ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won five of their last nine games since opening the season 1-4...are 4-0 in the last game of a series and 2-8 in all other games, including 1-4 in the first game of a series...however, their last six losses have been decided by a combined 12 runs...have spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, eight days in third place, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...the A's compiled a 3,555-3,280 (.520) record over the previous 43 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...the A's went 81-81 last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...this is the Athletics franchise's 111th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

AT HOME: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (0-2) and Boston (two games)...are now 1-4 at home and 5-4 on the road following their nine-game, three-city road trip to Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (2-1), which concluded Sunday...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 4-1 in day games and 2-7 at night...last year, they went 35-21 (.625) during day games and 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the third best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in their past four games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 16 errors total are **the most in the Major Leagues**...last season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

EXTRA INNINGS: Four of Oakland's last five games have been 10-inning affairs, with the A's winning two of those extra-inning games...the A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago from April 11-13...**the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland**...they also played three straight extra-inning games at home against the White Sox earlier that year (April 21-23), the first three games of a four-game series...the last time the A's had played three consecutive extra-inning games was June 1-3, 2004 at home...the first two games were also against the White Sox, the third against Toronto...are now 2-3 in extra-inning games this season after going 4-7 in such games last season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 4-2 record and have posted a 2.37 ERA (24 er in 91.0 ip) this season...**the innings pitched are the most by starting pitchers in the Major Leagues and the ERA ranks second best** (Texas, 2.32)...have allowed only four home runs this season, which is **fewest in the majors**...also rank second in the American League and tied for fifth in the Major Leagues with 69 strikeouts.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.96 ERA (42 er in 127.2 ip), which **ranks third in AL and fourth in the majors**...also rank fifth in opponents batting average (.234) and have recorded 104 strikeouts, which is tied for second most in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (113 for 478) this season, which is the sixth lowest average in the American League...are 25 for 119 (.210) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL...their seven home runs are tied for second fewest in the AL, but their 28 doubles are third most.

LOCKED UP: The A's announced Monday that they have agreed to terms with All-Star pitcher Trevor Cahill on a new five-year contract through 2015 with club options for both 2016 and 2017...Oakland now has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's current roster features three players under the age of 25 with Cahill, Anderson and Ross all 23...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales) and now have four with the April 6 addition of Wuertz (left hamstring strain) retroactive to April 2...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 91 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (103)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

A's vs. TIGERS

The A's, who have dropped the first two game of this series, were shut out 3-0 by the Tigers Thursday...it was the first time they have been shut out by Detroit since Aug. 23, 1993, a 9-0 loss at Tiger Stadium (Mike Moore one-hitter)...that was a span of 152 consecutive games without being shutout, which was **the longest in Oakland history** against one team...the A's have lost the season series only twice in the previous 10 seasons and are 51-31 (.622) against the Tigers over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 231-225 against the Tigers...that includes 128-99 in Oakland, 101-124 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 25-18 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 899-978 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp a .320 (95 for 297) career hitter against the Tigers, his highest average against any American League...is 5 for 32 (.156) in eight games since opening this season on a five-game hitting streak (7 for 21, .333)

David DeJesus has a 252-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Brian Fuentes has recorded five saves this season, which is **tied for second most in the Major Leagues**...now has 188 saves since 2005, which are the most by a left-handed reliever in the majors over that span.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1969**, Sal Bando hits the first Grand Slam in Oakland history in the A's 6-1 win over California at the Coliseum ... in **1984**, Dave Kingman becomes the second player in Oakland A's history to homer three times in one game in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle...he has a grand slam in the first, and two-run shots in the third and fifth and drives in eight runs.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...the A's were 13-17 (.433) in his starting assignments last year and are 34-44 (.436) in his 78 career starts...tossed six or more innings in 22 of his 30 starts in 2010, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 27 times.

FIRST START: Took the loss in an A's 5-3 defeat at Toronto April 6...allowed five runs on 10 hits in seven innings, walking one and striking out three...gave up one run in the first when Lind doubled in Escobar before throwing scoreless second and third innings...however, then allowed a three-run home run to Snider in the fourth to hand the Blue Jays a 4-2 lead...exited the game in the eighth inning after allowing a single to McDonald and double to Lind after throwing 89 pitches...Ziegler entered and allowed a RBI single to Hill, scoring McDonald to charge Braden with his fifth run.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win in Chicago Monday...held the White Sox scoreless through the first four innings before allowing his only run in the fifth inning when Lillibridge hit a two-out home run...gave up five hits, walked two and had seven strikeouts in six innings before he was replaced by Ross to start the seventh...Ross then pitched three scoreless innings, Suzuki hit the go-ahead home run in the 10th, and Fuentes threw a scoreless inning for his fourth save.

BRADEN vs. DETROIT: Is 2-4 with a 6.75 ERA (42.2 ip, 56 h, 32 r, 32 er, 11 bb, 24 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts...is 1-1 with a 4.30 ERA (11 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-3 with a 9.61 ERA (21 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts in Detroit...was 0-2 with a 5.25 ERA (7 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts last year...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-2 loss at Detroit May 30 when he allowed a career high tying 11 hits in 6.0 innings...allowed single runs in each of the first four innings on an Ordonez RBI single, a Laird RBI single, a Cabrera RBI double and an Inge solo home run...allowed a leadoff home run to Guillen in the sixth...also took the loss in a 5-1 decision in Oakland on May 19...shutout the Tigers on four hits over the first six innings before allowing a leadoff home run to Inge in the seventh...Laird followed with a single and Braden was removed from the game with the flu-like symptoms that he had in the days leading up to the start...left trailing 1-0 as Verlander tossed a complete game four-hitter, allowing the A's only run in the eighth inning.

