A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have clinched the season series, leading 12-6 with two games to play...had lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 32-43 (.427) against the Mariners since 2007, which is the lowest winning percentage by any American League team over that span...have lost 16 of the last 22 games at Safeco Field but have won nine of the last 11 contests in Oakland...all-time, the A's are 282-207 (.577) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .577)...are 158-88 in Oakland and 124-119 in Seattle.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after a season high six-game losing streak...need a win today to avoid posting their fourth consecutive losing season...have four or more consecutive losing seasons just twice in Oakland history (6, 1993-98 and 5, 1982-86)...however, will finish with their best record since 2006 when they won the American League West with a 93-69 mark...are second in the American League West and trail Texas by 10 games...will finish the season no worse than a second-place tie with the Angels...have been exactly .500 21 times since the All-Star Break and 32 times this year, which is an on-going Athletics record...are 24-27 in the first game of a series, 25-26 in the second game and 28-21 in the third game...have a 43-54 record against opponents that were at or above .500 when the A's played them and 37-27 against teams that were below .500...have 25 days alone in first this year, eight days tied for first, 73 days in second, 12 days tied for second, 59 days in third and one day in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have posted a 4.46 ERA (40 er in 80.2 ip) and allowed a .293 (96 for 328) opponents batting average over the past nine games (3-6 record)...have a 3.21 ERA (225 er in 631.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 3.85 ERA before the break...the A's post-break ERA is the **lowest in the majors** (San Francisco, 3.24)...have a 3.56 ERA for the season (563 er in 1422.2 ip), which is the **lowest in the AL** and fourth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in shutouts (17), opponents slugging percentage (.380), opponents batting average (.244) and pickoffs (27) and rank second in opponents on-base percentage (.313)...the 17 shutouts are the second best total by an A's team over the last 20 years (had 19 in 2002) and the third best total in the designated hitter ERA (since 1974).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-3 with a 3.47 ERA (22 er in 57.0 ip) and .282 (64 for 227) opponents batting over the last nine games...however, are 40-31 with a 3.13 ERA (193 er in 555.2 ip) over the last 87 games (since June 25) after going 23-27 with a 3.92 ERA over the first 74 contests...have a 3.47 ERA (381 er in 987.0 ip) for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the majors** (St. Louis, 3.52)...since 1992, the only American League team to have an ERA under 3.62 is the 2002 Boston Red Sox (3.53)...starters also have the lowest opponents batting average (.243) and slugging percentage (.373) in the AL and second lowest onbase percentage (.307).

ON THE BASES: The A's stole three bases last night and now have 156 stolen bases for the season, which is the ninth best single season total in Oakland history...it is the most since the 1989 club stole 157 bases, which ranks eighth on the single season charts...rank third in the American League and the majors in steals and top the AL in stolen base percentage (80.8%)...the percentage is second best in Oakland history (80.7%)...lead the majors with 91 since the All-Star Break...led the majors with 36 stolen bases in September...the last time the A's stole at least 36 bases in any month was in May, 1992 (39)...have a record of 57-30 when stealing at least one base and are 23-51 with no stolen bases.

STOLEN BASE TRIOS: Rajai Davis (50), Coco Crisp (32) and Cliff Pennington (29) have combined for 111 of the A's 156 stolen bases...those are the most steals by three Oakland teammates since 1983 when Rickey Henderson (108), Mike Davis (32) and Bill Almon (26) combined for 166...have two players with 30 or more stolen bases for the first time since 1995 and three with 20 or more steals for the first time since 1992...the only time in Oakland history the A's had more than two players steal 30 bases was in 1976 when they had six.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on the final road trip of the season against Los Angeles (0-3) and Seattle (3-0)...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have lost 20 of their last 33 road games...are 33-47 (.413) on the road and have clinched a losing road record for the fourth consecutive season...went 3-4 on the final homestand against Chicago (2-1) and Texas (1-3) and finished the season 47-34 (.580) at home...that was the A's best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006...posted a 3.02 ERA at home and have a 4.14 ERA (316 er in 686.2 ip) on the road...have the third lowest home ERA in the majors (San Diego, 2.90)...the home ERA was the lowest by an AL team since the 1992 Milwaukee Brewers posted a 2.74 ERA...allowed 62 home runs at home, which is the second fewest in the AL, and 91 on the road, which is tied for second most.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 34-21 (.618) record during the day compared to 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record is third best in the AL and the night record is fourth worst...have a 3.03 ERA (165 er in 490.1 ip) during the day and a 3.84 ERA (398 er in 931.1 ip) at night...have the lowest day ERA in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit three home runs last night (seven total during this series) and now have 107 for the season...the third fewest in home runs in a single season in Oakland history was 104 in 1981 (strike-shortened season) and fourth fewest is 108 in 1979...the 107 home runs are tied with Houston for the second fewest in the majors (Seattle 101).

