ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won their past two games since losing a season-high three in a row...have won five of their last eight games and nine of their last 15...have spent each of the last 13 days in third place and 17 days in third overall...have also spent one day in second place, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and four days in fourth place...this is the A's 44th season in Oakland where they have won 14 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only Atlanta (16) and the Yankees (16) have more division titles...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees have more league (11) and world (7) titles...since 1901, the A's have 14 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (10) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have combined for a 1.52 ERA (11 er in 65.0 ip) over their past 10 games and are now 9-5 with a 2.20 ERA (35 er in 143.1 ip) this season...the ERA ranks **first in the Major Leagues** among starting pitchers...are second in the majors in innings pitched (143.1) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (114)...have allowed three earned runs or less in 18 of their 22 games this season, including five games in which they did not allow a run...have allowed eight home runs this season, which is tied for third fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: A's pitchers have compiled a 2.46 ERA (54 er in 197.2 ip), which is the **best in the majors**...are also tied for first in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging (.320) and rank third in opponents batting average (.226)...have recorded 165 strikeouts, which ranks fourth in the American League, and have allowed 66 walks, fifth fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's pitchers lead the majors with eight pickoffs (Anderson 4, Breslow 3, McCarthy 1)...last year, the A's led the majors with 27 pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 12 of 18 (66.7%) stolen base attempts this season, which is tied for the third lowest percentage in the majors...the offense has been successful in 19 of 23 (82.6%) stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...stole 156 bases last season, which ranked third in the AL and the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 14 runs over their past two games after being shut out in their previous two games...it was their first time being shut out in consecutive games since May 13-14, 2008 at Cleveland...have been shut out three times this year overall...have scored a total of 80 runs, which is the fifth fewest in the American League...are batting .242 (181 for 748) on the season, which is the fifth lowest average in the AL...their 10 home runs are the second fewest in the majors, but their 44 doubles are the tied for sixth most in the majors...are hitting .224 (46 for 205) with runners in scoring position, the fifth lowest average in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error over the last four games after being charged with 11 errors in the previous eight games...opened the season by committing an Oakland-record nine errors over their first four games...their 21 errors total are the second most in the majors (Houston, 23)...last season, the A's were charged with less than 100 errors (99) for the sixth time in the last seven years.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-4 in one-run games this year...have had 10 of their 22 games this season decided by two runs or less and are 4-6 in those games...are 2-3 in extra-inning games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven game road trip through Seattle (2-2) and Los Angeles (three games)...went 3-3 on their last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Boston (1-1)...are now 4-5 at home and 7-6 on the road...went 47-34 (.580) at home last season, their best home mark since going 49-32 in 2006, compared to 34-47 on the road.

DAY AND NIGHT: The A's are 6-2 in day games and 5-9 at night...the day record is tied for third best in the majors and the night record is the seventh worst...have a 2.00 ERA (16 er in 72.0 ip) during the day, which is the second lowest majors, and a 2.72 ERA (38 er in 125.2 ip) at night, which is tied for third best...last year, the A's posted a 35-21 (.625) record for day games and 46-60 (.434) record at night...the day record was the second best in the American League and the night record was fourth worst.

STARTING LINEUPS: The A's have used 16 different lineups through their first 22 games this season...the only lineup they have used more than one time this year is their Opening Day lineup (Crisp, Barton, DeJesus, Willingham, Matsui, Suzuki, Ellis, Kouzmanoff, Pennington), which they have used six times.

LOCKED UP: Oakland has five players under contract beyond the 2011 season...Trevor Cahill is signed through 2015 with club options for 2016 and 2017 after agreeing to terms on a new contract April 11...Brett Anderson is signed through 2013 with club options for 2014 and 2015...Kurt Suzuki is also signed through 2013 with a club option for 2014...Grant Balfour and Brian Fuentes are both signed through 2012 with club options for 2013...Michael Wuertz has a club option for 2012.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the fifth time in the last six years...13 players return from last year's Opening Day roster (Anderson, Barton, Blevins, Braden, Breslow, Ellis, Gonzalez, Kouzmanoff, Pennington, Ross, Suzuki, Sweeney, Ziegler)...Mark Ellis was on his eighth Opening Day Roster in the last nine years...five other players on the current roster played for the A's at some point last year (Cahill, Cramer, Crisp, Jackson, Powell)...five signed with the A's as free agents (Balfour, Fuentes, LaRoche, Matsui, McCarthy)...the other two players were acquired in a trade (DeJesus, Willingham).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list five times this year and 92 times since the start of the 2007 season, which is second most in the majors to Texas (106)...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which was the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 25 in 2008...began the year with three players on the DL and they now have five (Braden, Wuertz, Bailey, Harden, Rosales)...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season, when they had one.

