ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five straight and six of the last seven games and are now tied with the Angels for second place in the American League West...trail Texas by 10 games and have been between seven and 10 games back every day since June 25...have not been more than 10 games back since June 24 when they were a season high 11 games out...drop to three games under .500 at 77-80...have been between two games over .500 and three games under .500 every day since the All-Star Break...have been exactly .500 21 times since the All-Star Break and 32 times this year, which is an on-going Athletics record...the A's 77 wins are their most since 2006 when they won the AL West with a 93-69 record...are 23-28 in the first game of a series, 24-27 in the second game and 27-20 in the third game...have a 43-54 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 34-26 against teams that were below .500...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 72 days in second, 10 days tied for second, 58 days in third and one day in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season high 16 runs Sunday against Texas and tied an Oakland record for hits allowed in a nine-inning game with 22 (also August 26, 1997 vs. New York)...allowed 30 runs on 49 hits over the final three games of the Texas series following Thursday's one-hit shutout of the Rangers...however, still have the **lowest ERA in the AL (3.63)**...also lead the AL in shutouts (16), opponents slugging percentage (.383) and pickoffs (26) and rank second in opponents batting average (.245)...the 16 shutouts are the second best total by an A's team over the last 20 years (had 19 in 2002) and tied for the third best total in the designated hitter ERA (since 1974).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 37-31 with a 3.26 ERA (191 er in 528.0 ip) over the last 83 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 contests...have a 3.56 ERA (379 er in 959.1 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors** (San Francisco, 3.52)...since 1992, the only American League team to have an ERA under 3.62 is the 2002 Boston Red Sox (3.53)...starters also have the lowest opponents batting average (.244) and slugging percentage (.376) in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.308).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game jaunt to Los Angeles (0-2) and Seattle (four games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip Kansas City (1-2) and Minnesota (2-1) and have lost 17 of their last 26 road games...are 30-46 (.395) on the road and have clinched a losing road record for the fourth consecutive season...went 3-4 on the final homestand against Chicago (2-1) and Texas (1-3)...the series loss to Texas was the A's first at home since they were swept by New York, July 5-7...had gone 10-0-1 over an 11-series home stretch...finished the season 47-34 (.580) at home, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006...posted a 3.02 ERA (247 er in 736.0 ip) at home and have a 4.32 ERA (308 er in 641.0 ip) on the road...have the second lowest home ERA in the majors (San Diego, 2.98)...the home ERA was the lowest by an AL team since the 1992 Milwaukee Brewers posted a 2.74 ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 34-20 (.630) record during the day compared to 43-60 (.417) at night...the day record is second best in the majors behind Colorado (34-19) and the night record is fourth worst in the American League...have a 3.06 ERA (163 er in 479.2 ip) during the day and a 3.94 ERA (395 er in 902.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have 150 stolen bases, which is the 10th best single season total in Oakland history...it is the best since the 1991 club stole 151 bases (which ranks ninth on the single season charts)...106 of the A's 150 steals have come from three players (Davis 47, Crisp 32, Pennington 28), which are the most steals by three Oakland teammates since 1983 when Rickey Henderson (108), Mike Davis (32) and Bill Almon (26) combined for 166...the A's lead the AL and rank second the majors in steals in stolen base percentage (80.2%)...the percentage is second best in Oakland history...lead the majors with 33 stolen bases in September and 85 since the All-Star Break...have two players with 30 or more stolen bases for the first time since 1995 and three with 20 or more steals for the first time since 1992...have a record of 55-30 when stealing at least one base and are 22-49 with no stolen bases.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit four home runs in their past three games and now have 100 for the season, which is tied for the third lowest single season total in Oakland history (100 in 1978)...the 100 home runs are second fewest in the majors ahead of Seattle (99)...Kevin Kouzmanoff leads the A's with 15 home runs and the fewest home runs by a team leader in Oakland history in 17 by Mitchell Page in 1978 and Dwayne Murphy and Davey Lopes in 1983...the last time the Athletics team leader had fewer than 17 home runs was in 1967 in Kansas City when Rick Monday led the team with 14.

