A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail the season series 8-9...are 2-5 in Anaheim and went 6-4 in Oakland...lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and five of the previous six...are 60-71 (.458) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 365-294 against the Angels...that includes 190-140 in Oakland and 175-154 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 414-371 against the Angels

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Craig Breslow has a career high 67 strikeouts, which is tied for the second best total by a left-handed reliever in Oakland history.

Mark Ellis hit the 191st double of his career yesterday, tying Miguel Tejada for 10th place in Oakland history...is batting an American League leading .407 (37 for 91) in September...he ranks second among AL second basemen in fielding (.994)...

Michael Wuertz has not allowed a run in nine career outings against the Angels (9.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 20 so).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1971 the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as they defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...in 1975 Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to nohit the California Angels, 5-0...Blue pitches five innings, Abbott and Lindblad one each and Fingers the final two in the first four-pitcher no-hitter in major league history...in 1990 Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th game of the season...he would go on to save 48 games while compiling a microscopic 0.61 ERA...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season in his final at bat as an Athletic...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's American League record for home runs by a catcher...also homered in his first at bat as an Athletic.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight and five of the last six games and are now two games under .500 at 77-79...have been between two games over .500 and three games under .500 every day since the All-Star Break...have been exactly .500 21 times since the All-Star Break and 32 times this year, which is an on-going Athletics record...the A's 77 wins are their most since 2006 when they won the AL West with a 93-69 record...trail Texas by 10 games in the American League West and have been between seven and 10 games back every day since June 25...have not been more than 10 games back since June 24 when they were a season high 11 games out...are 23-28 in the first game of a series, 24-26 in the second game and 27-20 in the third game...have a 43-54 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 34-25 against teams that were below .500...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 72 days in second, nine days tied for second, 58 days in third and one day in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season high 16 runs Sunday against Texas and tied an Oakland record for hits allowed in a nine-inning game with 22 (also August 26, 1997 vs. New York)...allowed 30 runs on 49 hits over the final three games of the Texas series following Thursday's one-hit shutout of the Rangers...the season ERA jumped .06 runs Sunday and is now 3.63 after yesterday's 6-5 loss...however, still have the **lowest ERA in the AL**...also lead the AL in shutouts (16), opponents batting average (.245), opponents slugging percentage (.382) and pickoffs (25)...the 16 shutouts are the second best total by an A's team over the last 20 years (had 19 in 2002) and tied for the third best total in the designated hitter ERA (since 1974).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 37-30 with a 3.25 ERA (188 er in 521.0 ip) over the last 82 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 contests...have a 3.55 ERA (376 er in 952.1 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors** (San Francisco, 3.53)...since 1992[S1], the only American League team to have an ERA under 3.62 is the 2002 Boston Red Sox (3.53)...starters also have the lowest opponents batting average (.243) and slugging percentage (.375) in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.308).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game jaunt to Los Angeles (0-1) and Seattle (four games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip Kansas City (1-2) and Minnesota (2-1) and have lost 17 of their last 26 road games...are 30-45 (.400) on the road and have clinched a losing road record for the fourth consecutive season...went 3-4 on the final homestand against Chicago (2-1) and Texas (1-3)...the series loss to Texas was the A's first at home since they were swept by New York, July 5-7...had gone 10-0-1 over an 11-series home stretch...finished the season 47-34 (.580) at home, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006...posted a 3.02 ERA (247 er in 736.0 ip) at home and have a 4.32 ERA (308 er in 641.0 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the majors (San Diego, 2.98)...the home ERA was the lowest by an AL team since the 1992 Milwaukee Brewers posted a 2.74 ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 34-20 (.630) record during the day compared to 43-59 (.422) at night...the day record is second best in the majors behind Colorado (34-19) and the night record is fourth worst in the American League...have a 3.06 ERA (163 er in 479.2 ip) during the day and a 3.94 ERA (392 er in 894.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have 148 stolen bases, which is the 10th best single season total in Oakland history...it is the best since the 1991 club stole 151 bases (which ranks ninth on the single season charts)...106 of the A's 148 steals have come from three players (Davis 47, Crisp 32, Pennington 27), which are the most steals by three Oakland teammates since 1983 when Rickey Henderson (108), Mike Davis (32) and Bill Almon (26) combined for 166...the A's rank third in the American League and the majors in steals and top the AL in stolen base percentage (80.0%)...the percentage is second [S2]best in Oakland history (80.7%)...lead the majors with 31 stolen bases in September and 83 since the All-Star Break...have two players with 30 or more stolen bases for the first time since 1995 and three with 20 or more steals for the first time since 1992...have a record of 55-29 when stealing at least one base and are 22-50 with no stolen bases.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit three home runs in their past two games and now have 99 for the season, which is the second lowest single season total in Oakland history (94 in 1968)...next lowest is 100 in 1978...the 99 home runs are second fewest in the majors ahead of Seattle (98)...Kevin Kouzmanoff leads the A's with 14 home runs and the fewest home runs by a team leader in Oakland history in 17 by Mitchell Page in 1978 and Dwayne Murphy and Davey Lopes in 1983...the last time the Athletics team leader had fewer than 17 home runs was in 1967 in Kansas City when Rick Monday led the team with 14.

