Central...club has held a lead between 7.0 and 10.0 games for 61 straight days...team's largest lead of the season is 10.0 games, accomplished 3 times (Sept. 2; Sept. 15; Sept. 18) after being done on only one day previously in franchise history (Sept. 30, 1999)...Texas has had sole possession of first for 109 straight days and has spent 145 total days in first.

WINNING SEASON: At 85-68, the Rangers have produced a winning season for only the 3rd time in the last 11 seasons (2000-10), also 2004 (89-73) and 2009 (87-75)...this marks the 1st time that Texas has had a winning record in consecutive years since 1998-99 and the 5th time club has had streaks of at least 2 straight winning seasons: 3--1977-79; 3--1989-91; 2--1955-96; 2--1998-99...the 85 victories tie 1991 for 10th most in club history, one shy of 1993 total.

ROAD RECORD: Texas is 37-42 (.468) away from home in 2010, 6th in the A.L. and 12th in the majors in road winning percentage...this will be the 4th straight year and 10th time in 11 seasons (starting 2000) that the Rangers have had a losing road record, the exception being 2006 (41-40)...the 42 road defeats match season total in both 2008 and 2009...club is 9-18 (.333) away from home since winning 3 in a row, August 4-6, the 3rd lowest road winning percentage in the majors since August 7 to: .105 (2-17) by Pittsburgh and .273 (6-16) by Kansas City...team has losing streaks of 6, 5, 4, and 3 road games in period....of the 18 losses in that span, 9 have been by one (6) or 2 (4) runs.

<u>VERSUS THE WEST AND THE A'S:</u> Texas is 27-21 in its own division in 2010, 9-13 beginning July 28..the Rangers are 12-14 in A.L. West parks this season. --Texas is 8-9 against the A's in 2010, ending a 3-game losing streak non Friday...the club finished 5-4 vs. Oakland in Arlington and is 3-5 at the Coliseum, having dropped 3 of 4 contests...the Rangers are 16-20 against the A's since the start of 2009 with a 7-11 record at the Coliseum in that span...in the all-time series, the Rangers lead, 292-286 overall with the A's holding a 152-136 edge here in Oakland.

--Batting at the Coliseum: Afyer hitting just .213 (48-225) in their 1st 7 games at the Oakland Coliseum this season, the Rangers had 10 runs and 18 hits on

Friday...it was the most hits by the Rangers in this park since May 4, 2005 (18)...overall, the Rangers have 18 homers in 17 games vs. the A's this season, the most against any opponent.

A LOOK BACK: The Rangers have won 3 A.L. West Division titles in club history, 1996, 1998, and 1999...Dates on which the clubs secured a playoff spot

IT'S NIGHT AND DAY: The Rangers have the majors' 2nd best winning percentage in night games at .611 (69-44) behind Philadelphia at .632 (67-39)...current team record for night game winning percentage is .614 (78-49) in 1999...on the other hand, Texas is 16-24 (.400) in day games, the majors' 7th lowest winning percentage and 11th lowest in the A.L. ahead of the Indians at .320 (16-34), the Mariners at .326 (15-31), and the Orioles at .390 (16-..Texas is 7-17 on the road in day games, losing 4 straight since winning in Baltimore on August 22 and 7 of the last 8 beginning August 1.

BATTING UPDATE: After being blanked on one hit on Thursday, the Rangers scored 10+ runs for the 14th time in 2010 last night..the club's 18 hits on Friday were 3rd most of season, most since July 19 at Detroit (19)...the team tied a season best for doubles (5), the 3rd time...club had scored just 2 runs, both unearned, in the previous $\hat{3}$ games, the 1st time Texas had ever gone $\hat{3}$ consecutive games without producing an earned run.

--Texas is hitting .237 (67-283) with 24 runs scored in the 1st 8 games of this trip, batting .244 (15-67) with RISP...club is batting .284 (236-830) over last 23 games and ranks 2nd in the majors and A.L. with .275 average behind Minnesota (.277)...Texas leads the majors with 1463 hits, including clubrecord (since 1987) 174 infield hits, ML best.

--The 18 hits on Friday matched the team's most ever in a next game after having one or fewer hits...Texas had just one hit on June 25, 1986 vs. California before pounding out 18 hits the following night in Seattle.

VLADIMIR GUERRERO has a .371 (26-70) average over last 17 contests to rise from .293 to .303, 10th in A.L....he has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games with 8 multi-hit games....his 4 BI on Friday gives him 111 for the season, 4th most in the A.L. and 61 more than his total for all of 2009...he is one of 4 active players with 10-or-more 100-RBI seasons (A. Rodriguez; M. Ramirez, Pujols), one of 16 overall players in modern era with 10 seasons of 100-or-more RBI...Vlad leads the majors with career best 52 2-out RBI and his 31 goahead RBI are 2nd-most in majors (Joey Votto-34) and most for Texas since Alex Rodriguez (32) in 2002.

