### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have lost two straight games...but have won eight of their last 14 games since opening the season 1-4...are 2-5 in the first game of a series, 5-1 in the last game and 4-8 in all other games...have had their last eight losses decided by a combined 15 runs...have spent each of the last 10 days in third place and 14 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44<sup>th</sup> season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) championships...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starters have combined for a 1.13 ERA (6 er in 47.2 ip) over their past seven games and are now 7-4 with a 2.14 ERA (30 er in 126.0 ip) this season...the ERA ranks **first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers (LAA, 3.01)...also lead the majors in strikeouts (106) and innings pitched (126.0)...have not allowed a run in five of their 18 games this season and have allowed three earned runs or less 15 times...have allowed eight home runs this season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers have compiled a 2.52 ERA (48 er in 171.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...also rank third in the majors in opponents batting average (.224)...have recorded 146 strikeouts, which ranks second in the American League and tied for sixth in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .254 (51 for 201) over their past six games...are .237 (152 for 641) on the season and the average is the sixth lowest in the American League...their eight home runs are tied for the fewest in the majors, but their 41 doubles are the second most in the majors...are hitting .211 (36 for 171) with runners in scoring position, the third lowest average in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 11 errors in their past nine games after going six consecutive games without an error...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 20 errors total are the **most in the Major Leagues**... last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's dropped their third one-run game of the season last night, and are now 3-3 in one run games this year...10 of the A's 19 games this season have been decided by two runs or less, and the A's are 4-6 in those games...are 2-3 in extra-inning games...the A's and White Sox played extra innings in each game of their three-game series in Chicago from April 11-13...the last time the A's played extra innings in each game of a three-game series was June 17-19, 1988 against Texas in Oakland.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this seven game road trip through Seattle (0-1) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (1-1)...are 4-5 at home and 5-5 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** The A's are 5-2 in day games and 4-8 at night...the day record is tied for fourth best in the majors and the night record is tied for the fourth worst...have a 2.14 ERA (15 er in 63.0 ip) during the day, which ranks second lowest in the majors, and a 2.57 ERA (31 er in 108.2 ip) in night games...last year, they went 35-21 (.625) during day games and 46-60 (.434) at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

**STARTING LINEUPS:** The A's have used a different starting lineup in each of their past 11 games and have now used 14 different lineups this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used five times this season.

**LOCKED UP:** Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's now have five players on the disabled list after placing Braden (stiff left shoulder) on the 15-day DL Monday retroactive to Sunday...placed Wuertz (left hamstring strain) on the 15-day DL April 6 retroactive to April 2...began the season with three players on the disabled list (Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...Rosales was placed on the 60-day DL retroactive to March 22 with a fractured right foot...Bailey (strained right forearm) and Harden (strained right shoulder) were placed on the 15-day DL retroactive to March 22...Harden was then transferred on the 60-day DL April 18...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...have now used the DL 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (103)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season (one).

### A's vs. MARINERS

The A's drop to 1-3 against the Mariners this season...they won the season series last year 13-6, with the 13 wins equalling their second most ever against Seattle, trailing only the 17-2 mark in 2006...were 7-2 in Oakland and 6-4 in Seattle last year...each team has two season series wins over the previous four years and the A's are 34-45 (.430) against Seattle since 2007...that is the **lowest winning percentage** by any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 284-210 (.575) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by an AL team against the Mariners (Boston, .577)...are 159-90 in Oakland and 125-120 in Seattle.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Daric Barton** is a .325 (53 for 163) career hitter against the Mariners with four home runs and 25 RBI...the average and RBI are his best against any team.

**David DeJesus** has a 257-game errorless streak, which is the longest active streak among all Major League outfielders...his last error came on Sept. 15, 2008.

**Mark Ellis** has 200 career doubles, and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for eighth most in Oakland history.

**Brian Fuentes** has recorded five saves this season, which is tied for third most in the American League.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1969**, Rollie Fingers tosses the first of his two career shutouts, a five-hitter in the A's 7-0 win at Minnesota...in **1984** Dave Kingman homers twice but the A's lose to Dennis Eckersley at Boston, 12-8.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance of the season, his first start...the A's are 0-2 in his starting assignments in his career, with both starts coming last season...tossed two or more innings in 12 of his 29 career appearances.

