A's vs. RED SOX

The A's lead the season series 1-0 after last night's 5-0 win...went 5-4 against the Red Sox last season, winning the season series for the first time since going 7-3 in 2006...are now 26-22 (.542) against the Red Sox since 2006, which is the **best record by any American League team over that span**...have swept just three series from Boston over the last 18 years (all in Oakland), most recently May 23-25, 2008...have won 17 of the last 23 games in the Coliseum but have lost 12 of the last 16 at Fenway...are 218-268 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 129-113 in Oakland, 88-154 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 860-1049 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 255-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

Mark Ellis has recorded 199 career doubles, leaving him one away from the 200th of his career and two away from tying Carney Lansford for eighth most in Oakland history.

Kurt Suzuki is a .328 (40 for 122) career hitter against the Boston, which is his second highest average against any team (New York-AL, .352).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1969**, Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in **1971**, Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in **1982**, Dan Meyer's twoout RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won eight of their last 12 games since opening the season 1-4...at 9-8, are now over .500 for the first time this season...it is their first time over .500 since September 24 of last season (77-76)...they then went 4-5 over their final nine games to finish 81-81, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing record...are 5-0 in the last game of a series and 4-8 in all other games, including 2-4 in the first game of a series...have had their last six losses decided by a combined 12 runs...have spent each of the last eight days in third place and 12 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships...

STARTING PITCHING: A's starters have combined for a 0.27 ERA (1 er in 33.2 ip) over their past five games and are now 7-2 with a 2.01 ERA (25 er in 112.0 ip) this season...the ERA and innings pitched **both rank first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers, with the ERA being nearly a full run better than Milwaukee, which ranks second at 2.99 (34 er in 102.1 ip)...have not allowed a run in five of their 17 games this season and have allowed three earned runs or less 14 times this year...have allowed only five home runs this season, which is **the fewest in the majors**...also rank second in the majors with 91 strikeouts.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.44 ERA (42 er in 154.2 ip), which is the **best in the Majors Leagues**...also rank third in opponents batting average (.223) and have recorded 128 strikeouts, which is the third most in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (135 for 571) this season, which is the sixth lowest average in the American League...are batting .217 (33 for 152) with runners in scoring position, the third lowest average in the AL...their seven home runs are the second fewest in the AL, but their 39 doubles are the most in the league.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in their past seven games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 19 errors total are **the most in the Major Leagues**...last season, the A's defense ranked fifth in the AL in fielding percentage (.984) and were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (1-0)...are now 4-4 at home and 5-4 on the road following their nine-game, three-city road trip to Toronto (1-2), Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-AL (2-1)...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 5-1 in day games and 4-7 at night...have a 1.67 ERA (10 er in 54.0 ip) during the day, which is **tied for the lowest in the major leagues** (Philadelphia), and a 2.86 ERA (32 er in 100.2 ip) in night games...last year, they went 35-21 (.625) during day games and 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the third best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

EXTRA INNINGS: The A's are 2-3 in extra-inning games this season after going 4-7 in such games last season...the A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago from April 11-13...**the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland**.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's used their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington) for the fifth time this season last night, which is the only lineup they have used more than one time this year...have now used a different starting lineup in each of their past nine games.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy), which are the most free agents to make the A's Opening Day roster since the 1999 club also had five...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's now have five players on the disabled list after placing Braden (stiff left shoulder) on the 15-day DL Monday retroactive to Sunday...placed Wuertz (left hamstring strain) on the 15-day DL April 6 retroactive to April 2...began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...Harden was then transferred on the 60-day DL April 18...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (103)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

fewer 19 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times...did not allow a run in eight starts...since 1975. the only other A's pitcher with eight starts in a season without allowing a run is Mike Moore in 1989.