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest extra base hits in the American League (398), the second lowest slugging percentage (.376) and batting average with runners in scoring position (.240) and the fourth fewest runs scored (634)...over the last 28 years, the only time the A's have scored fewer than 700 runs in a non-strike season was in 2008 (646)...have 510 walks and have not walked fewer than 527 times in a non-strike season since 1985 when they had 508.

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West Saturday in game 154 after being eliminated from the Wild Card on September 18 in game 147...this is the seventh time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated in game 154 or later, most recently in 2005 when they were eliminated in game 157...the A's magic number over the Angels to clinch second place is six and they need to win four of the remaining six games to end their streak of three consecutive losing seasons.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is second most in Oakland history (25 in 2008)...have used the DL 87 times since the start of the 2007 season and the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas [S3](98)...the 23 players have combined to miss an Oakland record 1335 games (58.0 games per stint)...the previous mark was 1259 in 2007...currently have nine players on the DL [S4]and have had at least five players on the DL all year[S5].

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season, his 14th since coming off the disabled list July 20...the A's are 12-16 (.429) in his starting assignments this year and are 32-42 (.432) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 21 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batter or fewer 25 times.

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 1-4 with a 4.55 ERA (15 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts in September...is second in the American League in losses this month...since 1999, the only A's pitcher to lose five games in one month is Joe Kennedy in September, 2005

ERA AND WINNING PERCENTAGE: Will finish with a losing record as he is 10-13 with two starts remaining...is tied for eighth in the American League in losses and has career highs in wins and losses...his 3.49 ERA is currently the lowest of his career (previously 3.89 in 2009)...the last time an A's pitcher finished the season with an ERA under 3.83 and a losing record was in 1978 when Matt Keough went 8-15 with a 3.24 ERA and Rick Langford went 7-13 with a 3.43 ERA.

SINCE HIS RETURN: Is 6-6 with a 3.12 ERA (30 er in 86.2 ip) and .220 (69 for

314) opponents batting average in 13 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 20...went 4-7 with a 3.83 ERA and .265 opponents average before that...was placed on the 15-day DL July 3 retroactive to June 23 with left elbow tightness...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab start for Single-A Stockton on July 15 and had a no decision in the Ports 10-9 win over Visalia (4.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in 16 of his 28 starts this year and his season run support of 3.59 (72 rs in 180.2 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League...has run support of 4.67 (45 rs in 86.2 ip) in his 13 starts since coming off the disabled list after receiving support of 2.59 runs over his first 15 starts...has 15 runs of support in his 13 losses this year (76.1 ip, 1.77 RSA) and 34 runs of support in his 34 career losses (185.0 ip, 1.65 RSA)...is 2-31 in 44 career starts with support of two runs or fewer and 21-3 in 30 starts with run support of three or more...has career run support of 3.62 (176 rs in 438.0 ip) as a starter.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 42 batters in 180.2 innings, an average of 2.09 per nine innings...that is the fifth lowest mark in the American League...had a streak of 20 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer from May 3 to September 7, which tied for the third longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history...Gil Heredia set the record with a 26-game streak (April 10-August 28, 1999) and Brett Anderson had a 22-game streak end September 11.

