Major League: 2010 season snapshot: The good stuff

Taking stock of all the good that came out of Oakland in 2010:

Pitching

- Ranked third in the Majors with an American League-leading 3.56 ERA, which was the lowest mark by an A's team since the 1990 club posted a 3.18 ERA.
- Led the AL in shutouts with 17, along with opponents slugging percentage (.379) and pickoffs (27). The 17 shutouts were the second best total by an A's team over the last 21 years (19 in 2002).
- Ranked second in opponents batting average (.245) and opponents on-base percentage (.313).
- Now have an AL-best 3.97 ERA since 2000.
- **Craig Breslow** ranked second among AL relievers with 75 games pitched, tied for fourth with 74 2/3 innings and tied for sixth with 71 strikeouts, which set an Oakland record for a left-handed reliever.
- Bullpen ranked sixth in the AL with a 3.75 ERA and had just 13 blown saves, which tied for the fewest in the AL.

Starting Pitching

- Major League-leading 3.47 ERA marked the lowest ERA by an American League team since 1990, when Boston compiled a 3.32 ERA.
- Posted the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the Majors (.373) and led the AL in opponents batting average (.243).
- **Trevor Cahill** and **Gio Gonzalez's** ability to garner at least 15 wins each while aged 24 years or younger represented just the 17th time in the post-World War II era that a Major League team has done so. However, it marked the third time it's happened in Oakland (2001, 2002) over the last nine seasons.
- **Cahill** tied for fourth in the AL with 18 wins, most by an A's starter since **Mark Mulder** tallied 17 in 2004. It was the first time a pitcher aged 22 years or younger won 18 games since **Brett Saberhagen** went 20-6 for Kansas City as a 21-year-old in 1985.

Defense

- The A's committed 99 errors, which was the fifth fewest in the AL. It marked the sixth time in the last seven years they committed fewer than 100 errors.
- **Mark Ellis** ranked second among AL second basemen with a .995 fielding percentage. He has now finished at least second in each of the last four seasons in which he qualified for the leader board.

Offense

- Ranked ninth in the AL with a .256 batting average and .324 on-base percentage.
- Tallied 527 walks for the second consecutive season and have not walked fewer than 527 times in a non-strike season since 1985.
- Had 30 triples, which were the most by an A's team since 1987 (33).
- **Daric Barton** led the AL with 110 walks, ranked fifth with a .392 on-base percentage and tied for ninth with five triples.

Running Game

- The club's 156 stolen bases represented the ninth best single-season total in Oakland history and the most by an A's club since the 1989 team stole 157.
- Ranked third in the AL and the Majors in steals and led the AL and ranked second in the Majors in stolen base percentage (80.4%).
- **Rajai Davis** (50), **Coco Crisp** (32) and **Cliff Pennington** (29) combined for 111 of the 156 stolen bases, marking the most by three Oakland teammates since 1983 when **Rickey Henderson** (108), **Mike Davis** (32) and **Bill Almon** (26) combined for 166.
- **Crisp's** 32 stolen bases was a career high, and he achieved the mark in just 75 games. He was successful in 32 of 35 (91.4%) attempts, which was the best percentage in the Majors and second best in Oakland history.
- **Davis'** 50 stolen bases was also a career-high, and the mark ranked second in the AL and third in the Majors. He now has 116 career steals with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history.
- **Pennington's** 29 steals were most by an A's infielder since Carney Lansford had 35 of his 37 steals in 1989 while playing in the infield.

Miscellaneous

- The A's pitching staff had a 3.27 ERA with **Kurt Suzuki** behind the plate, which was the lowest catchers ERA in the AL by more than half a run.
- The A's compiled a 47-34 (.580) record in Oakland, their best home mark since 2006. The pitching staff's 3.02 ERA at home was the third lowest home ERA in the Majors. They allowed just 62 homers at home, which was the fewest in the AL.
- Oakland had the second best day record in the Majors with a 35-21 (.625) mark.

Arizona Fall League Opens 19th Season

Phoenix, Arizona—The Arizona Fall League, known throughout professional baseball as a finishing school for Major League Baseball’s elite prospects, begins its 19th season on Tuesday, October 12 with three games — Surprise Rafters @ Peoria Javelinas (12:35 p.m.), Mesa Solar Sox @ Phoenix Desert Dogs (12:35 p.m.) and Peoria Saguaros @ Scottsdale Scorpions (6:35 p.m.).