SCORELESS STREAK: Has not allowed a run over his past 17.0 innings, which is the longest active scoreless inning streak in the Major Leagues...it is the second longest scoreless innings streak in the majors this season overall (Haren, 18.2 ip)...has not allowed a run since surrendering a home run to Langerhans in the second inning of his first start of the season April 3 against Seattle, the only run he has allowed this season.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has a 0.47 ERA (1 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts this season, which is the best ERA in the majors among starting pitchers...last year, he finished eighth in the American League with a 3.23 ERA (72 er in 200.2 ip)...now has a 2.99 ERA (73 er in 219.2 ip) over the past two seasons, which is the sixth lowest ERA in the American League over that span (minimum 163.0 ip).

TWO WINS: Has earned the win in two of his three starts this season...the two wins are tied for ninth most in the American League...won 15 games last season, which tied for 10th most in the American League, in 33 starts...now has won 17 games over the past two seasons, which is tied for eighth most in the AL over that span...prior to 2010, had seven career wins in 30 games, 24 starts.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact...it was the A's first shutout of the season.

LAST START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers Thursday...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...Ross allowed one run in the seventh and two in the eighth as he went on to take the loss.

GONZALEZ vs. BOSTON: Is 1-0 with a 5.51 ERA (16.1 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...earned the win in his last start, a 6-4 A's victory July 21 of last year in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the first inning but retired the side in order in innings two through four...had a 3-1 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Lowrie in the fifth but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the fifth to make the score 6-2...allowed a two-run home run to Beltre in the sixth and was relieved by Rodriguez after six innings...took the loss at Fenway Park on June 1 of last year...tossed 108 pitches but pitched just 5.0 innings...took a 4-0 lead into the fifth inning and allowed a three-run home run to Beltre...was relieved by Ross to start the sixth and he walked the first two batters before Breslow came in and allowed both inherited runners to score for the blown save...also had a no decision in the A's 8-5 loss at Boston on July 30, 2009...allowed just one run over the first five innings, a RBI single by Varitek in the second inning...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-2 with a 2.30 ERA (27.1 ip, 16 h, 7 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in six games, all starts...his 29 strikeouts ranked second in the Cactus League and tied for the best total by an A's pitcher since spring training stats were first kept in 1992 (Rich Harden, 2005 and 2007)...also tied for second in the CL in ERA (2.30) and tied for third in innings pitched (27.1)...held the opposition to a .170 (16 for 94) batting average...did not allow more than two runs in any of his six starts.

2010 RECAP: Began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...was the only Athletic to spend the entire season in the starting rotation...entered the season with a 7-11 record and 6.24 ERA in 30 games, 24 starts, over his first two seasons.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for fourth in the American League in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15) last year...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL...also ranked 10th in the AL in pitches (3369).

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents average in 11 starts during the day, 8-8 with a 3.86 ERA and .249 opponents average in 22 starts at night last year...ranked second in the AL in day ERA, tied for third in wins and fourth in opponents average...is now 11-4 with a 3.55 ERA (50 er in 126.2 ip) in 21 career appearances during the day, compared to 13-16 with a 4.71 ERA (115 er in 219.2 ip) in 44 games at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of two runs or fewer in each of his nine losses last year and had just six total runs of support in those starts (45.2 ip, 1.18 RSA)...has 18 runs of support in his 20 career losses (94.0 ip, 1.72 RSA)...is 22-4 in 37 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-16 in 22 starts with support of one run or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-0, 2.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...had a no decision in the A's 8-4 loss Friday against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...it was his most strikeouts in a game since also recording seven strikeouts May 13, 2009 with Texas against Seattle...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss to Toronto on April 5...allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits over eight innings, walking one while striking out two...is 1-2 with a 6.67 ERA (28.1 ip, 36 h, 21 r, 21 er, 7 bb, 24 so, 8 hr) seven career appearances, five starts, against Seattle

 The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 10 of its last 14 games and has a 2.80 ERA (11 er in 35.1 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...has been charged with six of the team's eight losses, which are the most losses by relievers in the majors...compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the American League...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL...the 13 blown saves tied for the fewest in the AL, but the save opportunities were third fewest and the saves tied for fourth fewest...also ranked fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.248), fifth in on-base percentage (.325) and eighth in slugging percentage (.394)...held first batters faced to a .214 batting average, which was the third lowest mark in the AL...it was the lowest average by an A's team since 1989 (.199).
