# Texas Rangers (84-67) at Oakland A's (76-75)

LHP Cliff Lee (12-8, 3.19) vs. LHP Dallas Braden (9-13, 3.65)

WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 4-game series in Oakland tonight, the 3rd and final stop on this 10-game A.L. West roadtrip to close the away portion of the regular season schedule...Texas snapped a 3-game losing streak on Wednesday, winning for the 1st tinme since Saturday in Seattle, and is 2-4 on this trip to Seattle (1-2) and Anaheim (1-2)...club has won 9 of 13 beginning September 8 after losing the previous 5 games...the 9-4 (.667) mark since Sept. 8 matches the 4th best in the majors in that period...team is 10-9 in September and 16-13 beginning August 22...club is 34-29 since the All-Star break and 79-58 (.577) over last 5 months since April 22, 6th best in majors in span.

--at 84-67 (.556), the Rangers own 4th-best overall record in the A.L....current record matches 2nd-best 151-game mark in team history, best since 2004...high mark of the year has been 19 games above .500 3 times, 64-45 on August 6, 82-63 on Sept. 15, and 83-64 on Sept. 18.

LEADERS OF THE PACK: Texas gained a game in the standings on Wednesday after 3.0 games in the previous 3 days...it marks the 1st time the Rangers have gained ground since MOST DAYS IN FIRST PLACE Sept. 18 (9.0 to 10.0 GA)...the Rangers have an 8.0 game FOR RANGERS advantage in the A.L. West with 11 contests remaining, matching Cincinnati's lead in the NL West for 2nd largest in BY SEASON ncluding Off Days <u>Days</u> 179 <u>Year</u> 1999 the majors to Minnesota's 12.0 game lead in the A.L. Central...club has held a lead between 7.0 and 10.0 games 177 1996 for 59 straight days...team's largest lead of the season is 10.0 games, accomplished 3 times (Sept. 2; Sept. 15; Sept. 143 2010 103 1998 18) after being done on only one day previously in franchise history (Sept. 30, 1999)...Texas has had sole possession of 101 1994 65 2009 first for 107 straight days and has spent 143 total days in first, 3rd-most in a season in club history.

WINNING SEASON: At 84-66, the Rangers have produced a winning season for only the 3rd time in the last 11 seasons (2000-10), also 2004 (89-73) and 2009 (87-75)...this marks the 1st time that Texas has had a winning record in consecutive years since 1998-99 and the 5th time club has had streaks of at least 2 straight winning seasons: 3--1977-79; 3--1989-91; 2--1955-96; 2--1998-99...the 84 victories match 1974 for 11th most in club history, one shy of 1991 total.

**ROAD RECORD:** Texas is 36-41 (.468) away from home in 2010, the 6th best in the A.L. and 12th in the majors in road winning percentage...this will be the 4th straight year and 10th time in 11 seasons (starting 2000) that the Rangers have had a losing road record, the exception being 2006 (41-40...club is 8-17 (.320) away from home since winning 3 in a row, August 4-6, the 3rd lowest road winning percentage in the majors beginning August 7 to: .105 (2-17) by Pittsburgh and .250 (5-15) by Kansas City...team has losing streaks of 6, 5, 4, and 3 road games in that period....of the 17 losses in that span, 9 have been by one (6) or 2 (4) runs.

VERSUS THE WEST AND THE A'S: Texas is 26-20 in its own division in 2010, 8-12 beginning July 28..the Rangers are 11-13 in A.L. West parks this season, dropping 6 of the last 7 series entering this one...of the 13 defeats in A.L. West parks, 7 have been by a single run. --Texas is 7-8 against the A's in 2010, losing 4 of the last 5...the club finished

--Texas is 7-8 against the A's in 2010, losing 4 of the last 5...the club finished 5-4 vs. Oakland in Arlington and is 2-4 at the Coliseum, having dropped the last 2 contests...the Rangers are 15-19 against the A's since the start of 2009 with a 6-10 record at the Coliseum in that span...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 291-285 overall with the A's holding a 151-135 edge here in Oakland.

**EXTRA FRAMES:** With Wednesday's 2-1, 12-inning victory, Texas is 11-5 in extra inning games in 2010, tying the Reds, Phillies, and Giants for the 2nd most wins in extra frames in the majors this season behind Baltimore (13)...it is the team's most extra inning wins since 1991 (14)...Texas has won its last 6 extra inning games since a loss in Boston on July 17...the Rangers have won 6 of 8 extra inning road contests in 2010.

**<u>CLOSE CALLS</u>**: Last night's 2-1 win improved the Rangers' record in one-run games to 27-22, 7-16 away from home...Texas had dropped its last 4 road games decided by a run since a 4-3 victory in Kansas City on Sept. 1.

