A's vs. RED SOX

The A's went 5-4 against the Red Sox last season, winning the season series for the first time since going 7-3 in 2006...are now 25-22 (.532) against the Red Sox since 2006, which is the best record by any American League team over that span...have swept just three series from Boston over the last 18 years (all in Oakland), most recently May 23-25, 2008...have won 16 of the last 22 games in the Coliseum but have lost 12 of the last 16 at Fenway...are 217-268 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 128-113 in Oakland, 8-154 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 859-1049 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 254-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Brian Fuentes has recorded five saves this season, which is tied for third most in the Major Leagues.

Kurt Suzuki was 10 for 34 (.294) against Boston last season and is a .331 (39 for 118) career hitter against the team, which is his second highest average against any team (New York-AL, .352).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1981, the A's defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-1 in the first game of a double header at the Coliseum to run their record to 11-0, a Major League record at the time...the Mariners won the second game of the twinbill to end the A's streak but Oakland won the next six to improve to 17-1...in 1986, Jose Rijo strikes out an Oakland record 16 batters in the A's 7-2 win at Seattle...Bill Mooneyham adds two in an inning of relief for a club record 18 for a nine inning game.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won seven of their last 11 games since opening the season 1-4...are 5-0 in the last game of a series and 3-8 in all other games, including 1-4 in the first game of a series...have had their last six losses have been decided by a combined 12 runs...with a win tonight, the A's would move over. 500 for the first time this season...the last time the A's were over .500 was September 24 of last season (77-76)...they then went 4-5 over their final nine games to finish 81-81, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record ...have spent each of the last seven days in third place and 11 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have not allowed a run in four of the first 16 games this season and have allowed three earned runs or less 13 times this year...have combined for a 6-2 record and have posted a 2.16 ERA (25 er in 104.0 ip) this season...the ERA and innings pitched **both rank first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers...have allowed only five home runs this season, which is **tied for the fewest in the majors**...also rank second in the American League and tied for sixth in the majors with 83 strikeouts.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.59 ERA (42 er in 145.2 ip), which is the **best in the Majors Leagues**...also rank fourth in opponents batting average (.226) and have recorded 120 strikeouts, which is the fourth most in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (127 for 538) this season, which is the fifth lowest average in the American League...are batting .211 (30 for 142) with runners in scoring position, which is the third lowest average in the AL...their seven home runs are the second fewest in the AL, but their 36 doubles are the most in the league.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in their past six games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 18 errors total are **the most in the Major Leagues**...last season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (two games)...are now 3-4 at home and 5-4 on the road following their nine-game, three-city road trip to Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (2-1)...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 5-1 in day games and 3-7 at night...have a 1.67 ERA (10 er in 54.0 ip) during the day, which is **tied for the lowest in the major leagues** (Philadelphia), and a 3.14 ERA (32 er in 91.2 ip) in night games...last year, they went 35-21 (.625) during day games and 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the third best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's are 2-3 in extra-inning games this season after going 4-7 in such games last season...the A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago from April 11-13...the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.96 years, which is nearly two years older than last year (27.16)...the A's current roster features three players under the age of 25 with Cahill, Anderson and Ross, all 23...there are 11 players that are at least 30 years old.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's now have five players on the disabled list after placing Braden (stiff left shoulder) on the 15-day DL Monday retroactive to Sunday...placed Wuertz (left hamstring strain) on the 15-day DL April 6 retroactive to April 2...began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...Harden was then transferred on the 60-day DL April 18...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (103)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...the A's (.421) in 8-11 were his starting assignments last year and are 23-29 (.442) in his career...tossed six or more innings in 14 of his 19 starts in 2010,

allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 18 times.

DON'T WALK: Has allowed only two walks through his first three starts, which is tied for the third fewest walks allowed in the American League and 10th fewest in the majors among starting pitchers...has walked one batter or fewer in each of those three starts and has now walked one or less in 32 of his 52 career starts, including 11 starts in which he has not walked a batter

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has allowed five earned runs in 19.2 innings through his first three starts for a 2.29 ERA, which is the eighth lowest in the American League among starting pitchers...is now 15-11 with a 2.83 ERA (75 er in 238.1 ip) in 39 starts since June 29, 2009, which is the eighth lowest ERA in the Major Leagues over that span (minimum 162.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .286 (22 for 77) against him this year, which includes .255 (12 for 47) by right-handed hitters and .333 (10 for 30) against left-handers...righties were .243 (80 for 329) and left-handers were .299 (32 for 107) last season and his career splits are now .246 (215 for 873) and .310 (99 for 319) against righties and lefties, respectively...allowed all six of his home runs to righties last year...five came at home, five were hit in night games and five were with the bases empty...his opponents batting average dropped to .225 with runners in scoring position after yielding a .314 average with RISP in 2009...however, the opposition hit .315 when leading off an inning.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 1-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a two out single to Bradley, who stole second and scored on a Cust single...was relieved by Breslow to start the seventh inning after throwing 108 pitches...left with the scored tied at 1-1.