ON THE BASES: Ranks third in the American League with a career high tying seven pickoffs (also 2008)...now has 16 career pickoffs...the Twins Danny Valencia stole second base in the second inning on June 4 and that was the first stolen base he allowed since Aug. 20, 2008, also against Minnesota (Punto)...had gone 230.1 innings without allowing a stolen base...opponents are 1 for 3 in stolen base attempts off him this year and 4 for 11 (36.4%) in his career.

SHUTOUTS AND COMPLETE GAMES: Is tied for the American League lead in shutouts (2) and ranks fourth in complete games (5)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts since Tim Hudson in 2004 and the first with five complete games since Mark Mulder in 2004...began his career with 52 consecutive starts without a complete game to set an Oakland record to start a career, topping the previous mark of 51 by Todd Van Poppel from September 11, 1991-September 12, 1995...it was the fourth longest streak at any point in Oakland history.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 35 of his 77 runs this year in the fifth and sixth inning (13 in the fifth, 22 in the sixth)...has a 2.25 ERA (28 er in 112.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 5.50 ERA (42 er in 68.2 ip) average after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 5-10 with a 4.19 ERA (48 er in 103.0 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest and 5-3 with a 2.55 ERA (22 er in 77.2 ip) in 12 starts on five or more days rest.

BRADEN AND POWELL: Has made nine starts with Landon Powell as his catcher and is 4-5 with four complete games, both of his shutouts and a 2.63 ERA (19 er in 65.0 ip) in those starts, including his perfect game...is 6-8 with a 3.97 ERA (51 er in 115.2 ip) in his other 19 starts.

LAST START: He combined with Ziegler on a one-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Texas last Thursday in Oakland...tossed eight of the inning and allowed the only hit, a two-out single to Cruz in the first inning...set down 19 in a row after that before issuing back-to-back walks to start the eighth...then retired each of the final three batters and was relieved by Ziegler to start the ninth after throwing 114 pitches.

BRADEN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-5 with a 4.61 ERA (52.2 ip, 66 h, 30 r, 27 er, 7 bb, 33 so, 5 hr) in 12 career appearances, including eight starts...has never walked more than one batter against the Angels...is 2-5 with a 4.82 ERA (25 er in 46.2 ip) in his eight starts...is 2-2 with a 3.66 ERA (13 er in 32.0 ip) in seven appearances, four starts, at Los Angeles and 0-3 with a 6.10 ERA (14 er in 20.2 ip) in five games, four starts, in Oakland...is 1-2 with a 5.03 ERA (19.2 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 11 er, 3 bb, 11 so) in three starts this year...the win came in a 9-4 A's victory at Los Angeles April 11...allowed two runs in the first inning on a solo home run by Abreu and a RBI single by Morales...allowed a sacrifice fly to Hunter in the sixth to give the Angels a 3-1 lead but the A's scored three times in the seventh for the win...then tossed a complete game in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles May 14...allowed four runs in the sixth inning on a Morales RBI single and a Matsui three-run home run...Saunders shutout the A's on four hits and two walks...also lost in a 7-1 decision in Oakland on June 9...allowed an unearned run in the third and the bullpen allowed two of his inherited runners to score in the sixth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Bobby Cramer (2-1, 3.71 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...won the first two starts of his career, both day games on the road...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to win each of the first two games of his career along with Dave Hamilton (4 in 1972), Bill Krueger (2 in 1983) and Vin Mazzaro (2 in 2009)...then lost his third start in a night game at home...is making his first career appearance and start against the Angels.

The A's bullpen has converted 36 of 49 (73.5%) save opportunities, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League...are tied for the fewest blown saves (13) but are tied for the second fewest save opportunities...last year, the pen had 50 save opportunities, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1982 (41)...has allowed 53 of 197 (26.9%) inherited runners to score, which is third lowest percentage in the AL...first batters faced are hitting .211 (78 for 369), which is third lowest in the AL...however, has allowed 13 first batter home runs, which is tied for third most...has a 3.46 ERA (62 er in 161.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.07 ERA before the break...has a 3.34 ERA (83 er in 223.1 ip) at home compared to 4.39 (98 er in 201.0 ip) on the road

- Underwent season ending surgery on his right elbow Friday...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in Florida.

 Finished with 25 saves, which was one short of his total of 26 from his rookie season last year...posted a 1.47 ERA after compiling a 1.84 mark
- Was on the disabled list from July 21 to August 21 with a right intercostal strain and had a 1.04 ERA in nine outings following his return.
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time.
