YESTERDAY

The A's split a split squad, defeating the Giants at Scottsdale 6-4 and losing to Diamondbacks in Phoenix, the McCarthy started 2...Brandon against San Francisco and picked up the win, becoming the first A's hurler to pitch 7.0 innings (5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so)...the A's scored four times in the second inning, highlighted by an Andy LaRoche RBI single and a Cliff Pennington sacrifice fly...Chris Carter added a two-run triple in the eighth inning and Trystan Magnuson retired the side in order in the ninth for the save...Matt Carson had two of the A's 10 hits...in Phoenix, Dallas Braden started and had a no decision (6.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...a first inning RBI single by Kevin Kouzmanoff and a fifth inning RBI single by Kurt Suzuki made the score 2-0 and Braden left with a 2-1 lead...after a scoreless inning of relief from Jerry Blevins and Grant Balfour, Brian Fuentes allowed three runs in the ninth (0.1 ip, 3 h, bb, 1 so) for the loss...Eric Sogard had three hits and Kouzmanoff added two

A's vs. DODGERS

This is the second and final meeting between the A's and Dodgers this spring...Oakland won the first meeting in Phoenix, 9-2...last spring, the two clubs played to a 3-3 tie in their only meeting...the A's are 3-0-1 against Los Angeles since the Dodgers moved to Arizona in 2009

IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 35 players remaining in camp...that includes 32 players on the 40-man roster and three non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 16 pitchers, three catchers, eight infielders and eight outfielders...the A's have 40 players on the 40-man roster

MINOR LEAGUE DATES

The full squad has reported to training camp at Papago Park and the first minor league spring training games are scheduled for today...extended Spring Training begins April 7.

A's ON THE AIR

The A's radio network will broadcast 10 games from Arizona this spring and all three games in the Bay Area...games can be heard in the Bay Area on XTRA Sports 860 AM...the remaining Cactus League schedule includes next Saturday and Sunday...Ken Korach returns for his 16th year in the A's broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (6th) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 26^t season in the booth...all other games in Arizona will be webcast on oaklandathletics.com...Comcast SportsNet California will televise one more game: the March 29 game against San Francisco in Oakland.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their nine-game road losing streak yesterday but also lost at home...are now 8-5-1 at Phoenix Muni and 2-9 on the road...the pitching staff has allowed the second most hits in the majors (265), has the third highest ERA (5.67), is tied for the third most home runs (29) and has yielded the fourth most runs (149)...the offense ranks second in the majors in walks (99) but is hitting .258, which is tied for the lowest mark in the Cactus League...is tied for the fewest doubles in the majors (38)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a sacrifice hit...this is the A's 43rd Spring Training in Arizona, their 30th consecutive spring in Phoenix...trained in Mesa from 1969-78, moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and have been in Phoenix since 1982...are scheduled to play 35 games, including 32 in Arizona, returning to the Bay Area for three games with the Giants on March 28 and 30 in San Francisco and March 29 in Oakland...the 35 games are second most in Oakland history to the 37 games played in 2009...the A's went 12-17-3 last spring, their second consecutive spring with a losing record (17-18-2 in 2009)...the .422 winning percentage was the A's worst mark since 1990 when they went 6-10 (.375)...the three tie games were the A's most since moving to Arizona in 1969.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have agreed to terms with all 40 players on the 40-man roster ... four of those players are under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

A's TOP PROSPECTS: Seven of the A's top 10 prospects according to Baseball America began this spring in major league camp...the list includes three players already on the A's 40-man roster in Chris Carter (#2), Tyson Ross (#4) and Michael Taylor (#10)...four are non-roster invitees including Grant Green (#1), Michael Choice (#3), Jemile Weeks (#5) and Max Stassi (#6)...the other three are Aaron Shipman (#7), Yordy Cabrera (#8) and Ian Krol (#9)...two of the A's top 10 appear on Baseball America's Top 100 Prospect List including Grant Green (#63) and Chris Carter (#91).

JAPANESE RELIEF EFFORTS: In their ongoing efforts to support victims of the Japanese earthquake disaster, the Oakland A's announced that the team will donate \$1 for every ticket sold to their Sunday, April 3 game against the Seattle Mariners at the Oakland-Alameda Coliseum to the Red Cross for their Japan...in addition, established relief efforts in the A's have new web site. а www.oaklandathletics.com/japan, which will allow fans to make tax-deductible donations to the A's Community Fund, with 100 percent of those proceeds — along with money raised from the April 3 game — given to the Red Cross...before and during the April 3 game, the A's will conduct a silent auction of signed and game-used baseball equipment by Oakland players, with 100 percent of the proceeds raised going to the relief efforts...the auction will also feature personally-signed game jerseys worn by Japanese baseball icons Hideki Matsui and Ichiro Suzuki on 2011 Opening Night...a limited supply of personally-signed 8x10 color photos of Matsui will be sold for \$50 each.