THIS SPRING: Was 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA (22.1 ip, 34 h, 18 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in six games, all starts...also started in a minor league game March 25...allowed a .337 (34 for 101) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 22.1 innings...went 0-3 with a 10.13 ERA over his first four starts but then had no decisions and a 0.77 ERA over his final two starts.

2010 RECAP: Had one of the most memorable performances in Oakland history with his Mother's Day Perfect Game yet finished the season with an 11-14 record despite a 3.50 ERA...the ERA was sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with a losing record and was the lowest since 1978 when Matt Keough went 8-15 with a 3.24 ERA and Rick Langford posted a 7-13 mark and a 3.43 ERA...the last Major Leaguer with an ERA of 3.50 or lower and a winning percentage of .440 or worse was Omar Daal, who was 8-12 with a 2.88 ERA for Arizona in 1998...had career bests in nearly every category, including ERA, opponents batting (.249), opponents on-base percentage and opponents slugging (.373)...is now 19-24 with a 3.68 ERA (140 er in 342.1 ip) since the start of 2009, with his ERA 11th lowest among AL pitchers with 300 or more innings over that span.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranked fifth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.01) and had the eighth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.294)...also tied for the league lead in shutouts (2) and ranked fourth in complete games (5)...tied for fifth in the AL in losses (14), becoming just the second A's pitcher over the last 12 years to lose at least 14 games (Greg Smith, 16 in 2008)...averaged 14.8 pitches per inning, which was third fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: Tied for second in the American League in pickoffs (8)...now has 19 career pickoffs...since 2007, only Mark Buehrle (31) and Andy Pettitte (23) have more pickoffs...opponents were successful in just 1 of 3 (33.3%) stolen base attempts, which tied for the lowest percentage in the AL...has yielded just one stolen base since the start of 2009, while opponents are 4 for 12 (33.3%) off him in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Had the fourth-lowest run support in the American League in 2010 (3.60)...received run support of two runs or fewer in 17 of his 30 starts...had 17 runs of support in his 14 losses (83.1 ip, 1.84 RSA) and now has 39 runs of support in his 36 career losses (197.0 ip, 1.78 RSA)...is 2-32 in 46 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, compared to 22-4 in 32 starts with run support of three or more...has career run support of 3.58 (184 rs in 463.0 ip) as a starter.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents hit .249, including .242 by right-handed hitters and .271 by left-handers...entered the season with a .295 mark against righties and .236 against lefties...yielded a .239 mark with runners in scoring position after entering the season with a .315 career mark with RISP.

DAYS REST: Was 6-11 with a 4.15 ERA in 18 starts on four days rest and 5-3 with a 2.55 ERA in 12 starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Yielded 48 of his 83 runs in the fifth through seventh innings...had a 2.18 ERA over the first four innings of a game and 5.70 from the fifth inning on

BRADEN AND POWELL: Made 10 starts with Landon Powell as his catcher, a pairing that produced a 4-6 record with four complete games, two shutouts and a 2.75 ERA (22 er in 72.0 ip) in those starts, including the perfect game...was 7-8 with a 3.95 ERA (53 er in 120.2 ip) in his other 20 starts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Was part of four double plays on defense, which tied for second among AL pitchers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (1-0, 3.12): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season ...posted an 18-8 record in 30 starts with a team-leading 2.97 ERA...his wins were the most by an Athletic over the last eight years...all of his wins came after May 1 and he had the most wins in Oakland history by a pitcher who did not win a game in April...the last Athletics pitcher to win as many as 18 games without winning one in April was Bobby Shantz, who had 18 for the Philadelphia A's in 1951...matched Jon Lester (BOS) and CC Sabathia (NYY) for most wins in the majors beginning May 1...went 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA over his first four starts, 13-3 with a 2.10 ERA over a 19-start stretch from May 21 to Aug. 25 and 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA over his last seven starts...ranked third in the American League in opponents batting average (.220), fourth in ERA (2.97) and opponents on-base percentage (.287), tied for fourth in wins (18), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.692) and sixth in opponents slugging (.332)... had a no decision in his last start, an A's 6-5 loss at Chicago Tuesday...surrendered all four of his runs in the second inning (4.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) ...is 1-1 with a 5.74 ERA (15.2 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 7 so) in three career starts vs. Detroit...is 1-1 with a 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in two starts in Detroit and 0-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Oakland ... the win came on May 31 of last year.

Despite being buffeted for eight runs (five earned) on four hits in 3.1 innings last night, the A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of its last 11 games and has a 3.68 ERA (12 er in 29.1 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...**has been charged with six of the team's eight losses, which are the most losses by relievers in the majors...**compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199).

- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Earned his first win as an Athletic Wednesday after pitching a scoreless ninth inning.
- Has not allowed a run in five of his six appearances this season...allowed two runs without recording an out April 5 and has a 3.38 ERA (2 er in 5.1 ip) overall this year.
- Did not allow a run in two appearances against Detroit last season (1.1 ip) and is 3-2 with three blown saves and a 2.90 ERA in 21 career outings (21.2 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 32 so)...the 32 strikeouts are his most against any team.
- Begins his eighth season in the majors but is on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Was 1-0 with a 6.97 ERA in 11 spring training appearances...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow an earned run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting a 12.00 ERA over his first six contests.
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
