#### A's vs. MARINERS

The A's won the season series last year 13-6...the 13 wins equaled their second most ever against Seattle, trailing only the 17-2 mark in 2006...were 7-2 in Oakland and 6-4 in Seattle...have a five-game winning streak against the Mariners and have won nine of the last 11 games in Oakland...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 33-43 (.434) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 283-207 (.578) against Seattle, which is the **best mark by an AL team** against the Mariners (Boston, .577)...are 158-88 in Oakland and 125-119 in Seattle.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 241-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on September 15, 2008.

**Mark Ellis** finished the 2010 season by hitting safely in a career high tying 13 consecutive games (21 for 52, .404).

**Hideki Matsui** has made eight consecutive Opening Day starts as a Major Leaguer and is 12 for 32 (.375) with four home runs and 13 RBI...has combined in the US and Japan for 2499 hits, 1492 runs and 493 home runs.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1996** the A's play on April 1 for the first time in Oakland history and lose to the Toronto Blue Jays, 9-6 in Las Vegas...the A's play their first homestand in Las Vegas as the Coliseum was not ready after renovations to the stadium...in **2003** Tim Hudson and Ricardo Rincon combine on a fivehit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Seattle, the first opening day shutout in Oakland history...Erubiel Durazo sets an Oakland opening day record with five RBI.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's open their 44<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...the A's have a 3555-3280 (.520) record over the previous 43 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...the A's went 81-81 last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...this is the Athletics franchise 111<sup>th</sup> season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8270-8752 (.486) in their previous 110 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's finished the spring with a 12-21-1 (.368) record, which was the fifth worst mark in the majors...set an Oakland record for Spring Training losses, topping the previous mark of 18 (1993, 2005, 2009)...the winning percentage was fourth lowest since the A's moved to Arizona in 1969...it was the lowest since the 1982 club went 8-14 (.364)...it was the A's third consecutive spring with a losing record, marking just the second time in Oakland history the A's have had more than two straight losing springs (had five from 1974-78)...the offense led the majors in walks (132), tied for the most grounded into double plays (36) and had the fewest doubles (52)...had the lowest slugging percentage in the Cactus League (.379), tied for the fewest home runs (27) and had the second lowest batting average (.256)...the pitching staff allowed the third most hits in the majors (349), the fifth most runs (196) and home runs (35) and had the sixth highest ERA (5.37).

**FOR OPENERS:** The A's have lost each of their last six openers, which is the **longest Opening Day losing streak in Athletics history** (since 1901)...the previous mark was five from 1994-98...it is the longest active Opening Day losing streak in the majors and the longest since Philadelphia lost eight straight from 1985-92...it is the longest by an American League team since the Washington Senators lost eight straight from 1963-70...the A's are batting .180 (35 for 194) and have scored just 10 runs during their current six-game Opening Day losing streak...have not won on Opening Day since a 5-4 win over Texas April 5, 2004...have lost 13 of their last 17 openers...open at home for the second consecutive season...also faced the Mariners to start the 2010 season and lost 5-3...this marks the eighth time Oakland has opened the season with Seattle...are 3-4 against the Mariners in openers, including 3-1 in Oakland and 0-3 at Seattle...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 20-23 on Opening Day, including 16-10 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-1 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 52-58 in openers.

**OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS:** Five players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Barton, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Suzuki)...Mark Ellis is scheduled to start at second base for the seventh consecutive season and eighth time in the last nine years...the eight starts are an on-going Oakland record for second basemen and are tied for ninth most by any player...in Athletics history, only Dick Green (10) and Max Bishop (9) have more Opening Day starts as a second baseman...Kurt Suzuki will be making his fourth consecutive start at catcher...in Oakland history, only Terry Steinbach (9) has more Opening Day starts behind the plate...Josh Willingham will become the A's 12<sup>th</sup> different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 12 years, Hideki Matsui will become the seventh different designated hitter in the last seven years and Trevor Cahill will be the A's sixth different starting pitcher in the last six years.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's open the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...12 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis is on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...six other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell, Wuertz)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

**ROOKIE AND VETERANS:** The A's have one rookie on the Opening Day Roster for the second consecutive season (Cramer)...six players have six or more years of service: Mark Ellis (8 years, 136 days), Brian Fuentes (8 years, 125 days), Hideki Matsui (8 years) Coco Crisp (7 years, 158 days), David DeJesus (6 years, 146 days) and Grant Balfour (6 years, 99 days).