**FIRST APPEARANCE:** Earned the win in his first appearance of the season, a 2-1 A's win in Chicago April 11...entered the game in relief of Braden to start the seventh inning and then pitched three shutout innings, allowing only one hit and one walk while striking out four...the four strikeouts matched his career high...was replaced by Fuentes to start the 10<sup>th</sup> inning, who pitching a scoreless inning for the save.

**SECOND APPEARANCE:** Took the loss in a 3-0 A's defeat April 14 against Detroit...relieved Gonzalez to start the seventh inning...allowed an RBI double to Raburn in the seventh and later walked Peralta and Boesch to start the eighth...was then replaced by Blevins who allowed both runs to score...the Boesch run, however, was unearned as he scored on a Willingham throwing error.

**THIRD APPEARANCE:** Had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win over Detroit April 17...entered the game in the ninth after Cahill allowed one run over eight innings...pitched one scoreless inning, allowing one hit and striking out two.

**ROSS vs. SEATTLE:** Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (2.1 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 0 hr) in one career appearance, which was his Major League debut...did not factor in the decision in a 6-5 A's win on April 7 of last season in Oakland...entered the game in relief of Duchscherer in the sixth inning with two outs and a runner on first...struck out Johnson to end the inning...held the Mariners to one hit over the next two innings before giving way to Ziegler to start the ninth inning.

**THIS SPRING:** Was 1-0 with a 0.59 ERA (15.1 ip, 14 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 10 so) in five appearances, two starts...allowed a .241 opponents batting average...surrendered his only run in his final appearance, where he earned the win after giving up four hits in 5.2 innings in a 15-7 victory over Arizona.

**2010 RECAP:** Made the Opening Day roster as a non-roster invitee and spent half of the season with Oakland...went 1-4 with a save and a 5.49 ERA in 26 games, including two starts, before he was optioned to Sacramento July 7...was 2-1 with a 3.55 ERA in six games, all starts, with the River Cats before he was shut down Aug. 10 with a strained right elbow...with the A's, he struck out 32 in 39.1 innings but also issued 20 walks (4.6 per nine innings)...had a 3.32 ERA over his first 11 appearances, a 7.52 ERA over his final 15 contests.

**THIS AND THAT:** Allowed a .271 opponents batting average, including .258 (17-for-66) against left-handed hitters and .282 (22-for-78) against right-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs and issued 14 of his 20 walks to right-handers...opponents batted .323 with runners in scoring position...compiled a 2.49 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in 13 appearances in Oakland compared to a 9.17 ERA and .328 opponents average in 13 games on the road...yielded three of his four home runs on the road...went 0-2 with a 7.04 ERA in his two starting assignments and 1-2 with a 5.12 ERA in 24 relief appearances...yielded a .368 batting average to the first four hitters in the batting order, a .207 mark against the bottom five...allowed 4-of-10 (40.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 8-for-21 (.381) with three walks (.458 on-base percentage)...tossed two or more innings in nine of his 24 relief appearances.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Trevor Cahill (2-0, 2.49 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts in his last start and now has 27 strikeouts this season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...in his last start, earned the win in a 5-1 win over Detroit Sunday in Oakland...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter for the eighth time in his career (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so 1 hr)...is 1-3 with a 2.80 ERA (35.1 ip, 32 h, 12 r, 11 er, 15 bb, 24 so, 3 hr) in six career starts against Seattle...is 1-1 with a 3.57 ERA (7 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.04 ERA (4 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 loss to Seattle on Opening Day in Oakland, allowing one run in 4.2 innings while recording eight strikeouts...his only win against Seattle came in his only start in 2010 when he combined with Rodriguez and Wolf on a six-hit shutout in a 9-0 win October 1.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

**2-6, 3.55 ERA (45.2 ip, 33 h, 28 r, 18 er, 24 bb, 40 so, 6 hr)**

**Save/Save Opportunities: 5/8 (62.5%)**

The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or fewer in 11 of the last 16 games and has a 2.82 ERA (12 er in 38.1 ip) over that span after allowing three earned runs in each of the first two games of the season...the 3.55 ERA ranks sixth best in the American League...has been charged with six of the team's 10 losses, which are the most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted five of eight (62.5%) save opportunities, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the three blown saves are tied for third most in the AL...rank fifth in the majors in opponents batting average (.204) and eighth in on-base percentage (.302)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities, which was third best in the AL.

