TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 35th season-opening roadtrip at the Oakland A's...tonight is game #2 (1-0) of a 3-game series against the A's and a 6-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on ROOT SPORTS in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the second (1-0) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...the A's make their first trip to Safeco Field for a 4-game set April 21-24...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 2-7 at Oakland Coliseum...last night's win snapped a 5G losing streak vs. A's...Seattle is 44-33 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 208-283, including a 89-158 mark in Oakland (dropped 7 of last 9 and 9 of last 12 in OAK).

SMOAK IS STREAKING...dating back to 2010, Justin Smoak has hit in a career-high 11 straight games (10 straight to end 2010, and last night)...he is one of just three Major Leaguers with current double-digit hitting streaks (Mark Ellis - 14 G, Mike Stanton - 12 G)...Smoak ended his rookie season in 2010 with hits in 10 consecutive games, batting .441 (15x34) with 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI (.537 OBP, .794 SLG)... marks the 11th time a Mariner has entered a season with a double-digit hitting streak.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT...Felix Hernandez opened the 2011 season with a complete game, 5-hitter last night; he did not walk a man and struck out 5...here are a few notes about last night;

*Last AL Pitcher to collect a CG win on Opening Day w/0 BB: Rick Rhoden on 4/5/88 (NYY vs. MIN) *Was the first Opening Day CG since Ben Sheets on 4/2/07 vs. LAD (with MIL).

*First Opening Day 9.0 IP CG by an AL Pitcher since Bartolo Colon 3/31/02 at ANA (with CLE).

*Only the tenth 9.0 IP CG by an AL Pitcher over the last 25 seasons (since 1987).

*First 9.0 CG win by a Mariners starter on Opening Day; Mark Langston had a CG L 4/3/89 at OAK. *Previous high IP by a Mariners starter on Opening Day was 8.1 IP (twice): Mike Moore (4/4/84 vs. TOR) and Erik Hanson(4/9/91 vs. ANA).

*After allowing 2 hits and 2 runs in the first inning, retired 23 of the last 26 batters he faced; had only 25 BF in final 8.0 IP (3H, but 2 GIDP).

"THE GREAT THING ABOUT BASEBALL...is that they play it every day"...the Mariners open the 2011 season with 23 games in the first 24 days of April...Seattle opens with 6 games in 6 days on the road (OAK & TEX 4/1-6) has an off day April 7 then plays 17 straight days April 8-24.

THE NEW SKIPPER...last night was game #1 for new Mariners manager Eric Wedge...Wedge is the 17th Manager in Mariners history, 15th full-time skipper...Seattle managers are now 11-7 in their first game as skipper of the club: Rene Lachemann, Del Crandall, Chuck Cottier, Dick Williams, Jim Snyder (interim), Lou Piniella, Mike Hargrove, Jim Riggleman, Don Wakamatsu, Daren Brown (interim) and Wedge all won their debuts, while Darrell Johnson, Maury Wills, Marty Martinez (interim), Jim Lefebvre, Bill Plummer, Bob Melvin and John McLaren took losses...the 7 managers with prior big league experience (Hargrove, Crandall, Williams, Piniella, Riggleman, Johnson and Wedge) are 6-1:

FOR STARTERS...Felix Hernandez made his 4th career Opening Day start for Seattle (also 2007 vs. A's, 2009 vs. Twins, 2010 at A's)...Felix joins Randy Johnson (6 - 1992,1993,1994,1995,1996, 1998) and Jamie Moyer (4 - 2000, 2004, 2005, 2006) as the only pitchers in franchise history to make 4 or more Opening Day starts...Felix's three career Opening Day wins are the most in Mariners history...in his 4 OD starts, Felix is 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER, 31.2 IP) and 27 strikeouts.

ON THE AIR...the Mariners will use a rotation of fourth announces this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehas...Rick Rizzs, Dave Sims and Mike Blowers will work all the games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in...Ron Fairly is working the first six games of the season (OAK and TEX) and will be in Seattle for Opening Night when the club honors Niehaus...Dave Valle will join Rizzs in the radio booth for the first home series of the year.

