The A's split a split squad. defeating the Dodgers 9-2 in Phoenix and losing to the Brewers 4-3 in Maryvale...in Phoenix, Gio Gonzlaez started for the A's and picked up the win (4.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 1 bb, 3 so), extending his spring-opening scoreless streak to 9.0 innings before allowing a run in the fifth...Brad Ziegler (0.2 ip), Fernando Cabrera (2.0 ip) and Willie Eyre (1.0 ip) all pitched scoreless relief...Coco Crisp has a solo home run and collected three hits and Andy LaRoche had two RBI...at Maryvale, Tyson Ross started for the A's (3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 1 so) and Gabe DeHoyos tossed a scoreless inning of relief before Josh Outman allows four runs on seven hits and a walk in 3.0 innings for the loss...Michael Taylor has two hits, including a RBI double...John Whitaker also has a RBI double and Matt Carson drives in a run with a single.

A's vs. MARINERS

This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Mariners this spring...the A's lost the first game, 6-3 in Phoenix last Monday...the two clubs split their two meetings last spring with the A's winning in Peoria 7-2 and losing in Phoenix 3-2.

IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 58 players in camp...the total includes 40 players on the 40-man roster and 18 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 28 pitchers, five catchers, 14 infielders and 11 outfielders.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 5-3-1 at Phoenix Muni and 1-5 on the road...the A's are tied for second in the majors in runs scored (88) but are seventh in most runs allowed (80)...the offense leads the majors with 67 walks...this is the A's 43rd Spring Training in Arizona, their 30th consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...are scheduled to play 35 games, including 32 in Arizona, returning to the Bay Area for three games with the Giants on March 28 and 30 in San Francisco and March 29 in Oakland...the 35 games are second most in Oakland history to the 37 games played in 2009...the A's went 12-17-3 last spring, their second consecutive spring with a losing record (17-18-2 in 2009)...the .422 winning percentage was the A's worst mark since 1990 when they went 6-10 (.375)...the three tie games were the A's most since moving to Arizona in 1969.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have agreed to terms with all 40 players on the 40-man roster...four of those players are under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

OFF-SEASON MOVES: The A's bolstered their offense this past off-season by acquiring David DeJesus from the Kansas City Royals (Nov. 10 for Vin Mazzaro and Justin Marks) and Josh Willingham from the Washington Nationals (Dec. 16 for Henry Rodriguez and Corey Brown)...Oakland also signed Hideki Matsui as a free agent Dec. 14...the A's turned to free agency to add to their pitching staff, signing Brandon McCarthy (Dec. 13), Rich Harden (Dec. 21), Grant Balfour (Jan. 18) and Brian Fuentes (Jan. 19).

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Seven of the A's top 10 prospects according to *Baseball America* are in major league camp this spring...the list includes three players already on the A's 40-man roster in Chris Carter (#2), Tyson Ross (#4) and Michael Taylor (#10)...four are non-roster invitees including Grant Green (#1), Michael Choice (#3), Jemile Weeks (#5) and Max Stassi (#6)...the other three are Aaron Shipman (#7), Yordy Cabrera (#8) and Ian Krol (#9)...two of the A's top 10 appear on *Baseball America*'s Top 100 Prospect List including Grant Green (#63) and Chris Carter (#91).