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest extra base hits in the American League (411), second lowest slugging percentage (.377) and batting average with runners in scoring position (.241) and fourth fewest runs scored (659)...over the last 28 years, the only time the A's have scored fewer than 700 runs in a non-strike season was in 2008 (646)...have 525 walks and have not walked fewer than 527 times in a non-strike season since 1985 when they had 508...have 30 triples, which are the most by an A's team since 1987 (33).

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West Saturday in game 154 after being eliminated from the Wild Card on September 18 in game 147...this is the seventh time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated in game 154 or later, most recently in 2005 when they were eliminated in game 157.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is second most in Oakland history (25 in 2008)...have used the DL 87 times since the start of the 2007 season and the only team that has used the DL more over that span is Texas (98)...the 23 players have combined to miss an Oakland record 1417 games (61.6 games per stint)...the previous mark was 1259 in 2007...currently have nine players on the DL and have had at least five players on the DL all year.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season, his 15th since coming off the disabled list July 20...the A's are 12-17 (.414) in his starting assignments this year and are 32-43 (.427) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 22 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batter or fewer 26 times.

IN SEPTEMBER: Went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA (18 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts in September...became just the second A's pitcher since 1999 to lose five games in one month (Joe Kennedy, September, 2005)...tied for the American League lead in losses in September (Vargas, SEA).

LOSSES AND ERA: Was charged with his 14th loss of the season in his last start and is tied for fifth in the American League in losses...however, has a 3.50 ERA, which ranks 13th in the AL...the last AL time an AL pitcher lost 14 or more games and finished with an ERA under 3.61 was in 1993 (Chuck Finley, David Cone and Ben McDonald)...is just the second A's pitcher since 1999 to lose 14 or more games (Greg Smith, 16 in 2008)...has just 10 wins and the last time an A's pitcher finished the season with an ERA under 3.83 and a losing record was in 1978 when Matt Keough went 8-15 with a 3.24 ERA and Rick Langford went 7-13 with a 3.43 ERA...has career highs in wins and losses

and his ERA is currently the lowest of his career.

SINCE HIS RETURN: Is 6-7 with a 3.17 ERA (33 er in 93.2 ip) and .231 (79 for 342) opponents batting average in 14 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 20...went 4-7 with a 3.83 ERA and .265 opponents average before that...was placed on the 15-day DL July 3 retroactive to June 23 with left elbow tightness...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab start for Single-A Stockton on July 15 and had a no decision in the Ports 10-9 win over Visalia (4.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in 17 of his 29 starts this year and his season run support of 3.55 (74 rs in 187.2 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League...has run support of 4.52 (47 rs in 93.2 ip) in his 14 starts since coming off the disabled list after receiving support of 2.59 runs over his first 15 starts...has 17 runs of support in his 14 losses this year (83.1 ip, 1.84 RSA) and 36 runs of support in his 35 career losses (192.0 ip, 1.69 RSA)...is 2-32 in 45 career starts with support of two runs or fewer and 21-3 in 30 starts with run support of three or more...has career run support of 3.60 (178 rs in 445.0 ip) as a starter.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 42 batters in 187.2 innings, an average of 2.01 per nine innings...that is the fifth lowest mark in the American League...had a streak of 20 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer from May 3 to September 7, which tied for the third longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history...Gil Heredia set the record with a 26-game streak (April 10-August 28, 1999) and Brett Anderson had a 22-game streak end September 11.

ON THE BASES: Picked off his career high eighth baserunner of the season in his last start, topping his previous high of seven from 2008...is tied for second in the majors in pickoffs this year (Buehrle, CWS 11) and now has 17 in his career...the Twins Danny Valencia stole second base in the second inning on June 4 and that was the first stolen base he allowed since Aug. 20, 2008, also against Minnesota (Punto)...had gone 230.1 innings without allowing a stolen base...opponents are 1 for 3 in stolen base attempts off him this year and 4 for 11 (36.4%) in his career.