ON THE MOUND: The Rangers have issued just one run in the their last 16.0 innings dating back to the 5th inning on Tuesday with 3 runs allowed in the last 21.0 frames...the staff has allowed 2 or fewer runs in 5 of the 1st 6 games of this trip, despite a 2-4 record, for a 2.38 ERA (14 ER/53.0 IP)...club has posted a 2.55 ERA (34 ER/120.0 IP) over the last 13 games, 5th best in ML in this span, to lower season mark from 4.03 to 3.90, 5th in the A.L. and lowest since Sept. 3 (3.89)...this current mark would be the Rangers' lowest ERA for a season since 1990 (3.83).

Starters: Colby Lewis and C.J. Wilson combined to allow 3 runs in 13.0 innings the last 2 nights in Anaheim...the rotation has issued 2 or fewer runs in 9 of the last 10 games with a 2.63 ERA (18 ER/61.2 IP) and a .210 opponents batting average in that span...Texas has quality starts in 6 of last 7 and 8 of last 11 games.

**Relievers:** The bullpen worked 6.0 scoreless innings on Wednesday and has not issued a run in its last 9.0 frames...relievers have a 2.45 ERA (25 ER/92.0 IP) over the last 31 games to drop from 3.42 to **3.23**, **2nd best in A.L.** and lowest since Aug. 10 (3.18)...the 3.23 mark would be lowest since 3.23 relief ERA in 1983 and match 5th lowest ever.

**NEFTALI FELIZ** has recorded 37 saves, **tying the major league record** for a rookie set by the Mariners' Kazuhiro Sasaki in 2000...that total matches Francisco Cordero (2005) for the 6th most overall saves in Rangers history. --Feliz has converted 37 of 40 save tries, a 92.5% success rate that matches Sasaki (also 37-40 in 2000) for the highest ever for a rookie (25 or more save opportunities)...Feliz is 21-for-21 in save tries on the road in 2010. --Feliz has pitched 11.0 scoreless innings in his last 11 games with a 1.48 ERA

(4 ER/24.1 IP) in his last 23 appearances to go from 3.86 to 2.95.

**MICHAEL'S MILESTONE:** Michael Young enters tonight with 1499 games played...he will become just the 4th player to ever appear in 1500 games as a Ranger, joining Rafael Palmeiro (1573), Jim Sundberg (1512), and Ivan Rodriguez (1507)...all 3 of those players had 2 different stints with Texas. --Young will become just the 7th active player to appear in 1500 games, all with one club.

ALEXI OGANDO has pitched 8.1 scoreless innings in his last 11 games with a 0.92 ERA (2 ER/19.2 IP) in his last 24 appearances...Ogando's 1.16 ERA is the lowest in the majors among all pitchers with at least 35.0 innings...that mark would be 10th lowest among all rookies since 1960 (35.0 or more IP)

TV ON SATURDAY: The Rangers-A's game on Saturday has been added to the FOX Saturday Baseball Game of the Week schedule...it will be carried at 1:10 p.m. PT/3:10 p.m. CT on KDFW FOX 4 and other FOX affiliates in Texas, Oklahoma, and Shreveport, LA...there was no TV previously for this game.

**SHORTS:** The Rangers have scored just 2 unearned runs over the last 22.0 innings since Chris Davis' pinch homer in the 8th on Monday in Anaheim...C.J. Wilson is 10-5, 3.26 ERA (42 ER/116.0 IP) in 19 starts this season following a Texas loss with thew club winning 8 of last 9...Elvis Andrus and Julio Borbon each have 34 INF hits T2nd in club history to 51 for Otis Nixon in 1995...Rangers are 24-22 in games started by opposing LHP in 2010.

#### **TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER**

## #33 Cliff Lee, LHP (12-8, 3.19)

**TONIGHT:** The 32-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 27th start tonight in Oakland to open a 4-game weekend set against the 2nd place Athletics...is 2-0, 1.13 (2 ER/16.0 IP) since missing one start while dealing with muscular pain and inflammation in his lower back...was 0-3, 9.00 ERA (23 ER/23.0 IP) in 4 August starts prior to receiving an injection to alleviate the discomfort by Dr. Keith Meister on September 1 in Arlington...won last start Sat. at SEA, a 6-1 Texas victory...this will be 14th start with Texas (4-5, 4.10 in 13 G/GS)...Texas offense has plated 3 runs-or-less in 6 of his 13 starts, including exactly one run 3 times...career .630 winning pct. (102-60) ranks 7th among active pitchers.

<u>MILESTONE REACHED</u>: Tossed 8.0 innings in his last start to raise his season total to 200.1 IP...is 5th career season with 200+ IP, including 3rd straight...reached 200.0 IP despite not making his first start until April 30, and missing a start earlier this month.