Daric Barton has reached base safely in each of his five games (4 for 14, 1 bb)...has batted second in each of his five starts...has not played since last Sunday...Matt Carson collected his fourth double Thursday against Kansas City, which is tied for second in the Cactus League...Michael Choice is tied for seventh in the Cactus League in runs (7)...Coco Crisp had three hits yesterday against the Dodgers, including his second home run, and has now reached base safely in each of his eight games (11 for 23, 2 bb)...is tied for fifth in the Cactus League in total bases (21), tied for sixth in RBI (8), tied for eighth in hits (11) and tied for 10th in home runs (2)...has batted leadoff and played center field in all eight of his starts...**David DeJesus** hit his first home run Wednesday at Texas and also singled for his first multiple hit game...has hit leadoff three times, third twice and second once...**Josh Donaldson** has not struck out in 18 at bats over 10 games this spring... Mark Ellis is 0 for 7 with three walks over his last three games after hitting safely in each of his first four (5 for 12, .417)...has batted leadoff three times, third twice and second twice...Grant Green has made all seven of his defensive appearances at shortstop...Conor Jackson started the spring 0 for 15 before singling in the third inning Monday against Seattle...has appeared in five games at first base, two at designated hitter and two in right field...Kevin Kouzmanoff has reached base safely in each of his seven games (9 for 17, 3 bb)...has hit safely in six of those contests and has three multiple hit games...has hit fifth six times and fourth once...Andy LaRoche has hit safely in each of his last five games (7 for 13, .539) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs and six RBI...ranks third in the Cactus League in slugging (.846), tied for third in home runs (3) and tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.500)...homered in back-to-back games on Monday and Tuesday...is one of three Athletics to appear in all 13 possible games (four at third base, four at first base, three at shortstop, two at second base)...Hideki Matsui singled in the first inning Monday against Seattle to snap a spring-opening 0 for 8 streak...that is his only hit in 21 at bats...has hit fourth four times and third four times...Jai Miller is tied for third in the Cactus League in walks (8), tied for fourth in steals (4) and tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.500)...is 2 for 14 (.143) over his last nine games after going 4 for 6 (.667) over his first four contests...is one of three Athletics to appear in all 13 possible games...Landon Powell hit his first home run Wednesday at Texas and also had his first multiple hit game...Anthony Recker hit his first home run Tuesday against San Diego and two of his four hits are for extra bases (double)...Eric Sogard has appeared in five games, all at shortstop...has not played since last Sunday...**Kurt Suzuki** hit his first home run Thursday against Kansas City and has now reached base safely in all seven of his games (7 for 19, 3 bb)...has hit safely in each of his last six (7 for 17, .412)...has hit second four times, fourth once, fifth once and sixth once...Ryan Sweeney went 2 for 3 in his first (and only) game of the spring Wednesday at Texas...Michael Taylor had his third multiple hit game yesterday and is 4 for 10 (.400) over his last four games after going 0 for 11 over his previous five contests...hit his second home run Tuesday against San Diego...Wes Timmons is tied for eighth in the Cactus League in walks (6)...is one of three Athletics to appear in all 13 possible games (seven at first base, six at third base, one at shortstop, one at second base)...Steve Tolleson is tied for sixth in the Cactus League in walks (7)...has appeared in six games at third base, four at shortstop and two at second base...Josh Willingham is 2 for 11 (.182) over his last five games after going 4 for 9 (.444) over his first three contests...has hit third four times and fourth four times

Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the spring...allowed two runs in his last outing Monday against Seattle after allowing no runs over his first two appearances (1.2 ip)...began the 2010 season on the disabled list for the second consecutive year...combined for a 2-5 record, one save and a 5.13 ERA in a career-high 37 appearances with Stockton and Midland...struck out 73 in 47.1 innings, an average of 13.9 per nine innings...walked just 19 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.8 to 1...yielded just one home run...allowed a .242 opponents batting average, including .167 with the bases empty...opponents were 4 for 39 (.103) when leading off an inning.

Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance of the spring...has not walked a batter in his first four outings (5.0 ip) but has allowed three home runs...was acquired by the A's from the Toronto Blue Jays with pitcher Danny Farquhar for outfielder Rajai Davis November 17...spent the entire 2010 season at Double-A New Hampshire, where he was 3-0 with five saves and a 2.58 ERA in 46 appearances, all in relief...had career highs in games, saves and strikeouts (63)...yielded just one home run in 73.1 innings...issued 10 walks for an average of 1.23 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark among Eastern League relievers...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .237 against right-handed hitters and .281 against left-handers.