SHUTOUTS AND COMPLETE GAMES: Is tied for the American League lead in shutouts (2) and ranks fourth in complete games (5)...is the first A's pitcher with two shutouts since Tim Hudson in 2004 and the first with five complete games since Mark Mulder in 2004...began his career with 52 consecutive starts without a complete game to set an Oakland record to start a career, topping the previous mark of 51 by Todd Van Poppel from September 11, 1991-September 12, 1995...it was the fourth longest streak at any point in Oakland history.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 37 of his 81 runs this year in the fifth and sixth inning (13 in the fifth, 24 in the sixth)...has a 2.25 ERA (29 er in 116.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 5.53 ERA (44 er in 71.2 ip) average after that.

BRADEN AND POWELL: Has made 10 starts with Landon Powell as his catcher and is 4-6 with four complete games, both of his shutouts and a 2.75 ERA (22 er in 72.0 ip) in those starts, including his perfect game...is 6-8 with a 3.97 ERA (51 er in 115.2 ip) in his other 19 starts.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Los Angeles on Tuesday...allowed a leadoff home run to Hunter in the second but that was the only run he would allow over the first five innings...took a 2-1 lead into the sixth inning but allowed a RBI single to Napoli and a RBI ground out to Matsui...was also charged with an unearned run in the seventh when Kendrick had a sacrifice fly following a Powell error.

BRADEN vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA (38.1 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 21 er, 10 bb, 24 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, six starts...is 1-1 with an 5.12 ERA (11 er in 19.1 ip) in four games in Seattle and 1-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 2-2 with a 4.71 ERA (19 er in 36.1 ip) in his six starts...is 1-1 with a 3.43 ERA (21.0 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 19 so) in three starts this year...the no decision came in a 2-1 A's win in 10 innings on April 6 in Oakland...struck out a career high 10 and allowed his only run in the fourth inning when Gutierrez doubled with one out, advance to third on a balk and scored on a wild pitch...then tossed a complete game four-hitter in the A's 5-1 win at Seattle August 11...allowed his only run in the seventh inning when Suzuki and Lopez singled, Branyan walked and Gutierrez had a sacrifice fly...took the loss in a 7-5 loss in Oakland on September 7...the Mariners sent 11 men to the plate in the second and scored five times, including a Kotchman RBI single, a Moore sacrifice fly and three straight RBI singles from Wilson, Suzuki and Figgins...also allowed a solo home run to Moore in the third.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 37/50 (74.0%)

The A's bullpen has converted 37 of 50 (74.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...are tied for the fewest blown saves (13) but have tied for the second fewest save opportunities...last year, the pen had 50 save opportunities, which was the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1982 (41)...has allowed 53 of 198 (26.8%) inherited runners to score, which is third lowest percentage in the AL...first batters faced are hitting .213 (80 for 376), which is third lowest in the AL...however, has allowed 13 first batter home runs, which is tied for fourth most...has a 3.34 ERA (83 er in 223.1 ip) at home compared to 4.29 (101 er in 212.0 ip) on the road.

- Underwent season ending surgery on his right elbow September 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in Florida.
- Finished with 25 saves, which was one short of his total of 26 from his rookie season last year...posted a 1.47 ERA after compiling a 1.84 mark in 2009.
- Was on the disabled list from July 21 to August 21 with a right intercostal strain and had a 1.04 ERA in nine outings following his return.
- Was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team and appeared in the game for the first time.
- Made the jump from Double-A to the majors in 2009 and was named American League Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA...set an Oakland
 rookie record with 26 saves, which tied for the sixth highest save total by a rookie in AL history...ranked third among AL relievers in ERA (1.84).

- Last pitched September 15 at Kansas City and has missed 16 consecutive games since then due to a left shoulder strain.
- Has not allowed a run in seven of his last nine outings (8.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 2.16 ERA) and has retired 10 of his last 11 first batters faced.
- Has allowed six of 11 inherited runners to score over his last 19 games and 12 of 34 (35.3%) for the season, which is the sixth highest percentage in the American League.
- Has a 2.37 ERA (10 er in 38.0 ip) in 41 appearances during night games compared to an 8.44 ERA (10 er in 10.2 ip) in 22 day outings.