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest extra base hits in the American League (401), the second lowest slugging percentage (.376) and batting average with runners in scoring position (.240) and the fourth fewest runs scored (636)...over the last 28 years, the only time the A's have scored fewer than 700 runs in a non-strike season was in 2008 (646)...have 513 walks and have not walked fewer than 527 times in a non-strike season since 1985 when they had 508.

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West Saturday in game 154 after being eliminated from the Wild Card on September 18 in game 147...this is the seventh time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated in game 154 or later, most recently in 2005 when they were eliminated in game 157...the A's need to win four of the remaining five games to end their streak of three consecutive losing seasons.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is second most in Oakland history (25 in 2008)...have used the DL 87 times since the start of the 2007 season and the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (98)...the 23 players have combined to miss an Oakland record 1358 games (59.0 games per stint)...the previous mark was 1259 in 2007...currently have nine players on the DL and have had at least five players on the DL all year.

A's vs. ANGELS

The A's trail the season series 8-10...are 2-6 in Anaheim and went 6-4 in Oakland...lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and five of the previous six...are 60-72 (.455) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 365-295 against the Angels...that includes 190-140 in Oakland and 175-155 in Los Angeles...all-time, the A's are 414-372 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Craig Breslow has a career high 67 strikeouts, which is tied for the second best total by a left-handed reliever in Oakland history.

Mark Ellis hit the 191st double of his career on Monday, tying Miguel Tejada for 10th place in Oakland history...is batting an American League leading .411 (39 for 95) in September...he ranks second among AL second basemen in fielding (.994).

Michael Wuertz has not allowed a run in nine career outings against the Angels (9.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 20 so).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1983, rookie pitcher Mike Warren, who started the year in Double-A, no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in the A's 3-0 win...in 1988, the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 6-2 for their 102nd win of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 101 set in 1971...Oakland would go on to win 104 games and sweep the Red Sox in the ALCS before losing to Los Angeles in the World Series...in 1991, Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in 2001, Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

OAKLAND A's OLDEST PLAYERS TO MAKE THEIR MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento on September 10 and made his Major League debut with a start at Kansas City September 13.

WINS AND LOSSES: Won the first two starts of his career, both day games on the road...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to win each of the first two games of his career along with Dave Hamilton (4 in 1972), Bill Krueger (2 in 1983) and Vin Mazzaro (2 in 2009)...then lost his third start in a night game at home.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs over his first three starts but all five have been solo shots...five of his seven runs allowed have come on homers...has yielded four of his home runs to right-handed hitters.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .326 (14 for 43) batting average with the bases empty and a .143 (3 for 21) mark with runners on...has a .160 (4 for 25) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 (7 for 25) the second time through and .429 (6 for 14) with three of his five home runs the third time through.

DEBUTS: Made his Major League debut September 13 in Kansas City at the age of 30 years, 320 days, making him the fourth oldest player in Oakland history to make his big league debut (see chart on lower left)...was the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make a start in his big league debut since Steve Gerkin started the second game of a doubleheader for the Philadelphia A's against St. Louis on May 13, 1945 at the age of 32 years, 175 days...became the 41st pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut...since 1957, the only ML pitcher born in the United States to make a start in his debut that was older than Cramer is David Manning of the Milwaukee Brewers on August 2, 2003 (30 years, 353 days)...all age data is according to baseball-reference.com.

