WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last five games as they continue this homestand tonight with the opener of a three-game series vs. the Oakland A's ... left-hander Mark Buehrle takes the mound for the White Sox, who are looking for their best 10-game start since 2005 (7-3).
- Following this series and a day off on Thursday, the Sox conclude the 10-game, 11-day homestand with three games vs. the Los Angeles Angels (4/15-17).
- The Sox went 3-2 on their season-opening trip to Cleveland (2-1) and Kansas City (1-1), which ended last Wednesday with a 10-7 victory in 12 innings over the Royals.
- After the off day on 4/14, Chicago plays 20 consecutive days from 4/15-5/4.
- The schedule includes four trips of 10 games or more and two to the west coast ... the Sox play the Cubs (six times), Dodgers, Arizona, Washington and Colorado in interleague action.

PERFECT MATCHUP

- Tonight's matchup between lefties Mark Buehrle and Dallas Braden is the 21st in major-league history featuring opposing starting pitchers who have thrown perfect games and third in White Sox history.
- The last three matchups of perfect game pitchers have been between David Wells and Randy Johnson, most recently on 4/24/07 when San Diego's Wells (5 ER/5.0 IP) won over Arizona's Johnson (6 ER/5.0 IP) at Chase Field.

 Wells also was involved in both previous White Sox perfect-
- Wells also was involved in both previous White Sox perfectgame matchups, facing Texas' Kenny Rogers in back-to-back starts on 5/6/01 in Arlington and 5/11/01 in Chicago.
- Buehrle threw the 18th perfect game in major-league history and second in Sox history on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay, while Braden was perfect vs. the Rays on 5/9/10.

TONIGHT'S OTHER STORYLINES

- The White Sox have hit 9,999 home runs in the 112-year history of the franchise.
- White Sox starters own a 1.93 ERA (6 ER/28.0 IP) in the last four games, while the bullpen has a 1.20 mark (2 ER/15.0 IP) in the last six
- The Sox have led in all nine games this season.
- Paul Konerko, who has recorded an RBI in eight of the Sox nine games, needs one home run to tie Ralph Kiner for 69th all-time with 369.
- Carlos Quentin has 99 career homers.

KONERKO HONORED

- Paul Konerko has been named co-American League Player of the Week with Cleveland's Asdrubal Cabrera.
- Konerko batted .417 (10-24) with three home runs, eight RBI to garner his fourth career weekly honor ... he tied for the AL lead in homers and RBI, ranked second in slugging percentage (.833) and third in average.
- Carlos Quentin received the honor last week, marking the first time Sox have players have received the award in consecutive weeks since Jim Thome and Mark Buehrle in July 2009.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Gavin Floyd allowed one unearned run on four hits over 8.0 IP, and Paul Konerko recorded his 28th career multihomer game to lead the White Sox to a 6-1 victory over Tampa Bay.
- Floyd walked one and struck out eight, while Konerko hit solo home runs in the first (Jeff Niemann) and fifth innings (Andy Sonnanstine) ... Gordon Beckham homered for the second time in three games.

PROGRAMMING NOTES

■ Due to conflicts with the Blackhawks playoff schedule, the Sox game on 4/15 vs. the Angels will begin on Comcast's main channel as well as CSN+ ... at 8:30 p.m., the game will switch exclusively to CSN+ in order to air the Blackhawks game.

DUNN ON THE MEND

■ Adam Dunn is day-to-day after undergoing an emergency appendectomy following the White Sox game on 4/5 at Kansas City in a laparoscopic procedure.

SOUTHPAW STATS

- The White Sox are 2-0 vs. left-handed starting pitchers this season, winning games started by Kansas City's Jeff Francis on 4/6 and Tampa Bay's David Price on 4/7.
- The Sox, who face lefties Dallas Braden and Brett Anderson in this series, rank second in the American League with a .328 (22-67) average vs. lefties in 2011.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox were 4-5 in 2010, going 2-1 at home and 2-4 in Oakland, to fall to 2-10-1 in 13 season matchups against the A's since 1998.
- The Sox batted .231 (68-295) with a 3.86 ERA (33 ER/77.0 IP) last season and were outscored, 38-29.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 261-283 ... they are 134-133 in Chicago (46-51 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 127-150 at the Oakland Coliseum.

ON THE HOMESTAND

- The Sox are 3-1 on the 10-game, 11-day homestand vs. Tampa Bay (3-1), Oakland (4/11-13) and the Angels (4/15-17).
- Phil Humber ("Umber"), making his third career start and first with the Sox, allowed one run on four hits over 6.0 IP in a 4-2 victory over the Rays on Saturday.
- The Rays scored five runs in the ninth inning off Matt Thornton on Friday to record a 9-7 victory over the White Sox.
- Edwin Jackson struck out a career-high 13 batters over 8.0 IP to lead the White Sox to a 5-1 win on Thursday ... Jackson's 13 strikeouts set a club record for a home opener (Elias).