**THE TRADE:** Was acquired in July 9 trade from Seattle along with RHP Mark Lowe in exchange for 1B Justin Smoak and minor league players RHP Blake Beavan, RHP Josh Lueke, and INF Matt Lawson...was scheduled to pitch for M's that night vs. NYY in Seattle, but made Texas debut the next night (Sat., 7/10) vs. Baltimore in Arlington...was traded for the 4th time in his career, 3rd time since July 29, 2009.

STEADY AS HE GOES: Lee opened the 2010 season with 21 straight starts of 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks. matching the 2nd-longest season-opening streak since 1920 with Arizona's Curt Schilling (21 in 2002) and 2 starts shy of San Franciso's Juan Marichal (23 in 1968)...Lee's 143 strikeouts before reaching double-digits in walks set a record in the modern era (since 1900)...prev. mark was 140 set by Schilling in 2002, when he had 140 K's before issuing his 10th walk of the year...Lee's 6.1 innings on Aug. 11 vs. NYY snapped stretch of 10 straight starts of at least 8.0 innings, longest such streak since Toronto's Pat Hentgen had run of 12 straight from July 28-Sept. 24, 1996 on his way to a CY Young Award...was longest such streak by a lefty since 15 straight by Yankees' Ron Guidry in 1983.

**LEAGUE LEADER:** Tied for A.L. lead with 7 CG, and ranks among A.L. leaders in **ERA** (9th, 3.19) and opp. avg. (13th, .240)...leads majors in walks-per-9 (0.72), pitches per inning (14.0), opponents OBP (.255), and runners per 9 innings (9.07)...batters swing at first pitch 37.5% of the time, highest figure in majors...opponents' .619 OPS is 6th-lowest in A.L...opponents' .364 slugging pct. ranks 14th in A.L...batters put 21.6% of his pitches into play, 13th-highest in A.L.

**RARE RATIO:** Has 174 strikeouts against just 16 walks (2 IBB), for a **ML-best 10.88 SO/BB ratio**, a figure over 3-and-a-half higher than next-closest in 2010 (Halladay-7.50)...his ratio dropped from 13.42 with 4 walks over his last 2 starts...the 10.88 mark would be just shy of a major league record for a season among qualifying pitchers in the modern era (since 1900), a title currently held by Bret Saberhagen (11.00 SO/BB with NYM in 1994)...Sabes is the only pitcher with a figure in double-digits in modern era, albeit in a strike-shortened season...walk of Carlos Pena (on 3-2 pitch) on Aug. 16 at TB was first issued to a left-handed batter in regular season since free pass to Adam Dunn (on 3-2 pitch) Sept. 15, 2009 vs. Washington in Philly...his season-high 3 walks on Sept. 12 vs. NYY was most since 3 walks in that 9/15/09 game vs. Washington (3).

LAST START: Won last start Sat. at SEA, a 6-1 Texas victory (8.0 IP, 6 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 107 pitches/78 strikes)...reached 200.0 inning for the 5th time in his career and 3rd straight season...faced the Mariners for the first time since the July 9 trade...retired 12 straight batters after a single by Ichiro Suzuki to start the game...Seattle's lone run came on a Franklin Gutierrez solo home run to lead off the 7th inning.

**THE WHIFF:** Has 9 career games of 10-or-more K's, 6 of which have come this season (3 w/ Texas)...his 6 double-digit K-totals in 2010 are T2nd-most in the A.L. and T3rd-most in majors: Lester (7), Gallardo (7), Lincecum (6)...recorded 11 strikeouts on Aug. 11 vs. New York-AL, just the 4th time in Texas history for a pitcher to record at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 6.1-inning-or-less.

**VS.** OAKLAND: Is 5-2, 2.14 (18 ER/75.2 IP) in 12 games/11 starts vs. A's in his career, including 1-0, 0.53 (1 ER/17.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts in 2 starts this season...earned 100th career victory in 5-1 Texas win on Aug. 6 at OAK (8.0 IP, 7 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 8 SO, 112 pitches-82 strikes)...notched a career-high 13 strikeouts, 7 of those coming on called third strikes, while taking a no decision in a 3-1, 10-inning Texas win on July 27 vs. OAK (9.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-0 ER, 0 BB, 13 SO, 118 pitches-88 strikes)...was the highest single-game total by any Rangers pitcher since right-hander Aaron Sele compiled 13 K's against the Tigers on Aug. 12, 1999 vs. Detroit...has tossed a quality start in 6 straight starts against Oakland, dating back to the 2007 season...beginning with the 2008 season, Lee has gone 3-1, 1.19 (5 ER/37.2 IP) with 36 strikeouts in 5 games/starts against

COLISEUM / ON ROAD: Is 2-1, 3.55 (10 ER/25.1 IP) in 4 games/starts in his career in Oakland...is 7-5, 3.35 (40 ER/107.1 IP) in 14 road starts this season, including 1-2, 6.58 (19 ER/26.0 IP) in last 4 road starts beginning Aug. 16 at TB...6 of his 9 road HR allowed in '10 have come in his past 3 road starts, 3 HR in first 11 road starts.