The six-team league, owned and operated by Major League Baseball, plays six days per week (Monday-Saturday) at five spring-training stadiums (Mesa Hohokam Stadium, Peoria Sports Complex, Phoenix Municipal Stadium, Scottsdale Stadium, and Surprise Stadium) in the Phoenix metropolitan area.

This year’s schedule features the fifth annual Rising Stars Game on Saturday, November 6 at Surprise Stadium and the annual championship game on Saturday, November 20 at Scottsdale Stadium.

The Peoria Javelinas are the defending league champions.

What Is The Arizona Fall League?

Q: What is the Arizona Fall League (AFL)?

A: Major League Baseball created the Arizona Fall League in 1992 to serve as an off-season “graduate school” for top prospects. The AFL often is known as a showcase league because its players have the opportunity to display their skills for baseball scouts, general managers and farm directors. For baseball fans, it’s a 40-day Valley of the Sun homestand featuring many of baseball’s elite prospects.

Q: How many players have played in the Arizona Fall League?

A: The Fall League welcomed its 3000th player in 2009. Over 1800 former Fall Leaguers have reached the big leagues, meaning approximately 60 percent of players assigned to the Fall League reach the major leagues.

Q: What is the genesis of the Arizona Fall League?

A: Long-time baseball executive, current special assistant to the president of the Arizona Diamondbacks, and Phoenix resident Roland Hemond is considered the “Architect of the Fall League.” His dream to create a six-week off-season league for baseball’s top prospects in Arizona each fall became reality when the Arizona Fall League began play in 1992 after he spent two years selling the concept to baseball’s hierarchy — first general managers, then owners. After veteran baseball front-office executive Mike Port shepherded the Fall League through its maiden voyage in 1992, former Cincinnati Reds traveling secretary and Triple-A Columbus Clippers’ executive Steve Cobb was hired as the Fall League’s director.

Q: Who oversees the Arizona Fall League?

A: Major League Baseball owns and operates the Arizona Fall League. Cobb has been the director since 1993. Major League Baseball’s Arizona Fall League oversight committee is comprised of two team general managers, Michael Hill (Marlins), and Tony Reagins (Angels), Cleveland team president Mark Shapiro and long-time baseball executive Terry Ryan who currently serves the Twins as special advisor to the general manager.

Q: How are the teams assembled?

A: Each major league organization sends seven players to the Arizona Fall League. Five-organization groupings comprise the six AFL teams.

Q: Where is the Arizona Fall League located?

A: During its season, the Arizona Fall League is housed in the spring-training offices of the Oakland Athletics at Phoenix Municipal Stadium.

Q: Who is eligible to play in the Arizona Fall League?

A: Roster size is 35 players, including 20 pitchers (15 designated “eligible” each game day), per team. No game will exceed 11 innings — the “Robinson Rule.” Games tied after 11 innings will be considered suspended. They will not be made up but statistics will count. Each major-league organization is required to provide seven players, subject to the following eligibility requirements:

- All Triple-A and Double-A players are eligible provided they are on Triple-A and Double-A rosters no later than August 16.
- Two players below the Double-A level are allowed for 2010.
- Foreign players are allowed as long as the player is not on his native country’s primary protected player list.
- No players with more than two years of credited major league service as of August 31 (including major league disabled list time) are eligible except a team may select one player picked in the most recently concluded Major League Rule 5 draft.
- To be eligible, players on minor league disabled lists must be activated at least 45 days before the conclusion of their respective seasons.

Q: What is the league’s schedule?

A: The six AFL teams each play a 32-game schedule from October 12-November 18. The fifth “Rising Stars Game” will be played at Surprise Stadium at 6:15 p.m. on Saturday, November 6. The league championship game is scheduled for 12:45 p.m. on Saturday, November 20 at Scottsdale Stadium.

Q: Do Fall League rosters include foreign-born players?

A: The Arizona Fall League welcomes a record number (30) of foreign-born players in 2010. They represent nine countries — Australia (2), Canada (5), Cuba (6), Dominican Republic (5), Germany (1), Mexico (2), Puerto Rico (4), Taiwan (1), and Venezuela (4).

Q: Where are the games played?

A: The 2010 Fall League utilizes five of the Valley's outstanding spring-training stadiums.

- Mesa HoHoKam Stadium, spring home of the Cubs (Mesa Solar Sox)
- Peoria Sports Complex, spring home of the Mariners/Padres (Peoria Javelinas & Saguaros)
- Phoenix Municipal Stadium, spring home of the Athletics (Phoenix Desert Dogs)
- Scottsdale Stadium, spring home of the Giants (Scottsdale Scorpions)
- Surprise Stadium, spring home of the Rangers/Royals (Surprise Rafters)

Also, the Fall League will play two games at the two newest spring-training venues.