JAKE PEAVY UPDATE

- Jake Peavy, who is on the 15-day disabled list to recover from a detached latissimus dorsi, is scheduled to throw a bullpen session this afternoon.
- Peavy made his first rehab start on Friday for Class AA Birmingham at Montgomery, allowing two unearned runs on five hits over 3.2 IP of a ND ... he walked one, struck out four and threw 71 pitches (43 strikes).
- He is next scheduled to throw 90 pitches on 4/13 at a site to be determined.

EARLY RETURNS

■ The White Sox lead the American League in runs scored (62, 6.9 per game), average (.307) and on-base percentage (.367) ... by comparison, the Sox ranked last in the AL in average last April (.223), 12th in OBP (.308) and 11th in runs scored (92).

NO RISP. NO REWARD

■ The White Sox lead the major leagues with a .389 (37-95) average with runners in scoring position ... the Sox are 31-70 (.443) with RISP in their six wins and 6-25 (.240) in three losses.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- The White Sox are 3-1 at home after going 45-36 (.531) at home in 2010, their 19th winning record in 20 seasons at U.S. Cellular Field.
- Chicago is 897-688 (.566) at U.S. Cellular Field, the fifth-best home winning percentage in the major leagues since 1991 behind New York-AL (.620), Atlanta (.610), Boston (.585) and St. Louis (.582).

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

■ Since the start of the 2003 season, White Sox pitchers lead the major leagues with 709 quality starts ... the Sox ranked third in the American League in 2010 with 94 quality starts, trailing only Oakland (103) and Tampa Bay (95).

THAT'S GONNA LEAVE A MARK

■ White Sox batters have been hit by pitch a major-league high seven times, while their pitchers have yet to hit a batter ... the Sox were hit 79 times in 2010, most in the American League ... by contrast, Sox pitchers hit just 34 batters, fewest in the AL.

IRONMAN BEHIND THE PLATE

- A.J. Pierzynski, who has never been on the disabled list during his major-league career, ranks 25th all-time with 11,165.2 IC ... he moved past Thurman Munson into 25th place on 4/3 at Cleveland and needs 12.2 to tie Terry Kennedy for 24th.
- Pierzynski has caught at least 1,000.0 innings in nine consecutive seasons, joining Jason Kendall as the only catchers to accomplish that feat.

AT THE HELM

- Ozzie Guillen has gone 606-538 (.530) in seven-plus seasons as White Sox manager ... Guillen is the only manager to guide the Sox to more than one division/league title.
- He is tied with Boston's Terry Francona for the fourth-longest current tenure as manager with one club in the major leagues, behind St. Louis' Tony La Russa (1996), the Angels' Mike Scioscia (2000) and Minnesota's Ron Gardenhire (2002).
- Has been ejected 25 times (none in 2011).

BUEHRLE AT A GLANCE

- 32-year-old left-hander makes his third start of the season and first at home looking for career victory No. 150 ... is tied with Hoyt Wilhelm for seventh in White Sox history with 361 appearances (336 starts).
- Tonight's game is the 21st in major-league history featuring opposing starting pitchers who have thrown perfect games and the first since San Diego's David Wells faced Arizona's Randy Johnson on 4/24/07.
- Ranks seventh among active pitchers with 2,282.1 IP and 10th with 149 victories ... among active lefties, ranks first in IP and second behind CC Sabathia (157) in wins.
- Has 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for a franchise-record 10 consecutive seasons (2001-current), the only active pitcher in baseball to accomplish that feat.
- Is 83-51 with a 3.80 ERA (509 ER/1,205.0 IP) lifetime at U.S. Cellular Field ... his 83 wins are a White Sox record.
- His 208 quality starts since 2001 rank second in the major leagues behind Roy Oswalt (211) ... owns a .575 career winning percentage (149-110).

2011 SEASON

■ Sox are 2-0 in his starts ... opponents are hitting .340 (16-47), with lefties at .333 (6-18) ... has not made a quality start ... has induced two double play grounders ... is averging 5.5 IP and 83.0 pitches per start ... is receiving 11.5 runs of support per 9.0 IP (14 R/11.0 IP).

I AST START

■ Posted a no decision on 4/6 at Kansas City, allowing five runs on eight hits over 5.0 IP ... walked two and struck out two ... gave up two runs in the first inning and three runs in the fifth ... left with a 5-0 deficit after throwing 86 pitches (52 strikes) ... Sox rallied for four runs in the ninth to force extra innings and went on to win, 10-7, in 12 ... game lasted 3:41.

GETTING THE NOD

- Earned the win on 4/1 at Cleveland in his ninth career Opening Day start ... allowed four runs on eight hits over 6.0 IP ... held the Indians scoreless on two hits through 5.0 IP before giving up four runs on six hits (all singles) in the sixth.
- Retired 10 straight batters in one stretch, the 52nd time he has accomplished that feat ... received 14 runs of support, his highest total since 7/21/04 at Cleveland.
- Opening Day assignment was the ninth of his career, extending his franchise record over Billy Pierce (7) and remaining tied with Roy Halladay and Livan Hernandez for most among active major leaguers.