Daric Barton is 7 for 19 (.368) with a home run and four RBI over his last six games after going a week without playing...has reached base safely in 10 of his 11 games...has hit second 10 times and third once...Matt Carson is 5 for 10 (.500) with two multiple hit games over his last five games...has not drawn a walk in 18 games and 43 at bats this spring...**Chris Carter** is 5 for 13 (.385) with a double, a triple, two home runs, six RBI and seven walks over his last seven games...has 12 walks overall, which is tied for the Major League lead...both of his home runs came a week ago today at Cleveland...Coco Crisp is 0 for 5 over his last two games after reaching base safely in each of his first 11 games (16 for 34, 2 bb)...is tied for third in the Cactus League in triples (2)...has batted leadoff and played center field in all 13 of his games...David DeJesus is 3 for 22 (.136) over his last seven games after going 4 for 13 (.308) over his first five games...has hit third seven times, leadoff three times, second once and fourth once...Josh Donaldson has not struck out in 30 at bats over 16 games this spring...hit his first home run Saturday against the White Sox...Mark Ellis is 4 for 28 (.143) over his last 10 games after going 5 for 12 (.417) over his first four contests...Conor Jackson is 6 for 22 (.273) over his last seven games after going 1 for 23 over his first eight contests...has appeared in seven games at first base, five in right field and three at designated hitter...Kevin Kouzmanoff is 3 for 15 (.200) over his last five games after reaching base safely in each of his first 10 contests (12 for 25, 4 bb)...Andy LaRoche is 3 for 17 (.176) over his last seven games but has four RBI over that span...has appeared in eight games at first base, eight at third base, four at shortstop and two at second base ... Hideki Matsui is 5 for 21 (.238) with four walks and his first home run over his last seven games after going 1 for 21 over his first eight games...has hit fourth eight times, third four times and fifth three times...**Cliff Pennington** is 5 for 15 (.333) with a home run and five RBI over his last five games after going 0 for 10 over his first four contests...Landon Powell is 2 for 14 (.143) over his last seven games after going 4 for 14 (.286) over his first six contests...Eric Sogard went 3 for 5 yesterday against Arizona after going 1 for 15 over his previous eight games...has appeared in 13 games at shortstop and two at second base...Kurt Suzuki has reached base safely in 11 of 12 games...is 2 for 10 (.200) over his last four games after going 8 for 22 (.364) over his first eight contests...Ryan Sweeney has reached base safely in all six of his games and has four multiple hit games (9 for 18, 1 bb)...Wes Timmons is 3 for 21 (.143) over his last 12 games after going 5 for 16 (.313) over his first eight contests...has appeared in 10 games at first base, nine at third base, four at second base and two at shortstop...**Josh Willingham** is 5 for 32 (.156) with 12 strikeouts over his last 12 games after going 4 for 9 (.444) over his first three contests...has hit third eight times and fourth seven times.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#49 BRETT ANDERSON LHP (1-2, 4.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the spring...is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) in his three starts after allowing four runs in 2.0 innings in his first outing of the spring, which came in relief...two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts in 2010...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353)...is now 15-10 with a 2.88 ERA in 36 starts since June 29, 2009...his ERA is second lowest among AL pitchers over that span (min. 200 ip).

#57 BRIAN FUENTES LHP (1-1, 1 save, 4.50 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance of the spring and become the first A's pitcher to work on consecutive days...allowed three runs in 0.1 innings yesterday against Arizona for the loss after not allowing a run over his first six outings (5.2 ip)...was signed by the A's as a free agent to a two-year contract with a club option for 2013, Jan. 19...started the 2010 season as the closer with Los Angeles (AL) but finished it in a set-up role with Minnesota following a late August trade...combined for a 4-1 record, 24 saves and a 2.81 ERA in 48 relief appearances...allowed a .181 opponents batting average, which ranked fifth lowest among American League relievers...first batters faced hit .122, which was fifth lowest in the AL.

#48 MICHAEL WUERTZ RHP (0-0, 9.00 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his third appearance of the spring...allowed two runs in the ninth inning in his last outing Saturday against the White Sox after tossing a scoreless seventh inning in his first outing last Tuesday against the Cubs...was 2-3 with a career-high six saves and a 4.31 ERA in 48 relief appearances with the A's in 2010...that was a drop of 26 games from 2009 as he spent the first month of the season on the disabled list with right shoulder tendinitis...tossed just 39.2 innings. which were his fewest since his rookie season of 2004 (29.0)...struck out 40 batters in

39.2 innings, the sixth time in his seven seasons he finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched...allowed just 3-of-26 (11.5%) inherited runners to score...allowed a .240 opponents batting average, including a .227 against right-handed hitters, .265 against left-handers.

#31 BRAD ZIEGLER RHP (1-0, 1 save, 1.17 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance of the spring...is tied for third in the Cactus League in games pitched (8)...allowed a run in the seventh inning last Thursday against the Cubs, his only run in eight outings (7.2 ip)...was 3-7 with a 3.26 ERA in 64 relief appearances last year...the losses were a career-high and tied for most among AL relievers...his .300 winning percentage ranked second lowest among AL relievers...had the highest ERA of his career...issued nine intentional walks, which led all AL pitchers...allowed a .241 opponents batting average, which broke down to .213 against right-handers and .317 against left-handers...first batters faced were 11-for-60 (.183) with three walks...allowed 7 of 31 (22.6%) inherited runners to score.