A's vs. ANGELS

A's lost the season series to the Angels 8-11 last season...went 2-7 in Anaheim and 6-4 in Oakland...have now lost the season series in each of the past three seasons and in six of the previous seven...are 60-73 (.451) against the Angels over that span (starting in 2004)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 365-296 against the Angels...that includes 190-140 in Oakland and 175-156 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 414-373 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

David DeJesus has a 259-game errorless streak, which is the **longest active streak among all Major League outfielders**...his last error came on September 15, 2008...is a .333 (68 for 204) career hitter against the Angels, his highest average against any American League team.

Mark Ellis has recorded 200 career doubles and is one double away from tying Carney Lansford for **eighth most in Oakland history**.

Brian Fuentes has six saves this season, which is tied for **third most in the Major Leagues**.

Hideki Matsui has scored a combined 1,499 runs between the United States and Japan, leaving him one away from the 1,500th of his career.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history...he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...the A's are 2-2 in his starting assignments this year and are 32-29 (.525) in his career...has tossed six innings or more in each of his four starts, allowed one run or less three times and walked two batters or fewer twice.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED: Had his scoreless streak snapped at 18.0 innings Wednesday against Boston when Crawford had an RBI single in the second inning...the streak was the longest of his career and had been the longest active streak in the majors.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Has a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts this season, which is the sixth best ERA in the American League and ninth best in the majors among starting pitchers...last year, he finished eighth in the AL with a 3.23 ERA (72 er in 200.2 ip)...now has a 3.07 ERA (77 er in 225.2 ip) over the past two seasons, which is the sixth lowest ERA in the AL over that span (minimum 163.0 ip).

WALK THIS WAY: Walked only one batter in 6.0 innings in his last start but has walked 13 batters this season, which is tied for fifth most in the American League among starting pitchers and 11th most in the Major Leagues...his 105 walks over the past two seasons are the second most in the majors over that span.

TWO WINS: Has earned the win in two of his four starts this season and has now won 17 games in 37 starts over the past two seasons, which is tied for 11th most in the American League over that span...prior to 2010, had seven career wins in 30 games, 24 starts.

FIRST START: Earned the win in the A's 7-1 victory over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...surrendered his only run in the form of a solo home run to Langerhans with one out in the second inning before limiting the Mariners to three hits over his remaining five innings...was relieved by Blevins to start the eighth after throwing 67 of his 116 pitches for strikes.

SECOND START: Earned his second win of the season after pitching six shutout innings in a 1-0 victory in Minnesota April 9...held the Twins to four hits, all singles, while walking two and recording four strikeouts...allowed two hits over the game's first four innings before giving up a pair of singles to start the fifth inning...then got a groundout, pop out and another groundout to get out of the inning...pitched a scoreless sixth before giving way to Balfour and Fuentes, who kept the shutout intact...it was the A's first shutout of the season.

THIRD START: Had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to the Tigers April 14...did not allow a run for his second consecutive start as he gave up only two hits while striking out six...however, did walk six batters, which matched his career high (also Aug. 15, 2009 vs. CWS)...was replaced by Ross to start the seventh inning after throwing 103 pitches...Ross allowed one run in the seventh and two in the eighth as he went on to take the loss.

LAST START: Took the loss in the A's 5-3 defeat to Boston Wednesday...recorded a season-high nine strikeouts and only walked one, a season low...however, also allowed season highs in hits (9) and runs (4) over six innings...gave up an RBI single to Crawford in the second and then Youkilis homered to lead off the fourth...allowed two more runs in the sixth in the form of a Lowrie home run...gave way to Blevins to start the seventh inning.

GONZALEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-1 with a 3.29 ERA (27.1 ip, 25 h, 10 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 33 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, all starts...is 2-0 with a 3.52 ERA (6 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts at Anaheim and 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts last year...he combined with Wuertz, Rodriguez and Ziegler on a five-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Los Angeles September 9...tossed six of the innings and allowed four of the hits while walking three...retired the side in order just once, the fifth inning...was also the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory at Anaheim on April 9...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Matsui in the bottom of the second...also yielded a RBI single to Izturis in the fifth and was relieved by Ramirez after allowing a leadoff double to Rivera in the seventh inning with a 10-2 lead.

AGAINST THE WEST: Posted a 7-1 record and a 2.58 ERA in 11 starts against AL West teams last year, 8-8 with a 3.55 ERA in 22 starts against everyone else...his career numbers are 11-3 with a 2.85 ERA (39 er in 123.1 ip) against divisional foes and 13-18 with a 4.98 ERA (130 er in 235.0 ip) against all other teams.

