The Mariners 25-man Opening Day roster includes 12 pitchers, 2 catchers, 6 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 designated hitter...Seattle also opens the season with 3 players on the 15-day disabled list (Aardsma, Gutierrez, Mangini) and 2 players on the 60-day DL (Kelley, Robles)...the youngest player on the roster is RHP **Michael Pineda** (1/18/89) at 22 years, 2 months+...the oldest is OF **Ichiro Suzuki** (10/22/73) at 37 years, 5 months+.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

1B **Justin Smoak**, OF **Michael Saunders**, INF **Matt Mangini** (DL) and RHPs **Michael Pineda**, **Josh Lueke**, **David Pauley** and **Tom Wilhelmson** are on an Opening Day roster for the first time in their careers...Pineda, Lueke and Wilhelmson have never appeared in a Major League game.

OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener a week from today, Friday, April 8, hosting the Cleveland Indians...Seattle is 21-13 all-time in the first home game of the season, including going 6-3 in home openers after starting the season on the road...will mark just the 2nd time to open the home schedule against the Indians (also 1998).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open their 35th season with a road tilt at the Oakland A's...tonight is the first game of a 3-game series against the A's and a 6-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

FOR OPENERS...the Mariners are 19-15 in season openers, including a 4-game Opening Day winning streak...have won 5 of the last 6 season openers...first time to win 4 consecutive openers since a 5-game OD win streak from 1982-86...prior to win in 2005, had lost 6 of previous 7 openers dating back to 1998...**OPENERS vs. THE A'S**...2011 marks the 8th time in club history the Mariners will open the season against the A's, and 5th time opening a season at The Coliseum...Seattle is 4-3 all-time on Opening Day against the A's, 1-3 in Oakland, 3-0 in Seattle...Seattle lost in Oakland in 1988 (1-4), 1989 (2-3), 2003 (0-5) and won in 2010 (5-3); Mariners won in Seattle in '85 (6-3), 2001 (5-4) and 2007 (4-0)...**NIGHT OPENERS**...the Mariners open the season with a night game for the 3rd consecutive season, but just the 4th time over the last 10 seasons...Mariners are 16-9 in night openers (3-6 during the day)...**FRIDAY OPENERS**...the Mariners will open a season on a Friday for the first time in club history...the lid lifter has primarily come on a Monday (14 G, 7-7 record) or Tuesday (12 G, 6-6 record).

ROAD OPENERS...the Mariners open on the road for the third consecutive season ('09 at MIN, '10 at OAK), and only the 10th time in club history...Seattle is 4-5 in season openers on the road...will open the season on the road in consecutive seasons against the same opponent for the 2nd time in club history (also vs. A's, 1988-89)...Mariners opened the season on the road in 1982 (at MIN), 1987 (at CAL), 1988 (at OAK), 1989 (at OAK), 1990 (at CAL), 1994 (at CLE), 2003 (at OAK), 2009 (at MIN) and 2010 (at OAK)...the Mariners are 10-24 all-time in the first road game of the season.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the first of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...the A's make their first trip to Safeco Field for a 4-game set April 21-24...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 2-7 at Oakland Coliseum, and have dropped 5 consecutive games...Seattle is 43-33 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 207-283, including a 88-158 mark in Oakland (dropped 7 of last 8 & 9 of last 11 in OAK).

THE NEW SKIPPER...tonight is game #1 for new Mariners manager **Eric Wedge**...Wedge is the 17th Manager in Mariners history, 15th full-time skipper...Seattle managers are 10-7 in their first game as skipper of the club: Rene Lachemann, Del Crandall, Chuck Cottier, Dick Williams, Jim Snyder (interim), Lou Piniella, Mike Hargrove, Jim Riggelman, Don Wakamatsu and Daren Brown (interim) all won their debuts, while Darrell Johnson, Maury Wills, Marty Martinez (interim), Jim Lefebvre, Bill Plummer, Bob Melvin and John McLaren took losses...the 6 managers with prior big league experience (Hargrove, Crandall, Williams, Piniella, Riggelman and Johnson) are 5-1:

FOR STARTERS...**Felix Hernandez** will make his 4th career Opening Day start for Seattle (also 2007 vs. A's, 2009 vs. Twins, 2010 at A's)...Felix will join Randy Johnson (6 - 1992,1993,1994,1995,1996, 1998) and Jamie Moyer (4 - 2000, 2004, 2005, 2006) as the only pitchers in franchise history to make 4 or more Opening Day starts...Felix's two career Opening Day wins are tied (with Johnson) for most in Mariners history...**in his 3 OD starts, Felix is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (4 ER, 22.2 IP) and 22 strikeouts.**

SMOAK IS STREAKING...**Justin Smoak** carries a career-high 10-game hitting streak into Opening Day...he is one of just three Major Leaguers with current double-digit hitting streaks (Mark Ellis - 13 G, Mike Stanton - 11 G)...Smoak ended his rookie season in 2010 with hits in 10 consecutive games, batting .441 (15x34) with 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI (.537 OBP, .794 SLG)...**marks the 11th time a Mariner has entered a season with a double-digit hitting streak.**

OPENING DAY FACTS...**Ichiro** will be making his 10th Opening Day start (missed '09), tied for 3rd-most in club history (Edgar Martinez - 15, Ken Griffey Jr. - 13, Dan Wilson - 10)...**RH Jamey Wright** has made the Opening Day roster for 6 different teams over the last 7 seasons...13 of Mariners 34 season openers have been decided by one run (6-7) and 4 in extra innings (3-1)...Mariners Opening Day Fact Sheet is Page 5 of today's notes.

