A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's own a 1-0 lead in 2011 by virtue of last night's win...won the season series 5-4 last year, the eighth time in the past 10 seasons they have won the season series...went 4-2 in Oakland and 1-2 in Chicago...are now 57-31 (.648) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the best record by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 284-261 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 150-127 in Oakland and 134-134 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 961-1015 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is a career .297 (82 for 276) hitter with nine home runs and 37 RBI against the White Sox...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team.

David DeJesus has a 249-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Brian Fuentes recorded his fourth save of the year last night and has 187 saves since 2005, which are the most by a left-handed reliever in the majors over than span.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1909, the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuffy" McInnis make his major league debut...in 1955, the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in 1994, Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: After opening the season 1-4, the A's have won three straight and four of their last five games despite scoring only 11 runs over that five-game span...are 3-0 in the last game of a series and 2-5 in all other games, including 1-3 in the first game of a series...their last three losses have been decided by a combined four runs and their last seven games have been decided by only nine runs... have spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, four days in third place, two days tied for third place and four days in fourth place... the A's finished the spring with a 12-21-1 (.368) record, which was the fifth worst mark in the majors...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...the A's compiled a 3555-3280 (.520) record over the previous 43 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...the A's went 81-81 last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...this is the Athletics franchise's 111th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

NINE-GAME ROAD TRIP: The A's are 4-3 on their first road trip of 2011, a nine-game, three-city trip through Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (1-0)...the nine games are one shy of the longest this season, as the A's play 10 games on two road trips later this year (BOS-BAL-CWS, June 3-12; NYY-BOS-CLE, Aug. 23-Sept. 1)...Oakland posted its fourth straight losing record (34-47) on the road in 2010.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 4-2 record and have posted a 2.38 ERA (18 er in 68.0 ip) this season...their 68.0 innings lead the majors and their 2.38 ERA ranks second behind Texas (2.26)...are also tied for second for fewest home runs allowed (3), rank third in walks (15) and are tied for third in strikeouts (50) in the American League.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have complied a 2.73 ERA, which ranks second in the majors (Texas, 2.22)...also rank fifth in the American League and sixth in the majors with a .240 opponents batting average...have walked only 22 batters, second fewest in the majors (18, PHI).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .196 (38 for 194) over their past six games and are now hitting .224 (74 for 331) overall...are 17 for 81 (.210) with runners in scoring position to rank third-to-last in the American League, but are batting .244 (10 for 41) with runners in scoring position and two outs, which ranks fourth best in the AL...have scored 31 runs this season, which are second fewest runs in the major leagues (Minnesota, 24)... their 23 walks are the second fewest in the AL (19, MIN) and their five home runs are tied for second fewest (3, MIN) in the majors...however, their 23 doubles rank second highest in the AL, third in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error over their past six games after committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...the nine errors are tied for second most in the majors (CWS, 10)...last season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

LOCKED UP: The A's announced yesterday that they have agreed to terms with All-Star pitcher Trevor Cahill on a new five-year contract through 2015 with club options for both 2016 and 2017...Oakland now has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have one rookie on the Opening Day Roster for the second consecutive season (Cramer)...six players have six or more years of service: Mark Ellis (8 years, 136 days), Brian Fuentes (8 years, 125 days), Hideki Matsui (8 years) Coco Crisp (7 years, 158 days), David DeJesus (6 years, 146 days) and Grant Balfour (6 years, 99 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's current roster features just three players under the age of 25...Trevor Cahill is the youngest at 23 years, 31 days...Brett Anderson is second youngest (23 years, 59 days), followed by Tyson Ross (23 years, 349 days)...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old...Hideki Matsui is the oldest at 36 years, 293 days...he is followed by Brian Fuentes (35 years, 235 days), Mark Ellis (33 years, 299 days) and Grant Balfour (33 years, 92 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and now have four with Wednesday's addition of Wuertz (left hamstring strain) retroactive to April 2...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 91 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (102)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's were 21-9 (.700) in his starting assignments last year and are 38-26 (.594) in his 64 career starts...tossed at least seven innings in 15 of his 30 starts in 2010, allowed one run or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland...struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to fan eight or more in fewer than five innings (Ted Lilly, 9 so in 4.2 ip on July 2, 2003 vs. Seattle and Tim Conroy, 9 so in 4.2 ip on June 17, 1984 vs. Chicago)...walked Suzuki to start the game but then retired each of the next eight batters he faced...walked Cust with the bases loaded in the third inning to make the score 2-1 and was relieved by Blevins with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Blevins got the final out but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning for the blown save...it was the first time in his 63 career starts the A's bullpen blew a save.

