THE ROSTER

The Mariners 25-man Opening Day roster includes 12 pitchers, 2 catchers, 6 infielders, 4 outfielders and 1 designated hitter...Seattle also opens the season with 3 players on the 15-day disabled list (Aardsma, Gutierrez, Mangini) and 2 players on the 60-day DL (Kelley, Robles)... the youngest player on the roster is RHP **Michael Pineda** (1/18/89) at 22 years, 2 months+...the oldest is OF **Ichiro Suzuki** (10/22/73) at 37 years, 5 months+.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

1B **Justin Smoak**, OF **Michael Saunders**, INF **Matt Mangini** (DL) and RHPs **Michael Pineda**, **Josh Lueke**, **David Pauley** and **Tom Wilhelmson** are on an Opening Day roster for the first time in their careers...Pineda, Lueke and Wilhelmson have never appeared in a Major League game.

OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener a week from today, Friday, April 8, hosting the Cleveland Indians... Seattle is 21-13 all-time in the first home game of the season, including going 6-3 in home openers after starting the season on the road...will mark just the 2nd time to open the home schedule against the Indians (also 1998).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 35th season-opening roadtrip at the Oakland A's... tonight is game #3 (2-0) of a 3-game series against the A's and a 6-game road trip to open the season (also 3 games at Texas)...today's game will be televised in the Northwest on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...today is the third (2-0) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2011...the A's make their first trip to Safeco Field for a 4-game set April 21-24...the Mariners went 6-13 against the A's last season, including 2-7 at Oakland Coliseum...have won 2 straight after a 5G losing streak vs. A's...Seattle is 45-33 vs. Oakland since 2007...Mariners trail the all-time series 209-283, including a 90-158 mark in Oakland (dropped 7 of last 10 and 9 of last 13 in OAK)... **SWEEPS**...the Mariners last swept Oakland in a 3-game series Sept. 29-Oct. 1, 2009 in Seattle... have not had a 3-game sweep here since Sept. 17-19, 2007.

TOUGH NIGHT FOR EDGAR...in addition to losing the club record for hits to **Ichiro** last night, **Edgar Martinez** was also passed on the all-time RBI list as a DH...David Ortiz notched 3 RBI at Texas, giving him 1,004 RBI as a DH in his career; that's now the most all-time, surpassing Edgar's total of 1,003 (STATS, Inc).

MULTI MADNESS...**Ichiro** has collected 2 hits in each of the first two games...he has 693 multi-hit games in his career, easily the most since he joined MLB in 2001 (Derek Jeter is second at 567).

LITTLE OF EVERYTHING...eight different Mariners players had a hit last night, and a ninth collected an RBI...on Opening Night, five different players had hits, and an additional two had an RBI.

SMOAK IS STREAKING...dating back to 2010, **Justin Smoak** has hit in a career-high 12 straight games (10 straight to end 2010, and first 2 games this year)...he is one of just three Major Leaguers with current double-digit hitting streaks (Mark Ellis - 15 G, Mike Stanton - 12 G)...Smoak ended his rookie season in 2010 with hits in 10 consecutive games, batting .441 (15x34) with 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI (.537 OBP, .794 SLG)...**marks the 11th time a Mariner has entered a season with a double-digit hitting streak.**

WE PLAY (NEARLY) EVERYDAY...the Mariners open the 2011 season with 23 games in the first 24 days of April...Seattle opens with 6 games in 6 days on the road (OAK & TEX April 1-6), has an off day April 7 then plays 17 straight days April 8-24.

THE NEW SKIPPER...Friday was game #1 for new Mariners manager **Eric Wedge**...Wedge is the 17th Manager in Mariners history, 15th full-time skipper...Seattle managers are now 11-7 in their first game as skipper of the club: Rene Lachemann, Del Crandall, Chuck Cottier, Dick Williams, Jim Snyder (interim), Lou Piniella, Mike Hargrove, Jim Riggleman, Don Wakamatsu, Daren Brown (interim) and Wedge all won their debuts, while Darrell Johnson, Maury Wills, Marty Martinez (interim), Jim Lefebvre, Bill Plummer, Bob Melvin and John McLaren took losses...the 7 managers with prior big league experience (Hargrove, Crandall, Williams, Piniella, Riggleman, Johnson and Wedge) are 6-1:

FOR STARTERS...**Felix Hernandez** made his 4th career Opening Day start for Seattle (also 2007 vs. A's, 2009 vs. Twins, 2010 at A's)...Felix joins Randy Johnson (6 - 1992,1993,1994,1995,1996, 1998) and Jamie Moyer (4 - 2000, 2004, 2005, 2006) as the only pitchers in franchise history to make 4 or more Opening Day starts...**Felix's three career Opening Day wins are the most in Mariners history...in his 4 OD starts, Felix is 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER, 31.2 IP) and 27 strikeouts.**

ON THE AIR...the Mariners will use a rotation of fourth announces this season, all former partners of HOF announcer **Dave Niehaus**...**Rick Rizzs**, **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** will work all the games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in...**Ron Fairly** is working the first six games of the season (OAK and TEX) and will be in Seattle for Opening Night when the club honors Niehaus...**Dave Valle** will join Rizzs in the radio booth for the first home series of the year.