**THE YOUNG AND THE OLD:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's roster features just two players under the age of 25...Trevor Cahill is the youngest at 23 years, 31 days...Brett Anderson is second youngest (23 years, 59 days)...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old...Hideki Matsui is the oldest at 36 years, 293 days...he is followed by Brian Fuentes (35 years, 235 days), Mark Ellis (33 years, 299 days) and Grant Balfour (33 years, 92 days).

**NUMBER CHANGES:** Landon Powell has switched to number 11 and Mike Gallego will now wear number three...Josh Donaldson, who was optioned to Sacramento, has switched to number 20.

**LOCKED UP:** The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's begin the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 90 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (102)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had just one.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...the A's were 21-9 (.700) in his starting assignments last year and are 37-25 (.597) in his career...tossed at least seven innings in 15 of his 30 starts in 2010, allowed one run or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times...the A's bullpen has never blown a save in his 62 career starts.

**OPENING DAY STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start...he becomes the sixth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last six years (Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he will be the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger – Vida Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968...A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA (21

THIS SPRING: Was 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (24.0 ip, 27 h, 13 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in six games, all starts...allowed a .278 (27 for 97) opponents batting average...allowed just seven runs, six earned, over his final four starts (21.1 ip, 2.53 ERA) after allowing six runs over his first two starts (2.2 ip, 20.25 ERA)...walked two batters or fewer in all six of his outings...did not allow a home run until his final start March 26 against Colorado.

**CAHILL vs. SEATTLE:** Is 1-3 with a 2.93 ERA (30.2 ip, 28 h, 11 r, 10 er, 11 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in five career starts...is 1-1 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...the win came in his only start last year when he combined with Rodriguez and Wolf on a six-hit shutout in a 9-0 win...yielded five of the hits and walked two...allowed just two base runners as far as third...went 0-3 with a 3.80 ERA in four starts in 2009...including April 12 when no-hit the Mariners over the first 6.1 innings before Beltre singled with one out in the seventh...ended up taking the loss in a 1-0 decision.

**2010 RECAP:** Began the season on the disabled list and was optioned to Sacramento before returning to Oakland April 30 to lead the A's with 18 wins...posted an 18-8 record in 30 starts with a team-leading 2.97 ERA...his wins were the most by an Athletic over the last eight years...all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...the last Athletics pitcher to win as many as 18 games without winning one in April was Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for the Philadelphia A's in 1951...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA over his first four starts, 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25 and 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA over his last seven starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranked third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), fourth in ERA (2.97) and opponents on-base percentage (.287), tied for fourth in wins (18), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.692) and sixth in opponents slugging (.332)...also tied for second in grounded into double plays (27), tied for third in shutouts (1) and tied for sixth in pickoffs (5)

**IN THE DAYS OF MY YOUTH:** His 18 wins tied for third most in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 23...the last AL pitcher under the age of 23 with at least 18 wins was Bret Saberhagen, who won 20 games for Kansas City in 1985 at the age of 21...the last major leaguer was Mark Prior, who won 18 for the Cubs in 2003...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career (Tim Hudson, 1999-2000)...is the eighth in franchise history (Jim Nash, Bob Hooper, Lefty Grove, Weldon Henley, Chief Bender and Eddie Plank)...his 2.97 ERA was the lowest by an AL pitcher younger than 23 since 1990 (Kevin Appier, KC 2.76) and was fifth lowest in Athletics history since the earned run became an official stat in 1913.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .198 mark against right-handed hitters and .237 against left-handers...the average against righties was the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the opposition hit .209 with a .252 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage ranked sixth in the AL and the batting average was seventh...allowed a .188 batting average the first time through the lineup, .221 the second time through and .253 after that...the mark the first time through was ninth lowest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 11-3 with a 2.18 ERA in 15 starts in Oakland and 7-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 15 starts on the road...tied for second in the AL in home wins and ranked fifth in ERA...is now 18-10 with a 3.26 ERA (76 er in 209.2 ip) in 33 career starts in Oakland compared to 10-11 with a 4.40 ERA (81 er in 165.2 ip) in 29 starts on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Went 7-2 with a 1.78 ERA in 10 starts against AL West competition and was 11-6 with a 3.57 ERA in 20 starts against all other teams...is 11-6 with a 2.39 ERA (35 er in 131.2 ip) in 21 career starts against the West, 17-15 with a 4.51 ERA (122 er in 243.2 ip) against everyone else.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** Went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in four interleague starts, tying for second in the majors in wins (Buehrle, CWS 4)...compiled a 1.50 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in the first inning...was 6-2 with a 2.20 ERA in nine starts during the day, 12-6 with a 3.29 ERA in 21 starts at night...had the third lowest day ERA in the AL...yielded three grand slams, which tied for the most in the majors (Santana, NYM)...it also tied the Athletics' franchise record set by Ed Rakow in 1961...led AL pitchers with 54 assists and tied for second with 61 total chances...the assists tied for third most in Oakland history.