WINNING DEBUTS: Picked up the win in his debut to become just the fifth pitcher since 1950 to start and win their Major League debut at age 30 or older, according to the Elias Sports Bureau...the other four were all Japanese veterans (Masato Yoshiii, Hiroki Kuroda, Koji Uehara and Kenshin Kawakami) making Cramer the first American-born pitcher to start and win his debut at the age of 30 or greater since John "Jocko" Thompson did it for the 1948 Phillies at the age of 31...is the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win his debut...is the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to start and win his debut.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 victory at Kansas City September 13...allowed a leadoff double to Dyson but after a ground out, he was picked off/caught stealing...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a Betemit single in the second was erased on a double play...allowed his only run in the fourth inning on a one-out solo home run by Aviles in the fourth...was relieved by Ziegler after retiring the first batter in the sixth inning.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 win at Minnesota September 19...shutout the Twins on three hits and three walks over the first five innings and took a 5-0 lead into the sixth inning...allowed a pair of solo home runs to Cuddyer and Thome in the sixth and was relieved by Ziegler with two outs in the sixth.

LAST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 10-3 loss to Texas last Friday in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Guerrero in the second inning and a RBI single to Francouer in the fourth...the A's scored their first run in the sixth inning but he allowed a leadoff home run to Francouer in the seventh...Cantu followed with a double and he was relieved by Bonser, who allowed Cantu to score plus three runs of his own.

CRAMER vs. LOS ANGELES: Is making his first career appearance and start.

2010 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Began the year with the Athletics organization but was loaned to Quintana Roo of the Mexican League on March 16...went 13-3 with a 2.95 ERA in 22 games, 20 starts, and allowed a .244 opponents batting average...also went 1-0 with a 4.38 ERA in three games, two starts, in the postseason...was returned to the Athletics organization August 3 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento where he went 2-2 with a 1.94 ERA in seven games, all starts...combined with both teams for a 15-5 record, 2.71 ERA and 158 strikeouts in 169.2 innings...issued just 38 walks for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.2 to 1...allowed a .246 opponents batting average, including .232 against right-handed hitters and .304 against lefties.

AMONG THE MEXICAN LEAGUE LEADERS: Led the Mexican League in wins (13), strikeouts (123), complete games (5), shutouts (3) and winning percentage (.813), ranked third in ERA (2.95) and opponents batting average (.244) and was fourth in innings pitched (128.0).

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in 41.2 innings at Sacramento and yielded just six in 128.0 innings with Quintana Roo...finished with an 11-start, 70.2 inning homerless streak...allowed just six home runs in 169.2 innings overall, an average of 0.32 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (14-9, 3.35 ERA): Is scheduled to make his team leading 33rd start of the season...is tied for fourth in the American League in games started (32), ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.333), ninth in opponents batting average (.231) and 10th in ERA (3.35)...is 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...in his last start, took the no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 1 hr)...is 3-1 with a 3.95 ERA (43.1 ip, 41 h, 21 r, 19 er, 23 bb, 40 so, 4 hr) in eight career appearances, six starts against the Angels.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

17-22, 3.78 ERA (425.2 ip, 397 h, 199 r, 179 er, 177 bb, 383 so, 52 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 36/49 (73.5%)

The A's bullpen has converted 36 of 49 (73.5%) save opportunities, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League...are tied for the fewest blown saves (13) but are tied for the second fewest save opportunities...last year, the pen had 50 save opportunities, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1982 (41)...has allowed 53 of 197 (26.9%) inherited runners to score, which is third lowest percentage in the AL...first batters faced are hitting .211 (78 for 370), which is third lowest in the AL...however, has allowed 13 first batter home runs, which is tied for third most...has a 3.44 ERA (62 er in 162.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.07 ERA before the break...has a 3.34 ERA (83 er in 223.1 ip) at home compared to 4.37 (98 er in 202.0 ip) on the road.

- Underwent season ending surgery on his right elbow Friday...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in Florida.
- Finished with 25 saves, which was one short of his total of 26 from his rookie season last year...posted a 1.47 ERA after compiling a 1.84 mark in 2009.
- Was on the disabled list from July 21 to August 21 with a right intercostal strain and had a 1.04 ERA in nine outings following his return.
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).
