ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won five of their last seven games since opening the season 1-4...are 4-0 in the last game of a series and 2-6 in all other games, including 1-3 in the first game of a series...however, their last four losses have been decided by a combined five runs...have spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, six days in third place, two days tied for third place and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...the A's compiled a 3,555-3,280 (.520) record over the previous 43 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...the A's went 81-81 last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...this is the Athletics franchise's 111th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

AT HOME: The A's begin a six-game homestand today against Detroit (four games) and Boston (two games)...are 1-2 at home this season following their season-opening series against Seattle...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006...went 5-4 on their nine-game, three-city road trip to Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (2-1), which concluded yesterday.

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago...**the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland**...they also played three straight extra-inning games at home against the White Sox earlier that year (April 21-23), the first three games of a four-game series...the last time the A's had played three consecutive extra-inning games was June 1-3, 2004 at home...the first two games were also against the White Sox, the third against Toronto...are now 2-2 in extra-inning games this season after going 4-7 in such games last season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 4-2 record and have posted a 2.76 ERA (24 er in 78.1 ip) this season...the ERA and innings pitched **each rank second in the Major Leagues**...have allowed only four home runs this season, which is **tied for the fewest in the majors**...have allowed only 19 walks, which is the third fewest total in the American League...their 56 strikeouts are tied for fifth.

PITCHING: A's pitched have compiled a 2.90 ERA (35 er in 108.2 ip), which **ranks third in the majors**...also rank seventh in opponents batting average (.239) and have walked only 30 batters this season, the fourth fewest totals in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are 23 for 80 (.288) over their past two games, which has raised their batting average 11 points from .227 to .238 (98 for 441)...however, the average ranks ninth in the American League...are 22 for 108 (.204) with runners in scoring position, which is **tied for second lowest in the AL**, but their .231 (12 for 52) batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs is fifth best in the league...**their seven home runs are tied for the second fewest in the AL, but their 27 doubles rank first.**

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in their past two games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 12 errors total are **the second most in the majors** (Chicago-AL, 13)...season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

LOCKED UP: The A's announced Monday that they have agreed to terms with All-Star pitcher Trevor Cahill on a new five-year contract through 2015 with club options for both 2016 and 2017...Oakland now has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's current roster features just three players under the age of 25...Trevor Cahill is the youngest at 23 years, 31 days...Brett Anderson is second youngest (23 years, 59 days), followed by Tyson Ross (23 years, 349 days)...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old...Hideki Matsui is the oldest at 36 years, 293 days...he is followed by Brian Fuentes (35 years, 235 days), Mark Ellis (33 years, 299 days) and Grant Balfour (33 years, 92 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and now have four with Wednesday's addition of Wuertz (left hamstring strain) retroactive to April 2...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 91 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (102)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

A's vs. TIGERS

The A's and Tigers split the season series 3-3 last year...the A's were 3-1 in Detroit and 0-2 in Oakland...have lost the season series only twice in the previous 10 seasons and are 51-30 (.630) against the Tigers over that span...have not been shut out by Detroit since Aug. 23, 1993, a 9-0 loss at Tiger Stadium (Mike Moore one-hitter)...that is a span of 152 consecutive games without being shutout, **the longest in Oakland history** against one team...were last shutout by Detroit in Oakland on Sept. 23, 1990, a 6-0 loss (Jack Morris four-hitter)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 231-223 against the Tigers...that includes 128-97 in Oakland, 101-124 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 25-18 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 899-976 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 251-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis was awarded a triple today by the league office for the fly ball he hit to center field April 9 in Minnesota, which was originally scored a three-base error on Span...the triple was the 22nd of his career, tying Sal Bando for **eighth most in Oakland history.**

Brian Fuentes recorded his fifth save of the year yesterday, which is **tied for second most in the Major Leagues**...now has 188 saves since 2005, which are the most by a left-handed reliever in the majors over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971**, Reggie Jackson hits his 100th home run in an Oakland uniform, becoming the first Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...he also hit his 101st in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota...in **2001**, Miguel Tejada hits the 10,000th home run Athletics history in a 9-8 loss to Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's were 19-14 (.576) in his starting assignments last year and are 32-27 (.542) in his career...tossed six or more innings in 25 of his 33 starts in 2010, allowed two runs or fewer 19 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times...did not allow a run in eight starts...since 1975, the only other A's pitcher with eight starts in a season without allowing a run is Mike Moore in 1989.

TWO WINS: Has earned the win in each of his two starts this season...the two wins are tied for fourth most in the Major Leagues...won 15 games last season, which tied for 10th most in the American League, in 33 starts...prior to 2010, had seven career wins in 30 games, 24 starts.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts this season, which ranks sixth in the majors...last year, he finished eighth in the American League with a 3.23 ERA (72 er in 200.2 ip)...is now 17-9 with a 3.07 ERA (73 er in 213.2 ip) over the past two seasons.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

LAST START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota on Saturday...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact...it was the A's first shutout of the season.