**MORE 2010:** Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a stress reaction in his left scapula...made one rehab start before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 20...was 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA in two starts with the River Cats before he was recalled by Oakland April 30...allowed six hits or fewer while pitching five innings or more in 20 consecutive starts from May 5 to Aug. 14...that matched the longest such streak in modern (since 1900) Major League history (Nolan Ryan, July 27, 1972 to April 18, 1973)...put together a career-high seven-game winning streak that spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 1...was named to his first American League All-Star team but was ineligible to pitch because he started on the Sunday before the game...tossed his first career complete game Aug. 2 against Kansas City, a three-hit shutout...allowed two unearned runs in the sixth inning Aug. 8 against Texas, ending his scoreless streak at a career-high 23.0 innings.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (7-6, 2.80 ERA): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA in six games, including five starts, this spring...ranked third in the Cactus League in strikeouts (25), sixth in innings pitched (27.0) and tied for eighth in wins (2)...is 5-3 with a 2.01 ERA in 10 career starts against Seattle...was 3-1 with a 0.81 ERA in five starts last year...the ERA was second lowest ever by any Major League pitcher against the Mariners in one season with a minimum of four starts (John Lackey, LAA 0.58)...finished the 2010 season with a career-high tying four-game winning streak...posted a 2.18 ERA and allowed a .233 opponents batting average over that six-start stretch...lowered his ERA by more than a run last year from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season.



ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE: Is 5-3 with a 2.01 ERA (62.2 ip, 60 h, 18 r, 14 er, 14 bb, 52 so, 5 hr) in 10 career starts...that includes 1-2 with a 1.13 ERA (4 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts at Safeco Field and 4-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts in Oakland...was 3-1 with a 0.81 ERA (33.2 ip, 26 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 27 so) in five starts last year...the ERA was second lowest ever by any Major League pitcher against the Mariners in one season with a minimum of four starts (John Lackey, LAA 0.58)...his first win came in a 6-2 decision on April 8 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 shutout innings, scattering three hits and a walk...then had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 shutout innings and allowed six hits and two walks...took the loss in a 2-0 loss at Seattle on August 10...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win over Seattle September 6...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a hit batsman over the first six innings and retired 13 straight at one point...allowed his only run in 7.2 innings when Gutierrez homered to lead off the seventh inning...won again in a 5-3 decision at Seattle October 2...allowed an unearned run in the fourth on a Smoak RBI double and another run in the sixth on a Halman RBI single.

**2010 RECAP:** Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...is now 15-10 with a 2.88 ERA in 36 starts since June 29, 2009.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353).


**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents batted .257, which included .243 (80 for 329) by right-handed hitters and .299 (32 for 107) by left-handers...his career splits are .246 (203 for 826) against righties and .308 (89 for 289) against lefties...allowed all six of his home runs to righties...five came at home, five were hit in night games and five were with the bases empty...his opponents batting average dropped to .225 with runners in scoring position after yielding a .314 average with RISP in 2009...however, the opposition hit .315 when leading off an inning.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received run support of one run or fewer in eight of his 19 starts and was 0-5 in those games...had a 7-1 record in his 11 starts with support of two runs or more...is now 0-14 in 20 career starts with zero or one run of support and 18-3 in 29 starts with at least two runs of support...tied for eighth in the AL with four pickoffs and now has eight in two seasons.

