RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers blanked the Athletics for a 3-0 victory last night at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum, the club's third consecutive victory. Phil Coke (1-2) tossed seven scoreless innings for the victory, while Jose Valverde fired a scoreless ninth for the save. Ramon Santiago led the Tigers offense with a pair of hits and a RBI, while Ryan Raburn added a double and a RBI. The Tigers continue a seven-game road trip this evening with the second game of a four-game series at Oakland. The club concludes the west coast trip with three games at Seattle beginning Monday evening.

LEYLAND ONE VICTORY SHY OF 1,500: Jim Leyland is in his sixth season as the manager of the Tigers in 2011. He enters tonight's game at Oakland with 1,499 wins during his major league managerial career, one win shy of becoming the 19th manager in major league history to reach 1,500 victories. Leyland's 1,499 wins are second among all active major league managers, trailing the 2,644 wins by Tony La Russa.

THAT HADN'T HAPPENED IN A WHILE: The Tigers 3-0 victory over the Athletics last night marked the club's first shutout in Oakland since posting a 6-0 victory on September 23, 1990 behind a complete game effort from Jack Morris.

LIMITING THE LONGBALL: Tigers pitchers have not allowed a home run in each of the last seven games. The seven-game streak is the longest by Tigers pitchers since not allowing a home run in seven consecutive games from August 25-September 1, 1985. The Tigers posted an eight-game streak without allowing a home run from June 3-11, 1981.

WALKING AWAY WITH IT: The Tigers finished last night's game at Oakland with 11 walks, marking the most by a Tigers team in a nine inning game since collecting 12 walks in a 14-5 victory over the Athletics on April 26, 1996 at Tiger Stadium.

THREE STRAIGHT WINS IN OAKLAND: Last night's victory was the Tigers third consecutive win at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum dating back to May 19, 2010. It marks the first time the Tigers have won at least three consecutive games here since also winning three straight from September 5, 1999 until April 3, 2000. The club last posted a longer streak with four consecutive wins from September 14, 1997 until May 7, 1998.

RABURN ROLLING ALONG: Ryan Raburn doubled and collected a RBI last night at Oakland and has now collected at least one extra-base hit in six of his 11 games this season. He is tied for fourth in the American League with five doubles and tied for eighth with six extra-base hits this season.

CABRERA'S OFFENSE AGAINST OAKLAND: Since joining the Tigers in 2008, Miguel Cabrera is batting .348 (32x92) with 20 runs scored, seven doubles, nine home runs and 26 RBI in 25 games against Oakland. He leads all American League players during that span with a .717 slugging percentage against the Athletics, while he is tied for second with nine home runs, third with a .445 on-base percentage and fifth with a .348 batting average.

QUANTITY OF QUALITY: Phil Coke recorded a quality start last night at Oakland and Tigers starting pitchers have posted a quality start in six of the last seven games. Tigers starting pitchers have posted a 2.91 ERA (46.1IP/15ER) during that stretch.

MIGGY MASHES AGAINST THE WEST: Miguel Cabrera is batting .350 (158x451) with 41 doubles, a triple, 27 home runs and 109 RBI in 118 games against teams from the American League West. Among active players with at least 200 plate appearances against teams from the division, Cabrera is tops with a .350 batting average and a .625 slugging percentage, while ranking second with a .420 on-base percentage.

DOUBLE TIME: The Tigers collected one double last night at Oakland and the club has now collected at least one double in each of the team's first 13 games. It is the longest such streak by a Tigers club to open a season since the team also doubled in each of the club's first 13 games of the 1993 season. The Tigers doubled in each of the first 14 games to start the 1970 season.

PERRY TO BEGIN REHAB ASSIGNMENT WITH TOLEDO TONIGHT: Righthanded pitcher Ryan Perry is scheduled to begin an injury rehabilitation assignment with Toledo tonight. Perry has been sidelined since April 5 with an infected eye.

TIGERS WEAR #42 IN HONOR OF JACKIE ROBINSON: Major League Baseball is commemorating the eighth annual Jackie Robinson Day today with the launch of the new 'IAM42.com' online campaign, multiple events, and all on-field personnel wearing number 42. Today is the 64th anniversary of Jackie Robinson's debut with the Brooklyn Dodgers.

PORCELLO'S PROGNOSIS: In his third season with the Tigers, Porcello will make his third start of the 2011 season tonight at Oakland.

GETTING THE GROUND BALL: Porcello has posted a 1.90 ground ball/fly ball ratio (617 ground balls/324 fly balls) for the Tigers during his major league career. Since the start of the 2009 season, he is fifth among all American League pitchers with a 1.90 ground ball/fly ball ratio.

RECORD IN OAKLAND: Porcello is making his third career start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening. He has posted a 0-2 record and 9.31 ERA (9.2IP/10ER) in his previous two starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS IN 2010: Porcello tied for sixth in the American League with 2.1 walks per nine innings during the 2010 season.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES IN 2010: Porcello finished 6-5 with a 4.00 ERA (92.1IP/41ER) in 14 starts for the Tigers following the all-star break in 2010. In 13 starts prior to the all-star break last season, he compiled a 4-7 record and 6.14 ERA (70.1IP/48ER).

BACK-TO-BACK DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN SEASONS: Porcello finished third on Detroit's staff as he registered 10 wins for the Tigers during the 2010 season. It marked the second straight season he posted a double-digit win total for the club after he led all American League rookies with 14 wins for the Tigers in 2009.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Porcello was selected by the Tigers in the first round (27th overall) of the June 2007 draft.
