30 ERA (71 ER/120.2 IP) in 21 career starts vs. Oakland ... is 3-3 with a 4.18 ERA (24 ER/51.2 IP) at the Coliseum ... earned his last win vs. the A's on 7/17/04 at Oakland (2 ER/6.2 IP).
