REMEMBERING SPARKY

The Tigers are wearing a patch on their right sleeves this season in the shape of a home plate emblazoned with the name SPARKY, to honor Hall of Fame manager Sparky Anderson who passed away on November 4, 2010. The club is scheduled to retire Anderson's number 11 in a pre-game ceremony on Sunday, June 26, 2011.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers scored seven runs in the 10th inning to defeat the Athletics 8-4 last night at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum. Brennan Boesch led the Tigers offense with three hits, including a double, and two RBI, while both Alex Avila and Victor Martinez finished with two hits and a RBI. The Tigers continue a seven-game road trip this evening with the third game of a four-game series at Oakland. The club concludes the west coast trip with three games at Seattle beginning Monday evening.

LEYLAND RECORDS HIS 1,500TH CAREER VICTORY: Last night's win over Oakland was the 1,500th victory of Jim Leyland's managerial career. He became the 19th manager in major league history to reach 1,500 victories. His 1,500 victories rank second among all active major league managers, trailing the 2,645 wins by Tony La Russa.

LOTS OF RUNS IN EXTRA INNINGS: The Tigers scored a season-high seven runs in the 10th inning last night at Oakland. The seven-run 10th inning marked the most runs the Tigers have scored in an extra inning since scoring seven runs in the 14th inning of a 15-9 victory at Milwaukee on May 27, 1991. (Source: ESPN Stats & Information)

LIMITING THE LONGBALL: Tigers pitchers have not allowed a home run in each of the last eight games. The eight-game streak is the longest single-season streak by Tigers pitchers since not allowing a home run in eight consecutive games from June 3-11, 1981. The Tigers did not allow a home run in nine consecutive games from April 10-23, 1976.

FOUR STRAIGHT WINS IN OAKLAND: Last night's victory was the Tigers fourth consecutive win at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum dating back to May 19, 2010. It marks the first time the Tigers have won at least four consecutive games here since also winning four straight from September 14, 1997 until May 7, 1998. The Tigers have never won more than four consecutive games at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum.

VICTOR LOCKED IN AGAINST LEFTIES: Since the start of the 2009 season, Victor Martinez is batting .328 (111x343) with 22 doubles, a triple, 22 home runs and 74 RBI against lefthanded pitchers. He is second in the American League with 22 home runs and 74 RBI during that time, while he is fourth with a .586 slugging percentage and 45 extra-base hits and sixth with a .324 batting average.

LOOKING FOR A FIVE-GAME STREAK: The Tigers enter tonight's game at Oakland with four consecutive wins. With one more victory, the Tigers would post the club's first winning streak of five-or-more games in April since winning five straight from April 19-23, 2006.

MIGGY'S LATE-GAME LONGBALLS: Miguel Cabrera drilled a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning last night at Oakland, his fifth home run of the season and second in the seventh inning-or-later. Cabrera has hit 15 home runs in the seventh inning-or-later over the last two seasons, tied for third-most among major league players.

CABRERA'S OFFENSE AGAINST OAKLAND: Since joining the Tigers in 2008, Miguel Cabrera is batting .344 (33x96) with 21 runs scored, seven doubles, 10 home runs and 27 RBI in 26 games against Oakland. He leads all American League players during that span with a .729 slugging percentage against the Athletics, while he is tied for the lead with 10 home runs, third with a .443 on-base percentage and fifth with a .344 batting average.

QUANTITY OF QUALITY: Rick Porcello recorded a quality start last night at Oakland and Tigers starting pitchers have posted a quality start in seven of the last eight games. Tigers starting pitchers have posted a 2.75 ERA (52.1IP/16ER) during that stretch.

MIGGY MASHES AGAINST THE WEST: Miguel Cabrera is batting .349 (159x455) with 41 doubles, a triple, 28 home runs and 110 RBI in 119 games against teams from the American League West. Among active players with at least 200 plate appearances against teams from the division, Cabrera is tops with a .349 batting average and a .629 slugging percentage, while ranking second with a .420 on-base percentage.

DOUBLE TIME: The Tigers collected two doubles last night at Oakland and the club has now collected at least one double in each of the team's first 14 games. It is the longest such streak by a Tigers club to open a season since the team also doubled in each of the club's first 14 games of the 1970 season. No Tigers team has doubled in more than 14 consecutive games to start the season since at least 1919.