GONZALEZ vs. DETROIT: Is 0-3 with a 10.22 ERA (12.1 ip, 16 h, 15 r, 14 er, 8 bb, 15 so, 6 hr) in three career starts...did not face the Tigers last year and has not made a start against the team since August 21, 2009...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss in Oakland when he struck out nine batters in just 5.2 innings...allowed a pair of solo home runs to Raburn in the first and third innings to give the Tigers a 2-1 lead...then allowed a RBI single to Thomas in the sixth inning...allowed four hits and four walks in his 5.2 innings...took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat on June 30, 2009 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Polanco in the first inning and a RBI single to Raburn in the third...retired six of the final seven hitters that he faced...left after five innings with the A's trailing 3-1...also took the loss in his lone start in 2008, a 14-8 decision at Detroit on September 8, 2008...allowed nine runs in 1.2 innings...yielded three runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Ordonez and a solo shot by Sheffield...Sheffield added a grand slam in the Tigers six run second inning.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-2 with a 2.30 ERA (27.1 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six games, all starts...his 29 strikeouts ranked second in the Cactus League and tied for the best total by an A's pitcher since spring training stats were first kept in 1992 (Rich Harden, 2005 and 2007)...also tied for second in the CL in ERA (2.30) and tied for third in innings pitched (27.1)...held the opposition to a .170 (16 for 94) batting average...did not allow more than two runs in any of his six starts.

2010 RECAP: Began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...was the only Athletic to spend the entire season in the starting rotation...entered the season with a 7-11 record and 6.24 ERA in 30 games, 24 starts, over his first two seasons.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for fourth in the American League in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15)...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL...also ranked 10th in the AL in pitches (3369).

HOME AND AWAY: Had an 8-3 record, a 2.56 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in 16 starts in Oakland, compared to 7-6 with a 3.92 ERA and .257 opponents average in 17 starts on the road...had the lowest home opponents batting average in the majors and ranked eighth in the AL in ERA and tied for ninth in wins.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 7-6 with a 3.79 ERA in 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 8-3 with a 2.59 ERA in 15 starts after the break...ranked fourth in the AL in post-break ERA and tied for fourth in wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .209 (37 for 177) against left-handed hitters and .235 (134 for 571) against right-handers...yielded a .188 batting average and .234 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning...the on-base percentage was second lowest in the AL while the batting average was third lowest...allowed a .204 batting average with the bases empty and .267 with runners on, although that dropped to .239 with runners in scoring position...held the opponents number three hitter to a .176 average, which was second lowest in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents average in 11 starts during the day, 8-8 with a 3.86 ERA and .249 opponents average in 22 starts at night...ranked second in the AL in day ERA, tied for third in wins and fourth in opponents average...is now 11-4 with a 3.55 ERA (50 er in 126.2 ip) in 21 career appearances during the day, compared to 13-16 with a 4.71 ERA (115 er in 219.2 ip) in 44 games at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of two runs or fewer in each of his nine losses and had just six total runs of support in those starts (45.2 ip, 1.18 RSA)...has 18 runs of support in his 20 career losses (94.0 ip, 1.72 RSA)...is 22-4 in 37 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-16 in 22 starts with support of one run or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-0, 3.52): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...his teams are 28-30 (.483) in his 58 career starts...tossed six or more innings in nine of his 17 starts in 2009, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer nine times...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota on Sunday...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...he struck out five and did not walk a batter, the eighth start of his career in which he did not allow a walk...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss to Toronto on April 5...allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits over eight innings, walking one while striking out two...is 1-3 with a 4.83 ERA (31.2 ip, 37 h, 18 r, 17 er, 7 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in 12 career games, five starts, against the Tigers...is 0-3 with a 4.55 ERA (14 er in 27.2 ip) in nine games, four starts, in Detroit and 1-0 with a 6.75 ERA (3 er in 4.0 ip) in three appearances, one start, at home...is 0-3 with a 5.14 ERA (12 er in 21.0 ip) in his five starts.

Save/Save Opportunities: 5/7 (71.4%)

The A's bullpen has not allowed an earned run in six of its last nine games and has a 1.96 ERA (5 er in 23.0 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...has pitched a total of 30.1 innings this season, which is the third fewest in the Major Leagues...however, has been charged with four of the team's six losses, which is tied for the most losses by relievers in the majors...compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199).

- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Earned his first win as an Athletic yesterday after pitching a scoreless ninth inning.
- Has not allowed a run in four of his five appearances this season...allowed two runs without recording an out April 5 and has a 4.15 ERA (2 er in 4.1 ip) overall this year.
- Did not allow a run in two appearances against Detroit last season (1.1 ip) and is 3-2 with three blown saves and a 3.05 ERA in 20 career outings (20.2 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 31 so)...the 31 strikeouts are his most against any team.
- Begins his eighth season in the majors but is on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Was 1-0 with a 6.97 ERA in 11 spring training appearances...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow an earned run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting a 12.00 ERA over his first six contests.
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.