**40 RHP ANDREW BAILEY**

**Save/Opportunities: 0-0**

**Last Outing: 3/14 at Cleveland (ND, 0.1 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)**

**Inherited Runners/Score: 0/0**

**First Hitters: 0-0 (0 bb)**

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list March 30 retroactive to March 22 with a strained right forearm...this is his second career stint on the DL.
- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

**50 RHP GRANT BALFOUR**

**Save/Opportunities: 0-1**

**Last Outing: 4/16 vs. Detroit (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)**

**Inherited Runners/Score: 0/2**

**First Hitters: 1-7 (0 bb)**

- Has not allowed a run in five of his seven appearances this season (3 er in 6.1 ip, 4.26 ERA).
- Has a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in three appearances at home and a 6.75 ERA (2 er in 2.2 ip) on the road...has not allowed a run in two appearances during the day (1.1 ip) and has a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in five outings at night.
- Has a 5.40 ERA in 12 career appearances against the Mariners (11.2 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 9 so).
- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

**13 LHP JERRY BLEVINS**

**Save/Opportunities: 0-0**

**Last Outing: 4/20 vs. Boston (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so)**

**Inherited Runners/Score: 6/4**

**First Hitters: 0-6 (1 bb)**

- Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his seven games this season, including four scoreless appearances (3 er in 8.0 ip, 3.38 ERA)...has a 1.93 ERA (1 er in 4.2 ip) in four appearances at night compared to a 5.40 ERA (2 er in 3.1 ip) in three appearances in day games.
- Is holding opponents to a .125 (3 for 24) batting average this season.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (1 er in 2.2 ip) in two appearances against Seattle this year...however, has a 6.48 ERA in 20 career appearances (16.2 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 12 er, 11 bb, 15 so).
- Is in his fifth Major League season, all with Oakland, and was on his third consecutive Opening Day roster.
- The 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but the first where he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings after yielding five in 64.2 innings over his first three years.

**56 LHP CRAIG BRESLOW**

**Save/Opportunities: 0-1**

**Last Outing: 4/19 vs. Boston (ND, 0.1 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 0 so)**

**Inherited Runners/Score: 6/1**

**First Hitters: 2-6 (1 bb)**

- Has pitched in five of the last eight games (1 er in 4.0 ip, 2.25 ERA) after going eight consecutive games without making an appearance.
- Has allowed at least one run in three of his seven outings this season (4 er in 5.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) and opponents are batting .400 (8 for 20) against him this season.
- Has a 3.86 ERA (1 er in 2.1 ip) in two road games and has a 10.13 ERA (3 er in 2.2 ip) in five appearances at home.
- Has allowed four runs (three earned) in 1.0 inning in two appearances against the Mariners this year and has a 5.59 ERA in 25 career appearances (19.1 ip, 24 h, 14 r, 12 er, 6 bb, 18 so).
- Has played for five teams in his Major League career, which is now in his sixth season...this is the first time he has started consecutive seasons with the same team.
- Made a team-leading 75 appearances for the A's in 2010, registering a 4-4 mark with five saves and 3.01 ERA...the games pitched tied for the fifth highest single season total in Oakland history...also set an Oakland record for strikeouts by a left-handed reliever with 71.

**26 LHP BOBBY CRAMER**

**Save/Opportunities: 0-0**

**Last Outing: 4/14 vs. Detroit (ND, 1.1 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)**

**Inherited Runners/Score: 3/0**

**First Hitters: 0-3 (0 bb)**

- Has not allowed a run in two of his three appearances this year...however, took the loss in his other appearance as he allowed a walk-off home run to Ramirez in Chicago April 12...the home run is the only hit he has allowed this season as opponents are 1 for 11 (.091).
- Has faced the Mariners once in his career and pitched 1.2 scoreless innings (1 bb, 1 so).
- Made his first Opening Day roster as he made his Major League debut with Oakland Sept. 13 of last year at Kansas City.