WALK THIS WAY: Tigers hitters collected four walks last night at Oakland, two of them intentional, and rank second among all American League clubs with 52 walks this season. The Tigers are also tied for second with four intentional walks.

PERRY'S REHAB HAPPENINGS: Righthanded pitcher Ryan Perry began an injury rehabilitation assignment with Toledo last night, allowing two runs (one earned) on three hits in 1.1 innings against Columbus.

INJURY UPDATE: INF Carlos Guillen (left knee microfracture surgery, 15-day DL on March 30), **RHP Ryan Perry** (infected eye, 15-day DL on April 5), **RHP Joel Zumaya** (right elbow olecranon fracture surgery, 15-day DL on March 30).

TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

JUSTIN'S CASE: In his sixth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his fourth start of the season tonight at Oakland.

AMONG THE AL BEST SINCE 2006: Verlander enters his start tonight at Oakland tops among all American League pitchers with 84 wins and 166 games started since the start of the 2006 season, while he is second with 1,076.0 innings pitched and 979 strikeouts.

GREAT WHEN GOING EIGHT: Verlander went the distance in his last outing on Monday afternoon against Texas and has posted a 16-3 record and 1.96 ERA (183.1IP/40ER) in 22 outings of eight innings-or-longer since the beginning of the 2009 season. His 22 outings of eight innings-or-longer ranks third among American League pitchers during that stretch, trailing Felix Hernandez (27) and Cliff Lee (25).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Verlander tossed a complete game in his last outing on Monday afternoon against the Rangers, the Tigers first complete game of the season and his 10th since the start of the 2007 season. He joined Roy Halladay (35), Cliff Lee (19), CC Sabathia (18), Felix Hernandez (12), Matt Cain (10) and Zack Greinke (10) as the only major league pitchers with 10-or-more complete games during that span.

CRUISING TOWARDS A GRAND: Verlander enters his start tonight at Oakland with 986 strikeouts during his major league career. With 14 more strikeouts, he will become the 15th pitcher in Tigers history to compile 1,000 strikeouts.

SEEKING 100 WINS: Verlander enters his start tonight at Oakland with 84 wins during his major league career. With 16 more wins, he will become the 16th pitcher in Tigers history to register 100 wins.

A RARE COMBINATION: As Verlander approaches both 100 wins and 1,000 strikeouts during his career with the Tigers, he would become just the 13th pitcher in franchise history to reach those figures in both categories.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Verlander is making the seventh start of his career at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening. In his previous six outings, he is 2-3 with a 2.85 ERA (41.0IP/13ER).

GETTING THE CALL ON OPENING DAY FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT SEASON: Verlander made his fourth career Opening Day start on March 31 against the New York Yankees. He became the first Tigers pitcher to start four consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).

RACKING UP THE STRIKEOUTS ON OPENING DAY: Verlander started for the Tigers on Opening Day at New York's Yankee Stadium on March 31, fanning eight batters as he did not figure in the decision. His eight strikeouts marked the most by a Tigers pitcher on Opening Day since Hideo Nomo also fanned eight batters on April 3, 2000 at Oakland.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS IN 2010: Verlander tied for third in the American League with 224.1 innings pitched during the 2010 season, while he finished fourth with 219 strikeouts, tied for fourth with 18 wins, 33 games started and 8.8 strikeouts per nine innings, tied for fifth with four complete games, finished seventh with 10.71 baserunners per nine innings, eighth with 7.62 hits per nine innings, ninth with a .228 batting average against and 10th with 3.08 strikeouts per walk.

BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE STRIKEOUTS: Verlander fanned 219 batters for the Tigers during the 2010 season, marking the second time in his career he has recorded 200-or-more strikeouts in a single season. He led the American League with 269 strikeouts for the Tigers in 2009 and he became the first club pitcher with 200-or-more strikeouts in consecutive seasons since Jack Morris did so in 1986 and 1987.

FOUR STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS: Verlander tossed 224.1 innings during the 2010 season, marking the fourth consecutive season he has surpassed the 200.0-inning mark with the Tigers. His streak of four straight seasons with 200-or-more innings pitched became the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88) and Walt Terrell did so over the final four seasons of Morris' streak (1985-88).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad in 2007, 2009 and 2010. Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006.
