YESTERDAY

The A's lost the Giants at San Francisco, 4-3...Brett Anderson allowed a run in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the second on a Cliff Pennington RBI single...Anderson allowed two runs in the third, but the A's came back to tie the game on a Daric Barton two-run single in the fifth inning...Anderson then allowed a run in the fifth inning for the loss...he yielded four runs on six hits and two walks while striking out six in 7.0 innings...Brian Fuentes then pitched a scoreless eighth inning, allowing one hit...Coco Crisp and Kevin Kouzmanoff had two hits each.

A's vs. GIANTS

This is the fourth of five meetings between the A's and Giants this spring...the A's won both games in Arizona – a 6-0 decision at Phoenix March 5 and a 6-4 victory at Scottsdale March 25 – before losing last night at San Francisco, 4-3...the two clubs meet again tomorrow afternoon at San Francisco...the A's lost four of six to the Giants last spring, splitting two games in Scottsdale and San Francisco and losing their only contests in Phoenix and Oakland.

IN CAMP

The A's have a total of 33 players remaining in camp...that includes 30 players on the 40-man roster and three non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 15 pitchers, three catchers, eight infielders and seven outfielders...the A's have 40 players on the 40-man roster.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a spring-high four-game losing streak and have also lost five of the last six games...the loss last night was the A's 19th of the spring, which sets an Oakland record...the previous mark for most spring losses was 18 (1993, 2005, 2009)...are now 12-19-1 (.391), which is the third worst record among Cactus League teams and the worst by an A's team since 1990 when they went 6-10 (.375)...will finish with a losing record for the third consecutive spring (12-17-3 in 2010, 17-18-2 in 2009)...this marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's had more than two straight losing springs...had five straight from 1974-78...the offense leads the majors in walks (124), has the fewest doubles (51) and ranks second in grounded into double plays (35)...the A's are the only team in the majors without a sacrifice hit...the pitching staff has allowed the fourth most hits in the majors (331), has the fifth most home runs (34) and the fifth highest ERA (5.52)...the A's will play 34 games this spring, which is tied for second most in Oakland history to the 37 games played in 2009.

FOR OPENERS: Trevor Cahill will start the A's opener this Friday, April 1 against Seattle at 7:05 pm...he will be making his first career Opening Day start and will become the sixth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last six years (Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he will be the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...is the youngest since Vida Blue in 1971 (21 years, 251 days)...the A's have lost each of their last six openers, which is the longest Opening Day losing streak in Athletics history...have not won on Opening Day since a 5-4 win over Texas April 5, 2004...have lost 13 of their last 17 openers and are 20-23 since moving to Oakland in 1968.

JAPANESE RELIEF EFFORTS: In their ongoing efforts to support victims of the Japanese earthquake disaster, the Oakland A's announced that the team will donate \$1 for every ticket sold to their Sunday, April 3 game against the Seattle Mariners at the Oakland-Alameda Coliseum to the Red Cross for their relief efforts in Japan...in addition, the A's have established a new web site, www.oaklandathletics.com/japan, which will allow fans to make tax-deductible donations to the A's Community Fund, with 100 percent of those proceeds – along with money raised from the April 3 game – given to the Red Cross...before and during the April 3 game, the A's will conduct a silent auction of signed and game-used baseball equipment by Oakland players, with 100 percent of the proceeds raised going to the relief efforts...the auction will also feature personally-signed game jerseys worn by Japanese baseball icons Hideki Matsui and Ichiro Suzuki on 2011 Opening Night...a limited supply of personally-signed 8x10 color photos of Matsui will be sold for \$50 each.

