A's vs. WHITE SOX

Oakland is 1-1 vs. Chicago in 2011...won the season series 5-4 last year, the eighth time in the past 10 seasons they have won the season series...went 4-2 in Oakland and 1-2 in Chicago...are now 57-32 (.640) against the White Sox since the start of the 2001 season, which is the best record by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 284-262 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 150-127 in Oakland and 134-135 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 961-1016 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 250-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Brian Fuentes recorded his fourth save of the year Monday and has 187 saves since 2005, which are the most by a left-handed reliever in the majors over than span.

Hideki Matsui, whose .217 (34 for 157) career average against the White Sox is his worst vs. any MLB team, went 3-for-5 with a double and two RBI last night. That broke a personal 1-for-24 drought vs. Chicago. His career hit total (Japan/MLB) is now 2,508. His next career milestones will be 500 (he has 494) and 1,500 runs scored (he has 1,495).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968, the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington ...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in 1994, the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game... Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: After opening the season 1-4, the A's have won four of their last six games despite scoring only 16 runs over that six-game span...are 3-0 in the last game of a series and 2-6 in all other games, including 1-3 in the first game of a series...their last four losses have been decided by a combined five runs and their last seven games have been decided by only 10 runs... have spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, five days in third place, two days tied for third place and four days in fourth place... the A's finished the spring with a 12-21-1 (.368) record, which was the fifth worst mark in the majors...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...the A's compiled a 3555-3280 (.520) record over the previous 43 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...the A's went 81-81 last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...this is the Athletics franchise's 111th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

NINE-GAME ROAD TRIP: The A's conclude their first road trip of 2011 today...are 4-4 on this nine-game, three-city trek to Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (1-1)...the nine games are one shy of the longest this season, as the A's play 10 games on two road trips later this year (BOS-BAL-CWS, June 3-12; NYY-BOS-CLE, Aug. 23-Sept. 1)...Oakland posted its fourth straight losing record (34-47) on the road in 2010.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 4-2 record and have posted a 2.72 ERA (22 er in 72.2 ip) this season...their 72.2 innings lead the majors and their 2.73 ERA ranks second behind Texas (2.56)...are also tied for second for fewest home runs allowed (4), tied for third in walks (18) and rankn fourth in strikeouts (53) in the American League.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have complied a 3.01 ERA, which ranks third in the American League and fourth in the majors...also rank sixth in the AL and seventh in the majors with a .239 opponents batting average...have walked only 27 batters, second fewest in the AL, third fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (50 for 237) over their past seven games and are now hitting .230 (86 for 374) overall...are 18 for 97 (.186) with runners in scoring position to rank last in the American League, but are batting .229 (11 for 48) with runners in scoring position and two outs, which ranks sixth best in the AL...have scored 36 runs this season, which is tied for third fewest runs in the AL and the major leagues ... their 26 walks are the third fewest in the AL and their six home runs are tied for third fewest in the majors...however, their 26 doubles rank first in the AL, second in the majors (Florida, 31).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped their errorless streak at six games last night when LaRoche was charged with a fifth inning error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their current 10 errors are tied for second most in the majors (CWS, 12)...last season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

LOCKED UP: The A's announced Monday that they have agreed to terms with All-Star pitcher Trevor Cahill on a new five-year contract through 2015 with club options for both 2016 and 2017...Oakland now has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have one rookie on the Opening Day Roster for the second consecutive season (Cramer)...six players have six or more years of service: Mark Ellis (8 years, 136 days), Brian Fuentes (8 years, 125 days), Hideki Matsui (8 years) Coco Crisp (7 years, 158 days), David DeJesus (6 years, 146 days) and Grant Balfour (6 years, 99 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's current roster features just three players under the age of 25...Trevor Cahill is the youngest at 23 years, 31 days...Brett Anderson is second youngest (23 years, 59 days), followed by Tyson Ross (23 years, 349 days)...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old...Hideki Matsui is the oldest at 36 years, 293 days...he is followed by Brian Fuentes (35 years, 235 days), Mark Ellis (33 years, 299 days) and Grant Balfour (33 years, 92 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and now have four with Wednesday's addition of Wuertz (left hamstring strain) retroactive to April 2...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 91 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (102)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's were 8-11 (.421) in his starting assignments last year and are 22-29 (.431) in his 51 career starts...tossed six or more innings in 14 of his 19 starts in 2010, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 18 times.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: His loss last Friday in Minnesota snapped a career-high-tying four-game winning streak dating back to last season...it was his first loss since September 1, 2010 at New York...had a 2.09 ERA (11 er in 47.1 ip) and a .232 (42 for 181) opponents batting average during the streak, which had spanned seven starts back to September 6, 2010.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning after throwing 108 pitches...left with the scored tied at 1-1.

LAST START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota last Friday...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles...he threw 75 of his 109 pitches for strikes.

