WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers have lost 4 of 5 and are 2-5 on the season's final regular season roadtrip to Seattle (1-2), Anaheim (1-2), and Oakland (0-1)...club has won 9 of 14 beginning September 8 after losing the previous 5 games...the 9-5 (.643) mark since Sept. 8 is the 5th best in the majors in that period...team is 10-10 in September and 16-14 beginning August 22...club is 34-30 since the All-Star break and 79-59 (.572) since April 22, 6th best in majors in span.

--at 84-68 (.553), the Rangers are tied with Boston for the 4th-best overall record in the A.L....current record matches 3rd-best 152-game mark in team history, best since 2004 (85-67)...Texas' best record of the season has been 19 games above .500 3 times, 64-45 on August 6, 82-63 on Sept. 15, and 83-64 on Sept. 18...the team's current mark of 16 games over .500 matches the lowest (also Sept. 21) since Sept. 11 (79-63) with last time at 15 games over .500 being Sept. 10 (78-63).

LEADERS OF THE PACK: In losing 3 of 4, Texas has seen its lead in the A.L.

West go from 10.0 to 7.0 games with 10 contests remaining...it is the 3rd largest advantagein the majors to Minnesota's 12.0 game lead in the A.L. Central and Cincinnati's 7.5 game mark in the N.L. Central...club has held a lead between 7.0 and 10.0 games for 60 straight days with 7.0 game edge on 2 of last 3 days...club's last margin of fewer than 7.0 games was 6.0 games on July 24...team's largest lead of the season is 10.0 games, accomplished 3 times (Sept. 2; Sept. 15; Sept. 18) after being done on only one day previously in franchise history (Sept. 30, 1999)...Texas has had sole possession of first for 108 straight days and has spent 144 total days in first.

WINNING SEASON: At 84-67, the Rangers have produced a winning season for only the 3rd time in the last 11 seasons (2000-10), also 2004 (89-73) and 2009 (87-75)...this marks the 1st time that Texas has had a winning record in consecutive years since 1998-99 and the 5th time club has had streaks of at least 2 straight winning seasons: 3--1977-79; 3--1989-91; 2--1955-96; 2--1998-99...the 84 victories tie 1974 for 11th in club history, one shy of 1991 total.

ROAD RECORD: Texas is 36-42 (.462) away from home in 2010, 7th in the A.L. and 13th in the majors in road winning percentage...this will be the 4th straight year and 10th time in 11 seasons (starting 2000) that the Rangers have had a losing road record, the exception being 2006 (41-40)...the 42 road defeats match season total in both 2008 and 2009...club is 8-18 (.308) away from home since winning 3 in a row, August 4-6, the 3rd lowest road winning percentage in the majors since August 7 to: .105 (2-17) by Pittsburgh and .286 (6-15) by Kansas City...team has losing streaks of 6, 5, 4, and 3 road games in period....of the 18 losses in that span, 9 have been by one (6) or 2 (4) runs.

<u>VERSUS THE WEST AND THE A'S:</u> Texas is 26-21 in its own division in 2010, 8-13 beginning July 28..the Rangers are 11-14 in A.L. West parks this season, dropping 6 of the last 7 series entering this one.

--Texas is 7-9 against the A's in 2010, losing the last 3 during which the club has been blanked twice and 5 of the last 6...the club finished 5-4 vs. Oakland in Arlington and is 2-5 at the Coliseum, having dropped the last 3 contests...the Rangers are 15-20 against the A's since the start of 2009 with a 6-11 record at the Coliseum in that span...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 291-286 against the A's bolding a 151-136 adds been in Oakland

overall with the A's holding a 151-136 edge here in Oakland.

--Batting at the Coliseum: The Rangers are hitting just .213 (48-225) in 7 games at the Oakland Coliseum this season, going 8-for-41 (.195) with runners in scoring position...overall, the Rangers have 16 homers in 16 games vs. the A's this season, the most against any opponent.

TV ON SATURDAY: The Rangers-A's game on Saturday has been added to the FOX Saturday Baseball Game of the Week schedule...it will be carried at 1:10 p.m. PT/3:10 p.m. CT on KDFW FOX 4 and other FOX affiliates in Texas, Oklahoma, and Shreveport, LA to a total of about 9% of the U.S....Josh Lewin and Tom Grieve will have the call.