- Camelback Ranch-Glandale, spring home of the Dodgers/White Sox (one Peoria Saguaros home game)
- Goodyear Stadium, spring home of the Indians/Reds (one Peoria Javelinas home game)

Q: When are daily start times?

A: First pitch for day games is 12:35 p.m. and 6:35 p.m. for night contests.

Q: Is the designated hitter rule employed in the Arizona Fall League?

A: Yes, the designated hitter is utilized in all Fall League games.

Q: What contributions has the Fall League made to baseball off the field?

A: Twenty-seven former AFL managers and players have become major-league managers, including 12 during the 2010 season — Dusty Baker (Reds), Daren Brown (Mariners), Terry Francona (Red Sox), Fredi Gonzalez (Marlins), Trey Hillman (Royals), A.J. Hinch (Diamondbacks), Ken Macha (Brewers), Jerry Manuel (Mets), Brad Mills (Astros), John Russell (Pirates), Mike Scioscia (Angels), and Ron Washington (Rangers). There have been 137 former AFL managers and coaches who have coached in the major leagues, including 66 in 2010. Eight ex-AFL trainers were head trainers in the major leagues in 2010. Thirty-four umpires were in the major leagues in 2010 as well. Fifty-one percent of 2010 MLB umpires received specialized training in the Arizona Fall League before reaching the major leagues. And, 76 former AFL administrators are present or past full-time employees in the baseball industry.

Q: What impact has the Arizona Fall League had on Major League Baseball?

A: As the Arizona Fall League stages its 19th season, the contribution the league has made to major-league baseball is undeniable. Nearly 60 percent of Fall League players — over 1,800 — have become major leaguers, including over 70 players from a year ago who reached the big leagues in 2010. On average, 75-100 Fall Leaguers appear in the major leagues the following season. There were 438 former Fall Leaguers on MLB opening day rosters in 2010, including six from the 2009 Fall League. One hundred fifty-nine ex-Fall Leaguers have been named to major league all-star teams. In the past five seasons, the major-league all-star teams included 23 AFL alums in 2005, 30 in 2006, 24 in 2007, 36 in 2008, 38 in 2009, and a record 45 in 2010. Former Fall Leaguers also have won numerous MLB awards, including 7 MVPs (Jason Giambi, Ryan Howard, Joe Mauer, Justin Morneau, Dustin Pedroia, Albert Pujols, Jimmy Rollins), 3 Cy Young Awards (Chris Carpenter, Roy Halladay, Brandon Webb), 3 World Series MVPs, 6 All-Star Game MVPs, 20 rookies-of-the-year, 8 batting champions, 12 hits leaders, 7 RBI leaders, 6 home-run leaders, 10 stolen-base leaders, 48 Silver Sluggers, and 41 Gold Gloves.

Q: What is the Fall League ticket information?

A: Tickets are priced at \$6 for adults, \$5 for seniors (55+) and youth (17 and under), and \$3 for groups of 20 or more. For group tickets and information, call 602-681-9362. Tickets may be purchased on game day at the respective ball park ticket offices beginning one hour prior to game time. There are no advance ticket sales. All seating is general admission. Gates open one hour prior to first pitch. Game times and special appearances are subject to change.

Q: Does the Fall League institute different rules to determine pitching decisions?

A: Yes. Fall League officials identified an inequity in the opportunity for starting pitchers to earn wins due to the limited number of innings pitched. Beginning in 2007, the Fall League adopted baseball's scoring rule (10.17c) for non-championship competition such as the All-Star Game. Simply stated, the mandatory five-inning minimum for starting pitchers to earn a win is waived. The winning pitcher is at the discretion of the official scorer.

Major League Rule 10.17(c)

“A league may designate a non-championship game (for example, the Major League All-Star Game or an exhibition game) for which Rules 10.17 (a) (1) and 10.17(b) do not apply. In such games, the official scorer shall credit as the winning pitcher that pitcher whose team assumes the lead while such pitcher is in the game, or during the inning on offense in which such pitcher is removed from the game, and does not relinquish such lead, unless such pitcher is knocked out after the winning team has attained a commanding lead and the official scorer concludes that a subsequent pitcher is entitled to credit as the winning pitcher.”
