THE LATEST:

- With last night's 7-6 victory in 10 innings vs. Oakland, the Blue Jays improved to 3-1 on the season.
- Are 2nd in the AL East, 1.0 GB of the division leading Orioles (4-0)...Are 0.5 GA of the Yankees for 2nd (3-2) & are 3.0 GA of both the Red Sox (0-4) & Rays (0-4).

ON THE HOMEFRONT:

Tonight, the Blue Jays continue a 7-day, 6-game homestand with the 2nd of a 3-game series vs. the A's (1-3)...Are 3-1 on the current homestand (2-1 vs. MIN & 1-0 vs. OAK) after last night's victory vs. OAK.

LOOKING AHEAD:

Following the series with the A's, the Jays will head out on their 1st road trip of the season, an 11-day, 10-game trip...Begin with a 3-game series in Los Angeles (2-3) on Apr. 8-10...Following the series with the Angels, take on the Mariners (2-3) from Apr. 11-13...TOR will enjoy an off-day on Apr. 14 before concluding the trip with a 4-game series in Boston (0-4) from Apr. 15-18.

WORKING THEIR WAY BACK:

- RHP Brandon Morrow is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with a start on Apr. 7 with the Dunedin Blue Jays (A) as they take on the Clearwater Phillies in their season opener...Morrow was placed on the 15-day DL back on Mar. 31 (retro to Mar. 22) with a strained right elbow.
- RHP Frank Francisco is also scheduled to begin a rehab assignment on Apr. 7 with Dunedin (A)...Francisco was placed on the 15-day DL back on Mar. 31 (retro to Mar. 22) with a right shoulder strain.

<u>THIS DAY IN BLUE JAYS HISTORY:</u> In 1992, Toronto played their season opener in Detroit with newly acquired **Jack Morris** setting a Major League record with his **13th** consecutive opening day start...He tossed a complete game as Toronto won 4-2.

BLUE JAYS vs. ATHLETICS:

- 2011: Play the A's 10 times this season, six at Rogers Centre & four at Alameda County Colliseum...These two Clubs will meet again for a 3-game set to be played in Toronto from Aug. 9-11.
- Are 0-1 vs. OAK this season after last night's 7-6 victory in 10 innings...The Jays have won each of their last three season series dating back to 2008, going 17-10 over that span...TOR has won seven of their last 10 contests dating back to 2009...The Jays are 10-2 over their last 12 games played in Toronto dating back to 2008.
- LAST SEASON: Posted an overall record of 4-3 (3-1 at home & 1-2 on the road) vs. OAK.
- ALL-TIME: Overall are 168-193, 80-99 at home & 88-94 on the road...The Jays have won three straight season series vs. OAK dating back to 2008.

BLAST OFF:

The Blue Jays, who led the Majors last season with a Club record 257 home runs, have now hit 8-HR after their first four games which ranks T-4th in the AL (TEX & NYY lead with 13)...The 8-HR hit after the first four games are the most since 2001 (8-HR)...The Jays are looking to homer in their first five games to begin a season for the 1st time since 2000 when they did so in their first six contests (12 total).

WALK IT OFF:

- Last night vs. OAK, Yunel Escobar ended the game in walk-off fashion with a two-run homer in the 10th inning against Grant Balfour...For Escobar, it marked his 2nd career walk-off shot, previously done on June 2, 2008 vs. FLA.
 For Toronto, it was their 1st walk-off victory since Sept. 25,
- For Toronto, it was their 1st walk-off victory since Sept. 25, 2010 vs. BAL on a walk-off homer by Lyle Overbay...The only other walk-off home run by Toronto last season occurred on Sept. 12 vs. TB (Adam Lind), wasn't recorded until game #143 of the season...The Jays recorded five walk-off victories last season, however, did not have one until game #57 of the season (vs. NYY on June 5).

STOPPING SHORT:

According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, **Yunel Escobar** became the **3rd Toronto shortstop** to hit a walk-off home run in Franchise history...**Tony Batista** did it against the Braves on **July 19, 1999 & Aaron Hill** hit one against the Rays on **Sept. 15, 2006**.

A SNEAK ATTACK:

Last night, the Blue Jays came back from a five run deficit (0-5) to defeat the A's in extra innings on a two-run walk-off home run by Yunel Escobar...Last season, 36 of Toronto's 85 victories were come-from-behind wins.

WORKING OVERTIME:

Last night, the Blue Jays played their 1st extra-inning contest of the season, a 7-6 win in 10 innings...Toronto posted a record of 5-6 in extra-inning affairs (3-2 at home) last season.

CLOSE CALL:

With last night's 7-6 victory, the Blue Jays improved to 1-1 in one-run contests this season...In 2010, the Club posted a record of 24-28 in one-run affairs (14-13 at home).

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD:

When Brett Cecil surrendered a home run to Danny Valencia in the 3rd inning on Sunday's loss vs. the Twins, it snapped a stretch of 20.0 innings to start the season without allowing a home run...It represented the longest stretch to start a season since 1999.

2011 SEASON:

- Will be making his first start since Aug. 1, 2010 after having surgery to repair a right labral tear in his right hip the week of Aug. 9, 2010.
- Has made only nine starts over the last two seasons.
- This spring was 2-0 with a 4.09 ERA (10ER/22IP) allowing 28H, HR, 3BB and tied for the Club lead with 20K.

2010 SEASON:

BEEN A WHILE:

- On July 20 picked up his first victory since Sept. 18, 2008 when he defeated Kansas City 13-1... Made eight starts in between going 0-5 with a 7.08 ERA (40.2IP/32ER).
- Made only nine ML starts after recovering from Tommy John surgery in 2009 and then being shut down due to a labral tear in the right hip after his start Aug. 1.

2009 SEASON:

- Made only two starts before being placed on the disabled list April 14th with a right forearm strain. Had season ending Tommy John surgery June 12th.
- In his two starts, pitched a total of nine innings, walking only one...Took the loss April 8th vs. DET and received a no-decision April 13th at MIN.

NO FREEBIES:

Set a Blue Jays record with 38.0 consecutive innings without a walk (Apr.27-May 24)...Walked Mark Teahan with two outs in the ninth to end the streak...Is currently 6th in the Majors allowing only 1.42 walks per nine innings.

ABOUT THE STARTS:

- Tossed his 2nd career shutout and 2nd this season, in a 9-0 win vs. MIN, Sept 4...9.0IP, 4H, 2BB, 3K
- Tossed his first complete game of his career, a seven-hit shutout vs. KC on May 24...Set a Blue Jays record with 38 consecutive innings without allowing a walk.

2007 SEASON:

- Made his ML debut on May 15, holding the Orioles to one run and four hits over 8.2 innings of work...The outing was the longest of any Blue Jay making their ML debut in franchise history, surpassing the former record of eight innings held by Jerry Garvin (April 10, 1977) and Mauro Gozzo (August 8, 1989).
- On July 31 at TB, returned to TB to face his former employers...Picked up the win, holding the Devil Rays without a run in 6.2 IP...Was the Devil Rays bat boy from 2002-2003.

 Has posted a 10-10 record with a 3.63 ERA in 27 career starts at home... Opposed to a 11-14 record with a 4.51 ERA in 33 career games (32 starts) on the road.