ATHLETICS BATTING NOTES

Daric Barton is 11 for 31 (.355) with two home runs and eight RBI over his last 10 games...has reached base safely in 14 of his 15 games...has hit second 14 times and third once...**Matt Carson** is 6 for 14 (.429) over his last 11 games...walked four times last Thursday at Arizona and now has five walks over his last six games after drawing no free passes over his first 18 contests...**Coco Crisp** is tied for fourth in the Cactus League in triples (2), ranks fifth in slugging (.727) and tied for ninth in batting (.400)...is 6 for 16 (.375) with three walks over his last five games...has batted leadoff and played center field in all 18 of his games...leads the A's with 14 runs scored...**David DeJesus** is 7 for 19 (.368) with three RBI over his last six games after going 2 for 19 (.105) with no RBI over his previous six contests...has hit third 12 times, leadoff three times, second once and fourth once...**Josh Donaldson** struck out for the first time this spring last Friday against the Angels...**Mark Ellis** is 4 for 35 (.114) over his last 11 games after going 8 for 24 (.333) over his first nine contests...doubled a week ago today against the Reds for his only extra base hit of the spring...**Conor Jackson** went 3 for 4 last Thursday at Arizona and is 10 for 40 (.250) over his last 14 games after going 1 for 23 over his first eight contests...has appeared in 13 games at first base, six in right field, three at designated hitter and one in left field...**Kevin Kouzmanoff** has four straight multiple hit games (9 for 15, .600) and nine overall...is 13 for 24 (.542) over his last seven games and is batting .439 overall, which ranks third in the Cactus League...is also tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.476) and tied for seventh in hits (25)...**Andy LaRoche** went 3 for 4 Saturday night against Colorado and is 5 for 12 (.417) over his last seven games...leads the A's with four home runs and 13 RBI...has appeared in 12 games at third base, nine at first base, seven at shortstop and three at second base...**Hideki Matsui** is 2 for 24 (.083) over his last seven games...has made 18 of his 20 appearances at designated hitter (played left field last Thursday at Arizona and pinch hit last night)...has hit fourth in 10 of his starts, fifth five times and third four times...**Cliff Pennington** is 10 for 34 (.294) over his last 11 games after going 0 for 10 over his first four contests...**Landon Powell** hit his second home run last Thursday at Arizona and is 4 for 13 (.308) with two walks over his last nine games...**Eric Sogard** is 5 for 30 (.167) over his last 14 games...has appeared in 16 games at shortstop, five at second base and three at third base...**Kurt Suzuki** is 4 for 18 (.222) over his last six games but has six RBI over that span...drove in three runs last Thursday at Arizona for his fourth multiple RBI game...**Ryan Sweeney** went 0 for 2 last night at San Francisco after reaching base safely in each of his first 10 games (13 for 32, three walks)...is now 3 for 13 (.231) over his last four games after going 10 for 21 (.476) over his first seven contests...**Wes Timmons** is 3 for 21 (.143) over his last 16 games after going 6 for 20 (.300) over his first 10 contests...does not have an extra base hit in 26 games and 41 at bats this spring...has appeared in 10 games at first base, 10 at third base, eight at second base and two at shortstop...**Josh Willingham** is 7 for 24 (.292) over his last eight games after going 1 for 19 over his previous seven contests...has hit third 10 times and fourth 10 times.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#47 GIO GONZALEZ LHP (1-1, 2.14 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the spring...has 25 strikeouts in 21.0 innings (10.7 per nine innings) and is tied for the Cactus League lead in strikeouts...since A's spring training stats were first kept in 1992, the most strikeouts during the spring is 29 by Rich Harden in 2005 and 2007...also ranks third in the CL in ERA...has allowed five runs on 13 hits over his last three outings (16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA) after not allow a hit or run over his first two outings (5.0 ip)...opponents are 13 for 72 (.181)...began the 2010 season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...tied for fourth in the AL in games started, ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA, 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins.

#50 GRANT BALFOUR RHP (1-0, 7.71 ERA)

Has made 10 appearances this spring, most recently Saturday against Colorado (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 2 so)...has not allowed an earned run in his last four outings (3.1 ip) after allowing at least one run in four of his first six games (12.00 ERA)...opponents are 14 for 40 (.350)...was signed by the A's as a free agent to a two-year contract through 2012 with a club option for 2013, January 18...made 57 relief appearances with Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA.

