### REMEMBERING SPARKY

The Tigers are wearing a patch on their right sleeves this season in the shape of a home plate emblazoned with the name SPARKY, to honor Hall of Fame manager Sparky Anderson who passed away on November 4, 2010. The club is scheduled to retire Anderson's number 11 in a pre-game ceremony on Sunday, June 26, 2011.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers lost 6-2 to the Oakland Athletics last night, snapping the Tigers four-game winning streak. Justin Verlander (1-2) started for the Tigers and took the loss after allowing four runs (three earned) on eight hits in six innings of work. Victor Martinez led the Tigers offense with a pair of hits, including a double, while Miguel Cabrera also doubled and walked twice in the loss. The Tigers continue a seven-game road trip this afternoon with the final game of a four-game series at Oakland. The club concludes the west coast trip with three games at Seattle beginning tomorrow evening.

**LOOKING FOR THE SERIES WIN IN OAKLAND:** The Tigers head into today's game looking for a victory to secure the series win over Oakland. A win would mark the first time the Tigers have taken a four-game series in Oakland since winning three-of-four games September 12-15, 1997.

**LIMITING THE LONGBALL:** Tigers pitchers have not allowed a home run in each of the last nine games. The nine-game streak is the longest single-season streak by Tigers pitchers since not allowing a home run in nine consecutive games from April 10-23, 1976. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team since not allowing a home run in 17 consecutive games from April 28-May 19, 1947.

**BOESCH'S ROAD WORK:** Brennan Boesch walked twice last night at Oakland and has now reached base safely in seven of his eight games on the road this season. He is batting .393 (11x28) with nine runs scored, three doubles, a home run and seven RBI in eight games on the road. He leads the American League with nine runs scored on the road, while he is fifth with a .393 batting average and sixth with a .455 on-base percentage.

**CABRERA'S OFFENSE AGAINST OAKLAND:** Since joining the Tigers in 2008, Miguel Cabrera is batting .347 (34x98) with 22 runs scored, eight doubles, 10 home runs and 27 RBI in 27 games against Oakland. He leads all American League players during that span with a .735 slugging percentage against the Athletics, while he is tied for the lead with 10 home runs, second with a .454 on-base percentage and fifth with a .347 batting average.

**QUANTITY OF QUALITY:** Justin Verlander recorded a quality start last night at Oakland and Tigers starting pitchers have posted a quality start in each of the last six games and in eight of the last nine games dating back to April 8. Tigers starting pitchers have posted a 2.93 ERA (58.1IP/19ER) during that stretch.

**MIGGY MASHES AGAINST THE WEST:** Miguel Cabrera is batting .350 (160x457) with 42 doubles, a triple, 28 home runs and 110 RBI in 120 games against teams from the American League West. Among active players with at least 200 plate appearances against teams from the division, Cabrera is tops with a .350 batting average, .422 on-base percentage and a .630 slugging percentage.

**DOUBLE TIME:** The Tigers collected two doubles last night at Oakland and the club has now collected at least one double in each of the team's first 15 games. It is the longest such streak by a Tigers club to open a season since at least 1919. The Tigers are third in the American League with 31 doubles.

**CABRERA'S AWESOME IN APRIL:** Miguel Cabrera enters today's game at Oakland batting .328 (215x655) with 122 runs scored, 44 doubles, a triple, 42 home runs and 139 RBI in 175 games during his major league career in the month of April. He is third among all active major league players with a .328 batting average during the month, while he is fourth with a .591 slugging percentage and seventh with a .411 on-base percentage.

**WALK THIS WAY:** Tigers hitters collected six walks last night at Oakland and rank third among all American League clubs with 58 walks this season. The Tigers are also tied for second with four intentional walks.

**CABRERA AMONG AL BEST SINCE 2008:** Miguel Cabrera is hitting .315 (575x1827) with 114 home runs and 367 RBI in 485 games with the Tigers since 2008. He is tops among all American League players with 114 home runs, 367 RBI and a .570 slugging percentage since the start of the 2008 season, while he is fourth with a .315 batting average and a .390 on-base percentage and seventh with 119 doubles.

**HAPPY 30TH BIRTHDAY RYAN RABURN:** Tigers outfielder Ryan Raburn is celebrating his 30th birthday today.

**PERRY'S REHAB HAPPENINGS:** Righthanded pitcher Ryan Perry began an injury rehabilitation assignment with Toledo Friday night, allowing two runs (one earned) on three hits in 1.1 innings against Columbus.

**INJURY UPDATE: INF Carlos Guillen** (left knee microfracture surgery, 15-day DL on March 30), **RHP Ryan Perry** (infected eye, 15-day DL on April 5), **RHP Joel Zumaya** (right elbow olecranon fracture surgery, 15-day DL on March 30).

**THE BOOK ON BRAD:** In his first season with the Tigers, Penny will make his fourth start of the season this afternoon at Oakland.

**BACK IN ACTION:** Penny opens the season in Detroit's starting rotation after he was sidelined for the remainder of the 2010 season with St. Louis on May 22 with a latissimus dorsi muscle injury.

**HEADING TOWARDS 300 STARTS:** Penny is making the 288th start of his major league career this afternoon at Oakland.

**ROUGHER ON THE ROAD:** Penny has compiled a 47-56 record and 4.62 ERA (839.2IP/431ER) on the road during his major league career. He has posted a 61-33 record and 3.70 ERA (866.0IP/356ER) in 146 outings at home during his major league career.

**STARTING IN A LOT OF DIFFERENT PARKS:** Penny is taking the hill today in his first career start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum, marking the 38th different ballpark in which he has started a game during his career. He is tied for third among active pitchers with games started in 38 different parks, trailing Javier Vazquez (44) and Livan Hernandez (43). (Source: STATS, LLC)

**RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM:** Penny is making his first career start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this afternoon.

**MR. APRIL:** Penny is making the 55th start of his major league career during the month of April this afternoon at Oakland. In his previous 54 starts during the month, he has compiled a 25-9 record and 3.70 ERA (336.0IP/138ER). Penny is tied for third among all active major league pitchers with 25 wins during the month, while he is sixth with a 3.70 ERA.

**LOOKING FOR THE GROUND BALL:** In his nine starts with St. Louis during the 2010 season, Penny posted a 1.98 ground ball/fly ball ratio (95 ground balls/48 fly balls). He has posted a 1.35 ground ball/fly ball ratio (2,460 ground balls/1,818 fly balls) during his major league career.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Penny was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on January 19, 2011. He was selected to the National League's all-star squad in both 2006 and 2007.