SECOND START: Took the loss despite pitching a complete game in a 2-1 defeat at Minnesota April 8...it was his second career complete game, his first since a two-hit shutout in Boston on July 6, 2009...allowed a base hit to Morneau in the first inning and then retired 14 consecutive batters...pitched seven shutout innings before allowing two runs in the eighth when Span and Mauer had back-to-back RBI singles...he threw 75 of his 109 pitches for strikes.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win in Chicago last Wednesday...allowed three runs, two earned, on nine hits in 5.2 innings...held the White Sox scoreless over the first four innings...made a fielding error in the fifth to allow Pierre to reach base, who then scored on a double by Beckham...then allowed two more runs in the sixth...Castro drove in the first run after reaching on a fielder's choice and then a Morel sacrifice bunt brought in the second run...was replaced by Breslow following a Pierre single, who then stranded both runners by getting Beckham to pop out to short.

ANDERSON vs. BOSTON: Is 3-1 with a 2.61 ERA (31.0 ip, 24 h, 9 r, 9 er, 11 bb, 28 so, 3 h) in five career starts...is 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts at Fenway Park...earned the win in his last start in the A's 4-3 victory over Boston on September 11 of last year...allowed a solo home run to Scutaro in the third inning and a RBI single to Kalish in the sixth to give the Red Sox a 2-0 lead...the A's then scored three times in the seventh for the win...left after seven innings with a 3-2 lead...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 win at Boston on June 3...tossed just 2.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the first and Hall scored on a Scutaro ground out in the second...left the game early with left elbow soreness and returned to the DL the next day...went 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA in three starts in 2009...including a complete game two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Boston on July 6...it was the fifth shutout by an Oakland pitcher at Fenway Park, the first since Bobby Witt (July 3, 1994)...according to Elias, he was the first rookie to shutout Boston at Fenway since California's Jim Abbott on August 30, 1989.

THIS SPRING: Was 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA (27.0 ip, 25 h, 16 r, 15 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 6 hr) in six games, including five starts...ranked third in the Cactus League in strikeouts (25), sixth in innings pitched (27.0) and tied for eighth in wins (2)...pitched in relief of Gio Gonzalez in his first outing March 1 and then started in each of his final five games...allowed a .238 105) batting for opponents average...struck out 25 and walked just six for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.2.

2010 RECAP: Lowered his ERA by more than a run from his rookie campaign of 2009 but two stints on the disabled list with elbow problems limited him to just 19 starts...was 7-6 with a 2.80 ERA after going 11-11 with a 4.06 ERA in his first season...tied for eighth in the American League with four pickoffs and now has nine in three seasons.

QUALIFICATIONS: Tossed 112.1 innings and did not qualify for the league leaders...however, based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranked fifth in the American League in ERA...also ranked fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.48), fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.76) and lowest run support (3.53), eighth in strikeout to walk ratio (3.41) and ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.353)

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of one run or fewer in eight of his 19 starts and was 0-5 in those games...had a 7-1 record in his 11 starts with support of two runs or more...is now 0-15 in 23 career starts with zero or one run of support and 18-3 in 29 starts with at least two runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (2-0, 0.47 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has not allowed a run over his past 17.0 innings, which is the longest active scoreless inning streak in the Major Leagues...it is the second longest scoreless innings streak in the majors this season overall (Haren, 18.2 ip)...has a 0.47 ERA (1 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts this season, which is the best ERA in the majors among starting pitchers...had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers Thursday...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning...is 1-0 with a 5.51 ERA (16.1 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against the Red Sox

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 5/8 (62.5%)
The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of its last 13 games and has a 2.88 ERA (11 er in 34.1 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...has been charged with six of the team's eight losses, which are the most losses by relievers in the majors...compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has not allowed a run in five of his seven appearances this season (3 er in 6.1 ip, 4.26 ERA).
- Is 2-0 and has converted his two career save opportunities against the Red Sox but has a 5.34 ERA against the team (32.0 ip, 31 h, 19 r, 19 er, 20 bb, 28 so)...the 20 walks are his most against any team.
- Begins his eighth season in the majors but is on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Was 1-0 with a 6.97 ERA in 11 spring training appearances...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow an earned run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting a 12.00 ERA over his first six contests.
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his six games this season, including four scoreless appearances (2 er in 7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA).
- Had a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in five appearances against Boston last season...however, has a 13.50 ERA against the team in eight career outings (5.1 ip, 11 h, 9 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 6 so).
- Begins his fifth Major League season, all with Oakland, and is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Had no decisions and a 7.30 ERA in a team-leading 12 appearances this spring...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in games pitched...did not allow a run over his last five outings (4.1 ip) after posting an 11.25 ERA over his first seven contests.
- The 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but the first where he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings after yielding five in 64.2 innings over his first three years.