#57 BRIAN FUENTES LHP (1-1, 1 save, 5.19 ERA)

Has made 10 appearances this spring, most recently last night at San Francisco (1.0 ip, 1 h)...has allowed five runs in his last four games (3.0 ip, 7 h, 1 bb, 2 so, 15.00 ERA) after not allowing a run over his first six outings (5.2 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...was signed by the A's as a free agent to a two-year contract with a club option for 2013, Jan. 19...combined for a 4-1 record, 24 saves and a 2.81 ERA in 48 relief appearances with Los Angeles (AL) and Minnesota last year...allowed a .181 opponents batting average.

#13 JERRY BLEVINS LHP (0-0, 7.94 ERA)

Has made 11 appearances this spring, most recently Sunday at Colorado (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is tied for fourth in the Cactus League in games pitched (11)...has not allowed a run in five of his last six outings (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA) after posting a 14.40 ERA over his first five contests...the 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but it marked the first time he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings.

#66 TYSON ROSS RHP (1-0, 0.59 ERA)

Has made five appearances this spring...including his last outing last Thursday at Arizona, a start and win (5.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...did not allow a run over his first four outings (9.2 ip), including his only other start March 11...went 1-4 with a save and a 5.49 ERA in 26 games, including two starts, with Oakland last year before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7...was 2-1 with a 3.55 ERA in six games, all starts, with the River Cats before he was shut down Aug. 10 with a strained right elbow.

#56 CRAIG BRESLOW LHP (0-0, 12.00 ERA)

Has made three appearances this spring...tossed a scoreless third inning in his last outing Sunday at Colorado (1 bb) after allowing at least two runs in each of his first two outings...made a team-leading 75 appearances for the A's last year, registering a 4-4 mark with five saves and 3.01 ERA...the games pitched tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history...also set an Oakland record for strikeouts by a left-handed reliever with 71...ranked second among AL relievers in appearances and tied for fourth in innings pitched (74.2).

#48 MICHAEL WUERTZ RHP (0-0, 7.20 ERA)

Has made five appearances this spring...tossed a scoreless ninth inning in his last outing Saturday against Colorado after allowing at least two runs in three consecutive outings (4 er in 3.0 ip, 12.00 ERA)...was 2-3 with a career-high six saves and a 4.31 ERA in 48 relief appearances with the A's in 2010...that was a drop of 26 games from 2009 as he spent the first month of the season on the disabled list with right shoulder tendinitis...tossed just 39.2 innings, which were his fewest since his rookie season of 2004 (29.0).

#26 BOBBY CRAMER LHP (0-1, 6.32 ERA)

Has made seven appearances this spring...his last outing was a start on Sunday at Colorado (2.0 ip, 1 h)...is 0-1 with a 10.29 ERA (8 er in 7.0 ip) in three starts (March 2, 18 and 27) and 0-0 with a 3.12 ERA (3 er in 8.2 ip in four relief appearances...was a combined 15-5 with a 2.71 ERA and 158 strikeouts in 29 games, 27 starts, with Quintana Roo and Triple-A Sacramento last year when he was selected by Oakland Sept. 10...went 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA in four starts with the A's...earned Mexican League Pitcher of the Year honors.

#31 BRAD ZIEGLER RHP (1-0, 1 save, 1.80 ERA)

Has made 11 appearances this spring, which is tied for fourth in the Cactus League...his last outing was Sunday at Colorado (1.0 ip)...has allowed a run in two of his last five outings (2 er in 4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA) after not allowing a run over his first six appearances (5.2 ip)...was 3-7 with a 3.26 ERA in 64 relief appearances last year...the losses tied for the most among AL relievers and his .300 winning percentage ranked second lowest...issued nine intentional walks, which led all AL pitchers...allowed a .241 opponents batting average.