2010 RECAP: Began the season as the A's fifth starter but ended up finishing second on the team in wins, posting a 15-9 record with a 3.23 ERA in a team-leading 33 starts...was the only Athletic to spend the entire season in the starting rotation...entered the season with a 7-11 record and 6.24 ERA in 30 games, 24 starts, over his first two seasons.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for fourth in the American League in games started (33), ranked fifth in opponents slugging (.329), eighth in ERA (3.23), 10th in opponents batting average (.229) and tied for 10th in wins (15)...led the A's with 171 strikeouts and 92 walks...his walk total was second highest in the AL...also led the A's in innings pitched (200.2)...yielded just 15 home runs for an average of 0.67 per nine innings, which was 10th lowest in the AL...also ranked 10th in the AL in pitches (3369).

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 7-1 with a 2.17 ERA and .192 opponents average in 11 starts during the day last year, 8-8 with a 3.86 ERA and .249 opponents average in 22 starts at night...ranked second in the AL in day ERA, tied for third in wins and fourth in opponents average...is now 11-5 with a 3.66 ERA (54 er in 132.2 ip) in 22 career appearances during the day, compared to 13-16 with a 4.59 ERA (115 er in 225.2 ip) in 45 games at night.

RUN SUPPORT: Received run support of two runs or fewer in each of his nine losses last year and had just six total runs of support in those starts (45.2 ip, 1.18 RSA)...has 19 runs of support in his 21 career losses (100.0 ip, 1.71 RSA)...is 22-4 in 37 career starts with run support of two or more and 2-17 in 24 starts with support of one run or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brandon McCarthy (1-1, 2.10 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has only walked three batters this season, which ties him for fifth fewest in the American League by a starting pitcher and 13th fewest in the majors...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 extra-innings loss to Toronto on April 5...allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits over eight innings, walking one while striking out two...earned his first win of the year in the A's 5-3 victory in Minnesota April 10...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2009 with Texas at Cleveland...allowed two runs on nine hits over 7.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 8-4 loss April 15 against Detroit in Oakland...gave up six hits, walked one and recorded a season-high seven strikeouts...took the loss despite pitching a complete game in the A's 1-0 defeat in Seattle Thursday...the complete game was his second of his career, his first since May 24, 2009 with Texas at Houston...is 0-1 with a 3.82 ERA (30.2 ip, 33 h, 17 r, 13 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 2 hr) in seven appearances against the Angels...is 0-1 with a 3.50 ERA (7 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts...is 0-1 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) in four games, three starts, in Anaheim and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in three relief appearances at home.

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in each of its past seven games and has a 1.53 ERA (3 er in 17.2 ip) over that span...ranks second in the American League and 10th in the majors with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) overall this season...has been charged with six of the team's 11 losses, which are tied for the most losses by relievers in the majors...have converted six of nine (66.7%) save opportunities, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage in the AL...the three blown saves are tied for fourth most in the AL...rank first in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and slugging (.320) and are second in opponents batting average (.226)...last year, compiled a 3.75 ERA last year, which ranked sixth in the AL...converted 38 of 51 (74.5%) save opportunities in 2010, which was third best in the AL.

- Appeared in just two games this spring, tossing a scoreless inning March 10 against Kansas City and allowing two unearned runs in 0.1 innings March 14 at Cleveland before leaving with his injury.
- Led the A's in saves (25) and was named to the American League All-Star team for the second consecutive season last year...was 1-3 with a 1.47 ERA in 47 relief appearances...ranked seventh among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and eighth in slugging (.292).

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his nine appearances this season (3 er in 8.0 ip, 3.38 ERA).
- Has a 2.45 ERA (1 er in 3.2 ip) in three appearances at home and a 4.91 ERA (2 er in 3.2 ip) in five road appearances.
- Had a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in five games against the Angels last year...however, has a 6.46 ERA in 15 career appearances (15.1 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 16 so).
- Is in his eighth season in the majors but was on an Opening Day roster for just the third time (2009, 2010).
- Signed with the A's as a free agent, January 18, 2011.
- Made 57 relief appearances for Tampa Bay last year, despite spending the month of August on the disabled list...compiled a 2.28 ERA, which ranked eighth among American League relievers...allowed a .216 batting average, including .174 against right-handed hitters.

- Has a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) in five appearances with one day of rest or less and a 13.50 ERA (3 er in 2.0 ip) in two appearances with two days rest or more.
- Has allowed six of eight inherited runners to score this season (75.0%), which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League.
- Is holding opponents to a .160 (4 for 25) batting average this season.
- Had a 6.23 ERA (3 er in 4.1 ip) in five appearances against Los Angeles last year and has a 4.63 ERA in 13 career appearances against the team (11.2 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 12 so).
- Is in his fifth Major League season, all with Oakland, and was on his third consecutive Opening Day roster.
- The 2010 season was his fourth in the majors but the first where he spent the entire year at the big league level...was 2-1 with a save and a 3.70 ERA in a career-high 63 appearances...allowed seven home runs in 48.2 innings after yielding five in 64.2 innings over his first three years.