Guerrero is just the 5th different righthanded batter to drive in at least 110 runs in a season in Rangers history...Juan Gonzalez did it 5 times (1993, 1996-99), Alex Rodriguez did it 3 times (2001-03) with one year each for Jeff Burroughs (1974) and Ivan Rodriguez (1999)...Alex Rodriguez was the last with 118 in 2003...Guerrero has 103 RBI as a DH, just the 2nd Texas DH ever to drive in 100+ runs...Rafael Palmeiro has a club record 115 in 1999. -Guerrero has 435 career homers, 38th all-time, one behind Chipper Jones, and 1429 RBI, 62nd all-time, one less than Yogi Berra.

ON THE MOUND: The Rangers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 6 of the 1st 8 games of this trip for a 2.83 ERA (22 ER/70.0 IP)...the club has posted a 2.76 ERA (42 ER/137.0 IP) over the last 15 games to lower season mark from 4.03 to 3.90, 5th in the A.L....the current 3.90 mark would be team's lowest for a season since 1990 (3.83)...the Rangers have not issued a homer in the last 22.0 innings with just 3 homers in the last 13 games (119.0 IP) with last 6 homers off Texas coming with bases empty.

Relievers: The bullpen has 2.55 ERA (28 ER/98.2 IP) over the last 33 games to drop from 3.42 to 3.24, **lowest in the A.L.** and 4th lowest in the majors...opponents batting .217 (78-360) over that 33-game span...the 3.22 mark would be lowest since 3.23 relief ERA in 1983 and rank as 6th lowest ever...Texas also leads A.L. with 29 relief wins, matching 5th most in club history...bullpen has issued one homer in 49.0 innings over last 13 games.

(4 ER/25.1 IP) in his last 24 appearances to go from 3.86 to 2.91.

TODAY: The 23-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and 10th start of the season this afternoon...will be his 6th appearance and 5th start since being recalled from Triple-A Oklahoma City on Aug. 28 for his 3rd stint with the Rangers this season...was also with the club May 12-30 and Aug. 18-19...has gone 1-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 ER/23.2 IP) over those 5 games/4 starts during this most recent stint...will be taking his 5th consecutive turn through the Texas rotation, going 1-2, 4.26 (9 ER/19.0 IP) over his last 4 starts to lower season figure from 4.76 to 4.56...will be working on regular 4 days' rest, as took a 4-3 loss to the Angels on Monday in Anaheim...is 3-4 with a 4.75 ERA (22 ER/41.2 IP) in 9 starts, posting a 3.18 ERA (2 ER/5.2 IP) in 2 relief appearances...has spent balance of 2010 season at Oklahoma City (AAA), going 6-2 with a 1.87 ERA (13 ER/62.2 IP) in 11 games/starts...PCL batters hit .216 (50-231) with 18 BB's and 51 K's.

LAST START: Logged just 3.2 innings in his start on Monday in Anaheim and took a 7-4 loss to the Angels (3.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R-ER, 3 BB, SO, 74 pitches-45 strikes)...gave up one run on Brandon Wood's 2-out RBI-single in the 2nd and 3 runs prior to his exit in the 4th on a trio of RBI-doubles from Jeff Mathis, Howie Kendrick, and Bobby Abreu.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 ER/19.0 IP) in 5 career games against Oakland, including 1-1, 2.61 (3 ER/10.1 IP) in 2 starts...has made a pair of appearances versus the A's in 2010, both in Arlington, allowing just a single ER over 10.2 innings (1-0, 0.84 ERA)...tossed 6.0 shutout frames (7 K's) in a 10-1 win on May 12, also his Texas season elieved Rich Harden in a 5-0 loss on Aug. 28, allowing 1 run over 4.2 innings...has made 2 career appearances here at the Oakland Coliseum: 2.0 scoreless innings of relief on May 6, 2009...took 6-0 loss on Aug. 4, 2009 (4.1 IP, 4 H, 4 R-3 ER, 1 HR, 4 BB, 4 SO), starting opposite Gio Gonzalez, his scheduled opponent this afternoon.

AS A STARTER: Has gone 9-16, 5.84 (103 ER/158.2 IP) through his first 30 career starts...has dropped 10 of his last 14 decisions over a span of 16 starts since Aug. 26, 2009 at Yankee Stadium...opponents are batting .277 (176-635) with 75 extra-base hits...48 of the 110 total runs he has allowed as a starter in his career have come by way of 29 home runs, as he has allowed at least one HR in 19 of 30 career starts, but none in his last 4 starts.