MORE 2010: Did not allow a run in his first two starts of the season April 8 against Seattle and April 13 at Seattle to become the first starting pitcher in Oakland history (among pitchers who began the season with the A's) to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...the last Athletics pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts...was charged with the first wild pitch of his career in the game on the 13th, snapping a careeropening streak of 31 starts and 186.1 innings without a wild pitch...the streak of 31 consecutive starts without a wild pitch tied for sixth longest by a starter in Oakland history...agreed to terms April 16 on a fourvear contract through the 2013 season with club options for 2014 and 2015...had his season-opening scoreless streak snapped at 14.0 innings in his third start, an 8-3 loss to Baltimore...that was the third longest season-opening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...was 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA in four starts before going on the 15-day disabled list April 27 retroactive to April 25 with left elbow inflammation and a proximal medial forearm strain...it was his first career stint on the DL...made one rehab start with Triple-A Sacramento May 24 against Nashville and had a no decision in the River Cats' 8-3 win (3.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hbp)...was reinstated from the DL May 29 and had a win and a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL with left elbow inflammation June 4...made four more rehab starts, going 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League and 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA in two starts with Sacramento, before he was reinstated July 30...went 5-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 13 starts following his return...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-1 loss July 30 at Chicago but picked up the win in his next start Aug. 4 against Kansas City...then had a career-high tying four-game losing streak from Aug. 10 to Sept. 1...went 0-4 despite a 3.21 ERA over that five-start span, receiving no run support three times, including Aug. 27 at Texas when he left after 2.0 innings with a mild hyper extension of his right knee...the 2.0 innings pitched matched his career low (June 3, 2010 at Boston)...then finished the season with a career-high tying four-game winning streak, posting a 2.18 ERA and holding the opposition to a .233 batting average over his final six starts...walked a season-high three batters Sept. 11 against Boston, snapping a 22-start streak dating back to Aug. 19, 2009 where he walked two batters or fewer...that was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history, falling four short of the record of 26 by Gil Heredia (April 10-Aug. 28, 1999)...went 3-1 with a 2.23 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in six starts in September...is now 7-1 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 10 career starts in September and is 11-16 with a 3.94 ERA (98 er in 223.2 ip) in 39 starts the rest of the season.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-2 with a 2.30 ERA (27.1 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six games, all starts...his 29 strikeouts ranked second in the Cactus League and tied for the best total by an A's pitcher since spring training stats were first kept in 1992 (Rich Harden, 2005 and 2007)...also tied for second in the CL in ERA (2.30) and tied for third in innings pitched (27.1)...held the opposition to a .170 (16 for 94) batting average...did not allow more than two runs in any of his six starts.

**GONZALEZ vs. SEATTLE:** Is 4-1 with a 3.40 ERA (50.1 ip, 45 h, 21 r, 19 er, 28 bb, 48 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, seven starts...is 1-1 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) in six games at Safeco Field and 3-0 with a 3.48 ERA (8 er in 20.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 4-1 with a 3.40 ERA (16 er in 42.1 ip) in his seven starting assignments...currently has a four-game winning streak (10 er in 32.1 ip, 2.78 ERA)...went 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA (25.1 ip, 20 h, 8 r, 8 er, 15 bb, 26 so) in four starts last year...the no decision came in the A's 4-2 loss at Seattle April 14...allowed six hits and walked four in 4.2 innings but allowed just two runs on a two-run single by Bradley in the fifth...left with the scored tied at 2-2...picked up the win in the A's 8-4 victory over Seattle May 17...allowed a RBI single to Lopez in the first but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first, three in the second and two more in the third...also yielded a solo home run to Tuiasosopo in the fourth and a Lopez RBI single in the sixth...also won in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on September 8...allowed a two-run home run to Branyan in the first inning and a solo home run to Tuiasosopo in the second...then retired 15 of the final 18 hitters he faced...then fired 7.0 shutout innings in an 8-1 win at Seattle September 30...tossed a career-high 118 pitches.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Was 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents average in 11 starts during the day, 8-8 with a 3.86 ERA and .249 opponents average in 22 starts at night...ranked second in the AL in day ERA, tied for third in wins and fourth in opponents average...is now 10-4 with a 3.69 ERA (49 er in 119.2 ip) in 20 career appearances during the day, compared to 12-16 with a 4.84 ERA (115 er in 213.2 ip) in 43 games at night.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received run support of two runs or fewer in each of his nine losses and had just six total runs of support in those starts (45.2 ip, 1.18 RSA)...has 18 runs of support in his 20 career losses (94.0 ip, 1.72 RSA)...is 21-4 in 36 career starts with run support of two or more and 1-16 in 21 starts with support of one run or fewer.