**BLANKED AGAIN:** Thursday's 5-0 loss marked the 2nd time in the last 3 games that the Rangers have been shut out following a 2-0 setback in Anaheim on Tuesday..it was the 5th time that Texas has been blanked in 2010, matching the White Sox for 2nd fewest in the majors, one more than the Red Sox...Thursday was the 3rd time the team has been blanked in last 33 games after once in season's 1st 119 contests...last night marked the 5th time that Texas has been shut out by the A"s beginning August 4, 2009.

--Texas has scored just 2 runs, both unearned, in the last 31.0 innings since Chris Davis homered in the 8th inning on Monday night at Anaheim...this is the 1st time in club history that the Rangers have gone 3 consecutive games without scoring an earned run.

ONE-HIT: Nelson's Cruz' infield hit with 2 out in the 1st inning last night was Texas' only hit of the game...it was the team's fewest hits since tallying just one on Sept. 30, 2009 at LA Angels, a combined 5-0 loss to Matt Palmer, Darren Oliver, Jose Arredondo, Kevin Jepsen, and Rafael Rodriguez...Thursday was the 18th time in history the Rangers have been held to just one hit.
--Last night was the 6th time that the Rangers have had their only hit in a game

--Last night was the 6th time that the Rangers have had their only hit in a game in the 1st inning: June 24, 1974 vs. Nolan Ryan at California (Alex Johnson 1B); April 23, 1993 at Milwaukee (Rafael Palmeiro HR); May 19, 2009 at Detroit (Michael Young 1B); June 28, 2009 vs. San Diego (Young 1B); and Sept. 30, 2009 at LA Angels (Julio Borbon 1B).

**BATTING:** Texas is 11-for-98 (.112) in the last 3 games and is hitting .202 (49-242) with 14 runs scored in the 1st 7 games of this trip, batting .154 (8-52) with RISP...club is batting .276 (218-789) over last 22 games and ranks 3rd in the majors and A.L. with .274 season average behind Minnesota (.276) and Kansas City (.276)...Rangers are also 3rd in the majors with 1445 hits and lead the majors with a team record 172 infield hits.

ON THE MOUND: The Rangers have allowed 2 or fewer runs in 5 of the 1st 7 games of this trip, despite a 2-5 record for a 2.80 ERA (19 ER/61.0 IP)...club has posted a 2.74 ERA (39 ER/128.0 IP) over the last 14 games to lower season mark from 4.03 to 3.91, 5th in the A.L...this current ERA would be the Rangers' lowest ERA for a season since 1990 (3.83). Relievers: The bullpen has allowed one run in its last 12.0 innings with a 2.46

Relievers: The bullpen has allowed one run in its last 12.0 innings with a 2.46 ERA (26 ER/95.0 IP) over the last 32 games to drop from 3.42 to 3.22, 2nd best in A.L. to Minnesota (3.18), 5th best in the majors, and lowest since August 10 (3.18)...opponents are batting just .210 (72-343) over that 32-game span...the 3.22 mark would be lowest since 2.91 relief ERA in 1981 and rank as 5th lowest ever...Texas leads A.L. with 29 relief wins, matching 5th most in club history...bullpen has issued one homer in 45.1 innings over last 12 games.

NEFTALI FELIZ has recorded 37 saves, tying the major league record for a rookie set by the Mariners' Kazuhiro Sasaki in 2000...that total matches Francisco Cordero (2005) for the 6th most overall saves in Rangers history. --Feliz has converted 37 of 40 save tries, a 92.5% success rate that matches Sasaki (also 37-40 in 2000) for the highest ever for a rookie (25 or more save opportunities)...Feliz is 21-for-21 in save tries on the road in 2010. --Feliz has pitched 11.0 scoreless innings in his last 11 games with a 1.48 ERA (4 ER/24.1 IP) in his last 23 appearances to go from 3.86 to 2.95.

MICHAEL'S MILESTONE: Michael Young played in his 1500th game on Thursday, just the 4th player to ever appear in 1500 games as a Ranger, joining Rafael Palmeiro (1573), Jim Sundberg (1512), and Ivan Rodriguez (1507)...all 3 of those players had 2 different stints with Texas...he became the 8th active player to appear in 1500 games, all with one club.

<u>A RARITY:</u> Cliff Lee issued consecutive walks to Daric Barton and Kurt Suzuki in the 4th inning last night, the 1st time he had walked back-to-back hitters in an inning since passing the Rangers' Milton Bradley and Marlon Byrd in the 1st inning on June 4, 2008 while with Cleveland...Lee had pitched 585.1 innings over 80 games in the interim (Bill Arnold and Elias Sports Bureau).