LAST START: Earned his first win of the season in a 2-1 victory over Toronto last Thursday, allowing one run on three hits in eight innings...he had seven strikeouts and walked none, the seventh time in his career he has not walked a batter...gave up a leadoff single to Hill in the second inning and then retired the next 12 batters he faced before Arencibia doubled to start the sixth...Arencibia later scored on a Nix single...was replaced by Fuentes to start the ninth after throwing 68 of 105 pitches for strikes

CAHILL vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-1 with a 3.34 ERA (29.2 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 11 er, 9 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in five career starts...is 0-0 with a 5.19 ERA (5 er in 8.2 ip) in two starts in Chicago and 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (6 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland...the win came September 9 of last season when he allowed two runs on six hits in eight innings in a 7-2 victory...blanked the White Sox on one hit and one walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a run in the fifth on an Aramis Ramirez double and back-toback ground outs...allowed another run in the sixth inning when Pierre scored on a Manny Ramirez grounded into double play...the loss also came last year, a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland on July 23...tossed seven innings and did not strike out a batter, his first career start of five or more innings without a strikeout...allowed a Quentin sacrifice fly in the first and two more runs in the sixth on a fielders choice and a ground out...Buehrle tossed a complete game four-hitter and did not walk a batter.

OPENING DAY STARTERS: Made his first career Opening Day start against Seattle...became the sixth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last six years (Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...at the age of 23 years, 31 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to start an opener in Athletics history...only two pitchers in Oakland history have been younger -Blue at the age of 21 years, 251 days in 1971 and Catfish Hunter at the age of 22 years, 2 days in 1968.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (24.0 ip, 27 h, 13 r, 12 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in six games, all starts.

2010 RECAP: Began the season on the disabled list and was optioned to Sacramento before returning to Oakland April 30 to lead the A's with 18 wins...posted an 18-8 record 30 starts with a team-leading ERA...his wins were the most by an Athletic

over the last eight years...all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...the last Athletics pitcher to win as many as 18 games without winning one in April was Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for the Philadelphia A's in 1951...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA over his first four starts, 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25 and 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA over his last seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranked third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), fourth in ERA (2.97) and opponents on-base percentage (.287), tied for fourth in wins (18), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.692) and sixth in opponents slugging (.332)...also tied for second in grounded into double plays (27), tied for third in shutouts (1) and tied for sixth in pickoffs (5)

IN THE DAYS OF MY YOUTH: His 18 wins tied for third most in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 23...the last AL pitcher under the age of 23 with at least 18 wins was Bret Saberhagen, who won 20 games for Kansas City in 1985 at the age of 21...the last major leaguer was Mark Prior, who won 18 for the Cubs in 2003...is just the second pitcher in Oakland history to win at least 10 games in each of the first two seasons of his career (Tim Hudson, 1999-2000)...is the eighth in franchise history (Jim Nash, Bob Hooper, Lefty Grove, Weldon Henley, Chief Bender and Eddie Plank)...his 2.97 ERA was the lowest by an AL pitcher younger than 23 since 1990 (Kevin Appier, KC 2.76) and was fifth lowest in Athletics history since the earned run became an official stat in 1913.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .198 mark against right-handed hitters and .237 against left-handers...the average against righties was the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the opposition hit .209 with a .252 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage ranked sixth in the AL and the batting average was seventh...allowed a .188 batting average the first time through the lineup, .221 the second time through and .253 after that...the mark the first time through was ninth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 11-3 with a 2.18 ERA in 15 starts in Oakland and 7-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 15 starts on the road...tied for second in the AL in home wins and ranked fifth in ERA...is now 18-10 with a 3.23 ERA (77 er in 214.1 ip) in 34 career starts in Oakland compared to 11-11 with a 4.25 ERA (82 er in 173.2 ip) in 30 starts on the road.

MISCELLANEOUS: Went 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA in four interleague starts, tying for second in the majors in wins (Buehrle, CWS 4)...compiled a 1.50 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in the first inning...was 6-2 with a 2.20 ERA in nine starts during the day, 12-6 with a 3.29 ERA in 21 starts at night...had the third lowest day ERA in the AL...yielded three grand slams, which tied for the most in the majors (Santana, NYM)...it also tied the Athletics' franchise record set by Ed Rakow in 1961.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (0-1, 1.93): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...his loss in his last start on Friday in Minnesota snapped a career-high-tying four-game winning streak dating back to last season...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat (8 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 5 so)... it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters... lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...is now 15-11 with a 2.82 ERA in 38 starts since June 29, 2009... is 1-1 with a 4.88 ERA (24.0 ip, 31 h, 13 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in four career starts vs. Chicago... had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 loss to Chicago on September 22 of last year in Oakland.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-3, 3.86 ERA (21.0 ip, 17 h, 12 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 24 so, 3 hr)

Save/Save Opportunities: 4/6 (66.7%)

The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in five of its last seven games (3 er in 13.2 ip, 1.98 ERA) after yielding three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...has pitched a total of 21.0 innings this season, the fewest by a bullpen in the major leagues, and has been charged with three of the team's five losses...the three losses by relievers are tied for second most in the majors...compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199)

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Begins his eighth season in the majors but is on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Did not allow a run in three appearances against the White Sox last season...however, has a 5.60 ERA in 20 career appearances against the team (17.2 ip, 17 h, 12 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 16 so, 3 hr).

 Was 1-0 with a 6.97 ERA in 11 spring training appearances...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow an earned
- run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting a 12.00 ERA over his first six contests.