AS YOU KNOW...**Ichiro** had two infield hits last night to set the Mariners club record with his 2,248 hits; he surpassed **Edgar Martinez** (2,247)...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Ichiro has 519 infield hits (including 3 this season) amongst his 2,248 hits; that's just over 23%...**Edgar Martinez** had 140 hits in his 18-year career; that is just 6.2% of his career hit total.

ABOUT FISTER...

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 1st start of 2011 season, 40th career MLB appearance and 39th MLB start today against the Athletics.
- Mariners 7th round selection in the 2006 June draft...signed by Mariners scout Stacey Pettis.
- Graduated from Golden Valley (CA) High School in 2002...two-year letter-winner...first-team All-Central California Conference his senior year...first-team all-conference selection in basketball as a senior.
- Attended Merced (CA) College from 2002-03 before transferring to Fresno State...drafted by San Francisco Giants in 2003 and New York Yankees after his junior year in 6th round of June 2005 draft...did not sign.
- His father Larry played football at Fresno State 1976-77.
- Making 5th career start in April...is 2-1, 1.67 (5 ER, 27.0 IP) in 4 April starts.

SPRING TRAINING...went 2-2, 5.01 ERA (13 ER, 23.1 IP) in a team leading six Cactus League starts...also had one minor league outing 3/19 vs. SD (4.2 IP, 5 H, 4 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 5 K)...in his last outing of the spring 3/29 at COL tossed 4.0 shutout innings (4.0 IP, 2 H, 3 BB, 2 K)...it was his only scoreless outing of the spring.

2010 HIGHLIGHTS...completed his first full season in the Majors...set career-highs in games, starts, innings, strikeouts and wins...opened season with 9 straight starts allowing 3 earned runs or less...streak was 3rd-longest in club history to begin a season (Erik Bedard-14 in '09, Erik Hanson-11 in '93)...allowed 3 earned runs or less runs in 19 of his 28 starts this season, and 21 of 30 since 2009...had a 10-start streak snapped May 31 vs. Minnesota; streaked ranked T8th in club history.

FAST STARTER...last April was 2-1, 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP) in four starts...ERA was the third lowest in the American League during the opening month behind Francisco Liriano (0.93) and John Danks (1.55)...his .208 opponent batting average against ranked 7th in the AL.

DAY TRIPPER...in day games last year was 1-2, 2.51 ERA (12 ER, 43.0 IP) in 7 starts...his 2.51 ERA was 7th best in the American League last year (Felix Hernandez was 1st, 1.95 ERA)...in his career, Fister is 2-3, 3.17 ERA (21 ER, 59.2 IP) in 10 career day starts.

SEEING GREEN AND GOLD...his 2.90 ERA (13 ER, 40.1 IP) in 7 starts against Oakland, the second lowest ERA against any team he has faced in his career...only his 2.25 ERA (5 ER, 20.0 IP) against the White Sox is lower.

THESE BOOTS AREN'T MADE FOR WALKING...in his career his 1.82 walks per nine innings is the lowest in club history (min. 200.0 IP)...he ranks ahead of Rob Dressler (1.95), Gaylord Perry (2.17), Jamie Moyer (2.25) and Glenn Abbott (2.29)...his 1.68 BB/9 IP in 2010 ranked 4th best in the Majors behind Cliff Lee (0.76), Roy Halladay (1.08) and Carl Pavano (1.51).

TOUGH LUCK...in 2010 had 11 starts of at least 7.0 innings, including 9 starts of 7.0+ IP and allowing 3 earned runs or less...had just 3 wins in those 11 starts...in those 11 starts was 3-4, 2.52 ERA (23 ER, 82.0 IP).

MIA...Fister was on the 15-day disabled list June 6 (retro to 6/1)-25 with right shoulder fatigue...made one rehab start with AAA Tacoma June 20 at Portland...at time of placement on the DL, ranked 3rd in the AL in ERA (2.45) and 10th in opponents batting average (.223)...after coming off the DL, was 3-9, 4.90 (49 ER, 90.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP ERIK BEDARD (5-3, 2.82 in 2009)

31-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 1st start in tomorrow's series opener against the Rangers...**2010 Spring Training:** went 3-0 with a 1.13 ERA in 5 official Spring Training starts...allowed 2 earned runs, while striking out 14 and walking 5 in 16.0 innings of work...also started in Minor League Intrasquad game on March 15 (3.1,5.2,2.0,6.2HR)...**2010:** did not pitch at the big league level in 2010, spending the entire season on the disabled list recovering from left shoulder surgery...was scheduled to make first start on July 6, 2010 vs. KC, but scratched with left shoulder discomfort...had season-ending surgery Aug. 6 in Seattle by Dr. Ed Khalfayan and Dr. Lewis Yocum...**CAREER** -- is 51-41, 3.71 ERA (339 ER, 822.0 IP) in 144 games, 141 starts with the Orioles (2002-07) and Mariners (2008-09)...vs. **TEX** -- Making his 12th start vs. the Rangers and first since July 12, 2009 vs. TEX (5.2,3.2,2.4,5,HR)...is 4-2 with a 3.12 ERA (23 ER, 66.1 IP) in 11 starts in his career, including going 1-1 with a 5.91 (14 ER, 21.1 IP) in 4 start at Texas...making his first start at Rangers Ballpark in Arlington since May 12, 2008 (2.0,7.6,6.4,2,2HR)...has not recorded a win vs. the Rangers since 8/21/07 (w/BAL)...his team has lost his last 3 starts after winning the previous 4...has recorded 6 quality starts vs. the Rangers.