AS YOU KNOW...Ichiro is one (1) hit away from tying the Mariners club record of 2,247 hits currently held by Edgar Martinez, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Edgar became the Mariners all-time hits leader on April 3, 2001 vs. Oakland, 10 years ago tomorrow...'Gar was 2-for-3 that day to surpass Ken Griffey Jr.'s mark of 1,742 hits...Ichiro, playing in his second MLB game that day, was 0-for-4 and remained "stuck" on two career hits.

- 28-year-old lefty making 1st start of season, 86th career MLB appearance (66th start) today against the Athletics
- Acquired from Mets in 3-team, 12-player trade 12/10/08.
- Selected by Marlins in 2nd round, 68th overall in '04 draft.
- Made Major League debut w/1.0 shutout inning of relief July 14, 2005 at PHI (with FLA)...first ML start July 18, 2005 at Arizona (5.0,4,3,2,4,3).
- Traded by the Marlins to the Mets in exchange for Henry Owens (rhp) and Matt Lindstrom (rhp) on Nov. 20, 2006.
- Did not pitch during 2008 season, spending year recovering from surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip...had surgery March 17, 2008 and spent summer rehabbing at Mets minor league facility in Port St. Lucie, FL.
- Played college baseball at LSU (2002), Cypress Junior College (2003) and Long Beach State (2004)...as junior at LBSU, went 7-4, 4.14 on mound & hit .354 with 14 doubles, 5 home
- Is 3-2, 4.62 ERA (25 ER, 48.2 IP) in 9 career starts in April.
- 10-10, 4.44 in 43 G/25 GS prior to ASG...is 8-16, 4.92 ERA (104 ER, 190.1 IP) in 42 G/30 GS in Post All-Star games.

SPRING TRAINING...made four Cactus League starts going 1-0 with a 4.24 ERA (8 ER, 17.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts...also started

in a minor league game 3/23 with a pitching line of 5.0 IP, 7 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 8 K while facing 23 batters...in his last outing 3/28 vs. COL received no-decision (5.0 IP, 11 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 1 BB, 2 K, HR).

APRIL SUCCESS...last April he was 2-1, 3.60 ERA (10 ER, 25.0 IP) in 4 starts...in his last three April starts (4/14/10 vs. OAK, 4/20/10 vs. BAL, 4/25/10 at CWS) is 2-0, 2.29 ERA (5 ER, 19.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts.

CAREER YEAR...in 2010 set career-highs in wins (9, old was 5 in '05), innings (192.2, old was 91.2 in '09), games (31, old was 23 in '09), starts (31, old was 14 in '09) and strikeouts (116, old was 59 in '05)

QUIET PRODUCTION...named Mariners Unsung Hero by the Seattle chapter of the BBWAA in 2010...recent winners include Sean White (2009), Roy Corcoran (2008), Sean Green (2007), Rafael Soriano (2006) and Willie Bloomquist (2005)...current ROOT Sports TV Analyst Mike Blowers won the inaugural award in 1993.

TALE OF TWO SEASONS ... was 9-5 and ranked 10th in the AL in ERA (3.15) through his first 23 starts of the season (through 8/15)...went 0-7, 5.74 (30 ER. 47.0 IP) over final 8 starts.

WRONG KIND OF STREAK...has lost a career-high 7 straight decisions... it is tied for the longest active losing streak in the Majors with Brian Bannister (June 29-current)...Vargas' streak began August 21 and during that time he is 0-7, 5.74 ERA (30 ER, 47.0 IP) in 8 starts.

A LITTLE HELP HERE?...had the 3rd-lowest run support average among AL starters (3.46)...received 2 or fewer runs of support in 20 of 31 starts....only Felix Hernandez (3.10) and Kevin Millwood (3.26) received less support per start than Vargas.

THAT'S QUALITY...recorded 21 quality starts last season to rank T8th in the American League and 2nd on the team (behind Felix Hernandez -30)...tossed 7 consecutive quality starts April 14-May 20, T7th longest in the AL last season...pitched at least 6.0 innings (not consecutive) in