YOU ALREADY KNOW...that **Felix Hernandez** is making 4th career Opening Day start...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Felix has a combined ERA of 1.36 (6 ER, 39.2 IP) in his first start of the season dating back to his MLB debut in 2005?...in his 6 season debuts, he has not allowed a home run and recorded 33 strikeouts.

2011 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

CACTUS LEAGUE...the Mariners finished their 35th spring in the Cactus League with a 16-13-2 record...recorded the first winning spring since going 18-10-1 in 2004...went 11-5-0 in home games and 5-8-2 on the road.

PEORIA STADIUM...the Mariners boasted an 11-5 record in home games this spring, and went 11-5-1 at Peoria Stadium...was the club's 2nd-best record at Peoria Stadium, trailing only a 13-3 mark in the inaugural season in 1994...owns an all-time 134-147-10 record at Peoria Stadium.

SMALL ROSTER...the Mariners used only 73 players (37 position players, 36 pitchers) during their 31 Cactus League games, the fewest since also using 73 in 2001...the 36 pitchers used were the fewest since 33 in '01...used the first minor league extra in the 20th spring game (Scott Patterson).

VS. THE AL...the Mariners finished the spring with a 6-1 record against the AL West, going 2-1 vs. the Rangers, 2-0 vs. the A's and 2-0 vs. the Angels...went 8-4-1 vs. AL opponents this spring, compared to 8-9-1 vs. the NL.

SPREADING THE WEALTH...the Mariners hit 27 home runs, by 19 different players...**Jack Cust** (4), **Adam Kennedy** (2), **Justin Smoak** (2), **Ryan Langerhans** (2), **Michael Saunders** (2) and **Alex Liddi** (2) all hit multiple home runs...**Steven Baron**, **Milton Bradley**, **Johermyn Chavez**, **Gabe Gross**, **Greg Halman**, **Carlos Peguero**, **Luis Rodriguez**, **Brendan Ryan**, **Jack Wilson**, **Matt Tuiasosopo**, **Mike Wilson**, **Chone Figgins** and **Kyle Seager** all hit one longball.

1-0...the Mariners defeated the Giants 1-0 on March 8...it was just the second spring shutout since 1994 (also: 3/20/10 vs. ARI) and the first official 9-inning, 1-0 victory in club spring training history...Seattle had a rain-shortened 1-0 win over the Padres on March 10, 1986 (6.0 innings)..

FIGGY...**Chone Figgins** ended the spring with hits in 12 of his final 13 games, including a 12-game hitting streak (.485/16x33) from March 9-28...over his last 13 games he raised his average from .200 to .373.

PINEDA...RH **Michael Pineda** led Mariners starters with a 2.12 ERA...in 5 spring appearances (4 starts), the 22-year-old allowed only 4 ER in 17.0 IP and struck out 15...his stellar performance earned him a spot in the starting rotation, becoming the first rookie Mariner to crack the Opening Day starting 5 since Freddy Garcia in 1999.

LEAGUE LEADER...RH **Brandon League** led the team and tied for the Cactus League lead with 13 appearance...had a strong finish to the spring, posting a 1.50 ERA (1 ER, 6.0 IP) and a .200 opponents batting average (4x20) over his final 6 appearances...had a 9.00 ERA (7 ER, 7.0 IP) in his first 7 outings.

THE BIG HANDSOME...RH **Jamey Wright** did not allow a run in his 11 Cactus League appearances (12.0 IP)...his spring ERA of 0.00 is the lowest by a Mariners reliever with a minimum of 10.0 IP...Ryan Rowland-Smith in 2008 (0.64, 9 G, 14.0 IP) and Mike Schooler in 1989 (0.73, 10 G, 12.1 IP) held the previous lowest reliever ERA's.

MAN OF MANY GLOVES...super utility man **Chris Gimenez** made starts at 5 different positions during the spring (1B - 4 G/1 GS, C - 9 G/4 GS, RF - 4 G/1 GS, 3B - 3 G/1 GS, LF - 3 G/2 GS).

SPRING ADDITION...the Cactus League again featured 15 times, but for the first time all teams were located in the Valley of the Sun...the D-backs and Rockies moved into Salt River Fields at Talking Stick in North Scottsdale...the Mariners went 1-2 at the new facility.

TOP PROSPECTS...the Mariners opened camp with three players listed on *Baseball America's* annual list of top 100 minor league prospects -- **Dustin Ackley** (#12), **Michael Pineda** (#16) and **Nick Franklin** (#53)...the trio is also listed on MLB.com's list of top 50 prospects -- Ackley (#5), Pineda (#13), Franklin (#38).

ATTENDANCE MARKS...the Mariners drew 112,338 fans at Peoria Stadium, an average of 7,021 fans for the 16 home games...high spring crowd was 11,721 March 18 vs. Arizona...Seattle has now drawn at least 100,000 fans in 13 of the last 14 spring trainings...ranked 6th in the Cactus League in average attendance.

WALK-OFF WINS...the Mariners recorded a pair of walk-off wins, March 27 vs. San Diego (**Josh Bard** single in 10th inning) and March 28 vs. Colorado (**Steven Baron** single in 9th inning).

SPRING SHUTOUTS...the Mariners recorded a trio of shutouts, 1-0 vs. San Francisco (3/8), 2-0 vs. Los Angeles Angels (3/13) and 6-0 vs. Los Angeles Dodgers (3/25)...Mariners recorded only 2 spring shutouts from 1994-2010.

SPRING ODDS AND ENDS...

- The Mariners opened camp with 64 players on the roster (40 roster players, 23 non-roster players)...added LHP's **Aaron Laffey** and **Jamex Paxton** during the spring.
- **Erik Bedard** led the team with 3 wins and tied for team lead with 6 games started.
- **Luis Rodriguez** appeared in a team-high 24 games.
- **Jack Cust** led the team with 4 home runs and 14 RBI.