SHORTS: Alexi Ogando's 1.16 ERA is the lowest in the majors among all pitchers with at least 35.0 innings...that mark would be 10th lowest among all rookies since 1960 (35.0 or more IP)...Jorge Cantu's 78 plate appearances without an RBI at the start of Rangers career are a club record, 2 more than Juan Beniquez in 1976...Dallas Braden came within 1.0 inning Thursday of becoming just the 5th pitcher with consecutive CG SHO vs. the Rangers in one season: Vida Blue (1972), Catfish Hunter (1975), Paul Hartzell (1976), and Bert Blyleven (1985)...lefthanders have started 4 of 5 SHO vs. Texas in 2010: Braden (2); Toronto's Ricky Romero; Baltimore's Brian Matusz.

TONIGHT: The 24-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 21st start and appearance of the season in tonight's game in Oakland...has gone 10-2, 3.93 (38 ER/87.0 IP) in night starts this ..Hunter's .750 winning pct. (12-4) is tied for best in the majors (also David Price - 18-6)...his 12 wins rank 2nd among Rangers, this despite not joining club until June 5...will be pitching on regular 4 days' rest, as he lost last start on Sunday at Seattle...is 0-2, 5.50 (11 ER/18.0 IP) last 3 starts to rise from 3.64 to 3.92, having lost consecutive decisions for the first time all year...is 0-1 last 2 starts with 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP)...began season 8-0 with a 2.31 ERA (16 ER/62.1 IP) over his first 10 starts, but is 4-4, 5.76 (35 ER/54.2 IP) over his last 10 starts to raise season ERA to 3.92...has still allowed 3 runs-or-less in 16 of 20 starts this season, including 2 earned runs-or-less 12 times...was first Texas pitcher ever to begin a season 8-0 exclusively as a starter...is carrying an 7.15 run support average this season, 2nd-highest for any ML pitcher since June 1 behind Yankees' Phil Hughes (7.59)...his 20 HR allowed since June 1 are also T6thmost by any ML pitcher in that span...began the season on DL after suffering an injury late during spring training...reinstated from DL April 28 and optioned to Oklahoma City, where he made 6 starts/appearances

WINNING WAYS: Hunter is 12-4 over 20 starts since making his season debut on June 5...only pitchers with more wins since the beginning of June are C.C. Sabathia (16-4), Trevor Cahill (13-5), and Roy Halladay (13-7)...the career-high 12 wins for Hunter are 2nd-most on staff behind Wilson (14-7)...the 12 wins are most by any pitcher in the majors with as little as 20 starts...every other pitcher who has earned 12-or-more wins has made at least 26 starts...will likely see just 2 more starts in 2010...is currently tied for club record of wins in 22-starts-or-less in a season, also done by Gaylord Perry in 1975...Hunter would be the first big league pitcher with 12-or-more wins in 22-starts-or-less since Toronto's Roy Halladay in 2005 (12 wins in 19 starts).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has quality starts in 13 of his 20 outings this season...had 7 straight from June 22-July 25 to match C.J. Wilson (April 8-May 13) for longest streaks among Rangers this season...his 13 QS are 3rd-most on the staff (excluding Lee), behind Wilson (20) and Lewis (19), despite the fact that Hunter's first start did not come until June 5.

PALE SEPTEMBER: Hunter has made 11 starts in Sept./Oct. in 2009 and 2010, going 4-5 with a 5.78 ERA (40 ER/62.1 IP)...in his other 28 starts in 2009-10, has gone 17-5 with a 3.35 ERA (62

LAST START: Took loss despite quality start Sunday at Seattle, a 2-1 Texas defeat in rubber game series finale (6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 99 pitches/69 strikes)...took a 1-0 lead into bottom of 6th, but Chone Figgins scored in 6th to tie game after a one-out infield single off the 2nd base bag...Hunter gave up leadoff triple to Langerhans to open 7th, then the go-ahead RBI single by Josh Wilson followed, his final batter faced...Rangers were 0-for-7 w/ RISP and stranded 11

VS. OAKLAND: Won only start vs. Oakland in 2010, Aug. 27 in Arlington (7.2 IP, 7 H, 3 R-ER) matchup with Brett Anderson, who was chased early...is 3-0, 5,26 (15 ER/25.2 IP) in 4 caree starts vs. A's, having won 3 straight with a 5.31 ERA (12 ER/20.1 IP) in that span...career at the Coliseum: 2-0, 6.39 (9 ER/12.2 IP), last start here a 9-8 win one year and a day ago (Sept. 23,

EIGHT IS ENOUGH: Went 8-0 over his first 10 starts in 2010 to become the first Texas pitcher begin a season 8-0 exclusively as a starter (no relief outings)...suffered first loss on July 31 at LA of Anaheim...last Rangers pitcher to begin a season with at least 8 wins and no losses vas Jeff Zimmerman, who went a club-record 9-0 over his first 44 relief appearances during his 1999 rookie season...Hunter joined Cubs' Carlos Silva (8-0 over his first 11 starts) as the only pitchers this season to win each of their first 8 decisions...Hunter's 8-game win streak to start the year matched the 3rd-longest ever by a Texas starter (at any point in a single season)...the

innings-or-less 3 times.