ON THE ROAD: Slated to make his 7th appearance and 6th start away from Arlington this season, going 1-4, 7.17 (17 ER/21.1 IP) in 6 previous games/5 starts...snapped a 6-game road losing streak with 5.0 shutout innings in his win on Sept. 8 at TOR, but has still dropped 9 of his last 11 road decisions...went 2-6, 4.98 (36 ER/65.0 IP) over 17 road games in 2009, including 1-6, 5.47 (31 ER/51.0 IP) in 9 road starts...road ERA was over 2 full runs lower than home ERA (7.12), while opponents Avg./OBP/SLG figures on the road (.252/.307/.417) were notably lower than those at Rangers Ballpark (.319/.379/.588).

REHAB: Missed 54 games while on the disabled list with inflammation in his left rotator cuff and a knee injury sustained on June 18 during fielding practice in Arizona...had been throwing bullpen sessions in anticipation of a rehab assignment when knee was injured...knee injury was similar to the one he suffered in spring training...made first rehab start with AZL Rangers July 23 vs. AZL Royals (3.0 IP, 0 H, 0 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR)...made additional rehab start with Oklahoma City on July 28 vs. Iowa (4.2 IP, 7 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 87 pitches/60 strikes)...was activated from DL on Aug. 1 and optioned to OKC.

2010 NOTES: Team is 4-5 in his 9 starts...of his 26 runs allowed as a starter this season, 8 have come on 6 home runs, but no home runs in 4 September starts (19.0 IP)...lefties are just 6-for-39 (.154) with no HR...optioned to OKC from major league spring training camp March 27...made 6 starts for RedHawks after beginning season in Pacific Coast Leagu....recalled from Triple-A Oklahoma City prior to game May 12 when Matt Harrison went on DL...earned win in that 10-1 victory on May 12 vs. Oakland, tossing 6.0 shutout innings on extended 7 days' rest...was 6th starter and 13th pitcher used by the Rangers...was the latest in a season (game no. 34) for Texas to use only 5 starters since 2005...that year, the season-opening rotation of Drese-Rogers-Young-Park-Astacio remained intact until Ricardo Rodriguez started game no. 60...also won his 2nd start of season in 4-3 Texas victory on May 17 vs. LAA in match-up with Scott Kazmir...allowed HR to Napoli (2-run) and Hunter (solo)...exited start on May 30 at Minnesota in the 2nd inning with left shoulder soreness...was later diagnosed with a rotator cuff inflammation and placed on the disabled list...made rehab starts with AZL Rangers on 7/23 and OKC on 7/28 before he was activated from ML disabled list on 8/1 and optioned to OKC...made 3 additional starts with OKC before recall prior to start on Aug. 18 at TB...optioned to OKC on Aug. 20...started one game with the RedHawks on 8/23 at Round Rock before latest recall on Aug. 28...made 2nd relief appearance of season on Aug. 28 vs. OAK, tossing 4.2 innings in relief of Rich Harden, matching longest relief outing for Texas this season (also Feldman, 8/7 at OAK)...lost start on Sept. 3 at MIN despite exiting with a 3-2 lead in the 7th (6.1 IP, 4 R-ER)...held a 2-1 lead until Twins tied game in 6th and plated 2 more runs in the 7th...gave up a one-out single (Valencia) and walk (Repko) in the 7th before exiting...Ogando and Harrison gave up RBI-singles to Hardy and Span, respectively, following Holland's departure...charged with 3 unearned runs (4 total runs) in 11-4 win on Sept. 14 vs. Detroit (ND).

AT OKLAHOMA CITY: Went 6-2 with a 1.87 ERA (13 ER/62.2) over 11 starts in 3 stints with the RedHawks this season...opposing Pacific Coast League batters batted .216 (50-231) with 18 walks and 51 strikeouts...held lefties to a .148 avg. (9-61), while right-handers hit .241 (41-170)...went 3-1 with a 2.51 (9 ER/32.1 IP) in 6 home starts at AT&T Bricktown Ballpark...was 3-1, 1.19 (4 ER/30.1 IP) in 5 road starts...opposition went 8-for-47 (.170) with runners in scoring position...opened season with 6 starts for the RedHawks, going 4-1 with a 0.93 ERA (4 ER/38.2 IP)...earned Rangers Minor League Pitcher of the Month honors for April, going 3-1 with a 0.53 ERA (2 ER/33.2 IP) in 5 games/starts...his 0.53 mark was the lowest qualifying ERA in the PCL for April, while his 29 strikeouts ranked 2nd.