ANDERSON vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-1 with a 4.88 ERA (24.0 ip, 31 h, 13 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 loss to Chicago on September 22 of last year in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on four hits, a walk and a hit batter over the first six innings...took a 2-0 lead into the seventh inning and allowed a two-out RBI single to Viciedo...left with a 2-1 lead, but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth and two more in the ninth for the loss...the loss came in a 6-1 decision at Chicago July 30, 2010...allowed a RBI single to Rios in the first and three more runs in the fourth on a groundout and two RBI singles by Pierzynski and Beckham...was relieved by Ziegler with runners on first and second and out in the sixth and he allowed one of those runs to score...had two other starts in 2009...the win came at Chicago on June 4 when he combined with Wuertz and Casilla on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings, yielded three of the hits and allowed only one base runner as far as third base...then had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 10-inning loss in Oakland August 14.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA (27.0 ip, 25 h, 16 r, 15 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 6 hr) in six games, including five starts...ranked third in the Cactus League in strikeouts (25), sixth in innings pitched (27.0) and tied for eighth in wins (2)...pitched in relief of Gio Gonzalez in his first outing March 1 and then started in each of his final five games...allowed a .238 (25 for 105) opponents batting average...struck out 25 and walked just six for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.2.

2010 RECAP: Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...is now 15-11 with a 2.82 ERA in 38 starts since June 29, 2009.

QUALIFICATIONS: Tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents batted .257, which included .243 (80 for 329) by right-handed hitters and .299 (32 for 107) by left-handers...his career splits are .245 (209 for 854) against righties and .307 (96 for 313) against lefties...allowed all six of his home runs to righties...five came at home, five were hit in night games and five were with the bases empty...his opponents batting average dropped to .225 with runners in scoring position after yielding a .314 average with RISP in 2009...however, the opposition hit .315 when leading off an inning.

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of one run or fewer in eight of his 19 starts and was 0-5 in those games...had a 7-1 record in his 11 starts with support of two runs or more...is now 0-15 in 22 career starts with zero or one run of support and 18-3 in 29 starts with at least two runs of support...tied for eighth in the AL with four pickoffs and now has nine in three seasons.

MORE 2010: Did not allow a run in his first two starts of the season April 8 against Seattle and April 13 at Seattle to become the first starting pitcher in Oakland history (among pitchers who began the season with the A's) to start the season with two consecutive scoreless outings...the last Athletics pitcher to do it was Alex Kellner of the 1953 Philadelphia A's, who started the season with back-to-back complete game shutouts...was charged with the first wild pitch of his career in the game on the 13th, snapping a careeroppening streak of 31 starts and 186.1 innings without a wild pitch...the streak of 31 consecutive starts without a wild pitch tied for sixth longest by a starter in Oakland history...had his season-opening scoreless streak snapped at 14.0 innings in his third start, an 8-3 loss to Baltimore...that was the third longest seasonopening streak by a starter in Oakland history and the longest since Matt Keough set the record with a 16.0 inning streak in 1980...was 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA in four starts before going on the 15-day disabled list April 27 retroactive to April 25 with left elbow inflammation and a proximal medial forearm strain...it was his first career stint on the DL... was reinstated from the DL May 29 and had a win and a 2.35 ERA in two starts before returning to the DL with left elbow inflammation June 4...was reinstated July 30...went 5-5 with a 2.98 ERA in 13 starts following his return...had a career-high tying four-game losing streak from Aug. 10 to Sept. 1...went 0-4 despite a 3.21 ERA over that five-start span, receiving no run support three times, including Aug. 27 at Texas when he left after 2.0 innings with a mild hyper extension of his right knee...the 2.0 innings pitched matched his career low (June 3, 2010 at Boston)...then finished the season with a career-high tying four-game winning streak, posting a 2.18 ERA and holding the opposition to a .233 batting average over his final six starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (2-0, 0.69): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season ... tossed six or more innings in 25 of his 33 starts in 2010, allowed two runs or fewer 19 times and did not allow a run in eight starts...since 1975, the only other A's pitcher with eight starts in a season without allowing a run is Mike Moore in 1989... began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...tied for fourth in the AL in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15)...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL... in his last start, earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 win in Minnesota Saturday... held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts... is 0-3 with a 10.22 ERA (12.1 ip, 16 h, 15 r, 14 er, 8 bb, 15 so, 6 hr) in three career starts against Detroit... did not face the Tigers last year and has not made a start against the team since Aug. 21, 2009, when he was the losing pitcher in a 3-2 A's loss at the Coliseum when he struck out nine batters in only 5.2 innings.

The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in five of its last eight games and has a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...has pitched a total of 26.0 innings this season, the fewest by a bullpen in the major leagues, but has been charged with four of the team's six losses...the four losses by relievers are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh)...compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Begins his eighth season in the majors but is on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Did not allow a run in three appearances against the White Sox last season...however, has a 5.60 ERA in 20 career appearances against the team (17.2 ip, 17 h, 12 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 16 so, 3 hr).

 Was 1-0 with a 6.97 ERA in 11 spring training appearances...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow an earned
- run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting a 12.00 ERA over his first six contests.
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.