SUCCESS IN ARLINGTON: Is 7-0, 3.19 (22 ER/62.0 IP) in 10 home starts this season, joining Kenny Rogers (April 27-Sept. 11, 2005) as only 2 pitchers with wins in 7 straight decisions during the same season at Rangers Ballpark...was first pitcher in club history to win each of his first 5 remainder of camp and placed on ML 15-day disabled list April 4...stayed in Surprise for rehab work the same season at Rangers Ballpark...was first pitcher in club history to win each of his first 5 home starts to begin a season before no decision on July 8 vs. Baltimore...for his career, has gone 13-4 with a 3.79 ERA (56 ER/133.0 IP) in 22 games/starts at Rangers Ballpark...his .765 winning pct. at RBIA is highest ever by a starting pitcher with at least 15 decisions...since start of 2010 WITH OKC: Was optioned to Triple-A Oklahoma City on April 28 and made 6 starts for the 2009, has gone 13-3, 3.27 ERA (45 ER/123.2 IP) in 20 starts in Arlington...made 7 straight QS at RBIA from June 5-July 25, 2nd-longest streak ever by a Texas pitcher (Ryan Drese-8).

RARE LINE: Did not record a strikeout or issue a walk over 8.0 innings on Aug. 22 at Baltimore...it was the first time in over 4 years for a pitcher to toss at least 8.0 innings without a walk or strike-out...in fact, the only 2 other pitchers in the past 11 seasons (2000-2010) to pull the trick both did it against Minnesota in May 2006: Detroit's Justin Verlander (5/17/06 at Comerica) and Seattle's Joel Pineiro (5/1/06 at Metrodome)...only one other pitcher in Rangers history had done it (8.0+ IP, 0 BB, 0 SO): Jon Matlack on May 11, 1979 at Toronto (9.0 IP).

2010 NOTES: Team is 15-5 in his 20 starts...opponents batting .258 (117-454) with 42 XBH (19 doubles, 3 triples, 20 HR), but are just 17-for-88 (.193) w/ RISP...has held opponents to 2 walksor-less in 15 of 20 starts, including one-or-zero walks 9 times...was recalled from Triple-A Oklahoma City June 5 and tossed his 2nd career CG that same day in a 6-1 victory over Tampa Bay (9.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER)...see more in separate note...left start on June 16 at Florida after facing 3 hitters in the 3rd inning due to a strained hip flexor (1 ER/2.1 IP)...initially injured hip flexor on a 2nd-inning pickoff attempt, but returned to the mound in the 3rd inning, facing 2-plus batters before exiting the game...earned rubber match 10-1 victory opposite Roy Oswalt on June 27 vs. Houston (1 ER/6.0 IP), helping to secure Rangers' 8th consecutive series victory to match 1977 club record...earned 3-1 victory on July 3 vs. Chicago-A.L., winning on his birthday for 2nd consecutive season, first pitcher to pull trick since Boston's Tim Wakefield in '04-'05 (Aug. 2)...opened 2nd "half" with first road victory on July 15 at Boston, matching club record with 6th consecutive win to start a season...earned 7-0 win on July 20 at Detroit, facing just 4 over minimum in 7.0

scoreless IP...pitched in front of several family members/friends visiting from nearby hometown of Indianapolis...took first loss of season July 31 at LAA after being staked to a 5-0 lead...allowed 8 runs, was 2nd-most in his career (9 on 8/14/08 at BOS)...tossed 6.1 scoreless in 6-0 win Aug. 5 at Seattle (vs. Felix Hernandez), as M's went 0-for-10 w/ RISP vs. Hunter...limited to 3.0-plus innings Aug. 13 vs. Boston by a stomach virus...allowed career-high 4 HR...set new career high with 10th victory in 6-4 win Aug. 22 at BAL...established career high with 8 K's Sept. 11 vs. NYY (5.0 IP, 2 R), an outing shortened due to a 59-minute rain delay.