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Lee worked 9.0 innings in each of his first 2 starts for Texas, the first pitcher in club history to debut with 2 outings of 9.0-or-more frames...Lee became the first ML pitcher to work at least 9.0 innings in his first 2 outings with a team and not record a win in either game since Milwaukee's Bill Parsons had a pair of 9-inning CG losses, April 13 and 18, 1971...Lee has tossed 9.0 frames in 3 of his 13 Texas outings, first Ranger with 3 starts of 9.0+ IP in a *season* since Aaron Sele and Rick Helling (3 each) did it in 1998.

**<u>COMPLETE-LEE CLIFF:</u>** Has set a new career high with 7 complete games this season, tied for most in the A.L. with Minnesota's Carl Pavano and 2nd in the majors behind only Roy Halladay, who has 8 CG for the Phillies...Lee became just the 3rd pitcher in the last 11 seasons with as many as 6 CG's at the All-Star break, joining Mark Mulder in 2003 (7) and Halladay in 2008 and 2010 (7 each)...has tossed 9.0 IP in 2 other starts that were not CG...tossed 3 consecutive CG's June 18 vs. Cincinnati, June 23 vs. Chicago-NL, and June 29 at New York-AL to become the first pitcher in the majors with 3 straight CG's since C.C. Sabathia for Milwaukee in 2008.

**CENTURY MARK:** Lee improved his career record to 100-57 with a win Aug. 6 at Oakland...according to Elias Sports Bureau, only 5 active pitchers reached 100 wins in as few decisions as Lee: Tim Hudson (100-45), Roy Oswalt (100-47), Johan Santana (100-47), Roy Halladay (100-50) and Andy Petitite (100-54).

<u>ALL-STAR:</u> Was selected to the 2010 A.L. All-Star roster via player voting (2nd career selection-started '08 Classic) and pitched a scoreless 4th inning in A.L.'s 3-1 loss July 13 in Anaheim...needed just 6 pitches (5 strikes) to retire Martin Prado (groundout), Albert Pujols (strikeout) and Ryan Howard (groundout)...now has 3.0 SHO IP in 2 All-Star appearances.

**JUNE HONORS:** Was named A.L. Pitcher of the Month for June after going 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA (10 ER/51.0 IP) in 6 starts...was his 3rd career monthly award, also earning the honor in both April and August of 2008 with Cleveland...became the first pitcher in the majors to record at least 4 complete game victories in a single month since Roy Halladay had 5 in September of 2003.

The 24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 21st start and appearance of the season in tomorrow's game...ranks among team leaders in wins (2nd), quality starts (3rd, 13), starts (4th), and innings (4th, 117.2), this despite not joining club until June 5...is 0-2, 5.50 (11 ER/18.0 IP) last 3 starts to rise from 3.64 to 3.92, having lost consecutive decisions for the first time all year...is 0-1 last 2 starts with 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP)...took loss in last outing despite quality start Sunday at Seattle, a 2-1 Texas defeat in rubber game series finale (6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 99 pitches/69 strikes)...took a 1-0 lead into bottom of 6th, but Chone Figgins scored in 6th to tie game after a one-out infield single off the 2nd base bag...Hunter gave up leadoff triple to Langerhans to open 7th, then the game-winning RBI single by Josh Wilson followed...Rangers were 0-for-7 w/ RISP and stranded 11 baserunners...Hunter career in Sept./Oct. in 2009-10: 4-5, 5.78 ERA (40 ER/62.1 IP) in 11 starts...all other starts in 2009-10: 17-5, 3.35 ERA (62 ER/166.2 IP) in 28 starts...has established career highs in wins (12), innings (117.0), and starts (20)...since the beginning of June, Hunter's 12 wins rank T4th in the majors while .750 winning pct. since start of June ranks T2ndbest in majors behind only Sabathia (.842)...began season 8-0 with a 2.31 ERA (16 ER/62.1 IP) over his first 10 starts, the first Texas pitcher ever to begin a season 8-0 exclusively as a starter...won only start vs. Oakland in '10, Aug. 27 in Arlington (7.2 IP, 7 H, 3 R-ER), matchup with Brett Anderson, who was chased early...is 3-0, 5.26 (15 ER/25.2 IP) in 4 career starts vs. A's, having won 3 straight with a 5.31 ERA (12 ER/20.1 IP) in that span...career at the Coliseum: 2-0, 6.39 (9 ER/12.2 IP), last start here a 9-8 win exactly a year ago today (Sept. 23, 2009): 5.2 IP, 9 H, 7 R-ER.