2010 SEASON

- Went 13-13 with a 4.28 ERA (100 ER/210.1 IP) in 33 starts ... recorded 10 wins, 30 starts and 200.0 IP for the 10th consecutive season, extending both his own franchise record and also the longest active streak in the major leagues ... won his second straight Rawlings Gold Glove Award (see note below).
- Ranked among the American League leaders in starts (T4th), walks per 9.0 IP (6th, 2.1) and complete games (T8th, 3) ... also led the major leagues with 11 pickoffs ... induced 19 double-play grounders and yielded a career-low 17 home runs (0.73 per 9.0 IP), down from 27 in 2009 ... his 99 strikeouts were the second-fewest of his career (98 in 2006).

SEEING DOUBLE

■ Has recorded 10 or more victories in a franchise-record 10 consecutive seasons ... he and CC Sabathia (2001-10) are the only active pitchers with 10-plus wins in each of the last 10 campaigns.

GOOD AS GOLD

- Won his second straight American League Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2010, becoming the first White Sox player to garner the honor in back-to-back seasons since Robin Ventura in 1991-93 ... received his award in a ceremony prior to yesterday's White Sox game vs. Tampa Bay.
- Was the Fielding Bible Award recipient for the second straight season, recognizing the single-best fielder at each position ... is one of six pitchers in major-league history to throw a no-hitter and win a Gold Glove, joining Bob Gibson, Phil Niekro, Jim Palmer, Kenny Rogers and Bret Saberhagen.
- Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads all major-league pitchers with 74 pickoffs, is tied for second with 424 assists and ranks third with 556 total chances.

PERFECTION

■ Threw the 18th perfect game in major-league history and second in White Sox history (first since 1922) on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay ... marked his second career no-hitter (also 4/18/07 vs. Texas) ... perfect game was the first in the majors since Arizona's Randy Johnson on 5/18/04 at Atlanta and the first in the American League since New York's David Cone on 7/18/99 vs. Montreal.

WORKHORSE

Has thrown 2,231.0 IP since the start of the 2001 season, most in the major leagues ... is the only pitcher in baseball to throw at least 200.0 IP each season from 2001-10 ... led the AL in IP in back-to-back seasons in 2004-05, the first Sox pitcher to accomplish the feat since Wilbur Wood in 1972-73.

AMONG THE BEST

■ Since the beginning of the 2001 season, leads the major leagues in IP (2,231.0), pickoffs (74) and opponents GIDP (257) and ranks among the leaders in quality starts (2nd, 208), starts (3rd, 333), wins (4th, 145), complete games (4th, 27), shutouts (T10th, 8) and walks per 9.0 IP (12th, 2.03).

NO WALKING OR RUNNING

■ Has averaged 2.06 walks per 9.0 IP over his career and 2.45 in 2011 ... has issued no walks in 70 of 336 career starts ... opponents have been successful on just 46 of 107 (43.0 percent) steal attempts and were 0-0 in 2011 ... has picked off 78 runners (MLB-high 11 in 2010).

DON'T GO TO THE FRIDGE

■ Nine of his career starts have been played in less than 2:00 ... his 1:39 game on 4/16/05 vs. Seattle was the fastest in the majors since 9/30/84 when Atlanta beat San Diego in 1:39 and fastest Sox game since 7/7/75 (1:38).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is a four-time All-Star (2002, 2005-06, '09) ... 209 of his 336 (62.2 percent) career starts have been quality ... ranks among the Sox all-time leaders in starts (4th, 336), strikeouts (5th, 1,289), wins (8th, 149) and IP (8th, 2,282.1) ... is one of five pitchers in history to record each of his first 100 wins in a Sox uniform and one of six to record his first 1,000 strikeouts with the Sox.
- Lasted at least 6.0 IP in 49 straight starts from 5/11/04-7/26/05, the longest streak in the majors since Steve Carlton went 69 straight with Philadelphia from 1979-82 ... has retired 10 or more straight batters in a game 52 times (last, 10 on 4/1/11 at Cleveland).

VS. OAKLAND A'S

- Has gone 4-13 with a 3.90 ERA (66 ER/152.1 IP) and three complete games in 26 career games (22 starts) against the A's ... 13 losses are his third-most vs. any opponent.
- Is 3-6 with a 3.23 ERA (25 ER/69.2 IP) in 12 games (10 starts) at U.S. Cellular Field and 1-7 with a 4.46 ERA (41 ER/82.2 IP) in 14 games (12 starts) at the Coliseum.
- Lost his last start on 9/21/10 at the Coliseum, allowing five runs on 11 hits over 6.0 IP ... went the distance on 7/23/10 for his first career victory in Oakland, giving up one run on four hits over 9.0 IP.
- Is making his first start in Chicago vs. Oakland since a loss on 6/4/09 (4 ER/8.0 IP) ... his win at home came on 5/24/06 (0 ER/7.0 IP).
- Back-to-back starts opposing Mark Mulder on 5/6/03 in Oakland (1:49) and 8/8/03 in Chicago (1:53) were played in less than 2:00.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

- RHP Edwin Jackson (2-0, 1.93) makes his third start of the season and second at home.
